



Only one nomination form per person each year will be accepted and no more than ten nominees in total may be included on each form.


- Skaters from throughout the world who have compiled an outstanding competitive record
  and who have made a noteworthy contribution in style or technique and have been retired
  from competitive skating for at least ten years.
- 2. Persons who have made a noteworthy contribution to figure skating in a non-skating capacity through service to an amateur figure skating association and have not been active in such capacity for at least five years.
- 3. Persons who have made a noteworthy contribution to figure skating in a non-amateur capacity. Non-teaching professionals must have been retired at least five years, while teaching professionals must have at least twenty-five years of experience as such.

Following compilation of all nominations received by the closing date of February 1, 1981, the 27 Hall of Fame Electors (3 from each Region) will vote for the eligible nominees in each category. The announcement and induction of the successful candidates into the Hall of Fame will take place at the Annual Meeting of the USESA Governing Council in May 1981.



## DICK BUTTON RECEIVES THE FIRST ANNUAL SUPERSKATES AWARD

Dick Button, two-time Olympic Gold Medalist and five-time World Figure Skating Champion, was the recipient of the first annual Superskates Award for his contributions to amateur figure skating, at a press conference and luncheon held on September 15, 1980 at the Sherry Netherland Hotel, NY.

The award was presented to Mr. Button by Mrs. Cornelius Vanderbilt Whitney, chairman of the gala benefit committee for Superskates VII, and Edwin I. Mosler, Jr., founder of Superskates and National Finance Chairman of the United States Olympic Committee.

Among those present at the awards presentation were special guests, Peggy Fleming and Elaine Zayak.

### SPORTS MEDICINE SERVICE NOW AVAILABLE IN NY

The Hospital for Joint Diseases Orthopaedic Institute, located at 17th Street and 2nd Avenue, New York, NY has announced the reorganization of its Sports Medicine Service which will now make a total commitment to total care of sportsrelated injuries.

The new Chief, Kim W. Sloan, M.D. is responsible for the care of the New York Giants and New Jersey Nets. There will be five other attending physicians on the Service with Dr. Sloan.

The new Service will treat acute and chronic sports injuries five days a week: Mondays from 9 to 11 a.m., Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 2 to 4 p.m. and Fridays from 1 to 3 p.m. Anyone seeking treatment will have available the facilities of the Hospital, including orthopaedists trained to care for sports injuries, therapists, rehabilitation specialists and exercise physiologists.

There will be several symposia held at the Hospital for coaches and trainers on the identification and care of serious injuries to assist them in determining when a physician's treatment is necessary.

Affiliated with the Beth Israel Medical Center, The Federation of Jewish Philanthropies and the Mount Sinai School of Medicine, the Orthopaedic Institute is the most modern treatment, teaching and research facility of its kind in the country. Skaters' Forum, Part 2 provides an opportunity to become acquainted with some of the young skaters who hope to become champions of the 80's.

### Q: How will figure skating in the 1980's differ from what we have seen in the 1970's?

Rosalynn Sumners: You will be seeing a much stronger all-around skater-in triples (much more than in the 70's), stronger style, presentation-also stronger figures.

Tiffany Chin: It has become more and more important to have triple jumps. I hope in the 1980's there will be more emphasis on the artistic style of skating. In this way a great champion skater will also be a great skater in the eyes of the general audience.

Vikki de Vries: Not too much different, except that triple jumps will be more common.

Melissa Thomas: The athletic portion of skating is being stressed more (triple jumps).

Susan Guild: Since the 1970's the triple jump has become a common element in figure skating. Now in the 80's, I feel that the skater is going to use the technique in combination with new innovative choreography, including impressive new styles of skating.

Tom Dickson: I think we will see an increased amount of athleticism involved. But the supreme skater will be one that can do it with integrity and with an artistic flair.

Jim White: This coming fall there will be a set single group of figures for skaters competing in Junior and Senior divisions, whereas, in the 1970's there were two and three groups of figures to draw from. Skaters might attempt to do more difficult jumps (stunts, etc.). However, I also think there will be more concentration on the traditional beauty/presentation, etc. in skating which seemed to be ignored in the 1970's.

Nathan Birch: Figure skating in the 70's improved in two major fields. Technically, with triples and artistically, with the use of more ballet and jazz. I think in 80's more skaters will use ballet and jazz to improve their skating and the use of triples will become more frequent with the younger skaters. Perhaps some auads.

Christopher Bowman: The jumps are getting more scientific all the time, to be able to do better triples and even "quadruples", you're going to have to be able to do all the difficult athletics with excellent choreography and make it look easy, more like a dance or a show.

Joan Campbell: In the 80's there will be more original moves. In previous years, it seemed as if skaters turned away from doing something different. But now the way to get ahead is to do something original.

**Debbie Thomas:** I think triples will be the answer in the 80's. Most of the style will probably stay the same, because everyone will be concentrating on triples. Maybe the 80's will bring quadruples into skating. The people with good figures. jumps, and style are your 1980 champions.

Frankie Hermanson: I think free style will be much stronger with more triple jumps in Novice and in Junior Ladies divisions.

Rosanna Tovi: In a freestyle program, the athletic requirements will become increasingly difficult, the added rotations to various jumps and more complicated jump combinations will put a severe strain on attempts toward developing and maintaining artistic style and creative expression in the program. Because of these difficult requirements the skater will have to spend more time training on and off the ice. Also, a fine academic program suited to the serious skaters schedule and real needs, may be developed.

Jim Cygan: There will be more upcoming skaters that will be recognized and the style of skaters will be better, while more and harder jumps will be completed.

Craig Henderson: Hopefully, there will be some unique innovations, combined with some interesting moves.

Dana Graham: Skating in the 1980's will be concentrated on all-round ability rather than an extreme accent on jumping.

Paul Wylie: I feel there will be more emphasis on all around skating, instead of just jumps and "tricks". Choreography, style, flair, plus all-around "skating" will become more important in the eighties.

**Debbie Lynch:** I feel all the style is changing. We are skating more modernly, more freely. And using more modern music changes the skating style . I feel it's a good change we are making.

**Keith Green:** Different moves, lifts will change, spins, footwork and style will be more noticeable.

Maryan Amaral: I feel that skating will probably take a more artistic and innovative turn in the 1980's, but leaning more towards power and speed.

**Bryan Amaral:** I feel that skating will tend to take on a more artistic focus but will progress on an athletic level, as it has steadily been doing.

### Q: What differences will be in this year's program as compared to last year's?

Rosalynn Sumners: There will be an increase in the amount of triples in the program, a change of division from Juniors to Seniors, change of music, stronger presentation, stronger jumps in general.

Tiffany Chin: Since my Senior program is not completely set yet, the following is just a guess: I already have triple toe loops and salchow, and since I've already landed some triple loops, I imagine all three will be in my program. In last year's Junior program I could only manage to have nice double axels. Frank feels that I should be able to skate more difficult, sophisticated and a more artistic program than last year since I'll be a little older.

Melissa Thomas: In this year's program, I will have more difficult combinations, at least two triple jumps and I'll be moving up from Juniors to Seniors.

Susan Guild: In my Senior program this year, I am trying to achieve the maturity that a "first year" Senior needs to have. My music is stronger and I am working to strengthen my skating accordingly.

**Tom Dickson:** I have been working on making my program more explosive and subtle, when it calls for it. Also, the fact of a five minute program calls for these types of dramatics to make it more interesting.

Jim White: I will compete in Senior men's division for the first time this year. My music is also new, and I will skate a five minute program instead of a four minute. The school figures are also new to me.

Nathan Birch: This year my program has been changed. The music is faster and the ending is longer. My presentation will be better because of a new choreographer.

Christopher Bowman: I'm trying to improve my speed and power this year, but I want to concentrate on my style, too. I would like to be known as a classy skater. Also, this year, I'm changing my music to more contemporary music.

Joan Campbell: I don't think there will be much difference as far as music or presentation goes.

**Debbie Thomas:** My music is a lot more powerful than last year's; so is my program. I am planning to have four triples in my long program, (twice as many as last year). As for my short program, a triple toe walley/double loop combination. Now that I'm a Junior lady, my coach Alex McGowan says I've got a goal and I'm responsible for reaching it.

Frankie Hermanson: I will have a short program with figures and a long program for the first time. I am excited about the short program!

Rosanna Tovi: This is my first year as a Junior lady. My choreographer, Tommy Litz has picked "The Skaters' Waltz" for my long program. It will be thirty seconds longer than last year. He is painting a picture of skating over the last fifty years and I have to learn various ice dances and special moves to express the music which interweaves its theme throughout in varying tempos. This in addition to triple jumps I hope to own by competition time in November. My short program, the first I've ever had, is being choreographed by Tommy Litz and Stacey Smith. I also hope to improve my artistic style especially in the jump itself.

Jim Cygan: Going to Novice to Junior will be harder because of the short program.

Craig Henderson: This year I will attempt two more triples in my program, and also feel my music more.

**Dana Graham:** We are working for more maturity as we move from Junior to Senior Pairs. We feel this is necessary for us to be competitive in Senior Pairs competition.

Paul Wylie: This year we will be concentrating on maturing our style as we move from Juniors to Seniors. We will increase speed and work on more speed in our program. In singles, I will work on improving my figures, and perfecting my triple jumps.

Maryan Amaral: This year being our first year in senior pairs, we will keep our contemporary music and basic style though more emphasis will be placed on ballet, speed and unison.

Bryan Amaral: This year we will be competing in the senior pair level. Musically, we are remaining with a contemporary group of pieces and we hope our skating will take on a more modern contemporary style.

Q: Who do you see as providing your major competition (nationally and/or internationally) this year?

Rosalynn Sumners: Elaine Zayak, Tracy Wainman, Sandy Lenz, Alicia Risberg, Tiffany Chin, Vikki de Vries.

Tiffany Chin: Since this is my first year in Seniors, and I do aim high, that means every national Senior lady will be my competitor, and yet in another way my true competitor is myself. If I work hard and seek to improve myself, in due time, I am confident that I can be groomed to be a real winner.

Vikki de Vries: Lisa Allen, Sandy Lenz, Elaine Zayak.

Melissa Thomas: All my competitors are my competition, but the most important idea is that I do the best I can in competition and not worry about anyone else.

Susan Guild: Since this is my first year as a Senior lady, I really do not consider myself as a threat to any particular person or they a threat to me. However, I have one great competitor who is myself. This year has been devoted towards competing with and being satisfied with myself.

Tom Dickson: Nationally, everyone. Internationally, Russia, Canada, Poland.

Jim White: A good number of National competitors in Senior men. Such as, Brian Boitano and Robert Wagenhoffer, etc.

Nathan Birch: Nationally, Paul Wylie who was second in Junior men last year.

Christopher Bowman: I don't think about what my competitors are doing. Each year I try to set a goal for myself, whether it's learning new triples or taking tests or going to Nationals, then I try my very best to do the best I can to achieve these goals.

Joan Campbell: Before I think about beating anyone, I must beat myself.

**Debbie Thomas:** My major competition for this year is me. I have to compete against myself, so when I get to the point where I have beat my normal self, I will become a winner.

Frankie Hermanson: I really don't see one person as major competition. I think everyone that competes is some kind of competition one way or another.

Rosanna Tovi: To numerous to mention and one never knows between the emotional state of the skater whether or not he or she will even be competing this year.

Craig Henderson: All my competitors I skate against this year, I consider my major competitors.

**Dana Graham:** Caitlin and Peter Carruthers and Sheryl Franks and Michael Botticelli will be our major competition.

Paul Wylie: The Carruthers, and Michael Botticelli and Sheryl Franks.

**Debbie Lynch:** It's very hard for me to say. Keith and I are just moving up, and Seniors is a big step. So, to me everyone is a major competitor.

Maryan Amaral: All the senior pair teams that have previously competed and are competing next year will provide our major competition.
