

Inasmuch as all of us who like to take deep edges and do spread eagles have found that the inner part of our boots start wearing off, I have found a way that this can be prevented. Just buy some mending tape, plastic or vinyl tape from a stationary store, and put it over those parts of the instep on the boots that might otherwise be rubbed off. They can easily be painted white and they prevent wear of the skating boot. I have found this method very useful. Have a happy skate.

## Club Notes

The 11th Annual I.S.U. Exhibition Tour (1977 World Tour) will be held in Japan after the 1977 World Figure Skating Championships in Tokyo. There will be ten exhibitions held in five cities in Japan.

An International Seminar on Recreational and Therapeutic Ice Skating will be held March 18 and 19 at the Pennsylvania State University [see Calendar for additional information]. The seminar is designed for people actively involved in ice skating, adaptive sports, sports medicine and organizations working with the handicapped

The methods suggested should aid the teaching of ice skills to the handicapped. It may also be used as a form of physical therapy by those working with special groups, such as the mentally retarded, the physically handicapped, the aged and those recuperating from ailments or accidents, with a physician's approval.

The seminar costs \$40.00. This includes the registration fee, cost of materials, note book, pencil, coffee breaks and participation certificates.

The program is a continuing education service of the Pennsylvania State University and is sponsored by the International Council on Therapeutic Ice Skating (ICOTIS) and supported by the USFSA.

# Ice Abroad

Great Britain: Barbie Smith, last year's Californian runner-up, went one better at Richmond Ice Rink on November 1, winning the 28th Richmond Trophy International Women's Competition after a pulsating duel with the American-based Italian Susan Driano.

Third was the greatly improved young Canadian, Heather Kemkaran. The only previous U.S. victory was in 1972, by the present World and Olympic Champion, Dorothy Hamill.

Barbie Smith, a 17-year-old from Los Angeles, spent much of last season on the sidelines because of a stress fracture in her right leg as well as an ulcerated stomach. Barbie's brilliant free program brought her the final victory, and put her back into contention for a place on the U.S. World team this season. She opened with a confident triple Salchow and double Axel, recovered coolly from an insecure landing on her second double Axel and did the best layback spin of the evening. Two Russian splits and a butterfly jump made a rousing conclusion, and brought her a great ovation from the crowd. The judges were almost equally enthusiastic, awarding nine 5.6's and five 5.5's.

Susan Driano fell attempting a triple Salchow and looked tired when falling again at the end of a double Axel in an otherwise very talented display. Heather Kemkaran brilliantly combined triple and double toe-loop jumps.

The other Los Angeles entry, tall and attractive Lisa Marie Allen showed that she is also a first-class skater; she was fourth on points in the Rockers, and she beat everyone except Miss Smith on the RFO Loop-change-loops. She had a sad lapse on the brackets, however, completely running out of speed a quarter-circle away from the center on one tracing. She was thirteenth on that figure—a costly error, for she would otherwise probably have finished third in the overall results.

Too many visably tired contenders were showing how some of their skills can be wasted without the required degree of physical fitness. Even Barbie, looking a little heavier than last year, should be more weight conscious to maintain elevation in those spectacular leaps.

Britain, the host country, offered no meaningful challenge but her two eager representatives, Tracey Solomons and Phyllida Beck showed heartening promise but were thrown too early into the deep end because the nation's best were not available.

The dynamic Karena Richardson was busy collecting a well-earned silver medal at the over-

lapping Skate Canada in Ottawa, Yvonne Kavanagh could also have been in with a chance but a sprained foot caused her late withdrawal. Skate Canada's George Blundun said that clashes of international meets will be avoided in the future.

The event was a triumph for the famous Italian-born trainer Carlo Fassi, who teaches all three of the top prize-winners as well as several of the other competitors. Miss Smith is the third of his pupils to win the Trophy, the others being Sandra Brugnera in 1963 and Olympic Champion Dorothy Hamill in 1972.

Australia: The 1976 Australian Figure Skating Championships were held in Brisbane, the capital city of Queensland, A record 68 competitors from New South Wales (N.S.W.), Queensland, South Australia and Victoria took part. There were also skaters from New Zealand.

The Novice Ladies started the championships with Colleen Jamieson (N.S.W.) first, Kerren Quinlan (Victoria) second and Cathy Taylor (Victoria) third. Colleen won both the figure and free skating sections of the event.

Glen Neate (Victoria) won the Novice Men's event. Peter Lynch (N.S.W.) was second and Mark Basto (Victoria) was third.

The next event was Novice Pairs, won by Eve and George Fabian (Victoria), second was Sharon and Christopher Pet (N.S.W.) and third was Amanda Kinna and Mark Hochman (Victoria). The youngest competitor was 6-year-old Danielle Carr, who skated with her brother Stephen, and finished fifth.

Next were the Junior Ladies. Men and Ice Dancing. There was a close contest in the Junior Ladies but Julie Hill (Victoria) won, Close behind were Vicki Holland (N.S.W.) and Marcelle Byrne (Queensland). All three girls are very strong skaters. Michael Pasfield (N.S.W.) won the Junior Men's title with Russell Marshall second and Marko Yovich (both from Victoria) third. Michael won all three sections of this event. Ann and Alan Brennock placed first in the Junior Ice Dance with Kerren Quinlan and Peter Hartshorn (Victoria) second, and Fran-

cesa and Paul Baulch (N.S.W.) placing third. As Ann and Alan are from New Zealand the title was passed to Kerren and Peter.

The final events were Senior Ladies, Men's and Pairs. Senior Ladies was won by Robyn Burley (Victoria), second was Belinda Coulthard (N.S.W.) and third was Lyndal Hicks (Victoria). Robyn won all sections and was a worthy successor to the former Champion, her sister, Sharon. Two skaters competed in the Senior Men's Event with Billy Schover (Victoria) winning and Brian Meek (N.S.W.) was second. The final event was the Senior Pairs in which Elizabeth and Peter Cain (N.S.W.) gave a performance of increasingly mature and difficult movements to take out the title for the second year.

At the awards presentation skaters selected to represent Australian I.S.U. Championships in 1977 were announced: I.S.U. Juniors-Vicki Holland, Marcelle Byrne and Michael Pasfield: Worlds-Robyn Burley, Billy Schober and Elizabeth and Peter Cain. -Susan Judd


# Skate Canada 1976

Skate Canada 76, North America's only international invitational figure skating competition, held at Ottawa's Civic Centre Oct. 28-31, highlighted a Cinderella story, provided the opportunity to see the classical beauty of World and Olympic pair champions, Rodnina and Zaitsev, and previewed the men's competition to be held at the World Championships in Tokyo in March.

Kim Alletson, runner-up to Canadian ladies' champion Lynne Nightingale, became the hometown heroine when she won the ladies overall title, as well as the free skating final, which required a strong comeback from a costly fall that marred her short program. After a strong second place finish in the compulsory figures, Alletson appeared nervous early in the short program and fell backwards into the boards. Although she completed the seven required elements, she fell to third place and faced a long climb back to the top.

By luck of the draw Alletson pulled the final skating position in the long program and used it to her advantage. Skating a technically strong and artistically impressive program, Alletson overtook Britain's Karena Richardson, West Germany's Garnet Ostermeier, and Karen De Angelo,

the American leader up to the final event to win the gold.

Interestingly, more of the younger women in the competition were attempting triple jumps than ever before as well as more difficult combinations, which will ultimately make for a more exciting women's competition. But judging from the performances at Skate Canada, the women's competition at this year's World's may well be lacklustre.

The real promise—and perhaps danger—comes from three relatively unknown youngsters.

Switzerland's 13-year-old Denise Beillman, Austria's Claudia Kristofics-Binder and Canada's 15-year-old Carolyn Skoczen, who placed fifth, seventh and 10th overall respectively, all do three triples and tough combinations.

Denise, a long-legged pixie, was the free-skating star, winning the short program and coming second in the long to wrap up the combined free skating title. More athletic than graceful at this stage, she is a phenomenal jumper—for either sex with three triple jumps, including a triple Lutz at her command. Few men can perform the triple Lutz, the jump pioneered by Don Jackson in 1962. Toller Cranston did not do it nor does Shaver. Only 1976 Canadian Junior Champion Vern Taylor, who placed eighth, and Japan's Mitsuru Matsumura, a promising skater who placed seventh, even tried the

jump in the free-skating final. Neither Denise nor the two men, however, landed their attempts.

The Swiss girl also has a breathtaking spin, in which she holds her free leg completely over her head, first with one hand, then with both.

Unfortunately, unlike former Skate Canada's, the American contingent almost failed to reach medal standings in any event. Only David Santee's long free program was able to eek out a bronze medal for the American team. The highest ranked man in the competition (having placed fifth at World's), David overcame a disasterous short program and skated his way to third place in the final and overall standings-just edging Russia's Igor Bobrin, who accumulated more points but failed to win a majority of third placings from the judges.

A strong jumper, with four triples, and a triple Axel almost under control, Santee's final was marred by errors and muffed landings.

Still, considering that he skated the whole five minutes with one skate lace untied, it is a miracle he stayed upright.

Actually, Bobrin was the most interesting man from an interpretive point of view. A free spirit who accents his modern style with "futuristic" sounding music, he would be a real threat if his program had more technical content. The lean Russian does a most unusual skating move -a horizontal body roll that boggles the mind.

Britain's Robin Cousins, whose free skating final was a disappointment after his outstanding short one, was second in both the final and overall competition.

Canadian Ron Shaver displaying the dynamic form of a potential World champion won the men's event, skating the same long program with which he won the free skating final at last year's Skate Canada in Edmonton.



# Hall of Fame SCRAPBOOK




**Jackson Haines** 

Known as "The American Skating King", Jackson Haines is almost a legendary and mysterious figure, whose life and career present many unanswered questions. There is no doubt, however, that he founded modern figure skating through his demonstrations and promotion of the international style during a brief and suddenly successful exhibition career in Europe in the late 1860's and early 1870's. Born in New York City in 1840, Haines became an outstanding competitor in the New York area in the American style, culminating with his winning of the

Championship of America in 1863 and 1864. Leaving the United States for reasons unknown shortly thereafter, but allegedly because his style of skating to music was not accepted in America, Haines appeared in Europe giving exhibitions in the new style, resulting in an outstanding success in Vienna in 1868, which actually established the school of skating so well exemplified by the Austrians in international competitions beginning in the 1890's and continuing through today.

Haines, best known for the sit spin bearing his name, continued his exhibition career, ultimately reaching Scandinavia and Finland, where he unexpectedly died in Kokkola in 1875, then known as Gamla-Karleby, although the actual date of his death is uncertain. Through the courtesy of the Finnish Skating Association, his grave has been newly cared for and the marker restored. The one hundredth anniversary of his death was duly commemorated in 1976 by the President of the Finnish Association and the United States Ambassador to Finland. Haines is not survived by any direct descendants, his only known relative being his great niece, Mrs. Ann Robinson Adair of New Haven, Connecticut, herself a former United States Novice Ladies Champion and now a figure skating teacher.



#### **Irving Brokaw**

Both as a skater and author, Irving Brokaw did much to introduce and promote within North America the so-called "International style" or modern form of figure skating known and practiced today. Originally demonstrated during the 1860's and 1870's in Europe by Jackson Haines (to whom Brokaw was a worthy successor), the international style did not reappear in America until after 1900, largely through the efforts of George H. Browne of Cambridge, Massachusetts and Brokaw. These two men travelled to Europe, studied the new style, skated it themselves, wrote about it and promoted its acceptance at home. Brokaw himself uniquely reflected the transition from the formal, rigid American style to the new free moving, flexible international style with

free skating to music. From an old and socially prominent family in New York City, Brokaw became interested in skating after seeing an exhibition at the old St. Nicholas rink in New York when he was a senior at Princeton in 1893. He became Champion of America, as the title was then known, in 1906 and was the first American competitor in figure skating in the Olympic Games in London in 1908, placing sixth in the men's event.

Under the sponsorship of Mr. Browne and the Cambridge Skating Club, he participated in the first formal exhibition of the international style in the United States in Cambridge in 1908. Although his active career as a competitor was before the USFSA and the United States Championships were formally inaugurated in 1914, Brokaw did win the United States Fourteenstep title with Mrs. Gertrude Cheever Porter in 1920. He then continued as an active skater in The Skating Club of New York and its major carnivals for the rest of his life. He also served as a judge in the early years of the National Championships.

A prolific author, Brokaw's *The Art of Skating* went through many editions, including an early and now extremely rare paperback in the Spalding's Athletic Library, and it is still relevant today to the interested student of the sport. He was also an amateur artist of some skill and his painting "Skating Girl" is in the Luxembourg Gallery in Paris. Brokaw also did much to develop the form of club carnivals which were so popular during the 1920's and 1930's and were the forerunners of the touring professional ice shows of today.

He was elected an Honorary President of the USFSA in 1932 in recognition of his contributions to the sport, continuing in that capacity until his death in 1939 at the age of 69. In 1941, his three daughters presented a magnificent trophy in his memory for the United States Junior Championships for Men, which is still in competition today, an appropriate memorial to one of the founders of modern figure skating. He is survived by his daughter Lucille and seven grandchildren.

#### **Axel Paulsen**

Remembered in his native Norway as a pioneering speed skater, Axel Paulsen could well be considered as the "universal" skater, because he was equally competent in speed and figure skating, actively competing in speed skating before the inauguration of the speed skating World Championship in 1889. Paulsen won the first international competition in speed skating at Hamburg, Germany in 1885 and again in 1886.

In collaboration with another Norwe-

gian speed skater, Carl Werner about 1880, he constructed a radically new racing skate screwed to the boot, as was originally done with the figure skate by Jackson Haines. The new skate was complete departure from those then in use, being lighter and having a stronger attachment to the shoe. Its tubular design was the model for both the modern speed and hockey skates.

As a figure skater, Paulsen competed in an international competition in Vienna in 1882, placing third behind Leopold Frey, a protege of Haines and Edward Engelmann, who later was the European Champion from 1892 to 1894. It was in this competition that Paulsen introduced the famous jump which has immortalized his name. He toured widely throughout Europe and also visited Canada and the United States giving exhibitions in figure skating and competing in match races in speed skating. During the 1880's, Paulsen held many of the recognized world records for speed skating at distances from 1,500 to 15,000 meters. His active career as a skater had come to an end by 1890 and the date of his death is unknown. There are no known survivors.

Now it's time to nominate your candidates for the USFSA Figure Skating Hall of Fame. Any person may participate, using the nominating form printed below or obtaining a copy from the USFSA Central Office (please enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope with request). You may submit one nominating form per year. Up to 10 nominations may be made, from any or all of the following categories:

- Skaters from throughout the world who have compiled outstanding competitive records or who have made notable contributions in style or technique, and who have been retired from competitive skating for at least five years;
- Persons who have made noteworthy contributions to figure skating in a non-skating capacity through service to an amateur figure skating association and who have not been active in this category for at least a year;
- 3) Persons who have made noteworthy contributions to figure skating as professionals. Nominations are not limited to living persons, nor to Americans; any person filling the qualifications listed above is eligible.

The 27 electors (three from each Region) will vote on the nominees, and the next induction to The Hall of Fame will take place at the USFSA Governing Council Meeting in May, 1977.

# TO SMOOTH TEST SESSIONS

A skater goes to a test to be tested. A judge goes to a test to judge the skater. The test chairman plans the tests the skater will take and makes sure the judges judge. This sounds very simple but may become confused if skaters, judges and chairmen don't work together. The Inter-Club Council of New England recently published "Tips to Test Chairmen" and "Tips to Trial Judges" and we reprint them here to help avoid confusion and make test sessions easier for all concerned.

#### TIPS TO TEST CHAIRMEN:

1. Line up your judges well in advance of the test dates. It is useful if you know the level of the tests you will have. An early cutoff date will help you to do this. Be sure you have judges of the right levels.

2. Send the judges a postcard as a reminder. If you do this, your chances of getting a cancellation are much slimmer. It also helps to keep dates, times and locations clear in the minds of your judges.

3. Most clubs require payment of test fees with the application. They do not make refunds unless they have to cancel the test. People are less likely to drop out if they understand this.

4. Plan the test session. You will need an announcer and someone in charge of music for dance or free style tests. These should be knowledgeable, dependable peo-

ple. You will also need at least one person to take care of hospitality. Someone has to be in charge of clerical tasks, such as posting results or handling test sheets and trial judges' sheets. You may be able to do these things yourself if you have a small test; but for a large test with two or three panels, several trial judges or a lot of tests, you will appreciate help.

5. Music. For dance tests, be sure to have two or more suitable records for each dance test scheduled. For these tests you will want records that have a discernable beat. Generally music that skaters are likely to know.

6. The judges will select the judge-incharge (usually from among themselves, although a relief judge may be used). Once chosen, this person will be in charge of the conduct of the tests. It will be necessary for you, as test chairman, to verify the results-check (or recheck) the addition and determine "pass" or "fail" for each test and see that the results are made known. Usually they are posted, listing those who passed with the test(s) passed. You will need to see that the candidate, parents and the instructor (and they alone) have a chance to look at the test sheets at the proper time. This is usually done at the conclusion of all the tests, or may also be done during a natural break, such as resurfacing or during a general

warmup. You will have to collect all sheets that have been given out in order to complete the required forms for reporting. It is also the duty of the test chairman to handle any dealings with rink management or personnel.

The order in which tests are taken is generally left to you to decide. It may depend upon the availability of your judges or of other persons. Some clubs prefer to use the best ice for high tests, though these may be held after resurfacing.

7. Be familiar with the rules concerning trial judging. It is here that you will appreciate your added clerical help. A report on trial judging must be filed and the sheets returned to the home club of the trial judge. For figure tests, there may be only three trial judges per test, but the only limit for dance, pairs, singles or free style tests is your willingness to handle or assign the clerical tasks.

#### TIPS TO TRIAL JUDGES:

- 1. Get to the test early and write in the names of the test candidates. Use your own test sheets. Your club can supply them, or you can get them from the Central Office.
- 2. If you are making your trial sheets on a copy machine, it is a good idea to fill in as much of the heading as you can on the original so you will not need to do this at the time of the tests.
- 3. Bring a piece of carbon paper and make a second trial sheet for yourself, for your own records. You can not have the carbon signed and all your own sheets will be collected.
- 4. Make comments on each test as though you were an official judge. Then read them back as you get the time to see how they would sound to you if you were a candidate reading them. Do they offer helpful suggestions? Are they criticisms of the main errors, or are they picayune? Have you written some positive comments if they were deserved?
- 5. Read the comments of the official judges to see how they align with yours. If you often have the same comments but disagree on marks or results, then you ought to reconsider your standards.

- 6. It is good practice to bring a stamped envelope addressed to your test chairman. It will make it easier for him to return your sheets to your club.
- 7. Ask the judges questions at the test sessions. Most of them will be pleased to help you.
- 8. Once you ask, listen. Be ready to accept another point of view. Something about the way another person makes decisions may help you.
- 9. If you disagree on some point, put it in the form of a question. You will learn more. For example, "Did you think those circles had a lot of flats in them?" If you failed a test that had passed a question is better than, "I think her circles had too many flats in them." You may find out that the disagreement is one of weight rather than substance. The judge you are speaking to may have found counter-balancing points in the skater's favor. Your implied disapproval is less likely to elicit this information. But, if you do have a strong question in your mind, you ought to find out why others decided differently. 10. If you are trial judging dances, draw
- the diagrams until you can reproduce them as to pattern, step numbers and timing. They do not have to be geometrically perfect but you ought to know where the dances are supposed to go.
- 11. Skate those items you are trying to judge, if you can. This will give you a good appreciation of the different points the skater is trying to achieve. Try both parts of the dance, too.
- 12. Although your pro has one way of teaching things, there are often valid methods of achieving the same thing. Remember to judge the results.
- 13. Read what some excellent teachers have had to say on the subject. There are a number of books available on the different phases of skating, many of them available through the USFSA Central Office.
- 14. Think about skating as a judge. Analyze what you see at tests and at sessions. Why does it look good or bad? What do other knowledgeable people think?
- 15. Your interest is of topmost importance, but you will never know enough. You will always keep learning.



# Stop·Look·Listen

**Question:** Does your club file Test Reports within the two week time period allowed by TR 11.03?

**Question:** Does your club pay its bills on time for materials ordered?

Question: Does your club pay its dues on time?

Question: Does your club register all of its members as soon as the dues are collected by promptly sending the cards to the Central Office?

■ If the answer to any of the above questions is "No" then you are not helping the USFSA office to serve you and your club members, nor are you encouraging your members to stay members of your club or any other USFSA club.

Test-skaters work long and hard preparing for tests. When they pass they deserve their test card and deserve to see their names in the Laurels of SKATING. It is not fair to keep a skater waiting six months or more for a card showing he has passed a given test. The remedy is to get the test reports in on time.

Check your bank statements and cancelled checks. If you sent a check to the office and feel enough time has passed for the cancelled check to be in your bank statement and it is not, write us at once! When you write be sure to include what the check was for, the amount, the club

name and the name of the person who was billed. We have had checks lost in the mail, some were with test reports, some with registration cards, others were paying club dues or other bills. We have no way of knowing that a problem exists if you do not tell us that you have no cancelled check.

- ■When members pay their club dues and the club gives the member a registration card, it is the club's duty to get these cards to the office. The member is not registered until we receive and process the card. It can delay the member's magazine sometimes by several months if not sent to the office promptly. Make a habit to send in cards once a week, or every other week.
- Remember, mailing labels for SKATING are always printed by the computer a month in advance. A run of the computer is made about the 15th of each month. The labels for the first issue (November) are printed on October 15; the December labels on November 15, etc. (Remember there are only eight issues of SKATING each year.) We do not send out back issues and each member who receives the magazine will receive his proper issues. If you wish back issues, you may write and order them. You will, however, be billed for these issues.
- ■If you do not receive test cards for skaters within two months of the date the test was taken, write to the office,

giving the skater's name, the test taken, the approximate date of the test and, most important, the name of the club that hosted the test session and filed the test report with the office. If the report is not in our files, or if the skater's name does not appear on that report we can write to the club and ask for a copy of the missing report or ask about the missing skater. The report may have been lost in the mail, or a test result left off due to an error. However, if we are alerted to a problem, we can go to work to correct the error at once, rather than trying to correct something that, in some cases, is over a year old. The longer you let something like this go, the harder it is for us to track down and correct.

■ Return any and all incorrect test cards to the office. It can and does happen that skater X takes a fourth test at the ABC Club in the east. Somehow, the number used for the skater is a number that belongs to a member on the west coast. Maybe the test was taken years ago, or maybe the skater never took the test. If you destroy the card it means that skater X is still waiting for a test card and to see his name in the Laurels of the magazine. He may wait six months before he complains to the office. If, however, the test chairman returns the incorrect card to us at once we can, with only about a week's delay, get a card to skater X and make a correction in the Laurels.

■ Never, never give a new number to a member who already holds a USFSA number. If the member does not have his old card or does not remember his old number, write to us and we will check the correct number from the computer. If the skater has dropped out of the USFSA for a year or two, you may then give him a new number. Or, you may write to us and we will trace down the number that he had and he may use that number again.

Always put your full name, return address and zip code on each piece of mail you send to us. It is true that we have all registered members on a master list but it takes a great deal of time to find missing addresses. It often adds up to much wasted time by the people in the office. The zip code is especially important on registration cards because the post office often will not deliver magazines without zip codes.

■ When you have questions, or need help or information write to us. We will make every effort to see that your questions, requests and problems get the attention they deserve.



His program opens with a spectacular series of three triple toe loops climaxing in a flying sit spin. Shaver demonstrates good technical mastery and definite masculine artistic flair. Although he missed both attempted triple Salchows in his long program, Shaver still had one of the most technically difficult programs, and one of the best choreographed.

The dance event was closely contested between the British champions, Janet Thompson and Warren Maxwell, and the Russian entry of Natalia Linichuk and Gennadi Karponosov.

Although the Russians won Skate Canada for the second successive year, it was not easy.

Demonstrating good compulsory dances, the Russian's march was more of a "flamingo flaunt" and was not well received by judges nor audience alike. Their usually flawless free dance almost became a catastrophe when they slipped and lost precious minutes of their music. This rare fall cost them the free dance event.

British dancers, Thompson and Maxwell won the free dance but not by enough to take home the overall title.

Canadians, Susan Carscallen and Eric Gillies won the original set pattern dance, a fine showing considering they were the first to present it. Simplistic in style, it surpassed many other more intricate and technically difficult, steppy marches presented by other couples.

Both American teams, Judi Genovesi and Kent Weigle and Michelle Ford and Glenn Patterson, Jr. danced well with no noticeable errors but failed to improve on their seventh and eighth place finishes.

Interestingly, it was the second place Canadian team of Lorna Wighton and John Dowding which drew the only standing ovation of the dance final from the almost-capacity crowd of 9,000. They placed sixth overall.

The impact of thier coach, Mary Jane Stong, (the same pro who worked with former Canadian champions, Berezowski and Porter) was very much in evidence in their inventive arm movements and strong, slow section.

The announcement Saturday in local papers that the Russian dance champions had retired created a stir in skating circles and indicated that this year's dance competition will be highly contested.

Exhibitions Sunday highlighted by World and Olympic champions, Rodnina and Zaitsev, left the audience and competitor alike looking forward to this year's World Competition.

With the retirement of all but the pairs champions, all events will be up for grabs. All eye's will look Eastward with great interest in March.




