### Readers Write

In the following letter, former World Ladies' Champion Cecilia Colledge offers her "Thoughts on Practice." We invite readers to respond to Miss Colledge or send their views on other skating topics to Readers Write c/o SKATING, Sears Crescent-Suite 500, City Hall Plaza, Boston, Mass. 02108.

Watching skaters practice at the rink, I often wonder what, if anything, is in their minds. What are they attempting to do? Are they trying to jump high and with control? Are they trying to do a fast, well-centered spin? Are they trying to skate smoothly with long, strong, silent edges, extending their free legs, pointing their toes, straightening their backs, holding their heads up? In other words, are they trying to do something beautiful? What is their goal?

Very often, to the onlooker, it would seem that skaters have nothing in their minds in the way of a final picture, not even to the extent of bringing off their "tricks" well. One watches them fling themselves in and out of movements with no thought of preparation, placement of body or control, and with a look of pain and frustration or blankness on their faces. "Let's have a bash and see if I stay on my feet" appears to be the idea, and "if I miss it, well, let's have another bash."

Surely in other fields more thought is given by the doer to the means by which the final goal may be accomplished. But in skating it would seem, for the most part, no. Over and over the same mistakes are repeated. Footwork is seldom practiced, and if it is, it is usually fumbled, smudgy and off time.

I welcome answers to my questions. When you go skating, what is your aim beyond passing the time and "having fun"? What do you hope to accomplish, but even more important, how do you hope to achieve it?—Cecilia Colledge

William E. Wardman, president of Pikes Peak FSC (now Broadmoor SC) in 1941-42 and former member of the USFSA Executive Committee, on August 2 in La Jolla, Calif.

#### **GUSTAVUS F.C. WITT**

The international skating community lost a dedicated supporter with the death of Gustavus F.C. Witt of the Netherlands on May 30. Mr. Witt served the ISU as Vice President (Figure Skating) in 1949-53, Secretary of the ISU Council in 1939-51 and Chairman of the Figure Skating Technical Committee in 1947-49. An ISU Referee, Mr. Witt officiated at the Olympic Winter Games in 1948, 1952 and 1956. He was an Honorary Member of the ISU.

#### RICHARD L. HAPGOOD

Richard L. Hapgood, who devoted 50 years of service to the USFSA and the SC of Boston. died in Gloucester, Mass., on July 31. Prior to his retirement, Mr. Hapgood, 71, was an International Judge and a National Accountant. He also served as a member of the USFSA Executive Committee for 15 years. He was Secretary of the Association from 1932 to 1940 and Chairman of the Competitions Committee from 1930-32. Dick was the first Chairman of the Sanctions Committee (formed in 1938 as Carnival and Exhibitions Sanctions), an appointment he held until 1942. For the last 25 years he served on the Board of Governors for the SC of Boston, Dick's talents were by no means limited to administrative affairs, however. In 1929 he won the National Junior Pair Championship (with Dorothy Weld) and in 1934, the National Fours Championship (with Suzanne Davis, Theresa Weld Blanchard and Frederick Goodridge).



We record with sorrow the death of Willy R. Boeckl, World Champion 1925-28, in May, 1975, in his native Austria. An engineer by profession. Mr. Boeckl was a World-level competitor for 16 years, having first won the Austrian Championship in 1913. After his fourth World victory, though, Willy left engineering to accept a teaching position with the SC of New York. Thus began the career for which he is fondly remembered here. As the mainstay of the New York club's professional staff for over two decades, the warm-hearted Austrian influenced a generation of skaters. He authored a comprehensive text, Willy Boeck! on Figure Skating, published in 1937. He also invented the Boeckl jump, sometimes called the inside Axel Paulsen for its forward inside takeoff. Willy retired to Phoenix several years ago and then, after his wife's death last year, returned to Austria, where a daughter survives him.

- 2. Persons who have made a noteworthy contribution to figure skating in a non-skating capacity through service to an amateur figure skating association and who have not been active in this category for at least a year.
- 3. Persons who have made a noteworthy contribution to figure skating as a professional.


Nominations are not limited to living persons, nor to Americans; any person filling the qualifications listed above is eligible.

The 27 electors (three from each Region) will vote on the nominees, and the first induction will take place at the USFSA Governing Council Meeting in May, 1976.

# Barbie and Ken:



real competitors



Under the watchful eye of coach Barbara Roles, Barbie Smith and Ken Newfield put in the early morning patch time so familiar to all competitors. To add some variety to their skating lives last year, Barbie and Ken passed the Bronze Pair Test together. They've never gotten around to competing as a pair, however.

Latest in the continuing series of outstanding figure skaters from Southern California is a couple of determined teenagers with the joke-provoking names of Barbie and Ken. By finishing fourth in their first times as Senior singles in Nationals last season, Barbie Smith and Ken Newfield definitely proved they're "real," however, and serious contenders for future World and Olympic Team and National title honors.

Totally different histories have brought these two "upcomers" to their present positions on the American figure skating scene. Barbie's is a classic history, reminiscent of the Carol Heiss story. She started skating at the age of six just because, like the proverbial mountain, "it was there" at a rink right in the neighborhood. Before long she was attacking skating, her mother recalls, "with typical Capricorn dedication."

Very early in the game, Barbie set up a schedule of goals for herself and, not surprisingly for such a determined young lady, she has fulfilled it pretty well to date. Her schedule led her to revive a rare competitive achievement when she won successive National Novice and Junior Ladies' titles—last attained by Carol Heiss—in 1973 and 1974. Prior to Carol's 1951-52 victories, five girls (including soon to be World Champion Tenley Albright) had won the back-to-back crowns. But figure skating's rapid growth in the ensuing two decades made a repetition of the double victory all the more difficult.

En route to the Junior title, Barbie proved that the triple Salchow holds no mystery for her. So in 1975 she scored another coup as the first woman to land two triple jumps—a triple Salchow/double loop combination and a triple toe-loop—in the U.S. Ladies' Championship.

Barbie's present goals, of course, are spots on the U.S. World and Olympic Teams and, eventually, the National Senior title. She has a special incentive to earn the U.S. Ladies' crown. Doing so will make her the first American woman since her coach Barbara Roles—and only the fifth in history—to win all three National singles titles.

Both Barbie and Ken are trained by Barbara Roles, who won her National gold medals in 1956, 1958 and 1962. Ms. Roles has coached more skaters to the past two National Championships than any other American trainer. Asked the secret of her teaching success, she replies simply, "I make them work hard." Both Barbie and Ken agree, however, that they think the most important thing she does is never to let them blame anyone but themselves if they don't reach their goals.



Favorite companion to 16-year-old Barbie, an only child, is "just a mutt" Charlie, who loves to take her for walks around their apartment grounds. The dress Barbie wears is a souvenir from South Africa, where she won the ladies' title in Skate Safari '75 last spring. This month she will represent the U.S. at the Richmond Trophy competition in England. Barbie has done some photographic modeling and once appeared as a hungry child waiting for something "lovin" from the oven" in a Pillsbury television commercial.



Ranked fourth in the U.S. Men's Championship last season, Ken collected international competition medals at Oberstdorf and St. Gervais this summer (see report. page 34). For upper body development and general strengthening, Ken lifts weights and plays tennis regularly, obviously with the same gusto he puts into his skating. Ken likes to read in his spare time and attends classes to become fluent in French, which was his favorite high school subject. He has a brother two years older serving in the U.S. Navy.

Unlike Barbie, Ken got a late start in figure skating, trying it for the first time at a friend's birthday party when he was 13 years old. He caught the fever but soon realized that he would have to make up for lost time if he wanted to compete successfully. Subsequently, he passed three figure tests—Second, Third and Fourth—in less than a year in order to compete in Novice Men in 1972. Shrugging off such an unusual achievement, Ken just grins and says, "It only took five patches a day to do it!"

Competing for the very first time at the age of 15, Ken advanced to the National Novice Men's Championship in 1972, finishing fifth. The following two years he placed fifth and second respectively in National Junior Men, and last season the Oakland arena buzzed as he finished second in figures and fourth overall in the U.S. Men's Championship.

Ken's present goals are also the World and Olympic Team, the National Senior title and—most immediately—"a terrific triple Lutz"! Chances are the jump will be in Ken's program this season. This young man, too, has a way of accomplishing what he sets out to do. O

# Remembering Jackson Haines

One hundred years ago, when Jackson Haines died in the Finnish coastal town of Kokkola, figure skating lost the acknowledged founder of modern, artistic skating. Though his technique survived and flourished as the "international style" of skating, Haines the man passed into obscurity.

The contributions of this gifted American, however, have not been forgotten. On June 23, 1975, leaders of the Finnish Figure Skating Association, the U.S. Ambassador to Finland and other officials gathered in Kokkola to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Jackson Haines's death. They held a quiet ceremony in Kokkola's cemetary, standing beneath the windswept pines that shelter the American skater's resting place. A girl and boy dressed in traditional local costumes stood honor guard beside the Finnish and American flags at graveside.

Aatos Erkko, president of the Finnish Figure Skating Association, told the gathering, "We have come to do homage to this great American champion." Mr. Erkko laid flowers at Haines's grave on behalf of the International Skating Union, the Finnish Figure Skating Association and the United States Figure Skating Association.

U.S. Ambassador Mark Evans Austad laid a wreath on behalf of the American people. He said, "I hope we can begin a commemoration for Haines in the United States." Ambassador Austad, who is on leave as vice president of Metromedia, Inc., the parent company of Ice Capades, also



laid flowers on behalf of that organization.

To commemorate the Jackson Haines centenary, the Finnish Figure Skating Association cleaned and reengraved the monuments marking the great skater's gravesite. Approximately ten years after Haines's death, a tall gray stone had been placed over the grave by a local sea captain named Nylund. Then 15 years ago the local chapter of Rotary International dedicated another marker inscribed, "In Remembrance of the American Skating King."

How Jackson Haines came to Kokkolaand many other details of his life-remains a mystery. Historians believe he was born in New York City in 1840, though the gravestone in Kokkola gives his age as 30 years at the time of his death in 1875. We do know that Haines studied music, dance and dramatic arts as a youth. When a skating craze, accompanied by a dancing craze, swept the United States in the 1860's, Haines came into the limelight. He combined skating and dancing, devising programs keyed to music and inventing many free skating moves (the sit spin was one). With the balletic and theatrical flair gained from his early studies. Haines enthralled audiences all over the eastern United States and Canada.



Haines's innovations did not find favor, though, among New Yorkers, who were devoted to the rigid tracing of figures. So in 1864 Haines crossed the Atlantic. Undismayed by a similar reception in England, he finally won acclaim on the Continent. In music-blessed Vienna especially, the master's graceful skating took root, flowering as the "international style" that formed the basis of modern-day free skating.

After 11 years of fame in Europe, the Haines history ended in Kokkola. Local records say Haines came to this isolated shipping center, 265 miles north of Helsinki, to give exhibitions. Others believe he became ill there while traveling overland from St. Petersburg to Stockholm. Though the full story may never be known, this Finnish community and the Finnish Figure Skating Association have not forgotten Jackson Haines. One hundred years later they remind us of the central role in the development of free skating played by the "American skating king."O

# Triple Crown Preview

1976 tantalizes skaters the world over with the prospect of a triple crown. The Olympics—quadrennial crown jewels of amateur sport—compound the competitive excitement of the National and World Championships. In a trio of previews, correspondent Howard Bass visits the scenes of these soon-to-begin events.

#### COLORADO SPRINGS

Hopes for future international honors will mingle with memories of championships past at the 1976 United States Figure Skating Championships in Colorado Springs, Colo., from January 7-10. The Broadmoor World Arena, scene of the World Championships just last year, will once more provide a matchless Rocky Mountain backdrop for figure skating competition.

Members of the Broadmoor Skating Club, hosts for Nationals, have demonstrated their Western hospitality time and again. They will welcome competitors and

spectators at the Broadmoor Hotel, linked to the World Arena by a lakeside terrace. Additional accommodations will be available at hotels in downtown Colorado Springs, with shuttle bus service to the arena provided. For further information, consult the inside front cover of this magazine. INNSBRUCK

In non-striking contrast to the much publicized Montreal preparations for next summer, progress has been quiet and smooth at Innsbruck, the Austrian host for the XII Olympic Winter Games on February 4-15. Despite the collapse of public support in Denver, the original choice of the International Olympic Committee, the Tyroleans never doubted the wisdom of accepting their second chance in 12 years to stage the Games.

They boast of an ability to stay within a budget markedly modest compared with Grenoble or Sapporo. The true cost of the Games should be very reasonable considering that the new Olympic village will become a housing estate, competitors' medical and catering areas will form a new school and the main press center will become a teaching academy.

Similarly, the expense of extra sports installations must be weighed against their probable lasting benefit to the city's recreation facilities. These include a new aerial tram at Axamer Lizum, where most of the alpine ski events are scheduled.

From Innsbruck railway station one can see the Bergisel ski jumping hill just over a mile away. A new iron and concrete takeoff tower has modernized this spectacular landmark, also to be used frequently in subsequent seasons. A renovated speed skating circuit, with refrigeration pipes sunk in concrete instead of the previous gravel, will give longer afteruse for the 120,000 Innsbruck citizens. It adjoins the 11,000-seat, architecturally impressive indoor Olympic Ice Stadium, congenial setting for the major figure skating and ice hockey events.

The downhill ski courses at Patscherkofel and Hoadl have been widened considerably since 1964. These runs will thus be available afterward to many more holiday skiers. The cross-country ski trails at

Seefeld also have been widened to allow machine maintenance and greater public use after the Games. Cross-country skiing is now booming in the Alps.

Despite earlier talk of reducing the size of the Winter Olympics, two new events are being added—ice dancing and the 1,000-meter race in men's speed skating. Both will use existing facilities and sell more admission tickets.

Revenue expected from television, commemorative coins and special postage stamps has been allowed for when assessing a possible overall loss of around \$16 million. But the worldwide publicity may offset this quickly through increased tourist trade in subsequent years.

During the Olympic fortnight more than half a million visitors will be attracted to this picturesque Tyrolean area on the route to the famed Brenner Pass. Those fortunate enough to attend will especially


A four-day feast of skating views and news unfolded in Boston this summer at the first joint convention of the Professional Skaters Guild of America and the Professional Skating Association of Canada. From June 6-9, leading instructors and amateurs of North America and Europe initiated a lively dialogue ranging from the treatment of injuries to free skating choreography. Convention attendees met at the Sheraton Boston Hotel for lectures and discussions, then held an on-ice clinic at the Charles River Ice Skating Center.

Dr. Tenley Albright, an Olympic gold medalist in 1956 and a Boston surgeon today, reported on sports medicine. As a member of the Olympic Medical Advisory Committee, she knows that doctors are becoming more aware of skaters' needs. Guest speaker Erich Zeller, trainer of World com-

petitors in West Germany, described the advanced state of sports medicine in his country.

Also from Europe came Jacques Gerschwiler, the Swiss master of compulsory figures. During the ice session, the 76-year-old gentleman proved he can trace a figure or teach others his technique with equal finesse. Mr. Gerschwiler's recollections of his 50 years plus as a figure skater and trainer of World Champions enriched this convention considerably.

The enthusiasm Mr. Gerschwiler brought to school figures was matched by Gustave Lussi in the free skating clinic. There to demonstrate Mr. Lussi's points was 1962 World Champion Don Jackson.

Practicing ice dance elements under the guidance of the top Canadian and U.S. instructors; Sheldon Galbraith discussing the contemporary approach to school figures; Ron Ludington and Kerry Leitch lecturing on pair skating, and a free dance forum brought the Saturday session to a close.

Amateur skaters took part in the proceedings from time to time. USFSA President Benjamin T. Wright addressed one session of the convention, and members of the Charles River Skating Club formed a hospitality committee for the clinic held at the rink.

Participants praised this first joint PSGA-PSAC convention for the variety of topics covered and the exchange of ideas generated. O







# ISU Congress

ISU Representative

The 36th biennial Congress of the International Skating Union and ISU Council meetings were held in Munich June 9-14, 1975. Officials of the Deutsche Eislauf-Union and Deutscher Eissport-Verband amiably hosted delegates from 31 ISU Member associations. Four other Members were represented by proxies. I thought this Congress the best and least political I have ever attended. The decisions were progressive, and the delegates covered the many proposals in a friendly, constructive manner. This report will summarize those decisions of particular interest to the USFSA. (All rule changes that will affect USFSA skaters have been incorporated in the 1976-77 USFSA Rulebook, which should be consulted for specific information.) The effective date of ISU rule changes is December 1, 1975 (the effective date of the 1975 Constitution and Regulations), unless otherwise stated.

#### **General Regulations**

The Amateur and Reinstatement Rules were revised, deleting the provision that a person who has "signed a contract to practice or teach skating for gain" is a non-amateur.

ISU Junior Championships for Men, Ladies, Pairs and Dance were approved on a two-year trial basis. If successful, these will become the World Junior Championships. The first trial event will be held in March, 1976, in Megeve, France.

The ISU defines a Junior as a singles skater who is not older than age 16, or a pair or dance couple neither of whom is older than age 18, on the July 1st preceding the championships. Further, a skater who has competed in the European or World Championships, the Olympic Winter Games, or who has placed among the first three in an international Senior competition may not compete as a Junior.

The rules governing citizenship of competitors will be redrafted to provide, generally, that skaters who hold dual citizenship must select the Association they wish to represent the first time they skate internationally.

#### Special Regulations for Figure Skating

Several required elements in the pair short program groups were changed to eliminate duplication. Remarks on the new elements and additional remarks on some singles short program elements have been included in the 1976-77 USFSA Rulebook.

A new method of judging the singles and pair short programs was adopted. Two marks, one for "required elements" (height of jumps, control and speed of spins, etc.) and one for "presentation" of the program (harmonious composition, originality, use of ice surface, etc.), will be awarded. For every failure or omission of a required element, deductions must be made only from the first mark according to a specified approximate scale of values, since there is no direct relationship between the two marks. However, deductions must be made from the second

# the Olympic picture

Every four years, in the valley of Olympia in Thessaly, the ancient Greeks held a festival dedicated to the god Zeus. Included in these festivals were exhibitions of achievement in music and literature, athletic contests and tests of courage, strength and skill. The four-year intervals between festivals were called "Olympiads" and were numbered to mark the passage of time. These ancient games, which can be traced back to 776 B.C., flourished for over a thousand years. They were abolished in the year 394 A.D. by decree of Emporer Theodosius.

The modern revival of the games was the result of one man's belief that bringing the youth of the world together for friendly competition in amateur sport would be a powerful means of improving international understanding. Baron Pierre de Coubertin of France worked for the acceptance of his dream, and in 1896 he saw the first Olympic Games in the modern era take place in Athens, Greece.

Although competitions in figure skating were held in conjunction with the IV Olympic Games of the modern era in London in 1908 and again in Antwerp in 1920, not until 1924 were winter sports included officially in the Olympic program. That year the "summer games," the Games of the VIII Olympiad, were held in Paris, and the "winter games," the I Olympic Winter Games, were held in Chamonix, France. Competitors from 18 countries vied in Chamonix for medals in figure skating, speed skating, ski jumping, bobsled, curling and hockey. Among the figure skaters from 11 countries who took part in these first Winter Games ranked many who would make lasting contributions to the sport: Gillis Grafström, Willy Boeckl, Andree Joly & Pierre Brunet, Mr. & Mrs. T.D. Richardson, Canadian Melville Rogers, Americans Beatrix Loughran, Theresa Weld Blanchard and Nathaniel Niles, and 11-year-old Sonja Henie (who placed eighth, last in the ladies' event).

The opening ceremonies of the XII Olympic Winter Games will take place on February 4, 1976, in Innsbruck, Austria. As in every previous Games, there will be a United States Figure Skating Team. With ice dancing scheduled for the very first time, our team may consist of as many as 20 athletes and officials, all of whom must be transported to Innsbruck and housed, clothed and fed while there. This will be an expensive undertaking. While it is the responsibility of the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) to raise the needed money, we in figure skating have always contributed our share, and we hope to do so this time.

Boston's historic Freedom Trail passes just outside the front door of the USFSA Central Office. Inside is a bit of history of our own—the USFSA Museum, Library and Figure Skating Hall of Fame.

A substantial part of the Museum's collections are the trophies and medals through which the history of competitive skating may be traced. They vary as much in form and design as the skating styles that were used to win them. The names engraved on them rank among the greatest in figure skating annals.


We have a complete set of the commemorative medals of the Olympic Winter Games, gathered through the efforts of USFSA President Benjamin T. Wright, museum curator, who is largely responsible for the establishment of the Museum. There is a collection of badges from three-time Olympic Champion Gillis Grafström of Sweden, donated by his widow Mrs.

Cécile Grafström, and a display of skating pins from many countries.

All of these badges, medals and trophies are housed in display cases in the Museum proper. Along one wall will be the USFSA Figure Skating Hall of Fame with awards and pictures of those installed, beginning next May. (Please see the nominating form on page 16.) There will also be a Presidents' Corner with pictures and biographical information about the 18 men who have held this office in the USFSA.



Works of art depicting skating scenes also feature prominently among the wall displays. The long-time affinity between artists and skaters is reflected in the Museum's paintings, prints and porcelains, notably in works donated from the collections of Joel B. Liberman and Charles A. McCarthy.

The Library contains many of the known books written about figure skating. some of them rare and valuable and some that have been restored. Decades of skating achievement are chronicled in pamphlets and periodicals in both English and foreign languages, and two complete, bound sets of SKATING, all of which are fascinating to peruse. There are also complete sets of USFSA Rulebooks, minutes of Executive Committee and Governing Council Meetings and programs and profrom competitions-Regional through Olympic. We are missing some of the programs but hope to fill in the gaps.

In addition to a reference section in the Library, all Library and Museum materials are catalogued, including original manuscripts and correspondence among skating greats such as Sonja Henie, Maribel Vinson Owen, T.D. Richardson, Robert Dench, Ulrich Salchow and others.

The complete collection of T.D. Richardson works, donated by his widow Mrs. Mildred (Allingham) Richardson of London, gives us a unique insight into the world of international figure skating over a 50-year span, including the first World Championship to be held in England in 1898. In addition to his books and profuse correspondence, we have the fruits of Mr. Richardson's work as international correspondent on winter sports for several London-based periodicals and newspapers. His fabulous picture collection, now mounted in albums, includes early photos of Sonja Henie, Karl Schaefer, Gillis Grafström, Cecilia Colledge and Megan Taylor, as well as other world champions.

Visitors will also enjoy poring over the scrapbooks and photo albums donated by Mrs. Harold Storke, Theodore G. Patterson, the Estate of Gretchen Merrill and others. Or you can arrange to view the 16mm films of National and World Cham-

pionships past and present.

We are forming a collection of materials pertinent to the air disaster that struck our 1961 World Team. It includes news clippings, photographs and telegrams, some of which express condolences in beautiful poetry. We are also building a collection which will depict the evolution of the figure skate, though the display still has missing elements.

The Museum is part of the USFSA Memorial Fund, established in 1961 as a living memorial to the members of the 1961 World Team, who lost their lives in a plane crash while en route to the World Figure Skating Championships. The Memorial Fund is recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a charitable organization. Thus, donations to the Museum of either cash or items of historical or fine arts value are deductible for income tax purposes to the extent permitted by the Internal Revenue Service.

Memorabilia to be donated should be offered by letter to the Chairman of the Museum Committee, Theodore M. Buck. The letter should describe the proposed item and all the pertinent facts known about it and should specify any terms that are to apply, such as donation or loan. Upon acceptance by the Committee, the item should be sent to the Museum.

The Museum, which had its beginnings in Colorado Springs, moved to the Skating Club of Boston in 1971. There a satellite collection remains on display. Under the chairmanship of Mr. Buck, the need for more spacious and accessible quarters was perceived, and these requirements are met very well by the USFSA suite in the Sears Crescent. This distinctive red brick building, built in 1841, has been restored in a manner that is at once compatible with modern office needs and representative of the charming architectural style of its era. The public is welcome to visit during regular office hours, Monday through Friday, 8:30 A.M. to 4:30 P.M. When you come, you are sure to be greeted by Mrs. Jean C. Winder, the Assistant Secretary of the USFSA, who will invite you to sign the guest book and enjoy vour stay. O

# Oberstdorf & St. Gervais

The American team selected to compete for the Nebelhorn Trophy in Oberstdorf, West Germany, and the Grand Prix of St. Gervais, France, met in New York on August 11.

After the 747 flight to Munich, Team Leader Norman Fuller instigated a three-minute train change that included all 15 members of the group and their baggage! Safely aboard, the group proceeded to Oberstdorf, which is nestled in the Bavarian Alps and is a favorite resort of the German people. The international scope of this and the later event in St. Gervais grew this year, with Russian, Romanian and Japanese skaters participating for the first time. Referees were also present from Hungary and East Germany.

Ken Newfield led off the men's event with a huge lead in figures over Harald Kuhn and Gert-Walter Graebner, both of West Germany. After the short program Ken still held the lead, while Ted Barton of Canada pulled up to second. In free skating Ken had bad luck, missing his opening triple jump and double Axel. That was all Ted Barton needed to overtake Ken and win by .12 of a point.

In the ladies' contest, Lisa-Marie Allen finished the compulsory figures in third place behind Petra Wagner and Dagmar Lurz, both of West Germany. Lisa won the short program and later performed a brilliant free skating program to take the lead by four and a half points.

Alice Cook, with her lovely smile, and Bill Fauver placed second in the pairs' short program and lost to Cherri and Dennis Pinner of Canada by only .27 of a point after the free skating was completed.

Susie Kelley and Andy Stroukoff skated their compulsory dances well, placing fourth behind Wighton/Dowding of Canada, Zueva/Vitman of the USSR and Garanina/Zavozin of the USSR. After the free dancing the American couple was still in fourth place. Susie twisted her knee before the exhibitions and was unable to skate that day. The Russian dancers were the hit of these exhibitions.

After a very successful competition in Oberstdorf, the U.S. and Canadian teams boarded a bus that left the Bavarian Alps and took them across part of Austria and Switzerland into the French Alps to St. Gervais, which is situated at the foot of Mt. Blanc. This rink is open at two ends, and the competition was stopped once when heavy rain on the roof made it impossible to hear the music.

Ken Newfield took another lead in figures, although he did not do as well as he had done in Oberstdorf. He was followed this time by Ted Barton. Ted won the short program. Even though he was third in the short, Ken held his lead from figures through this segment and the free skating. He topped Barton by .56 of a point to win.

In ladies, Emi Watanabe of Japan took the lead in figures and short program, followed by Lisa-Marie Allen and Danielle Rieder of Switzerland. Lisa opened her free skating program with a triple Salchow followed by two double Axels to overtake Emi by over a point and a half for the final result.

Bill Fauver failed to complete his double loop in the pairs' short program, which put the U.S. pair in third place after the compulsory. Alice and Bill gave an excellent performance of their free program, however, to pull up to second place overall.

There was no dance competition in St. Gervais, but the U.S. and Canadian dance couples teamed up to present a fun program, which was a highlight of the exhibi-

mark for failures if the harmonious and artistic aspects of the program are involved. These new guidelines took effect July 1, 1975.

#### Competitions

For singles competitions, the value of compulsory figures was changed from 40% to 30%, short program remains 20%, and free skating was changed from 40% to 50%. The new divisor for figure mark totals and for short program mark totals is 2.5.

#### **Judges**

New rules for appointment of International Judges will necessitate attendance at a national (USFSA sanctioned) judging school at least once during the three-year experience period. Nominees for promotion to World Championship Judge must attend such judging schools twice during the three-year period. The international judging experience required of these nominees must have been in a competition with competitors from at least four ISU Members.

Further requirements for the continuation of judging status were adopted in principle, to begin after the 1977 ISU Congress. In general terms, new nominees as Championship Judges shall attend an ISU-organized judges' seminar (one will be held in North America) and shall pass written and practical (on ice) examinations during the three-year period prior to nomination. Judges already on the Championship list must have acted satisfactorily as Judges or Referee in ISU Championships or international competitions during the three years before their annual renomination; otherwise, they must fulfill the requirements for new nominees.

The three proposed new compulsory dances —Yankee Polka, Ravensburger Waltz and Tango Romantica—were accepted. Diagrams and descriptions of these have been included in the 1976-77 USFSA Rulebook.

Various rule changes now specify that dance couples who skate more than the maximum seven introductory steps permitted in compulsory and original set-pattern dances must be penalized. Similarly, excessive posing before, during the introductory steps or at the close of any dance, including free dance, must be penalized.

The use of vocal music in OSP and free dance was prohibited. But the free dance rules were altered to permit all types of music, including classical ballet, folk and contemporary, providing it is suitable for ice dancing. Ballet skating to interpret ballet music, however, is more characteristic of pair skating than ice dancing and must be penalized. Further, partners skating in separated or hand-in-hand positions, side by side, shadow or mirror skating, if done to excess, must be penalized.

admire the Bergisel ski jump and the ice stadium with adjacent speed oval, one of the world's largest artificially refrigerated surfaces. The ice complex consists of the main covered arena and an adjoining outdoor speed circuit in the center of which are two practice rinks. A second covered rink in another part of the city will be used for some of the figure training and secondary ice hockey games.

But, as in 1964, it is in the bowl of the Bergisel jump within the city boundary that the colorful and emotional Olympic opening ceremony will be performed. Accommodation has been installed in the pear-shaped ampitheatre at Bergisel for 60,000 spectators and, thanks to television coverage, this and many individual events may be seen by the largest-ever audience for any winter sports program.

#### GOTHENBURG

"Goddag, Var sa god." That is how the Swedes of Gothenburg will greet visitors to the World Figure Skating Championships on March 2-7. It means: "How do you do. You're welcome."

This will be the 66th Men's Championship, the 56th Ladies', the 54th for Pairs and the 24th in Ice Dancing. It is the first world meeting to be hosted by Sweden since 1947, when Stockholm was venue for a seventh time.

The Svenska Konstakningsforbundet, the

Swedish figure skating association, was a popular choice to host Worlds after its successful handling of the 1972 European Championships, also in Gothenburg.

The 1976 contest will take place in the splendid Scandinavium, the largest indoor arena in northern Europe. This circular, architecturally magnificent structure, which opened in May, 1971, has a suspension roof 360 feet in diameter and is endowed with the latest air conditioning, lighting and sound equipment. It seats 12,300 and, with additional standing room, has a capacity of 14,000. The Scandinavium—a word derived from Scandinavia and stadium—is conveniently located in the heart of the city, close to the major hotels and shopping centers.

Gothenburg, an extensive metropolis of 700,000 inhabitants, is the principal port for all Scandinavian countries, centrally located between the capital cities of Stockholm, Copenhagen and Oslo. The second largest city in Sweden, Gothenburg was founded in 1621. Its cultural heart is Götaplatsen, where Carl Milles's giant bronze statue of the sea-god Poseidon dominates the 19th century Kungsports Avenue of linden trees.

The Worlds organizing committee is busy completing preparations for the many visitors expected. Tickets or more information may be obtained by writing to: World Championships in Figure Skating, P.O. Box 5225, S-402 24, Gothenburg, Sweden. O


