In spite of the coldest weather in a century, judges and competitors managed to arrive on time for all events in a championship in which skaters from the Wagon Wheel FSC topped all other clubs by piling up 74 points to win the coveted Memorial Trophy presented by the Cleveland SC. It was the first time that Rockton, Illinois, skaters had brought home the Midwestern Team Trophy since its inception in 1945. The 74 points were accumulated by seven skaters five of
whom qualified for U.S. Championships.
After winning the Southwestern Senior Ladies event Cindy Watson was determined to capture the Sectional trophyand win it she did in the closing program at Hobart Arena. It was her first Sectional title. On the other hand there was little doubt about John Baldwin's superiority in the Senior Men's division although his performance was less dynamic than that which won him the regional trophy last month. He failed to land a triple salchow

jump cleanly but compensated by executing an abundance of double jump sequences tied into complicated footwork.

Honors for one of the competition's most spectacular programs went to petite Melissa Militano who ran away with the Junior Lady title. Drawing last place in the order of skating, she overshadowed the above average skating of her predecessors by the ease and elevation of her jumps, effortless flow and smiling confidence.

The amazing Glenn tamily from Wagon Wheel FSC contributed immeasurably to the club's team points. Roger captured the Junior Men's crown, Nancy, the Novice Ladies', and together they took second place in Junior Pairs. A sister, Leslie, gained a fourth place in Intermediate Ladies which was won by Carter Ellison.

Third place winners in the 1969 U.S. Junior Pair Championships, Barbara Brown \& Douglas Berndt skated with elegance and beauty in a sophisticated program of polished maneuvers which won them the Junior Pair title and left little doubt that they would be serious contenders for the national title in Tulsa.

The Novice Men's free skating was particularly advanced. Not only did David Santee jump from a third figure spot to first, but Tom Van Camp, characterized by many as a junior version of John Petkevich, pulled from sixth to third. Santee later teamed with Lorrie Reed to secure second place in Novice Pairs. One of the competitions most spectacular breakthroughs came when Alice Cook, who had placed ninth in Novice figures, skated an exciting free style to place third overall in the division. So overcome was she that tears of joy streamed down her cheeks as she accepted her medal from Frederic LeFevre, competition chairman.

A tight contest for first place in the

Gold Dance event had the audience on the edge of their seats as a virtual tie in the initial round left Kathy West \& Paul Spruell a gasp away from first placea situation they speedily remedied by their free dance which settled them comfortably in top position. Runnersup were Mary Campbell \& Johnny Johns with third place going to Ginni Luttenton \& Eddie Marshall.

In this competition all competitors' music was taped on cassettes assuring the the skaters of absolutely correct timing and eliminating the danger of broken records. At the conclusion of the competition each skater's cassette was presented to him while those not picked up were destroyed to prevent any opportunity to crib another competitor's music.

Most attending the 1970 Midwesterns agreed that the overall calibre of free skating was excitingly high. The progress of those going on to Tulsa will be studiously followed by everyone who had the pleasure of cheering them on in Troy.
