## THE UNITED STATES

THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS will be held under the auspices of The Skating Club of New York on March 6, 7, 8, 1943. Mr. Heaton R. Robertson will serve as Referee and Mr. Harold Hartshorne will be Chairman in charge of the Championships. Address all inquires to Mr. Hartshorne, at Iceland, 304 West 50th St., New York.

Exact hours will be included in the general announcement to be mailed to all USFSA Clubs and Individual Members in January. The general schedule has been announced as follows: Saturday, March 6 (Iceland): Morning-all Novice School Figures; Afternoon-all Senior School Figures; Evening-all Novice Free Skating, Junior Pairs, Fours (for program). Sunday, March 7 (Iceland): Morning-Senior and Junior Dance (complete). Monday, March 8, (Iceland): all Junior School Figures; Evening (Madison Square Garden)-all Junior Free Skating; all Senior Free Skating; Senior Pairs; Fours (for performance); exhibitions by winners; presentation of prizes.

The Monday evening events will be held for the benefit of the American Flying Services Foundation at Madison Square Garden. Inquiries about tickets should be sent to The Skating Club of New York, 304 West 50th St., New York City.

Novice School Figures for Men are Numbers 4, 16, 19 a or b, and 27 a or b; for Ladies, Numbers 6 a or b, 17, 19 a or b, and 29 a or b. A and B figures to be skated on one foot only, the starting foot to be drawn by lot.

The Executive Committee has voted that, owing to wartime conditions, only those placing first, second, and third in Sectional Singles held during the season commencing September 1, 1942, may compete in the 1943 U. S. Novice Singles, subject, however, to the right to apply for leave to enter under the provisions of Rule 40, subdivision 5. This year there will be both a Senior and a Junior Dance Championship; see Rules 33 and 35 in 1942-43 RULEBOOK for details.

# CANADIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

THE CANADIAN FIGURE SKATING ASSOCIA-TION abandoned the Senior Championships this season owing to war conditions, but will hold the Junior Championships as There are three events: Junior usual. Men's Championship and Junior Ladies' Championship, for the two cups presented by Mr. Allan E. Howard of Montreal; and the Junior Pair Championship, for the two cups presented by Mr. Arthur L. Dysart of Winnipeg. These three Junior Competitions will take place at the Toronto Skating Club on Saturday, January 30. Entries must be in the hands of the Secretary of the Toronto Skating Club on or before January 26.

#### THE SECTIONALS

IN ALL SECTIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS the Novice School Figures for Men are Numbers 6 a or b, 15, and 26 a or b; for Ladies, Numbers 4, 14, and 26 a or b. A and B figures to be skated on one foot only, the starting foot to be drawn by lot.

In all Sectional Juvenile Championships, the School Figures for both Boys and Girls are Numbers 3, 5a or b, and 7. A and B figures to be skated on one foot only, the starting foot to be drawn by lot.

Where there are more than twenty competitors in any Junior, Novice, or Juvenile Sectional Singles event, the Referee may, in his discretion, limit the number of those entitled to free skate to not less than twenty. The winners of any previous Sectional Juvenile, Novice, or Junior Singles

or Pair event may not enter that event again in any section or with a different partner.

Sectional Senior Dance Events will consist of Waltz, Tango, Foxtrot, and Fourteenstep conducted as provided in new Rule 33.

Sectional Junior Dance Events will consist of Continental Waltz and Fourteenstep conducted as provided in new Rules 31 and 32 but with Continental Waltz skated in all waltz rounds. Individuals and couples who have placed first, second, third, or fourth in a National or Sectional Senior Dance Championship, or who have placed first in a National or Sectional Junior Dance Championship may not enter a Junior Sectional Dance Championship.

THE EASTERN CHAMPIONSHIPS, under the auspices of the New Haven Skating Club, will be held on February 19 and 20 in the New Haven Arena. Mr. Herman C. Fritz, 61 Pendleton St., New Haven, is Chairman of the committee in charge of these competitions.

THE MID-WESTERN CHAMPIONSHIPS will be held by the Cleveland Skating Club at its own rink, on January 29 and 30. Mr. Henry M. Beatty will be in charge of the competitions and can be reached in care of the club, 2501 East 130th St., Shaker Heights, Cleveland, Ohio.

THE PACIFIC COAST CHAMPIONSHIPS will be held at East Bay Iceland, Berkeley, Calif., on February 12 and 13, under the auspices of the St. Moritz Ice Skating Club. Chairman of the Competition Committee is Mr. R. C. Gingg, % Henry F. Swift, 490 California St., San Francisco.
