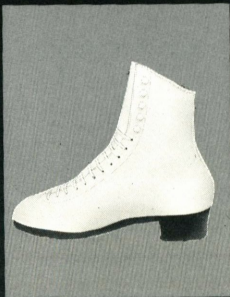

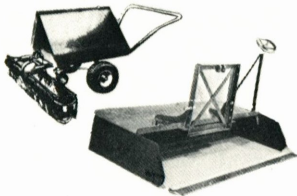

Of all the functions of the USFSA none is of more importance than the conduct of qualifying competitions. It represents the unification of all Association facets—testing, judging, accounting and the all-important establishing of standards of excellence in the sport of figure skating. Regionals, the first group of annual competitions, have just taken place at nine locations, and a whole new crop of youngsters has emerged providing future contenders for golden crowns (story, page 6; results, page 18).

Burgeoning divisions of lower level competition at Regionals points up the national clamor for more judges. In the Greater Cleveland area six clubs have joined forces to create a Figure Skating Judges' Education Organization in an effort to motivate a sustained judges training curriculum. One of the organization's first steps was to schedule a dance judges school through the auspices of the USFSA Judges Committee. Cleveland SC member Susan Scherer reports on the successful outcome of the school (page 10). Perhaps the account will stimulate the founding of other regional groups dedicated to the specific task of reinforcing the judging ranks.

Dancers and athletes are dependent on good breath control to carry them through rigorous physical routines. For the athlete who doesn't want to be left breathless, a daily Yoga routine not only improves his overall physical fitness, but also helps to counteract tension. Melitta Brunner, one-time World competitor and physical education instructor, is a long-time devotee of Yoga which she learned from a Frenchman in England! She offers selected exercises which have proven to be of exceptional benefit to figure skaters. Take a deep breath with Melitta on page 8.

Anyone who has chaperoned a competitor at any of the big events knows of the vicissitudes of finding ice time, transportation, sleep and food at odd hours. 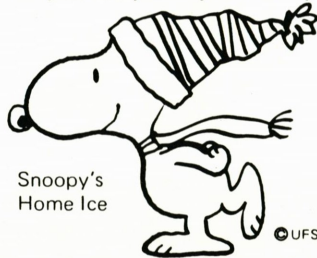

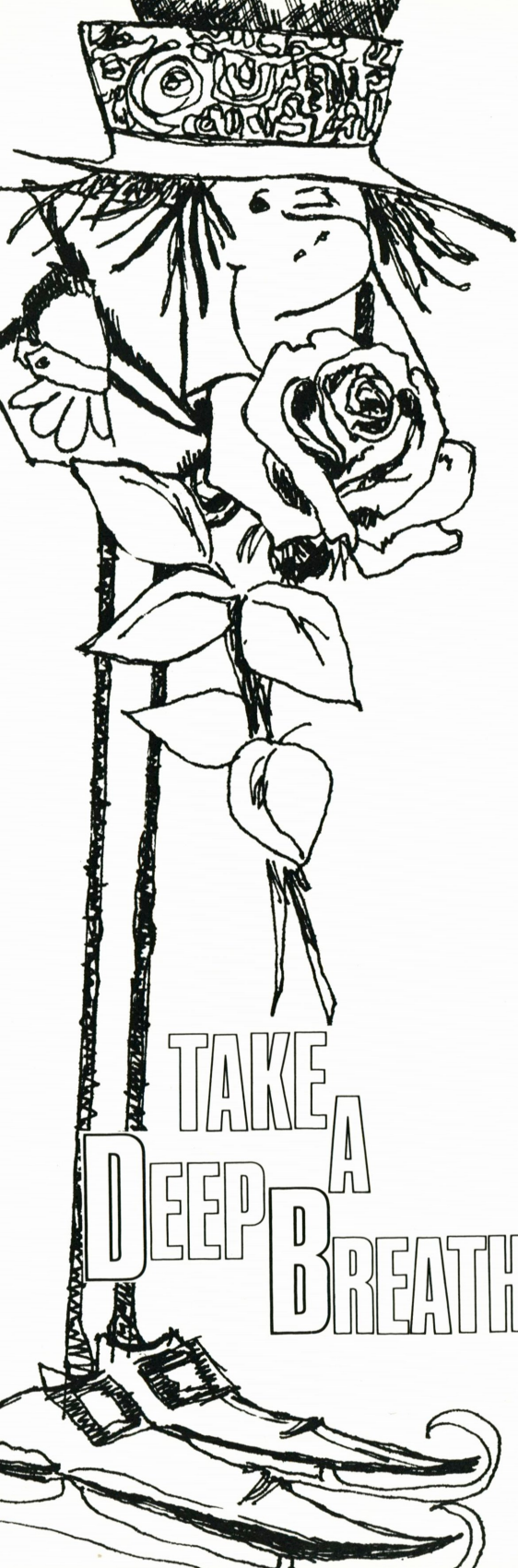

Climaxing months, sometimes years, of slow, progressive testing, many young skaters are entering official qualifying competitions at regional level for the first time this year. For most entrants, their only previous exposure to competitive skating has been club, inter-club and summer skating school contests—wonderful proving grounds for experience, but hardly to be compared with the spine-tingling excitement of one's first step onto the competitive ladder. Newcomers are happy when they've held their nerve and turned in a creditable performance. Repeaters strive for higher placements while seasoned skaters battle for Bronze, Silver and Gold medals. Win, lose or draw, everyone feels it's a privilege to be an accepted contestant in a sport which becomes more meaningful with each year's commitment. Please turn to page 18 for the results.

Breath is life. When we inhale, the red blood cells in our lungs absorb the life-sustaining oxygen from the air and distribute it to all of our tissues. Using this oxygen, our tissues undergo metabolic processes which produce the energy we require at all times, even when we are relaxing. When we exercise, our demand for energy increases. To perform more extensive metabolic processes which will yield this greater amount of energy, our tissues require a larger supply of oxygen. To rush more oxygenated blood to the tissues, the heart pumps faster and blood pressure increases. We suffer fatigue and shortness of breath as we gasp for more oxygen. If we breathe correctly, we can reduce the body's need to rush excessive amounts of blood to the tissues. By taking deep breaths, we allow each red blood cell to take in a greater amount of oxygen; and by exhaling slowly, we give our tissues a chance to absorb most of this oxygen.

The Yoga concept of breathing differs somewhat from the purely physical explanation. Developed thousands of years ago in India, Yoga is the science of mental as well as physical well-being, and it is still practiced widely today. Eastern philosophers handed down the belief that the universe is permeated with a life force called *Prana*. The greatest abundance of Prana available to human beings can be found in the atmosphere, and it is most readily attainable through correct breathing. The Yogis regard breathing as essential for obvious physical reasons and for tranquil emotional makeup and proper mind control.

From both the medical explanation and the Yoga philosophy, we can assume that proper breathing is necessary for our physical and mental health. The following are

exercises, derived primarily from Yoga, which will help us to achieve proper breathing techniques, thereby reducing fatigue and building stamina.

Always clear the respiratory system of mucous before attempting any exercises or before any big physical undertaking, such as a skating competition. You should gargle daily, and you should also rinse your nose each morning with lukewarm water.

To clear the respiratory system of mucous and other blockage in the windpipe and bronchial tubes, the following exercise is beneficial. Lie on back with legs outstretched, hands next to hips. Press elbows strongly against floor while head is relaxed hanging back. This will raise your chest and arch it. In this position inhale deeply and exhale thoroughly. Relax. Return to the starting position. Remain relaxed for a few seconds, then take an ordinary breath. Repeat four to six times.

Natural breathing exercises are singing, whistling and humming. Sing in your car and in your bath, and whistle while you work. It all helps. Try singing the scales up and down in one breath. It may not work the first day, but with persistent practice, your breathing system will improve. Never mind the wrong notes!

THE CLEANSING BREATH

Lie flat on your back on the floor or bed (no pillow), or sit with an absolutely straight back. Before you start inhaling, always exhale as much air from the lungs as possible. Now take a deep breath by sniffing the air in a staccato rhythm through your nose until you can sniff in no more air. Pause for one or two seconds, then expel the air through your mouth with a puh! puh! puh!—like the sound of a steam kettle. Pretend you're sniffing a flower for

as long as you can, and then imagine blowing out the candles on a birthday cake. Do not inhale while you are blowing out the candles. Repeat this exercise a few times followed by the "complete breath".

COMPLETE BREATH

Lie flat on the floor (no pillow). Push the air out of your lungs before you start. Now hold your hands very loosely over your diaphragm and inhale, feeling your body fill with air from your lower parts, through the middle section of your body and on up to your shoulders. Hold your breath for a second or two, then exhale through your slightly opened mouth until no more air can be expelled. You should feel like a balloon being deflated as the abdominal muscles contract. Do not do this strenuous exercise more than twice a day in the beginning.

RHYTHMIC BREATH

While walking inhale for four steps, hold your breath for four steps, then exhale for eight steps. By holding your breath your need for expelling air is more urgent. You can vary the rhythm, but always exhale many steps longer than you inhale. Do this while skating by counting strokes instead of steps.

LETTER "L" BREATHING EXERCISE

Sit on the floor facing a wall. Rest outstretched legs up the wall with buttocks and hips touching the baseboard. Hold arms outstretched over head, hands loosely touching the floor, palms up. Keep elbows straight. Your body is now in a letter "L" shape. In this position, perform the "complete breath" exercise ten times. Do not force. At the end of each exhalation, pull in the abdomen in order to expel just a bit more air from the lungs.

The Cleveland SC, Ohio, hosted the first Dance Judges School sponsored by the USFSA and conducted by the USFSA Judges Committee in cooperation with the Figure Skating Judges' Education Organization of Greater Cleveland. Representing this newly developed organization were: Cleveland SC—Mrs. Stanley Engel, Mrs. L.A. Graham, Mrs. Frederic Rittinger; Euclid Blade & Edge Club—Loyal Luikart Jr.; Forestwood FSC—John Chrien; Plaza FSC—Dr. E. Leonard Arnoff, James Cunningham, H. Kendall Kelley; and Towne 'n Country FSC—Mrs. William McHale.

On Saturday, November 15, 1969, with the first snowfall of the season, 66 prospective dance judges and Bronze and Silver dance judges met with an outstanding instruction panel of 9 judges and 9 local professionals. Representing 23 clubs, the enrollees came from eight states—Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania and West Virginia—to attend the Judging School.

Everyone became acquainted at an 8:00 A.M. continental breakfast served in the club grill. An instruction booklet, edited by Mrs. L.A. Graham who was also Judge-in-Charge, was distributed. The booklet contained the schedule and informational material such as the qualities requisite for a judge, Judge's Creed and

Regulations, suggestions for dance judges, introductory steps, fundamentals to observe in judging dances, USFSA judging cards, marking of free dancing, range of marks for dance tests and competitions, duties of the Judge-in-Charge and a report of the USFSA Dance Committee. The booklet proved a resourceful introduction to the seminar. (Additional copies may be obtained by writing to Mrs. L.A. Graham, 3119 Highland Drive, Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio 44224.)

Two groups were formed. One was arranged for prospective dance judges. On the instruction panel were Chairman, Mrs. Benjamin W. Fauver, National Dance Judge; Mrs. Patricia Byer, Gold Dance Test Judge; H. Kendall Kelley, World Dance Referee; and Mrs. Harry W. Meiss, National Dance Judge. Professionals on the panel were Carole Gatti, Pieter Kollen and Claire O'Neill Staples, Cleveland SC; and Robert A. Keyes, Plaza FSC.

The second group for instruction of Bronze and Silver Dance Judges was moderated by International Dance Judge, Mrs. Charles A. DeMore, who was assisted by International Dance Judges, Dorothy Burkholder and Mrs. William O. Hickok IV, and National Dance Judge, Mrs. Frederic Rittinger. Professional helpers in this group included Lorie Kooker and Phil Racine, Plaza FSC; Gordon Manzie, Cleve-

land SC; and Mr. and Mrs. Robert Munz, Cleveland Heights Ice Rink and Towne 'n Country FSC.

Classroom discussions and ice demonstrations kept the panels busy on Saturday, until the 4:00 P.M. dance session. This session provided a pleasant change of pace as members of the Cleveland SC skated with their guests. During the refreshment intermission Ginni Luttenton and Eddie Marshall exhibited the Starlight Waltz, Rhumba and Silver Samba.

After dinner the enrollees assembled to study the elements, program, music and judging of the Silver Free Dance. Mrs. Graham moderated the session assisted by H. Kendall Kelley. Particular aspects of the dance were discussed by Mrs. Fauver, Mrs. Meiss, Mrs. Staples and Mr. Kollen. Later there were demonstrations of Silver Free Dance, Gold Free Dance and an Original Set-Pattern Dance. To complete the evening everyone returned to the assembly room to hear James A. Cunningham discuss ice dance figures and the selection and timing of dance music.

Classroom discussions and demonstrations were scheduled for Sunday morning followed by a final assembly at which Mrs. Byer spoke about requirements for appointment and promotion of judges. Pro Pieter Kollen explained that the Pro-

ONE SWELL FELLA

Heroes are as much a part of life's warp and woof as food and drink. Often the most deeply influential people have been regular Joe's who, because of their dedicated involvement and sensitivity to the needs of others, have become models of inspiration to those who know them—and to those who knew him, Joe Byer was a hero. In his all-too-brief lifetime, Joe devoted most of his spare hours to encouraging the growth of figure skating in Johnstown, Pennsylvania. Frozen ponds and rivers were Joe's favorite rendezvous as a youngster. He met and courted his wife Patricia on skates, and together they raised five children who learned to skate almost simultaneously with walking. As ice dancing became popular, Pat and Joe traveled to indoor rinks where they could learn the new dances and meet others who shared their enthusiasm. In 1950 the Cambria County War Memorial Rink was constructed, offering the op-

portunity for more months of skating. For three years Pat and Joe laid the groundwork for the formation of a USFSA club, helping to draw up the constitution and bylaws and learning with others the procedures for renting ice and providing instruction.

Until 1963 there were no funds for professional instruction, so Joe volunteered as a teacher, guiding hundreds of enthusiastic children through the ups and downs of skating careers. Even when Judith Peterson was hired as the club's first professional, Joe, his son Dennis and daughter Susan continued to instruct children who flocked to the popular Johnstown rink.

Although Joe Byer officiated as president of the Johnstown FSC for several years and as ice chairman for 19 years, he preferred to work unobtrusively behind the scenes. He arranged the music system for club and test sessions, sharpened dozens of pairs of skates and spent countless hours at carnival time building scenery and planning the program and lighting.

Despite the many hours he spent helping others in skating, Joe managed to find the time to pass tests through the Pre-Silver Dance. He was also an inspiration to the myriads of frightened girls whom he happily escorted through dance tests with whispered words of encouragement. In competition, Joe and Pat, who is now a judge, captured a first in Bronze Dance in the 1963 Genesee FSC Dance Competition as well as placing second in the Veterans. Dance in the South Atlantic Championships that same year. Joe's skillful comedy acts, too, were a highlight of many ice shows.

Joseph Byer died on May 6, 1969, a little more than three months after the death of his 16-year-old son Dennis. But in Johnstown, Pennsylvania, skaters still recall "one swell fella's" warmth and kindness that transformed anguished moments into the thrill of accomplishment—surely a model for each skater to emulate in his own lifetime.

Sage advice? Well, as a veteran traveler of the competition trail, I've learned something of value which I'd like to pass along to mothers of competitors heading for the competition circuit for the first time.

What of the late night hours competitors must keep to get in an extra practice session at the rink where the competition is being held? Free ice time is often available only long after regular bedtime. And late at night, after a few hours of strenuous practice, skaters are tired—and hungry! But in a strange city, when restaurants are either closed or inaccessible at that hour, the all-too-familiar cries of, "Gee, Mom, I'm starved!" must go unheeded.

Skating mothers, be prepared! Jot down a list of foods that are appetizing, filling, non-spillers and non-spoilers. And keep your eyes open at the market for items that require no refrigeration and are compact in size. Then with a hot water coil immerser and a small coffeepot or pan for boiling the water, you'll be all set. Your range of possibilities for midnight snacks at competitions can be limitless.

Think of all the "instants"—coffee, tea, hot chocolate (bring a box of marshmallows, too), powdered milk and orange juice, bouillon cube soup, even instant oatmeal—just add water.

Cookies, chips, nuts and pretzels are good fillers and favorite stand-bys for the perennial snacker. Spread anything on crackers—cheese (it comes in cans), peanut butter, jams, canned ham or chicken spreads. For the diet-conscious snacker, try dried fruits—apricots, peaches, pears and raisins. Fresh fruits and vegetables keep for a few days unrefrigerated. Bring along apples, oranges, celery and carrots.

With your own corner-of-the-bedroom, 24-hour snack bar, you'll be surprised how quickly you can quiet the hunger pangs of your favorite competitors—at least until breakfast!

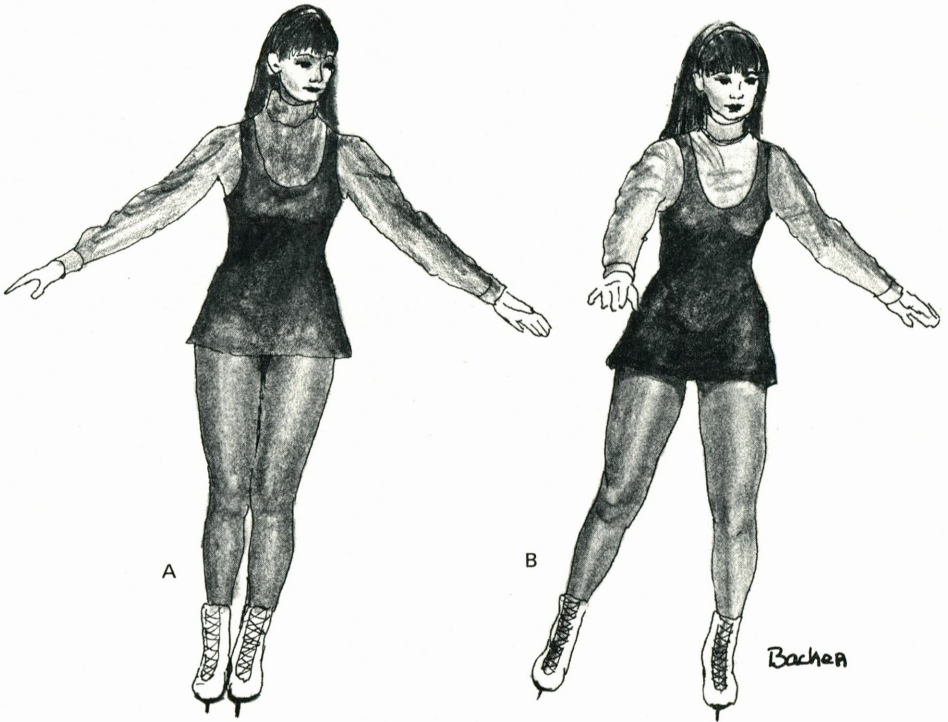

FORWARD CURVE ON TWO FEET

Adapted from *Basic Ice Skating Skills* by Robert Ogilvie; copyrighted by the USFSA and J.P. Lippincott Co.

In skating curves or edges:

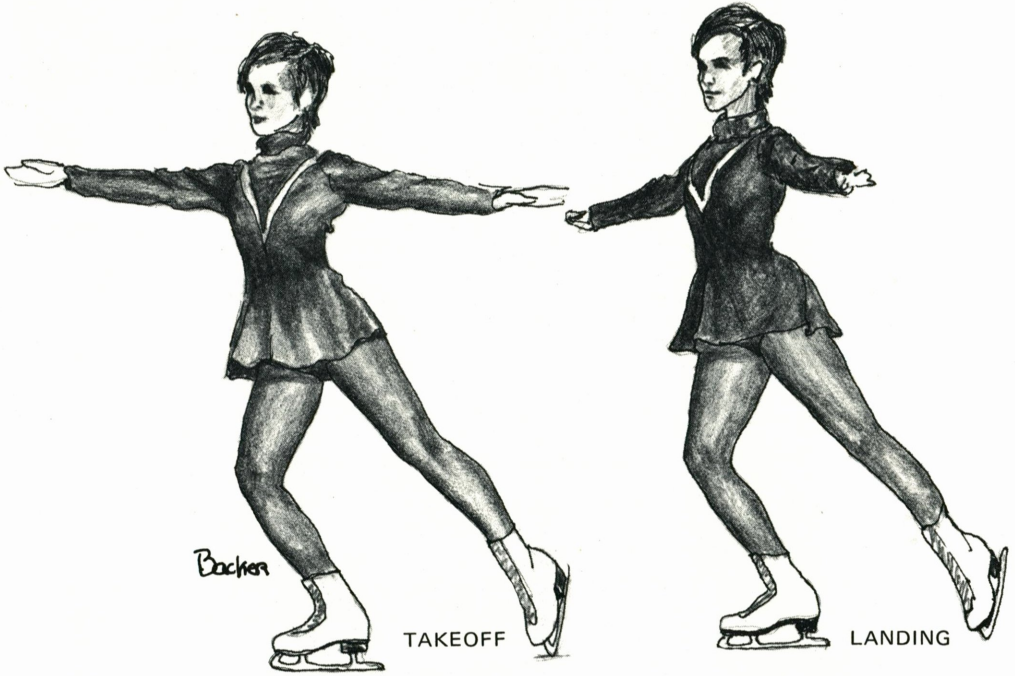
Skate in a straight line at moderate speed;
Bring feet close and parallel;

Keep shoulders square to the print;
Lean to left (or right).

Learning to skate a strong edge on two feet will promote a strong edge on one foot.

TIP: The *entire body* must lean as a unit. Skidding will occur if one leans forward. Note correct body lean in (A), improper body position in (B).

BACK SPLIT JUMP

by Mimi Pong Johnston, Professional
Towne 'n Country FSC

Takeoff: Skate on right back edge allowing right shoulder and arm to stretch forward. Place left arm back and dig in with left toe.

Jump: Bend right knee deeply keeping back and torso straight. Spring up and split with

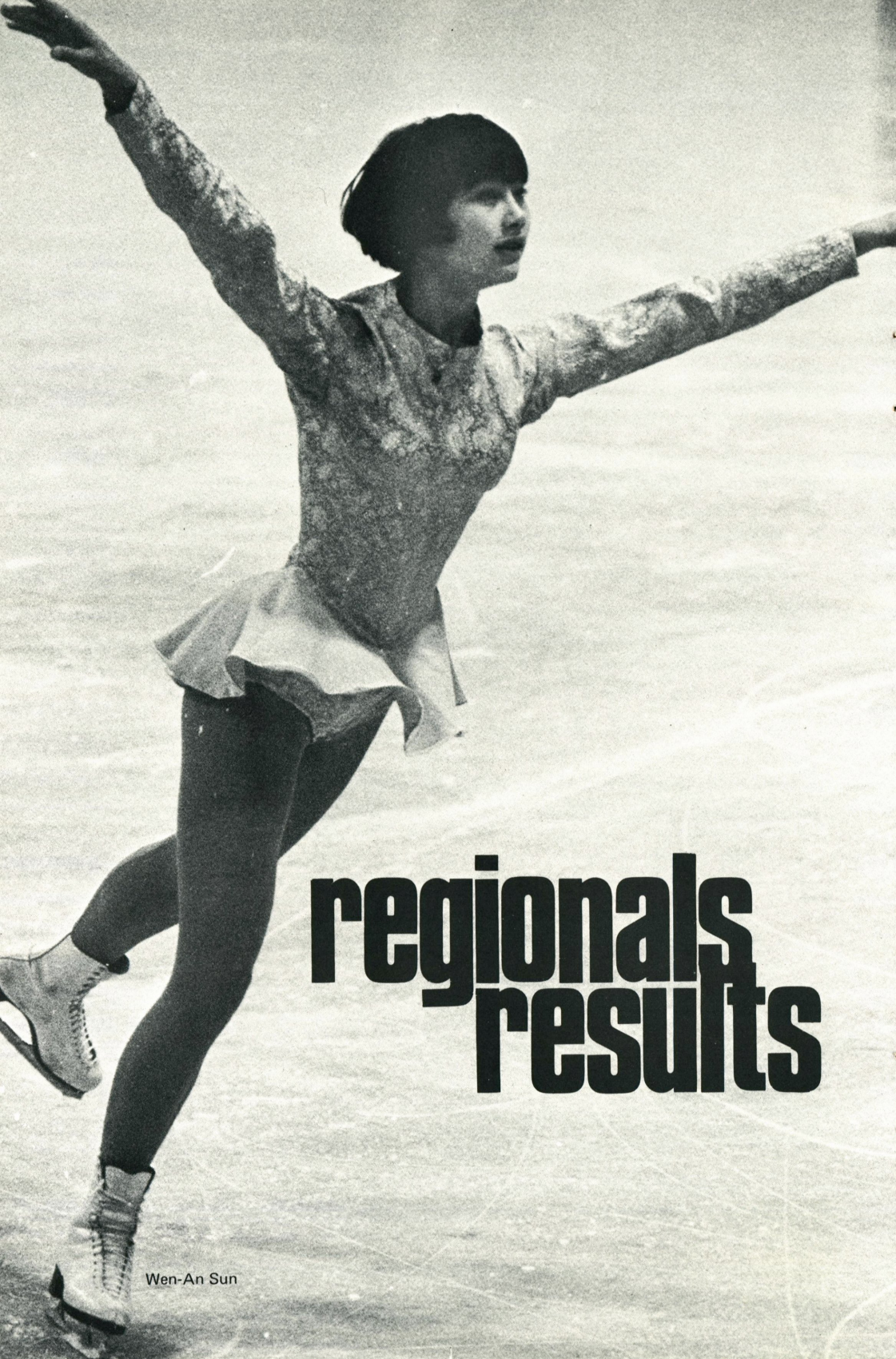

Landing: Start left foot backwards as right foot comes down. Land on a slight back outer edge. Hold shoulders in square position for checkout.

TIP: Split must occur at top of jump, not on the way up.

For a good combination, try using a RFI three-turn immediately after a forward split jump.

The first games are taking place now, having been scheduled for January 9-March 15, 1970, at Lake Placid, New York. In addition to the figure skating championships scheduled for March 12-14, there will be bobsled and luge races, ski jumping, cross country racing and hockey championships.

The figure skating events include Senior Men's and Ladies' Singles and Pairs with the maximum number of entrants limited to 12 in singles and 8 in pairs and national/representation limited to one in each event. Depending upon the number of entrants, however, these limits may be modified. Five compulsory figures will be drawn for both the ladies, who will skate a four-minute free skating program, and the men, who will skate a five-minute program. The short program for Pairs will be Group A followed by a five-minute free program. A panel of seven international judges will be selected from among the participating countries-which are Austria, Canada, Czechoslovakia, France, Italy, Japan, Norway, Poland, Switzerland, United States, West Germany and Yugoslavia.

The program calls for an opening ice show on January 10 at the Lake Placid Olympic Arena and figure skating exhibitions as part of the closing ceremony on March 15. Reserved seats are \$2.00, \$2.50 and \$3.00 and are available by writing Olympic Arena, Lake Placid, N.Y. 12946. When sending your check for tickets, be sure to ask for the Lake Placid list of accommodations and restaurants. The Chamber of Commerce has a comprehensive listing which includes descriptions of a variety of lodgings with prices and a handy map to aid you in taking in all the points of interest in this famed winter sports center. ○

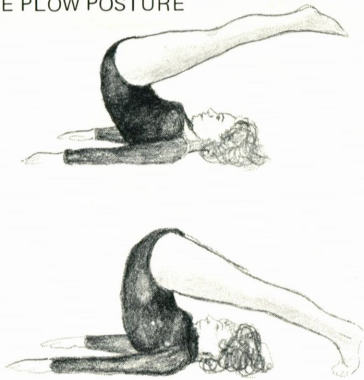

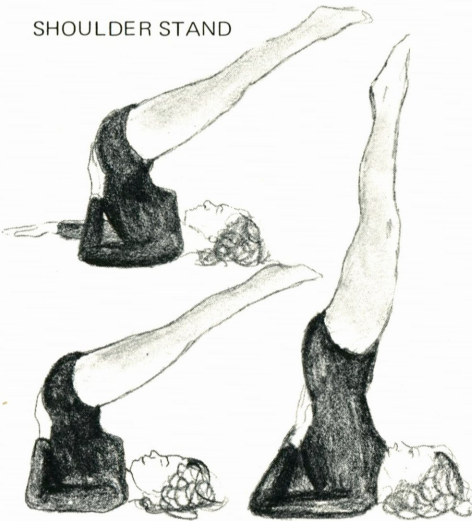
TAKE A DEEP BREATH

THE PLOW POSTURE



Sit on floor. Pull knees up and roll with the rest of your body so far back that your outstretched feet touch the floor behind. Tuck in your chin until it touches the breastbone. In this position perform one or two "complete breath" exercises. Now unwind yourself *slowly* and repeat a few times.

SHOULDER STAND



Proceed in the plow position. After feet have reached the floor behind you, place hands on back of hips for support. Now swing one leg, then the other, to a vertical position. You are now in the "candle" position. Stay in this position as long as it is comfortable (never longer than ten minutes) while doing regular breathing.

While standing on your shoulders, you can: 1) do bicycle peddling; 2) swing both legs to the sides then close again; or 3) swing open legs around to right and left in windmill fashion.

TAKE A DEEP BREATH HEAD-TO-KNEE EXERCISE

Sit on a straight-back chair, feet placed apart on floor, hands on knees. Now inhale deeply and then quickly bend forward from the waist, placing head between knees and pushing the air out of the lungs. Stay in this position until no more air can be expelled. Repeat a few times. This exercise restores an athlete who has completed a particularly exacting performance—such as a free skating program.

These exercises will help you to breathe right, feel vital and enjoy living. Don't go through life breathless!

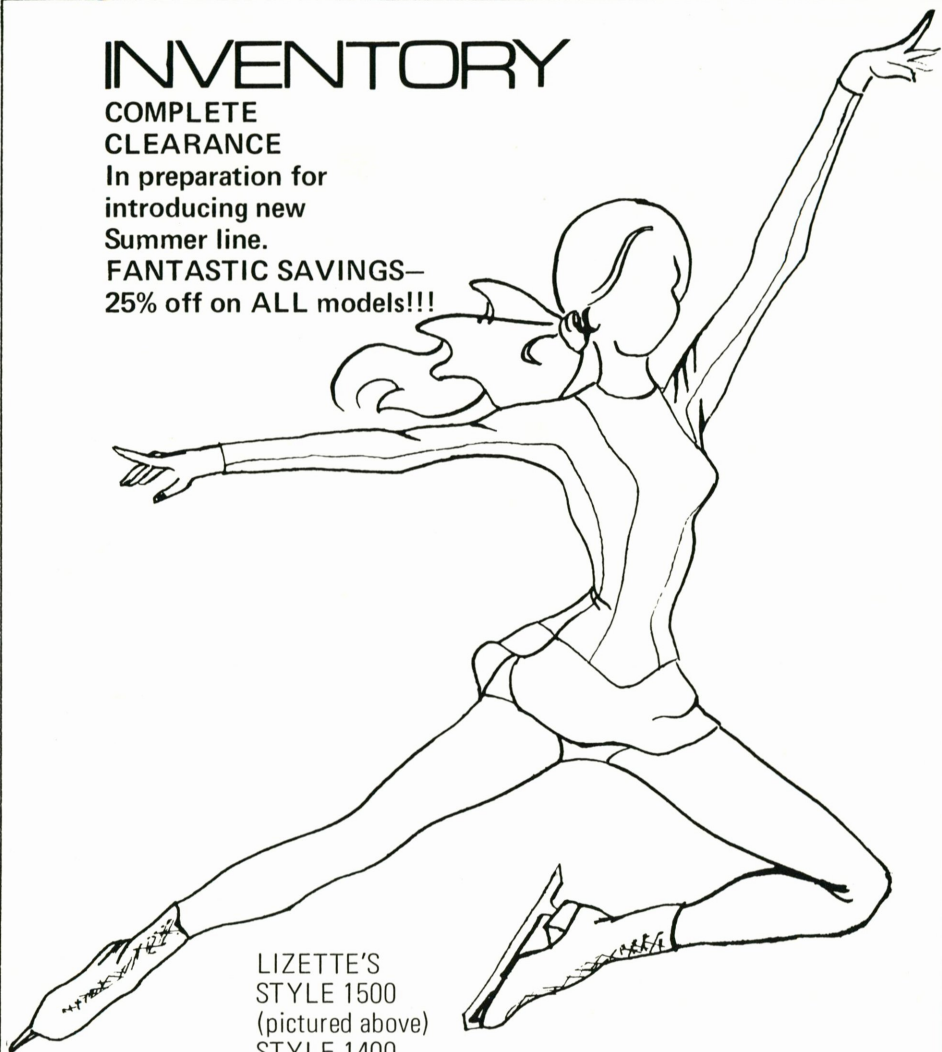
