



It was late in the afternoon, my unruly beginner class of eight-vear-olds was getting to me, doing little of what I wanted, and nothing right. I was hungry, irritable, the public session music was too loud-I was in a thoroughly bad way. In desperation, I drew two circles on the ice with snow piles and told the class to follow the snow using cross-overs—in short a figure eight. To make certain, I started first, motioning for them to follow. Soon I stopped but they, for the first time that afternoon, did not. Around they went, over and over. absorbed. I watched for the first signs of boredom, but only exhaustion stopped them. Not for long. Back to the eight they'd go, looking like eager archaeologists un-covering the first signs of a remote civilization.

In using this "gimmick" often since, I'm no longer surprised at the intense concentration produced. The word mesmerized comes to mind. Trance, too, reminding me of the story told by the late Hans Johnsen. Hans was in the habit of following pupils around practice figures. talking or not as fitted the situation. A particular lesson started well enough but fell apart when Hans drifted off into his own thoughts. Startled back to reality by his pupil plaintively asking, "Can I stop now, Mr. Johnsen?", Hans looked at the clock, stunned. Twenty-five minutes had gone by. Or perhaps you've heard the one about the famous instructor who (absently-mindedly, I suppose) left his equally famous English champion doing figures while he dined. Upon returning, he was shocked to discover the girl still working. "But you didn't tell me to stop," she exclaimed.

Perpetual motion never had a more valid booster than the skated eight. Is there a need to explain this phenomenon? What compels little children to propel themselves out of warm beds into huge freezer lockers that are ice rinks while the sun is lighting another part of the earth? Who can explain it? Maybe by now a former pupil of mine who was interning in psychiatry at a Berkeley hospital some years ago. Jumping and spinning, especially the former, were



his delights. The suggestion of a figure eight, however, made him blanch. "Oh no," he would say. "There's something fishy about all that going around and coming back where you started and never getting anywhere. I'm going to have to look into it some day." I haven't heard from him but I suspect he may have been trapped on an eight one day and is still on it.


Sports reporters question the figure eight. To them, watching competitive figures is as interesting as having to count jelly beans in Reagan's candy jar. Patterns on ice being judged for brilliance give the illusion that that's the be-all-and-end-all of figures. Huh-uh. Eight-making has emotional, as well as mental, symmetry. The confusion of the world is pushed aside for awhile as the path stretches endlessly, seamlessly, and the body sings a soothing melody as the flow of the blade produces one vast muscular hum. Mozart would have loved it. (He would probably have then composed a concerto for three turn, two loops, four edges and twenty patchers.)

But there is that incredible roundness to circles. You laugh! But consider: earthly motion is straight lines. A thrown ball will not return to the thrower. Whirled objects released will not stay "in orbit." Even a boomerang does not make a real circle. But we can. A push, a slight "falling" of weight, a minute tip of blade and voila! le cercle. Seen from a distance, the eight is a necklace of two pearls. Mentally strung together, they are more precious than a perfect Pac Man score. Appreciate,

appreciate.

All directions given in a ballet class are traditionally spoken in French. Just as Port de Bras means carriage of the arms, Port de Tete is then carriage of the head.

Head gestures can be utilized by skaters to enhance the movements of the torso and limbs. A lot of expression is lost when the head remains stationery, even though suitable arm and body movements are being performed.

A very simple rule to use that will help you get the habit of moving your head is to ALWAYS FOLLOW A MOVING ARM WITH YOUR HEAD AND EYES. This will automatically endow you with an expression that was not there before, even if you don't feel it internally.

Experiment by standing in front of a mirror and keep your head straight forward, not moving it at all. Now, improvise all kinds of arm movements. You will notice how static and expressionless it is. Next, repeat the arm movements and follow them with your head and eves. You can glance at the mirror out of the corner of your eyes and see how much more interesting you look and how you automatically acquired more expression. As you practice this simple exercise, the easier and more natural your head movements will look, and you will also begin to internalize more expression.

You are not designing head movements at this point. You are merely developing the habit of moving your head naturally and in coordination with the movements of the rest of your body. Apply this now to your skating program and see how much more expression is automatically instilled in your overall look. Following your arm movements with your head and eyes is a basic tool to use and a rule that you can deliberately break whenever you want to get a different expression or a more dramatic look. Try doing an arm movement and deliberately turn your head away from it. You are now working in opposition and many times this gives a very strong feeling to your overall picture.

When talking about movements of the head, it would be well to analyze the different ways the head can move. Imagine that there is a square picture frame hanging in space about ten inches in front of your face. Starting with your head straightforward in the middle of the frame, try the following head positions:

- 1. Lower your chin and point it to the bottom left corner of the picture frame.
- 2. Lower your chin and point it to the bottom right corner.
- 3. Lower your chin and point it to the center of the bottom of the frame.
- 4. Raise your chin to top middle of of the frame.
- 5. Raise your chin and point it to the top right corner.
- 6. Raise your chin and point it to the top left corner.
- 7. Point your nose to the middle of the left side of the frame.
- 8. Repeat to the right. (Side to side movements can be used as a quick accent.)
- 9. To do a half roll with the head, turn your head directly to the left and point your chin to the top left corner of the frame. Lower it to the bottom left corner, then to the middle of the bottom of the frame, letting your chin almost



Nutritional Guide for the Skater

CONSTRUCTION OF A BALANCED DIET

We obtain our needed nutrients from foods, and so a basic knowledge of the nutritional composition of foods is necessary in planning a balanced diet. A balanced diet is one that contains all the required nutrients in proper quantities that meet the nutritional needs of individuals. In addition, it should contain the proper amount of calories to meet physical activity and lifestyle. The proper amount of calories is that quantity which keeps your weight at the most desirable level. Table 1 shows the recommended caloric allowance for a person by height, weight and age, and Table 2 shows the protein, vitamin and mineral allowance by age and sex.

There are several ways that a balanced diet can be constructed. One way is to calculate the amount of nutrients derived from each food item eaten throughout the day using conventional nutrition composition tables as reference. This method, although used routinely by dietitians and nutritionists, is time-consuming and not very practical for the average person. Another approach, which is much simpler and more practical for general usage, is to plan and assess a diet using eating guides.

In the Basic Four Food Group Guide. foods are chosen from four main groups -Milk, Meat, Vegetable and Fruit, and Bread and Cereal, (Table 3). Foods are placed in these four food groups on the basis that they contain similar nutrients. For example, servings from each food group are provided by age group; i.e., from the Milk group: 2 or more servings for adults; 4 servings for teens and 3 servings for children; From the Meat group: at least 2 more servings for

all age groups; From the Vegetable-Fruit group: at least 4 or more servings: From the Bread-Cereal group: at least 4 servings or more. While the Basic Four Food Group Guide is the best practical guide we have today for meeting our nutritional needs, care must be taken to select a variety of foods within each and among all four groups.

Many of the recommended foods deal with fresh foods. However, we eat many processed foods or, foods containing items from more than one of the groups that can be translated into nutritious eating. For example, pizza may contain items from all four food groups—Meat, Bread-Cereal, Milk and Vegetable. Tomato soup prepared with milk contains both Vegetable and Milk groups, Canned beans can be used as a contributor to the Meat group. Vegetable juice can be used as a substitute for Vegetables. A cheeseburger with lettuce and tomatoes has items from the Milk, Meat, Vegetable and Cereal groups.

Nutrition is important to your health -both mental and physical-and your ability to perform up to your maximum potential. You are in charge of what you eat so it's up to you! Take the time to learn about foods and which ones are needed to fulfill your needs. Of course, it's important that you enjoy them. We're certain you can select foods that meet your nutritional needs and

are enjoyable.

BEREAVEMENTS

Barbara Fazio, former Secretary of the Newbridge FSC, died in July. She was forty-two vears old.

Arild C. Lie, one of the original founders of the Plymouth FSC, in Plymouth, MI, passed away on November 2, 1982, of cancer. Mr. Lie was a native of England where he began ice dancing, later he came to the United States and became a judge, a board member and also was a chairman of the 1978 and 1981 Eastern Great Lakes Regionals, through the Plymouth FSC.

Hugh C. Graham, Sr., M.D., passed away on November 11, 1982. He was eighty-six. Dr. Graham was a retired pediatrician and a longtime devotee of figure skating. He was a mem-

ber of the Tulsa FSC since 1940, serving as a member of the board of directors and a former president. He was a USFSA High Test and Silver Dance judge. He is survived by his son, Hugh C. Graham, Jr., M.D., U.S. Senior Men's Bronze Medalist in 1955; and daughter, Margaret Anne Wier, U.S. Senior Ladies' Bronze Medalist in 1954, together winning the Silver Medal in U.S. Pairs in 1953 and 1954, placing fifth in the World in 1954; and six grandchildren, four of whom hold USFSA Gold medals, one of whom, Dana E. Graham, was National Junior Pair Champion of the United States in 1980, and a member of the U.S. National Skating Team in 1980 and 1981.



ENNIA INTERNATIONALS '82

By HOWARD BASS

The seventh Ennia Internationals, again at the Uithof Stadium in the Hague, Holland, appropriately celebrated the centenary of the Royal Dutch Skating Union with a record participation of 89 skaters from 18 nations.

The four days of competition, without compulsory figures or dances, were very

satisfying from an American viewpoint, with convincing victories in each of the singles and fifth places well earned by less experienced performers in each of the doubles. Four United States skaters finally won the Ennia Challenge Cup awarded to the best national team.

Brian Boitano, the men's winner at Skate Canada only a fortnight previously, eased into a lead in the short, his superiority typified by a difficult triple Lutz with one arm extended overhead. The West German Norbert Schramm.

the European champion, turned an intended triple Lutz into a single, to trail in fifth behind Igor Bobrin, USSR, Jozef Sabovcik, Czechoslovakia, and

Greg Filipowski, Poland.

Boitano went on to win comfortably. He landed six triples in the long, five of them different, but he and Sabovcik each failed an attempted triple Axel. Schramm, despite falling twice from triple toe loops, managed to land five triples, three different, and did well enough to pull up to second. His attire caused much merriment—a one-piece suit in wide, vivid red and yellow stripes spiralling down to one red and one vellow trouser leg with respectively matching boot covers.

Sabovcik, a rapidly improving jumper, fell from a triple Axel but well earned third place. Bobrin went to pieces, failing four triples, and sunk to a humble fifth. James White, USA, showed great jumping potential, ending seventh of 17 after falling from a triple Lutz.

Vikki de Vries, USA, was never seriously threatened en route to her women's victory, appropriate in Holland as the daughter of a former Dutch national ice

hockey player.

Claudia Leistner, of West Germany, and Charlene Wong, Canada, came nearest to her in the short, all opting for triple and double toe loops. In the long, Vikki landed two triple toe loops and a good triple Salchow after stepping off an earlier triple Salchow. Her music, opening with the 20th Century-Fox fanfare and featuring easily hummable music from their films, was also a winner.

Claudia was consistently next best, excelling with triple loop, her higher marks for technical merit suggesting that the judges much preferred her contents to style. Third placed Anna Antonova included the best Biellmann spin seen since Denise left the circuit.

Tall, elegantly slim Maria Causey, USA, included some fine spins—particularly her layback. In the short, she seemed harshly marked, which being a newcomer does not, in itself, justify. Her long was marred only when touching

The East Germans, Birgit Lorenz and Knut Schubert, set the pairs pace with the best split double Lutz twist lift and one-hand lasso lift in the short, but their errors in the long allowed Larisa Selezneva and Oleg Makarov, USSR, to pass

them. Birgit fell when entering a death spiral and also erred in the throw double Axel.

Sue Garland and Ian Jenkins, Great Britain, who seem to improve each time they skate, were consistently third. Lynne and Jay Freeman, USA, fifth, dropped vital marks in the long when Linda fell from a triple throw Salchow. Cara and Craig Gill, USA, were a little out of depth in this company, but early international experience is just what Ennia ideally provides.

Current British strength in ice dancing was reflected by the winning form of Karen Barber and Nicky Slater, who kept two respected and hardly separable Soviet couples at bay throughout. Many of the Londoners' opponents looked at sea in this season's none too popular original set pattern dance to a required swingy jazz rhythm, with rock n' roll style a stipulated dominant feature.

Renee Roca and Don Adair, USA, fifth, more experienced than their teammates Eva Hunvadi and Jav Pinkerton. looked to be advancing appreciably in partnership.

From the best collective positions in the individual events, six nations qualified for the first separate international team tournament of its kind to be acknowledged by the ISU, the winner to hold the Ennia Challenge Cup for a year.

Countries to qualify were the USSR, United States, Great Britain, West Germany, and Czechoslovakia, but the West Germans withdrew because of an injury to their dancer, Birgit Goller, and were replaced by Canada.

·Each nation was permitted to enter any three of the four events, all determined solely by long programs, and the United States, represented by Brian, Vikki, Roca and Don, won decisively, with East Germany the runner-up and the USSR gaining the narrowest possible verdict over Britain for third place.

Vikki easily defeated Janina Wirth, East Germany, with Charlene Wong third. Brian sealed the triumph with an equally decisive men's win over Sabovcik, who this time landed his triple Axel. Lorenz and Schubert turned the

tables on Selezneva and Makarov in the pairs, with Garland and Jenkins again third, and there was no change in the top three of the ice dance. Barber and Slater excelling a second time.

The team event was a well received

and worthwhile experiment, but whether it continues as a separate entity must depend on how the skaters feel about lifting themselves anew so soon after the individual contests.

United States victories in all three events was a significant outcome of the Ninth Skate Canada international at the Memorial Auditorium in Kitchener, Ontario, which previously played host in 1974. Brian Boitano, Rosalynn Sumners, Elisa Spitz and Scott Gregory took the top honors in a collective entry of 45 skaters from 13 nations.

Boitano's triumph was impressive, his figures providing the decisive edge over the always threatening Canadian, Brian Orser.

The tall Californian led West Germany's Heiko Fischer and the Pole, Grzegorz Filipowski, in the compulsories, passing Fischer after the champion of West Germany had been front-runner in the opening rocker.


Boitano's superior paragraph bracket and paragraph loop were crucial factors in the contest. Orser had alignment problems but held fourth spot in each of the first two figures, dropping to fifth after the loops to put possible victory, as things turned out, mathematically beyond his reach.

Neither of the top trio missed an element in the short, Boitano featuring a triple Lutz in his combination while Fischer, Filipowski and Orser each opted for the triple toe loop. Orser's finesse promoted him to third and U.S.'s Bobby Beauchamp, who included a triple toe walley, rose a place to fifth.

To achieve victory, Orser had not only to win the long free, he needed Fischer also to finish above Boitano, in which case the



Men's Silver Medalist Brian Orser Canada




Men's Bronze Medalist Heiko Fischer West Germany

three would have tied with equal points to give the Canadian a tie-break.

Boitano duly upset that possibility by passing Fischer. Both Orser and Boitano attempted a triple Axel, but the Canadian touched down and the Californian two-footed the landing.

With jumps outweighing spins and presentation, Orser accomplished four triples-Lutz, Salchow and two toe-loops. Boitano featured three—Lutz, toe-loop and toe-Salchow-but fluffed two double Axels.

Third placed Fischer landed five triples—loop, Salchow, toe-Salchow, and two toe-loops—but fell from a triple Lutz.

Beauchamp, overall sixth, touched down on triple loop.

triple Lutz and double toe-loop on not one of his best days, but he had a good program.

In the women's event Finland's Kristiina Wegelius set the early pace for Finland, pursued by Manuela Ruben from West Germany, and Rosalvnn Sumners and Vikki de Vries from the U.S.

The three behind Wegelius jostled and changed places until Manuela burst through to second with persistently steady etchings. She went on to steal an overall lead after a clean short free, triple toe loop included, all her main rivals dropping vital points in the jump combination.


Rosalynn, who fell from the obligatory double toe-loop after landing the triple, did well enough to rise to level second with the Finn, whose attempt to link double Axel and double cherry disintegrated. Vikki stayed fourth after turning between her triple and double cherries.

Vikki came through in the long from fourth to a hard-earned win. overhauling the Finn as well as Rosalynn and Manuela. The winner's long free was admirable, including two triple Salchows and two triple toe-loops, carrying herself with a competent style. Her Russian split lift into a double Axel was very effective, as was her shrewd choice of dress, ideally complimenting her hair and neck to enhance appearance.

Wegelius lacked difficulty in her contents and looked as though she needed a Helsinki crowdwhich she'll have in March-to inspire a more animated personality.

Rosalynn fell from a triple toeloop and from a double Axel. Three other double Axels appeared deceptively easy and fast.

Manuela muffed her big chance, falling from triple loop and triple toe-loop and two-footing a double Salchow.

Although the order of the top four ice dance couples never altered throughout their contest—Elisa and Scott were always hard pressed by the much improved Canadians, Tracy Wilson and Bob McCall, whose OSP provided a most entertainingly interpretative rock 'n' roll.

This dance found everyone wanting, no couple by this time of the season having really got to grips with the newly required rhythm, which does not readily lend itself to the smooth flow of

normal ice dance requirements.

Wendy Sessions and Steve Williams, The British national third string, worried the third placed Soviets, Natalya Annenko and Genrikh Sretenski, as doggedly as the Canadians' threat to the leaders.

Renee Roca and Don Adair of the U.S. proved understandably more at home in the OSP than in the compulsories, having replaced Judy Blumberg and the indisposed Mike Seibert at very short notice and thus not having prepared the compulsories quite so well, these being unrequired for their Ennia entry in early November.


rest on your chest. Keep it moving to the right lower corner and then up to the right upper corner. Now reverse this and try doing it with more speed until it becomes a fluid movement.

10. Starting with the half roll, continue moving your chin up to the top center of the frame, then to the top left corner and down to the left middle between top and bottom. This makes a complete head roll and you should practice doing it in the opposite direction

also. Be sure you hit all the points and try to do these faster and then in reverse.

These head positions can be done with sharp attacks or they can flow with the body and arm movements. Many times skaters are concentrating so much on working on their jumps and other technical aspects of skating, that they fail to realize how important the simple gestures of the head in various directions can be in adding color and interest to a movement.


When you have introduced head gestures into your skating program, you will have added another dimension to your skating and artistic presentation.




