## MORE ON ISU COMMUNICATION No. 596 SINGLE FREE SKATING

### A. SENIOR

#### Jumps

All triple jumps can be executed either:

- a) as individual jumps;
- b) in jump sequences; or
- c) in jump combinations, but only one of these triple jumps can be repeated in one jump combination.

Some examples:

1. Triple Axel; triple Lutz; triple toe loop; triple Salchow; triple toe loop/triple toe loop; triple Flip.
2. Triple Salchow; triple toe loop; triple toe loop/double toe loop; triple loop/double toe loop.
3. Triple Axel/triple loop; triple loop/triple loop; triple Flip/triple toe loop; triple Lutz/double toe loop.
4. Triple Axel/triple loop; triple toe loop/triple toe loop; triple Flip/triple toe loop; triple Lutz/double loop.
5. Double Axel/half loop/triple toe loop; triple Lutz/triple toe loop; triple Flip; triple loop/double toe loop.

These are only a few examples. There are of course many more.

### Spins

At least four spins of a different nature are required, one of which must be a spin combination, but there can of course be more. The skaters have complete freedom in selecting the kind of spin they intend to execute; in the spin combination the change of foot is not compulsory and the number of different positions is free.

*Mrs. Amy Browne Townsend accepted the USFSA Hall of Fame medal and plaque on behalf of her late father, Mr. George H. Browne, from Mr. Benjamin T. Wright, Chairman of the USFSA Hall of Fame and Museum Committee.*

On the occasion of the Centennial Sports Banquet, held at the Buckingham Browne and Nichols School in Cambridge, Massachusetts, October 29, 1983, presentation of the United States Figure Skating Association Hall of Fame plaque and medal was posthumously awarded to George H. Browne (1857-1931).

Mr. Browne, Headmaster Emeritus of the Buckingham Browne and Nichols School of Cambridge, authored many books on the art of figure skating, studied the International Style of Figure Skating in Europe, and was most responsible for its adoption in the United States. He served as judge in many competitions both in the United States and in Europe, was very active and prominent in the Cambridge Skating Club, Honorary Member of the Skating Club of Boston, and belonged to several skating clubs abroad.

Mr. Benjamin T. Wright, Chairman of the USFSA Hall of Fame and Museum Committee, presented the USFSA Hall of Fame plaque and medal to Mrs. Amy Browne Townsend, Mr. Browne's sole surviving daughter.

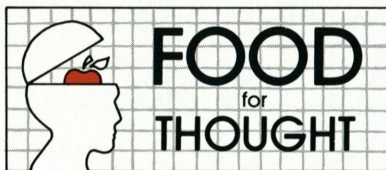

## Nutritional Guide for the Skater.

### THE IMPORTANCE OF SPORTS NUTRITION

Proper nutrition is necessary for a winning performance. Given an equal ability in training and skill, in a group of athletes, diet is the factor that can make a difference in what happens in those last few seconds or minutes of a championship event.

Good nutrition is not just important for top physical performance, it can also help you cope with stress and keep you in top mental condition.

There are many myths associated with sports nutrition; probably because what is known about nutrition has never been seriously applied to sports nutrition until recently. From a nutritional standpoint, top performance in sports is a result of long-term good eating habits; it does not depend just on a pre-game meal, or on a special dietary program during training.

But eating "right" is really quite easy—all it takes is a little thought and planning. The simple rule is to eat a variety of foods each day from each of these food groups: cheese/dairy products, meats/legumes, vegetables/fruits, and cereal/grain products. The quantities to be served from each food group have been broken out by age in the chart below. These should be sufficient to keep your body at its proper weight.

If you are eating a good diet, there is no need for you to take extra vitamin or mineral supplements. However, an iron supplement that meets the day's allowance is usually recommended for most women as well as teenage male athletes. It is *not* advisable to take megadoses of vitamins or mineral supplements. Unusually high intake of only select vitamins or minerals can lead to imbalances of other nutrients.

You may have heard of "stress" vitamins. These are a mixture of B vitamins including Vitamin B6. Before you take them consider this: a recent report in the *New England Journal of Medicine* (August 25, 1983) based on the work of researchers from four universities has shown that a 2-5 gram daily intake of B6 over two months or longer can in fact be harmful.

The traditional belief has been that high intakes of water soluble vitamins (B and C) are not toxic because the body excretes most of the excesses—this is *not* always the case.

Finally, we already know that high intakes of fat soluble vitamins (A, D, E, K) are harmful because they can build up over time in the body.

So play it safe—be nutritionally smart and get into the habit of eating a balanced diet. If you feel you must choose a supplement, pick a multi-vitamin and mineral supplement that meets only the day's allowance. We recommend that you should always consult with your physician when taking these supplements.

Remember, your basic dietary needs are really no different from the non-athlete, with the possible exception that the athlete needs more calories due to his or her increased activity. That good eating plan you start following today will take you through life.

Come this Christmas, *The Bishop's Wife* may appear again on your TV screen, as it does so often during the holidays each year. Its Christmasy theme helps to bring it back as often as "Jingle Bells" and with it comes a little bit of ice skating.

A stuffy bishop, played by David Niven, needs help in building a cathedral. Cary Grant portrays an angel sent to help him, causing a bit of jealousy when Niven's wife, Loretta Young, shows considerable admiration for Grant. A skating sequence has Grant and Loretta, accompanied by their cab driver, Jimmy Gleason, stopping by a frozen lake to try their luck. Obviously, an angel can skate (or didn't you know that), but in the scriptwriter's original plan this angel was to fly and swoop and . . . apparently, no one had really seen figure skating before. When the director saw the real thing he apparently realized it would be fantastic enough to have Grant just skate: spin, jump, spread eagle, et al., and then to have him "magically create ability" in Loretta and Gleason. For Gleason the studio signed a former vaudevillian named Walter Ridge who used to roller-skate in vaudeville and did occasional comedy in various ice shows. Ridge was the spitting image of Gleason. Loretta Young's double looked just like her. I looked like Cary Grant having an attack of delirium tremens, so I got the full treatment: a head mask, complete with eye holes, nostrils, and an opening where I could mutter, "I can't breathe." I couldn't see either, directly down anyhow. If you've ever skated without quite knowing where the ice is . . . ! A lovely feeling.

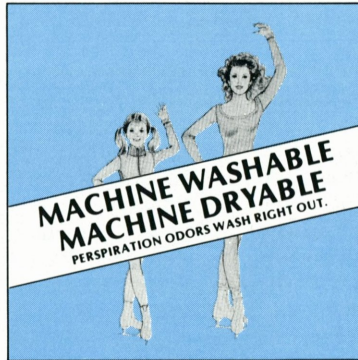
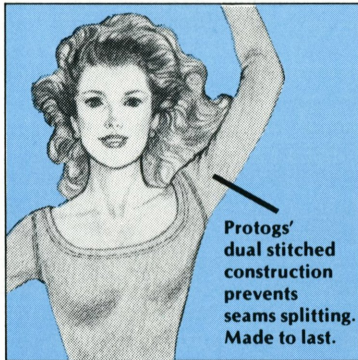
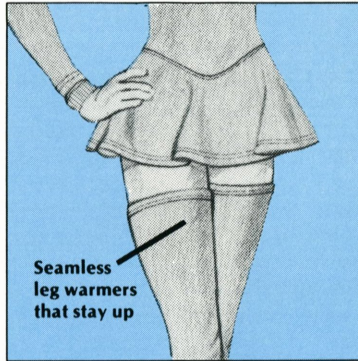
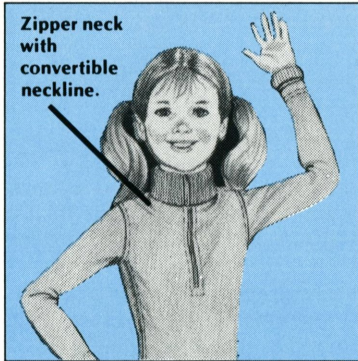
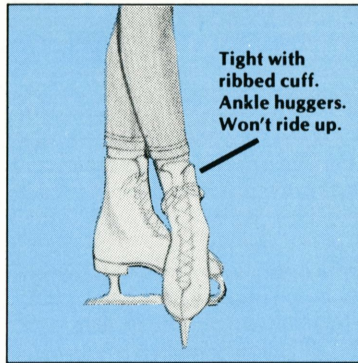
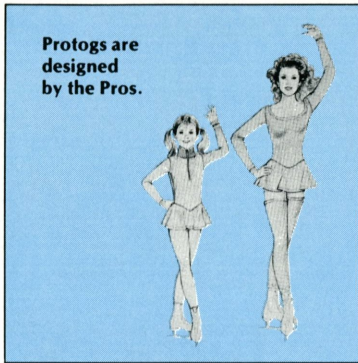
The studio built a beautiful little rink inside one of the sound stages, surrounded it with an artful bridge, a Swiss bandstand, and "real" foliage, introduced us to it, and then everyone disappeared, leaving the three of us to ourselves. Three and a half weeks went by and all we saw was a stray dog. Our instructions were to prepare at least a trio and maybe work up a few tricks for solos, pairs, etc., but the days went by, we got lazy, began to fool around, and suddenly the time came when real people came in one day and said,



"Show us what you've got." Show??? We scrambled around somehow, huddled together, linked up whispering and giggling, and out of that melee came what you see on the screen: after three and a half weeks, there's what a minute and a half of "great choreographic effort" on a trio can produce.

One episode in the skating stands out. A long shot shows me doing a cross-foot spin in front of "Loretta Young." Then follows a close-up of Grant, waist up, finishing the spin. How was it done? Grant was strapped, from the waist down, inside a metal device constructed on a spindle, then spun by hand—the crew wound up the spindle with rope, just like a top, grabbed the rope, and ran. I don't know which was funnier, the men running on the ice with no foot grip, slipping and sliding, tumbling and cussing, or seeing Grant's double (who was being tested in the spindle) after half a dozen attempts. The double staggered off zig-zag, sick, dizzy, blotto, and wasn't seen for the rest of the day. Interestingly, Grant himself was totally unflappable. They must have shot that scene a dozen times and each time he seemed hardly fazed. Of course, it was funny to see them try to stop the spindle so Grant would be facing Loretta. In the "rushes" the next day we'd howl as they would show him stopped with his back to her. Anyhow, three weeks of play, three days of work. Not bad. But another day of that mask, I'd have been a candidate for a wax works!

## COMPETITIVE PRESSURES

The methods a competitor develops to handle competition pressure are highly individual and should be. Occasionally, these techniques are counterproductive and performance suffers. Also, as a competitor grows older, he may become more keenly aware of his "nerves." It can be disconcerting to compete against a younger skater who may actually enjoy the chance to perform while you struggle for control yourself. The competitive demands now require more risk taking than in the past resulting in increasing uncertainty as you step on the ice. The competition performance itself is rarely "fun." The gratification is in consummating a year of work while displaying yourself at your best.

There are no absolute "do's and don'ts" in coping with competitive stress. There are some hints that might be helpful.

1. A person has to have a reasonable expectation that he can perform the program

well to be able to do so in competition. No matter what the competitive pressures, a program involving extensive risk taking will rarely come off well. One should be able to perform in practice most of the moves at least ninety percent of the time. Any content involving lower levels of confidence should be limited to one or two "risks" and preferably early in the routine where coordination is maximum and mental preoccupation with the move can be avoided.

2. You must train yourself to complete your program with *all* of its content in *every* training session, no matter if you fall on the "first move." Then you can have confidence in the program in competition even if an early move goes poorly.

3. A coach can offer important technical advice and encouragement in competition. However, you should learn to depend on your own preparation and concentration, because neither parents nor coach can do a

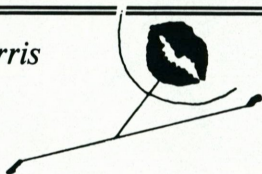

The biggest challenge I have in my work is trying to improve skaters' hands. Attempting to analyze this situation, one conclusion I made is that skaters are now expected to look more artistic, but lacking the body training for this, tension is sometimes put in the wrong places. One of the results of this is hands that sometimes look "crippled." This occurs when too much tension is put in the hands causing the wrist to bend at an angle.

Hands should be adaptable to the music so they become an artistic accent to the program. There are several ways to hold hands:

#### The Natural Hand

Let your arms hang down completely relaxed by your sides. The position your hands are in is called "natural hands." Keep them that way and raise your arms to your shoulder level, allowing your back muscles to move them up. Do this several times, getting used to the feel of your arms being stretched, but the hands held in a natural position. Improvise arm movements with your hands that way.

#### Jazz and Modern Hands

Although many jazz and modern movements are done with natural hands, many are also done with fingers stretched out completely; sometimes with fingers widely spread. The palms can face down, up, front, or back; depending on the move being performed.

#### Ballet Hands

The position of this hand usually has the middle finger very slightly lower than the rest, fingers much softer than jazz hands, with very little spread between them. The thumb should be held close to the index finger, but not bent or tense. The wrist is very supple, allowing the hand to flow easily up and down.

#### Character and Ethnic Hands

Flexed wrists are used at times both in jazz, character, and ethnic moves, however, it is not very attractive to watch skaters, regardless of the music being played, using flexed wrists throughout the entire program. This position should be reserved for specific moves.

There are more complicated ways to hold the hands in ethnic forms, such as Spanish, East Indian, Balinese, and Siamese dancing. This takes special training and practice, but never-the-less can be quite effective if the music calls for it.

One of the unattractive looks that skaters get when putting too much tension into their hands is what I call "duck hands." The fingers are clenched tightly together straight, but with the knuckles raised to cause the hands to look like the head of a duck.

The following exercises can help you to get more attractive hands:

1. Stroke around the rink, holding your arms straight out from the shoulders, completely stretched out. Squeeze your back muscles together and relax your hands only. Begin rotating your hands at the wrist in outer circles. After making one complete round of the rink, rotate the wrists in the opposite direction and go around again. You can do this skating both forwards and backwards. It is almost like "hula hands." Be sure to let your fingers relax completely while you are doing this.

2. Using your mirror will help you to improve your hands by rotating your wrists while watching them in the mirror. Improvise arm movements for about five minutes. Just let anything happen. Get used to following your arms with your head and eyes and you will begin feeling the strength in the arm while the hands look firm, but relaxed.

Of course, taking a trip to the Hawaiian Islands and studying Hawaiian Dance would be an ideal way to improve your hands. But in lieu of that, practicing the above exercises will help enormously.





## IDA TATEOKA: Dedication Earns World-Class Status

**A**s I picked myself up for the umpteenth time, I looked to see if the ice had cracked. We had been at this half-hour lesson for an eternity with no discernible progress and the ice review was only a week away. All I wanted was to be able to stay up on my skates in front of my parents and peers who were coming to see if the lessons could tame a klutz. Practice, practice, practice . . .

That was twenty-five years ago when Salt Lake City had one small ice rink with rubber floors and a six-seat snack bar serving dynamite french fries. The city now has four major rinks, is home for the 1984 National Figure Skating Championships, and boasts a World-class figure skating judge, Ida Tateoka.

Twenty-five years ago Ida skated significantly better than I at that same small rink. She relished her ice time as her young family filled the majority of her days. Skating remained a top priority, however, and today she continues to work hard to improve the quality of the sport and the facilities for our young skaters.

She is pleased at the progress of the sport and proud of Salt Lake City's expanded facilities. Hosting the 1984 Nationals has been a long awaited pleasure of all Utah figure skaters. Ida still skates three times each week, but she spends much of her time in the board room as a member of the Board of Directors of the United States Figure Skating Association, and as Vice Chairman of the Pacific Coast Judges Committee. Judging remains her top devotion.

Her status as a World-class judge is a relatively new hat to wear and she spoke of her appointment with dignity, but with some

reservation about the loftiness of the position. The grueling three-day qualifying exam she took in Prague, Czechoslovakia, last year to become classified as a World judge, she described only as "not much fun."

The ISU (International Skating Union) tests were a culmination of a twenty-year learning process which Ida likened to the trek of a young Novice skater dreaming of Olympic gold.



"The education of a figure skating judge is essentially a series of levels. One begins as a Trial judge, which is actually practice judging. I trained with official judges as they judged on different panels in all phases of testing and competition. My papers were kept and recorded, and as I became a judge on one level, I would trial judge the next level in order to progress.

"The apprenticeship took about two years on each level. It took me ten years to go from a Low Test judge to a National judge. From the national rank to my present status as a World judge took a bit longer than ten years. The United States now has fourteen World-class judges, which is our quota. When a judge retires, another is appointed to fill the position."

Dedication is the key to judging as well as the key to skating toward an Olympic goal. Ida continued, "To become a World-class skater takes dedication and inborn talent. There are very few people who make it out of the thousands of talented skaters. A great portion of what you become is through effort, but the talent really has to be there. Practice at the basic level on the compulsory figures is tedious, but essential.

"Compulsory figures are very important. They give a skater a lot of controlled skating which consequently helps the freestyle performance. Even the freestyle and short program are judged in two parts. One score is for the technical part of the performance and how well the skater moves. The other part is judged on artistic merit, combining the manner of performing with the beauty of movement.

"A skater's choice of music is important, I think, because it sets the type of skating and defines the types of moves one wants to show. Sometimes skaters choose music which is much too heavy and it makes it difficult for them to skate to their potential. Skaters must put each element together properly, knowing their capabilities and finding the best movements and music to enhance the performance.

"Costumes, I feel, are of the least importance in judging a performance. A skater needs to choose a costume primarily for comfort. The design should not be too loose or too restrictive. One should not have the ad-

ditional pressure of worrying about a popped seam."

The intricacies of judging are many and the USFSA is continually striving to develop quality judges, therefore, the learning process takes time and extensive training. "Judging is a lot of work," Ida stressed, "and there are many people working to improve their judging and climb ahead." She had some fine mentors, Margarita Drake, of Glencoe, Illinois, and Edith Shoemaker, of San Francisco, who guided and encouraged her. "I do encourage everyone to keep learning and working toward improvement in judging."

The rewards for twenty years of working toward her goal of becoming a World-class figure judge are great. As well as traveling worldwide, Ida has developed numerous friends. She enjoys the comradery of her fellow judges and looks forward to traveling to Sarajevo, Yugoslavia in February to judge the Men's skating events. Elaine DeMore, of Cleveland, Ohio, Dr. Franklin Nelson, of Tulsa, Oklahoma, and Raymond Alperth, of San Francisco, California, will join her at the Olympics as the United States' four delegated judges.

"The best rewards, however, have come from watching the young Novice skaters work and improve. Scott Hamilton, Elaine Zayak, and Rosalynn Sumners I have known for many years. I have known Rosalynn since she was seven, so you really follow the skaters. In the last fifteen years I have judged seven Nationals and watched our skaters as they fulfilled their goals."

As for this reporter's trek up the skating ladder, success was never truly measured. I do feel, however, the taming of a klutz was accomplished in part by learning to stay up on ice. My skates were eventually turned in for a swift pair of slats to conquer the fabulous ski slopes of Salt Lake City. Lesson after lesson and hundreds of weekends of dedication brought me two fancy leg casts, but many exhilarating moments as I attempted in vain to become a winter Olympian.

# 1983-84 USFSA MEMORIAL FUND AWARDS

The United States Figure Skating Association's Memorial Fund received approximately 300 applications from skaters nationwide for financial assistance through the Memorial Fund's Competitive Skaters Education Program (CSEP) and Academic Scholarship Program (ASP) for the fiscal year 1983-84.

The selection of recipients from the applications submitted were made by the Grants and Allocations Subcommittee. CSEP grants and loans were awarded on the basis of financial need, academic performance, and continuing active participation in competitive figure skating.

Mr. Frederick C. LeFevre, Chairman of the Grants and Allocations Subcommittee, notified each skater of the results of their application in August. Mr. LeFevre is assisted in the review and selection of the applications by three Vice Chairmen: Mr. George B. Ludlow, Eastern Section, Mr. Monty Hoyt, Midwestern Section, and Mr. Robert T. McLeod, Pacific Coast Section.

The grants and loans under these programs are intended for reimbursement of direct expenses incurred for education and development of figure skating skills.

The availability of grants and loans depends entirely upon the annual financial position of the Memorial Fund. As com-

petitive skaters have faced the increasing demands in the continuance of their amateur careers, so has the Memorial Fund. Less than a decade ago, the Memorial Fund awarded \$28,000 to promising skaters in the form of grants. Today the annual budget for grants, loans, and scholarships is \$325,000. But each year the number of skaters requesting financial aid for their training has significantly increased. Funding limitations to this year's programs alone were responsible for the denial of assistance to almost 100 applicants.

Contributions to the Memorial Fund are encouraged to retain not only the level of our current programs, but to meet the requirements of future years.

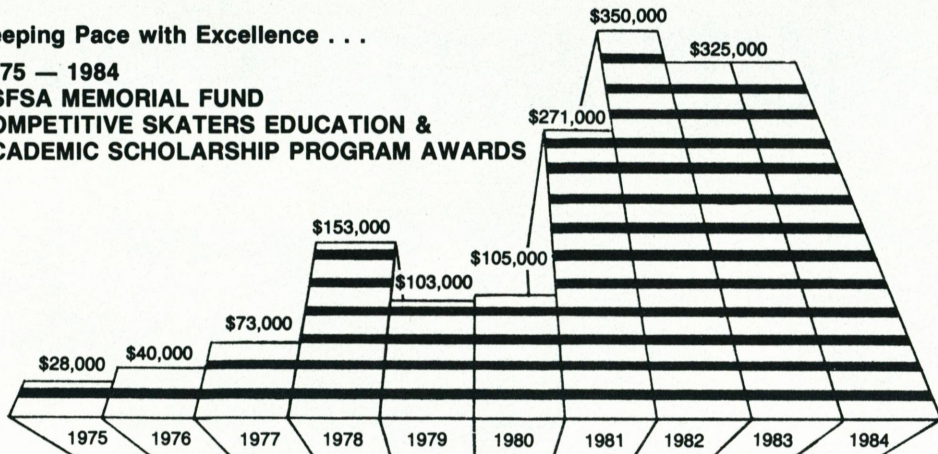

# An Organizational Success In Rochester, New York

**T**he third annual Skate America, entrusted to F. Ritter Shumway's Genesee FSC at Rochester, New York, rates among the best organized international meetings in my experience—thanks to an admirably zealous local committee quite new to such a task, and it would be invidious to single out names from a magnificent backroom team.

Despite late withdrawals of several top names, the participation of fifty-nine skaters from sixteen nations was of rewardingly high quality. Skaters from the host nation won every event and shared the remaining podium positions with British, Canadian, and West German contestants.

**P**robably most predictable was the Pairs victory of Kitty and Peter Carruthers. Their back inside death spiral and superbly-timed change sit spins took the eye in their clean short, when their required split double Lutz twist lift and double lasso lift never for a moment looked in doubt. Their long was also difficult to fault, with lateral twist and throw triple Salchow the outstanding highlights.

Jill Watson and Burt Lancon were second best throughout, with enterprising presentation in both short and long. Their pair sit spin



in the short was strikingly original while, in the long, two triple twists and a throw double Salchow were salient elements of a shrewdly devised program marred only when Burt's arms "collapsed" during their table top lift. Melinda Kunhegyi and Lyndon Johnston did well to overhaul Gillian Wachsman and Robert Daw for third place. The Canadians reached their peak with throw double Axel, throw triple Salchow, and side-by-side double Axels.

The injured Susan Garland had the unusual experience of watching her former partner Robert, with whom she won three British national titles, during which time she outgrew him. The petite Gillian is obviously more suited to Robert, as evidenced by their throw triple Salchow, triple twist, and throw triple toe loop. Robert, though qualifying by residence for the U.S. national team, is ineligible to compete for a second nation in the Olympics, having already represented Britain at Lake Placid.

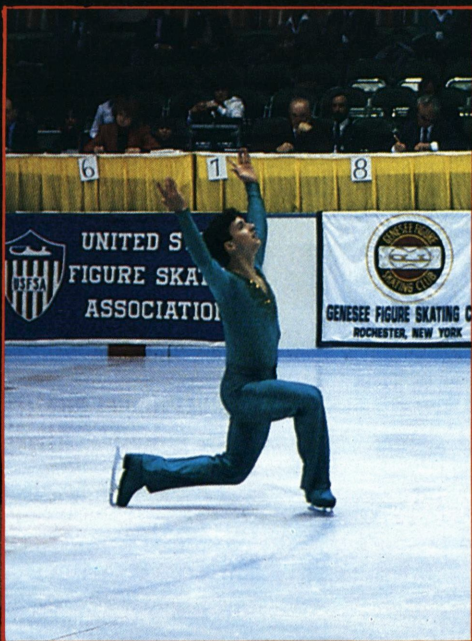
**T**iffany Chin made an unexpectedly profitable start by winning the figures, when her likely main challenger, West German Manuela Ruben, dropped to fifth and subsequent oblivion. Sanda Dubravcic, the Olympic host country's main hope for the Sarajevo Games, took second slot ahead of Kelly Webster and Jill Frost.

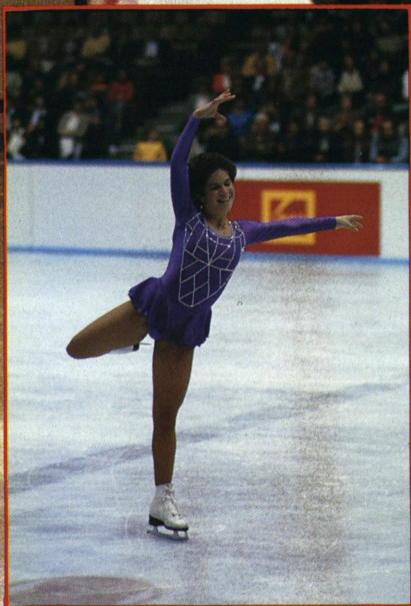

Giving nothing away in the short, Tiffany's very well-landed triple toe loop combination consolidated her earlier advantage. Sanda, attempting double Axel-double loop, paid dearly for missing the latter, allowing Kelly and Jill to overtake her. Kelly made the same mistake as Sanda, but was stronger in the other elements, while Jill, scoring well with her spins, fell while attempting triple toe loop-double loop.

Tiffany's well-polished long put the issue beyond doubt, sweetly landing triple toe loop, triple Salchow, and two high double Axels. Kelly's best jump was triple toe loop, but her two-footed triple loop and double Axel enabled Jill to move up to second. Obviously a great prospect, her triple Salchow and triple toe loop were clinically executed. Her spins were impressive in a well-devised program faulted only when two-footing a double Axel.

Cynthia Coull, bettered only by Tiffany in the long, could not prevent a U.S. grand slam. The effervescent little Canadian held all eyes with her always busy-looking style, neatly combining triple and double toe loops and also featuring a triple Salchow, another triple toe loop, two excellent double Axels, and a superb split jump.

**E**lisa Spitz and Scott Gregory led throughout the dance, while a hectic tussle developed between the Canadians, Kelly Johnson and John Thomas, and Britain's Wendy Sessions and Steve Williams. After gaining the initiative in the opening Paso Doble, the Britons were narrowly outpointed by the Toronto twosome in the Rhumba and Westminster Waltz.

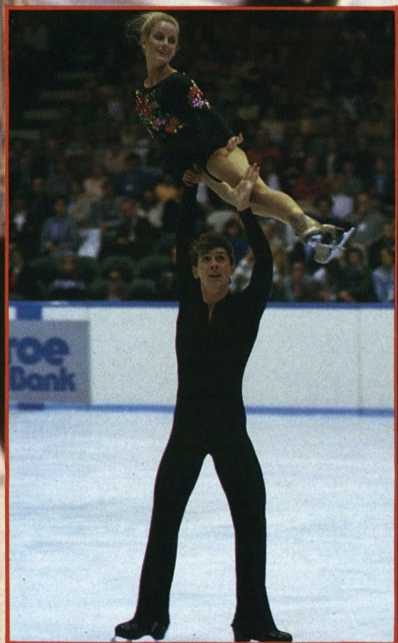
The three top couples interpreted the set pattern dance to Paso Doble rhythm in quite different, entertainingly original ways, with the judges disinclined to change the order.

The free dance also failed to alter the positions, each of the leading couples reflecting in their own distinctive ways a current trend towards more "showy" presentations. It was apparent that dance judges, coaches, and competitors alike have decided to turn a Nelsonian eye on some breaches of the rules regarding separations, jumps, lifts, and various other similarities to pair skating, now only half-heartedly curbed.

One felt that all the dancers were to a great extent experimenting with their new programs, which clearly would be variously adapted and polished come the championships, rendering detailed comment at so early a stage of the season somewhat superfluous.

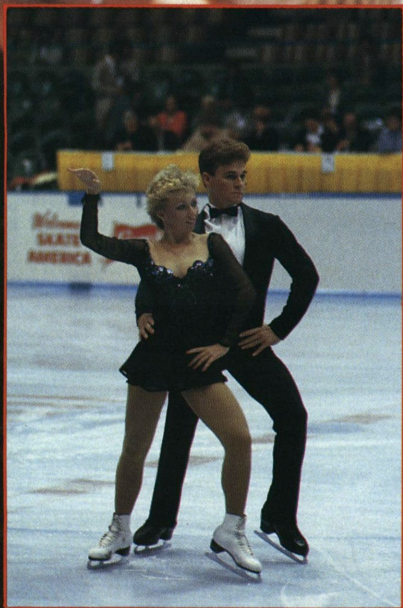

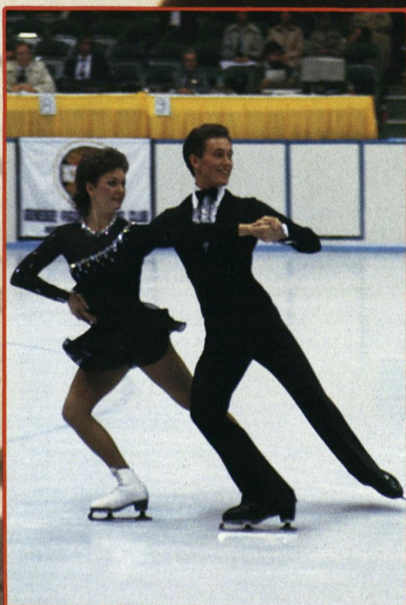

Renee Roca and Don Adair suggested considerable potential and, like several others, an understandable Torvill-Dean influence. Susan Wynne and Joseph Druar, less internationally experienced, no doubt profited much from the outing.

The victory of Elisa and Scott was never in doubt, but the Anglo-Canadian duel for second place stayed alive to the last gasp because the respective merits and sometimes similar styles of these long-standing rivals were so hardly separable.

**T**he main European men's effort was expected from the West German, Rudi Cerne, and so it proved. Brian Boitano set the pace in the figures, but Cerne pressed him hardest and again in the short, while Bobby Beauchamp and Frenchman Fernand Fedronic hotly contested the third spot.

Brian gave no chance in a clean short, replete with triple Lutz. Rudi and Bobby each succeeded with triple toe loop after the obligatory double loop, the West German's very neat serpentine step sequence deserving to sway the balance his way. Fernand, third in figures, dropped to fifth after failing his combination.

The meeting concluded with a storybook finale, the last to skate being the winner and home favorite with the best performance of probably the highest free skating standard in a Men's event since the 1980 Worlds.

The glory of the long was shared by Brian and the Japanese, Masaru Ogawa, the second best free skater and overall fourth. Each landed six different triples—Lutz, loop, Salchow, toe loop, and toe walley—Brian also attempting but two-footing the triple Axel.

Rudi, third in the free—enough to end runner-up—accomplished three triples: toe loop, Salchow, and flip. Bobby Beauchamp had a bad start, faultily landing a triple toe loop combined with a double Axel. He fell from a triple loop, but will be best remembered for eight piston rolls at the end, reminiscent of Gordie McKellen and Ronnie Robertson.

The new ISU regulations, restricting triples and with more specific spin and step sequence requirements, began to take the desired effect generally better balanced, more versatile performances.



**R**ochester deserved better revenue than received, the unfortunate date clashed with the World Series probably affecting attendances as well as helping to dissuade commercial TV support, which should be more readily forthcoming in a non-Olympic season. One hopes that justice will prevail through a lucrative second meeting at the same venue.

# Skaters' Nutrition Levels Analyzed At Sports Medicine Seminar

The life of a competitive figure skater is fast-paced and hectic. And when it comes to eating, many skaters grab a quick snack at the rink or a fast-food restaurant without giving much thought to what they're eating.

Dr. Arnold E. Denton, President of Campbell Soup Company's Institute for Research and Technology, is conducting a survey of USFSA skaters' eating habits to determine their average nutrition level.

In his speech at "Sports Medicine for the Figure Skater," a *free* seminar slated for Saturday, January 21, 1984, during the U.S. Figure Skating Championships in Salt Lake City, Dr. Denton will present the results of his survey, along with some tips and suggestions for improvement.

"Sports Medicine for the Figure Skater," sponsored by Campbell's Soups and Salt Lake City's Holy Cross Hospital, will address many aspects of sports medicine in addition to nutrition.

Joel Fuhrman, a Pairs competitor at the 1973 World Competition, will share his experience with a skating injury and discuss how it led to his interest in podiatry and orthopedics.

"My doctors told me I might never walk again because I had smashed my heel against the ice so many times in jumps," Fuhrman said. "The thing is, ninety percent of the injuries skaters sustain are avoidable if you take some simple safety precautions."

Injury is a subject that Dr. John Bergfeld, President-Elect of the American College of Sports Medicine, also will address at the seminar. An orthopedic surgeon and head of the Sports Medicine Section at Cleveland Clinic Hospital, Dr. Bergfeld is team physician for the Cleveland Browns and Cavaliers and a consultant to the Cleveland Ballet.

Dr. Bergfeld's talk will focus on injury diagnosis and treatment.

In addition, Mr. Keith Henschen, Professor of Sports Psychology at the University of Utah, and Dr. Craig McQueen, Assistant Professor of Orthopedic Surgery also at the University of Utah, will discuss sports psychology and stretching for injury prevention, respectively.

Dr. Howard Silby, Chairman of the USFSA Sports Medicine Committee, will serve as moderator for the seminar and lead a concluding panel discussion and question and answer session.

"Sports Medicine for the Figure Skater" will take place in Ballroom A at the Little America Hotel in Salt Lake City, the headquarters hotel for '84 Nationals. Registration begins January 21, 1984, at 8:30 A.M., and the seminar will be over at noon—in time for the afternoon's competition.

# 1983 BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

The written reports of the Officers and Committee Chairman presented to the 1983 Annual Meeting of the USFSA Board of Directors are contained in the Report Book of the Meeting. Action taken by the Board on specific requests, and action on requests from the floor are summarized as follows:

**President:**

1. Announced that the format of the Governing Council Meeting in May would be changed by replacing the round-table discussions on Friday afternoon with several workshops on specific topics of special interest to clubs.
2. Approved the recommendation of the Ad Hoc Committee on 1987 World Championship Site Selection to award the 1987 World Championships to the Cincinnati, Ohio joint venturer, subject to approval by the ISU.

**Treasurer:**

1. Approved the Treasurer's Report as contained in the Meeting Book.
2. Appointed Fox and Company as auditors for the fiscal year to end June 30, 1984.
3. Created a permanent finance committee and directed the Rules Committee to formulate and draft new rules and a By Law amendment to present to the 1984 Governing Council.

**Amateur Status:**

1. Approved the following members for reinstatement from Professional to Reinstated Amateur Status: Kristin L. Arneson, Rebecca J. Barger, Barbara (Johnson) Carr, Sandra (Knecht) Drogosch, Mary Jo Eyman, Michael W. Fisher, Nancy (De Hays) Hepburn, Ann (Niggin) Ianni, Deborah (Cann) Kiley, Julie

(Bedessem) Lapina, Marie (Palumbo) Larocca, Martha (Baker) Sharp, Marilyn B. Teig, J. Scot Tyson, Betty (Blendin) Zachary.

2. Directed the Chairman to furnish to the Chairman of the Judges Committee the names of those above-listed persons who cited their desire to judge as the primary reason for reinstatement.

**Competition:**

1. Authorized a revision in the sanction for the 1985 Nationals to reflect the new corporate entity and name of Eighty Five Nationals in Kansas City Committee.
2. Directed the formulation of a new rule to require the execution of a contract between the USFSA and the organization awarded a Nationals be a condition precedent to the USFSA accepting a bid from such organization.
3. Authorized the Chairman to issue a sanction for a 1984 National Precision Team Championships.
4. Authorized the purchase of Medals for Regional, Sectional, and National Championships including medals for Precision Team Championships.
5. Authorized the purchase of 2 new computer terminals (not to exceed \$3,000) and 2 new sets of judging boxes.
6. Appointed Mrs. John Leiter of the Wichita Figure Skating Club a National Referee.
7. Directed the Competitions Committee to study the Canadian Figure Skating Association manual for precision team skating, and to report recommendations to the Board at its May meeting.

**Dance:**

1. Approved an amendment to CR 37.052 to read that: the Initial Round shall consist of two Compulsory Dances to be selected by the USFSA Dance Committee and announced at the Annual Meeting of the USFSA each year for the following year.



2. Approved an amendment to TR 17.03 to read: . . . judged, with *the same or* another partner; and . . .
3. Approved an amendment to TR 18.08 to read: . . . candidate to skate with *the same or* another partner . . .
4. Approved an amendment to TR 17.04 to include only Adult Dance Tests (Classes A-E) thereby deleting Class F (Adult Preliminary Dance Test).

Directed ISU Representative to (a) propose age 45, as the maximum age for an ISU Judge appointed, (b) to increase the number of USFSA Judges eligible for appointment to 20, (c) to require ISU Junior figures conform to that of USFSA (3 groups), (d) to require dance music to be at least 20 seconds longer than required number of pattern.

#### **Television and Commercial Sponsorship:**

1. Deposited \$15,000 received from the General Foods sponsorship into the general fund of the Memorial Fund.
2. Directed the Committee to study Television and Commercial sponsorship moneys and how they are to be dispursed when specific skaters are involved in sponsorship.

thing once the music begins. When you learn to fight through some of your own problems in competitive practices your confidence in yourself will mature.

4. Almost every athlete goes through his own "ritual" to warm up and handle tension in every sport. Various, almost superstitious, rituals serve the purpose of telling you the status of your body, alerting your body to prepare, and particularly help in settling the nerves. Obviously, your preparations involve stretching to "awaken" your muscles and should not be overly taxing. The development of a routine or ritual becomes a reassuring communication of mind and body indicating that "all is well" and serves to release nervous energy. Don't worry about anybody finding your ritual "silly." It is always amusing to discuss with former competitors what they did at those times.

5. If you have warmed up in the practice period like "a dream," beware, for you must not stop concentrating. A bad warm-up is actually a greater guarantee that you will not get carried away with yourself. Don't try to "read" how you feel. You should count on your previous training and concentration. Don't try to jump higher or spin faster than ever before. If you succeed in doing so you would probably destroy the timing you have been trained to expect. How many times have we seen someone successfully complete their

most difficult move, and when charged with energy, later fall on something they have mastered? You cannot allow your emotions to overrule disciplined concentration. You should be trying to do the program in competition *as well as*, not better, than you have been doing in training for many weeks.

Skating is a sport in which we can perform only to our own best levels—we are in essence competing with a personal standard we established in training and within that particular program. We are trying to reach our own personal standards. Whether that is sufficient to win is beyond our control. If you can reach your own standard, then give yourself some credit. You will have done your best even if you finish last. It is trite to tell you that the results of an *individual* competition rarely mean much in the context of an entire skating career, leave alone your life. If personal standards are being reached and stretched with succeeding competitions then you will be doing all that is possible to succeed.

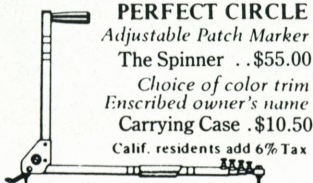

### Steps

**Men:** Two different step sequences are required. The skaters have complete freedom in selecting the kind of step sequences they intend to execute. Jumps may also be included in the step sequences. All step sequences must fully utilize the ice surface. Step sequences that are too short and barely identifiable as such cannot be considered as meeting the requirements for a step sequence, but additional step sequences for the purpose of connecting the various elements are left to the discretion of the skater.

**Ladies:** At least one step sequence is required. The same principles as stated above apply. Sequence of Spirals may be composed either of a sequence of spirals (one or more) or of spirals combined with other free skating movements or of a sequence of free skating movements only, such as turns, arabesques, or spread eagles. Again the requirement is that the sequence fully utilizes the ice surface.

### B. JUNIOR

The same principles apply, only the number of required spins and step sequences being different (see Communication No. 596).

### C. SENIOR AND JUNIOR

*None of the limitations and requirements set forth in the remarks for the Short Program apply.*

## 1984 USFSA HALL OF FAME NOMINATION FORM

Use this form to nominate those persons that are worthy of election to membership in the Hall of Fame and who meet the qualifications in any one of the categories listed below. Only one nomination form per person each year will be accepted and no more than ten nominees in total may be included on each form.

1. Skaters from throughout the world who have compiled an outstanding competitive record and who have made a noteworthy contribution in style or technique and have been retired from competitive skating for at least ten years.
2. Persons who have made a noteworthy contribution to figure skating in a non-skating capacity through service to an amateur figure skating association and have not been active in such capacity for at least five years.
3. Persons who have made a noteworthy contribution to figure skating in a non-amateur capacity. Non-teaching professionals must have been retired at least five years, while teaching professionals must have at least twenty-five years of experience as such.

Following compilation of all nominations received by the closing date of February 1, 1984, the 27 Hall of Fame Electors (3 from each Region) will vote for the eligible nominees in each category. The announcement and induction of the successful candidates into the Hall of Fame will take place at the Annual Meeting of the USFSA Governing Council in May 1984:

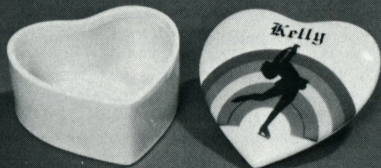

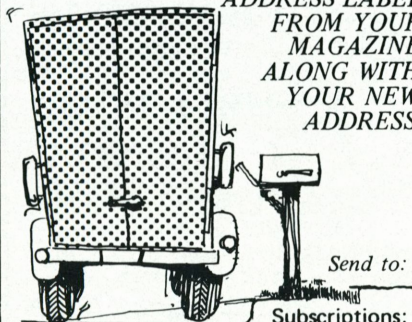
