The Figure Skating Club of Minneapolis had the honor of being host to the 24th Annual Midwestern Championships, on February 17-19. This was a new experience for a great many members of the Minneapolis Club since it was the first major championship event held in Minneapolis since the Nationals in 1944. The Board of Directors and their wives, as well as the Junior Board members, spent many hours to make the Championships a pleasant and successful one for the 114 contestants.

The Judges and Officials' dinner was held at the Minneapolis Club on Wednesday evening preceding the competition. Many thanks to the officials: H. Kendall Kelley, George B. Jenkinson, Harry N. Keighley and the nine judges who contributed so much to the smooth operation

of the various events. Our thanks also to Dr. Robert R. Kierland of Rochester for the many hours he spent in the accounting room.

The St. Paul Figure Skating Club was host to the directors of both clubs and their wives, officials and judges at a cocktail party and dinner on Thursday evening between events.

In the free skating, the little girls and the young ladies with pigtails and pony tails, all dressed up like someone you read about or see in pictures, gave performances that only Hollywood adjectives could adequately describe. The boys and young men, while less colorful in attire, were not to be outdone in the difficulty, variety or harmonious composition of their free skating programs. To try and single out one, two or three skaters who were outstanding in each event was the herculean task of the judges. It was not easy, but was well taken care of.

It takes more than one skater to make a competition. At this point the writer would like to pay tribute to those who

placed in the lower brackets. Because of these skaters we have championships, and also because of these skaters the champions are truly champions. No event in the Midwesterns this year was a walkaway for anyone.

The competition opened with the Novice Men's figures with five contestants en-At the end of the figures John Hendrickson was in first place, followed by Tommy DeBaca. After the free skating Tommy placed first and John, second. The final marks in the Juvenile Boys' event found Douglas Ramsay in first place, Monroe Meier in second position, and Dixon Perry-Smith, Jr., third.

In the Novice Ladies' class Donna Abbott placed first in both figures and free skating. Vicky Fisher came from behind in figures to place second. In the Junior Men's Championship Robert James was ahead all the way. Tommy Weinreich placed second after having finished fourth in figures. A new trophy in the Midwesterns this year, gift of Mrs. Mary Louise Premer Wright in memory of her father, Frederick W. Premer, was presented to the new Junior Champion by Mrs. Premer.

In the Junior Pairs, Roy Pringle and Janet Harley placed ahead of Karl Freed and Gayle Benvie, who were second, and Jane and John G. Horsman, Jr., who were third.

The new Senior Men's Champion is Barlow Nelson; he received the unanimous decision of the judges in both figures and free skating to outplace his only competitor, Lee Carroll Owen.

In the Bronze Dance, Gail Kizer and Roy Speeg outdanced Mary Pat Ryan and Patrick Rance, runners-up, and Karl Freed and Gayle Benvie, third-place couple. In the Juvenile Girls' event, Carol Ann Springman placed first after having been third in figures. Blair Bacon came up from sixth in figures to take second place. Third place went to Ruth Hayes.

The new Midwestern Senior Ladies' Champion is Charlene Adams. Gladys Irene Jacobs placed second, and Carol Keyes, third. Charlene Adams and Lee Carroll Owen took first honors in the Silver Dance over Carol Miller and Arnold

Schroeder, and Gladys Irene Jacobs and Arthur Dammkoehler.

A supper party, held in the Cardinal Room of the Curtis Hotel after the final event, dissipated all the tension of the competition.
