

#### DIET FOR THE INJURED ATHLETE

Injury can occur fairly rapidly and without warning even to the most trained athlete. It can happen during training or in competition when stress is high. When this happens, the athlete's healing time can range from just a few days off training to extensive bedrest and hospitalization, depending on the severity of the injury.

Dietary adjustments may be needed for the injured athlete in order to maintain proper body weight. If hospitalization and prolonged bedrest is required, the athlete is usually under the care of a trained dietitian to follow a particular dietary regimen; however, for those skaters whose injury is not so severe, simple rest from training may be the solution. For these individuals, here are some simple suggestions for dietary changes to speed your recovery and return to the ice:

1. Reduce total caloric intake. Since total caloric intake for an active athlete in training is high because energy expenditure is high, the normal solution is to reduce the amount of foods eaten to cut down on calories. If an athlete persists in eating his normal share of food when he was in training, he will probably gain weight during bedrest. Remember, however, that though you may be eating less, it is always important to eat well.


He was around forty, tall impeccably dressed, with a skating style to match his clothes, nothing flamboyant in either, a lawyer, I'd say about \$85,000 per. As I finished a detailed explanation of a choctaw, he stood resolutely in front of me and said, "I know what to do, Gene. I know how to do it! I also know where, when, if, and why. Just tell me one thing. Tell me to do it!!"

Take the case of a psychiatrist (two daughters skating) who described coming to the end of a ski run, one of many that day, to be told by a ski instructor, "You're tired. Take them off, you're through!"—all this related very proudly.

Lesson-taking is a mixed bag. The varieties are endless, from the desire to learn everything to the desire to be led anywhere. Anything can happen and often does. For instance, what do I tell my sister when she comes to me, as she did one day, to state, "Oh, I had such a wonderful lesson from Jimmy! Why don't you teach me like that?" The Jimmy in question moonlighted skating teaching from his firemen's job, often helping my sister on the ice since they played a lot of tennis together. "Hey, that's great," I said. "What did he teach you?" "Oh, he taught me . . . well, he said . . . ." She made a face. "Oh! He taught me all sorts of things. It was wonderful. But I just can't remember anything!!"

Don't get me wrong, it probably was wonderful, and she must have had a great time. There *are* lessons like that, many of them. I have a pupil who states quite honestly, "I think I mostly want you to watch me. I skate better that way." And he does. My mother used to marvel at the number of kids who would come up to her at the rink. "Watch me do this," they'd plead. She'd stand by the hour not saying much more than, "Do it again." Later, she'd shake her head and mutter, "I don't tell them anything. I think they just want an audience."

The basic lesson is considered to be someone telling you to do something—or not to do something—either eyeball to eyeball or part of a group. The results are again varied, entirely dependent on what is best for you. Are you a good copycat? I was. Skating, golf,



tennis, you name it, that's how I learned. Or maybe you learn better by analysis. Someone's words form patterns in your skull (astonishing how teenagers remember the words to songs on only one hearing.) What about written words? And designed patterns? Do they affect you pleasantly like they do me, or are you as discomfitted by the sight of words as I am by their sound? And some skaters find in rulebook dance patterns only a tangled enigma.

Yet here's one. A thin, shy, bespectacled father asked me one day for lessons for his daughter, but "she won't take unless I do, too." Agreed. But while she was fine, he was hopeless. Absent was everything except intellect—no substitute for physical comprehension. My words were wasted; so was demonstrating. If the aural and the visual were kaput, what was left? In deep frustration, one day, I drew a pattern of what I wanted and added words. He was eagerly reaching for the paper before I'd finished, read it as if it would save his life, then proceeded to perform almost expertly. I was stunned, but he, with an embarrassed smile, said, "I'm sorry, Gene. I should have explained earlier. You see, as an attorney, I get told many things on the phone. I let people finish, answer appropriately, then request the information be sent me by messenger or mailed. Only the printed word do I really comprehend?



On
Curved and
Circular Designs

Your music will tell you what path to take in choreographing designs. If your music has notes that are connected together like a slur, where you hardly hear the beginning or end of each note, (this is called legato) then designs could be used that are connected to one another without a break.

Curved and circular designs standing in one area or moving across the ice produce a sense of flow and a feeling that you are floating in space. You can create designs by tracing circular patterns, curves, and figure eights in the space around you; using different parts of your body just as you would draw these designs on paper with a pencil. Think of all that space around you as that sheet of paper and using your arms, hands, head, shoulders, elbows, etc., draw different patterns all connected together as you stroke. turn threes, and do mohawks. You cannot see the whole pattern at once as you draw these designs in the air, but audiences can remember the design after it is made.


Use your imagination to help you create this kind of movement by picturing yourself under water or floating in space. You cannot move sharply under water. Movements become soft and supple and your body and arms move in a very relaxed sort of way. Think of how your hair flows and moves under water. Keep these images when mov-

ing to the music making curves, circles, and figure eights; little ones with your hands and big ones with your body. Let your body move in different directions concentrating at times on the ribcage alone, then rippling your torso from hips to stomach to chest. See how many ways your body can move without using straight lines.

Using your imagery again, travel through space on curved paths, using curved and rounded movements. Continue this process even when coming to a standstill, turning around, or changing levels by kneeling or going all the way down to the ice.

Find a way to finish in a stop that shows the same feeling of this way of moving, but in a still position. You can use your body, head, and limbs to form these curved and circular shapes and hold them in a freeze, so that the design can be seen as long as the body is held in this position.

Many slow parts of programs use legato music. Therefore, curved and circular designs would be well suited to these parts. They give feelings of softness and gentleness and are soothing to watch. You can build a story around these movements that portray feelings of love, sadness, or happiness. This will help you to feel your music more, making you a more emotional and interpretive performer.



# Sundae's Review

#### PRECISION PARENTS

The team has had a meeting as well as a few practices. Things are progressing smoothly on the ice. Now is the time to call a meeting of the parents and encourage their *PROPER* involvement in the team.

At the first meeting the committee and coach should be present. It is important a parent is there to represent each skater.

Several weeks prior in a general meeting for those prospective members, the coach gave a list of competitions the team would hopefully attend. Dates may have been changed and other competitions may have arisen. A revised list of competition dates should be given. The parents must be informed of any changes, and they should be cooperative. The coach knows the competitions held throughout the season and it is the coach's decision what competition the team shall enter. The parents and committee should have confidence in the coach and not question the decision. To reach his/her decision, the coach weighed carefully the pros and cons of each competition and decided what would be in the best interest of the team. The competitions and dates were not just pulled out of a hat at random.

There is much work involved in a precision team and it is not all on the ice with the skaters and coach. The committee should give a list of jobs that need to be handled. There are several—costumes, funding-raising, and team travel to name a few.

Many fund-raisers are necessary during a season and the parents should share equally in participation. One or two parents cannot handle this undertaking alone. Fund-raising is a major issue and an article or two will be designated to it during the year.

Being in charge of team costumes is a major responsibility. Depending upon the size of the team a few parents should be assigned to handle team wardrobe.

If the team has a banner, a parent should be responsible for its arrival to and from a competition.

There should be a parent or two in charge of team travel, making transportation and hotel accommodations. This job takes careful planning.

Most important is to assign certain parents as team chaperones. Two parents designated head chaperones should recruit another two parents on a rotational basis to assist them at competitions and exhibitions. These parents take attendance on the team bus, room check, attendance at team breakfast and dinner, assist the skaters in the dressing room, and are present to take guards and jackets at the official warm-up. It is the responsibility of the parents who are not attending the competition or exhibition, to make it clear to their children that the chaperones are in charge off the ice and they are to be treated with the utmost respect.

Finally, the parents should be encouraged to speak in a positive manner about the team and refrain from criticism of team activities, obligations, and team members. Cooperation begins at *home*. The skaters reflect the attitude presented in their home. Generally, the parents least willing to help have the skaters with the poorest attendance record and the "I don't care attitude."

#### **USOC NATIONAL SPORTS** FESTIVAL MOVING AHEAD

#### WARM-UPS AND STRETCHES ARE **TOPICS AT '85 NATIONALS SPORTS** MEDICINE SEMINAR

Warming up and stretching are essential phases of quality ice training that are often neglected by skaters who are in a rush to dash onto the rink for their precious practice time. However, a good, quick warm-up routine off the ice that raises a skaters's pulse rate is critical for fine performance.

"When I ask most skaters if they warmed up or stretched their muscles before beginning to practice their routines, they usually say, 'yes,' " says Ricky Harris, skating choreograographer, teacher, former professional ice skater and author of Choreography and Style for Ice Skaters. "When I dig a little further and ask them what they did, they usually say they put their leg up on the railing and stretched a bit. The fact is, that's not really warming up! In fact, it's also a good way for skaters to open themselves up for unnecessary injuries."

Ms. Harris will share her expertise on "Warm-Ups and Stretches: The Key to Quality Ice Training," at "Well-Being: The Competitive Edge," a half-day seminar for skaters, their parents, and coaches to be held during the 1985 U.S. Figure Skating Championships in Kansas City. The seminar, created by Campbell's Soups, national sponsor of the U.S. Figure Skating Team, and Baptist Medical Center of Kansas City, takes place at the Westin Crown Center on Saturday, February 2, 1985, from 8:30 A.M. until noon.

"Skaters don't realize that they can actually save valuable ice time by warming up off the ice for about two minutes. You can increase your pulse rate by doing a set of exercises on the floor in tennis shoes or ballet slippers," Ms. Harris says.

In an experiment with a twelve-year-old skater, Ms. Harris proved to herself that warming up and stretching off the ice really works. The skater came to the rink each day after school to practice and did two minutes of warming up off the ice. Then she went on to the ice and immediately began practicing her program. At first it was difficult for her, Ms. Harris says, but within three months, she was going right into the program and landing her tricks.

"This is possible for most skaters," says Ms. Harris. "If your body is warmed up and your pulse rate is heightened, you can really have a much more efficient practice session."

Ms. Harris will explain the details of her suggested warm-up and stretching routine during her presentation at the seminar.

"I think warming up and stretching should be mandatory," says Ms. Harris. "No gymnast, football player, or ballet dancer would ever dream of beginning to practice without preparing their bodies with warm-ups and stretches. There's no reason skaters shouldn't do this too."

Other topics and speakers for the seminar are: "Growing Up On the Ice: Hints on Suc-

#### MENSTRUAL CRAMPS

This is a problem that affects over half of all menstruating women, and since a very large percentage of our skating population is female this is a problem that afflicts many skaters to one degree or another. This problem is called *dysmenorrhea*, which means difficult monthly flow. About 10 percent of women with dysmenorrhea are incapacitated for 1-3 days each month, making this the greatest single cause of missing school and work among young women. We are uncertain of the exact effect on skating training and performance, but feel that it would be similar.

The symptoms associated with dysmenorrhea usually begin several hours before or just after the onset of the menstrual flow. The pains are cramping in nature and are strongest in the lower abdomen but may be felt in the low back and thighs. Other symptoms are present in 50 percent of the women having problems; these include nausea and vomiting, fatigue, diarrhea, backache, and headache. The symptoms may last from a few hours to one day, but seldom last for longer than 2-3 days.

The usual form of cramps, primary dysmenorrhea, usually occurs in normal cycles where an egg is released from the ovary and is reassuring that things are functioning normally. This usually starts within 6-12 months of the onset of regular ovulatory cycles. The periods from the onset of menses may be irregular for this length of time and are not associated with the passage of an ovum from the ovary. Another type of cramping, secondary dysmenorrhea, usually starts years after the onset of periods and may be associated with other forms of pathology of the female organs. This form requires further investigation by your doctor and different forms of treatment depending on the problem found.

Not too many years ago, people thought that there was a strong psychological element in women that complained of cramps with their periods. We have now shown that there is a chemical called *prostaglandin* that is formed in the uterus associated with menstrual flow, and that higher levels of this compound are found in people that have more severe symptoms with their periods. Treatment is now available with medication that

counteracts the prostaglandin and relieves the symptoms.

Patients in the past tried using heating pads, rest, aspirin, and many other remedies with varying degrees of success. There are many tablets in the drug store for treatment of cramps and these also have limited success. The treatment that is used now, requires the use of the medications that decrease the amount of prostaglandin formed and also counteract it's effects on the body. These drugs are well tolerated and have few side effects. Another form of treatment that is successful is the use of birth control pills. However, there are more side effects and problems associated with the use of these pills. Both forms of treatment require prescriptions and therefore evaluation by your physician.

In summary, the common form of menstrual cramps starts shortly after the onset of periods. They are associated with normal cycles where an egg is released by the ovary. The cramps are caused by a chemical that is released by the uterus, which causes the cramping and other symptoms. If you suffer from this problem, safe effective medications are available from your physician that will relieve your symptoms and prevent you from losing time from skating, school, or work.

The Sports Medicine Committee is currently engaging in a research study to attempt to determine the effect of dysmenorrhea and the premenstrual syndrome on your skating performance and training. Many of you will be receiving questionnaires as part of this study. Your cooperation in completing these and returning them promptly will be very much appreciated.

- 2. Select a balanced meal, emphasizing foods with quality protein. Studies have shown that during injury, protein requirement increases. Protein is needed for tissue repair and antibody synthesis. A diet carefully planned and balanced will normally furnish the increased protein need. It is important to at least remember to select good quality protein such as cheese, milk, meats, poultry, fish, or, when using dried beans or legumes, to compliment these protein sources with rice or eggs. Check with your doctor for advice on vitamin supplements. And, if your injury is to a bone, you might want to ask if you should be increasing your calcium intake.
- Eat lightly, use the multi-snack concept. Often times an injury may restrict mobility, and when this happens, eat-

ing large meals may not be the most comfortable. The multi-snack concept should be useful—take light meals with several in-between-meal snacks. Healthy choices for snacks should be fruits, fresh vegetables, or soups, or even cereal and milk.

It is important to know that there is no "magical" diet that will heal an injury faster. The myth has been that high zinc, Vitamin C or E intake may induce faster healing. Though these nutrients are important in wound healing and scar-tissue formation, the balanced diet concept is still the safest and most logical approach. Rest, balanced diet, and drugs (if prescribed by a doctor) and a proper amount of exercise are still the soundest therapy for an injured athlete.

This is the second in a series on tracking in ice dancing. The articles are excerpts from the book. Ice Dancing Illustrated, by Lorna Dver.

"Tracking" is the process of positioning the partners relative to one another and the "tracker" is the partner primarily responsible for that positioning. This article deals with tracking when partners are skating in closed position. The forward skating partner is the tracker in this situation.


The general rule for tracking in closed position is that the forward skating partner skates as far as possible to the outside of the tracing of the backward skating partner's skating foot. This positioning of the partners permits skating with maximum closeness without tripping.

The Swing Dance is the first dance in which closed position is skated and the general rule of closed position tracking can be demonstrated. Steps 1 through 8 are the chassé sequences and the swing rolls. They are skated in closed position with the man skating forward. He is the tracker and places his skating foot *outside* the woman's tracing, i.e., on the side of the woman's foot that is away from the center of the circle. Likewise, steps 14 through 23 are skated in closed position, but with the woman skating forward and acting as the tracker. She, like the man did earlier in the dance, places her skating foot to the outside of the man's tracing. Finally, steps 29 and 30 are skated in closed position with the man tracking once more outside the woman's tracing.

One exception to the general rule for tracking in closed position occurs when the forward skating partner enters a three turn. In this case, the turner should enter the turn with the skating foot outside the backward skating partner's tracing, but the turner's foot should be placed as close as possible to the backward skating partner's tracing (rather than as far outside as suggested in the general case). Closeness of the two skaters' feet during the turn promotes greater control during the turn. Examples of this situation occurs in the Willow Waltz, where step 8 is a right forward outside edge with a dropped three turn for the woman, and step 14 is a left forward outside edge with a dropped three turn for the man.

Experiment with a partner by skating a series of swing rolls down the side of the arena. Have the forward skating partner track as far as possible to the outside of the tracing of the backward skating partner and still maintain control. If you feel out of control, have the tracker move in toward the backward skating partner's skating foot until control



RICHMOND, ENGLAND **SEPTEMBER 25-27, 1984**

Six U.S. skaters paid a very successful visit to the Richmond Ice Rink in England from September 25-27. The occasion was the St. Ivel Ice International, and the result was two victories, a second place, and a third in four events. They thus kept up the standard set by such past winners as Linda Fratianne, Sandy Lenz, Elaine Zayak, Tiffany Chin, and Judy Blumberg and Michael Seibert.

Altogether, there were forty-three skaters from thirteen countries, and outstanding among them was the U.S.'s Brian Boitano. In compulsory figures, he was in a class by himself; the British judge Vanessa Riley was so impressed by his inside counter and back paragraph loop that she gave him 4.0 for each of them, in an event where the marks seldom went above 3.2. The judges were unanimous; they were equally of one mind in giving second place in figures to seventeen-year-old Grzegorz Filipowski of Poland. Joachim Ehmann (West Germany) was third; Russia's World Junior champion Victor Petrenko was fifth, with turns about six inches off axis in the forward paragraph brackets.

In the Men's short programs, it was a different story. The Russian excelled himself with a triple Lutz/double toe loop combination, and he was placed first in this section by every judge except the Pole. He preferred his fellow-countryman Filipowski, who slipped on some steps and skated in a slightly rough style. His combination included a triple toe Salchow.

Brian Boitano did the same combination as Petrenko, but had to put a hand down to steady himself on the triple Lutz. Skating to the James Bond theme, he moved fast and smoothly round the rink.

Going into the final free skating, Boitano led on combined results with Filipowski second and Petrenko third. This last section of the event provided some exciting skating. Canadian Kevin Parker, fourth in figures and sixth in the short, had been doing good triple jumps in practice. In the competition, he disappointingly did none at all, and dropped to eighth and last in the long program. Paul Robinson, of Britain, did a good triple toe loop and a triple Salchow; his triple flip was unsteady, but he moved up to fourth place in the final results. Grzegorz Filipowski tried a triple Axel, but landed forwards, and later turned what should have been a triple loop into a double.

The two best men skated last. Victor Petrenko opened with a fine triple Lutz; he seemed inspired by his music (mainly Tchaikovsky) and did three more triples, but his style lacked polish. That quality was abundantly present in the performance by Brian Boitano, who skated without fault except for a slightly over-rotated double Axel. This was a fine program, awarded first place by every judge except one, and Brian added one more international prize to his victories in Holland, Skate Canada, and Skate America.

In the Ladies' singles, the United States did not achieve prominence until the last stage. European skaters dominated the compulsory figures. Cornelia Tesch (West Germany) won all three figures and Claudia Villiger, of Switzerland, celebrated her fifteenth birthday by placing second. Cynthia Coull (Canada) had been fifth after the outside rocker, but a fine forward paragraph loop brought her up to third. Kathryn Adams, of the U.S., competing in only her second international event, was fourth.

The short program produced a sparkling performance from the British champion Susan Jackson, full of zip and including a

triple toe loop in her combination jump. She won this section, ahead of the Canadian Cynthia Coull, who had been runner-up the previous year in Pairs, with Mark Rowsom. Miss Coull's delightful interpretation of the Railway Children film music brought her first places from the Yugoslav and Canadian judges, but she was finally placed second in the short. Third was Miss Adams, whose combination included a triple toe loop.

An interesting situation had now developed. Miss Tesch and Miss Jackson had each won one section, but had not done well in the other. The most consistent skater was Miss Coull, who now took the lead on combined results. Could she win overall? It seemed likely, especially when her long free included a triple toe loop and attracted several marks of 5.5 and a 5.6. She fell on her triple Salchow, however, and there was still a chance for the last skater, the girl from Walnut Creek, California. Miss Adams seized her opportunity. She showed real feeling for her music (part of it from Johann Strauss's Die Fledermaus), and skated throughout with elegant grace. A fall on a triple loop jump did not put her off, and her marks included five 5.6's. So from fourth place she deservedly moved up to first.

Inna Bekker and Sergei Likhansky, from the Soviet Union, won the Pairs' contest, with Kathryn Keeley and Joseph Mero, of the U.S., second. The Americans have been partners only since May, and this was a creditable achievement. Kathryn is petite and Joe is tall; their contrasting stature brought back memories of former U.S. Pair champions Cynthia and Ronald Kauffman.

Most fiercely contested of all events was the ice dance. The first two compulsories—Viennese Waltz and Yankee Polka—resulted in a tie between the Russians Natalia Annenko and Genrekh Sretenski and the three-times champions of Canada, Tracy Wilson and Robert McCall. Only after the Blues was the issue resolved, with the French, Russian, British, and Czech judges all voting for the Moscow couple. Like Miss Villiger, Miss Wilson had a birthday on this day—she was twenty-three—and like the Swiss girl, she too finished second in her event.

The next night's original set pattern Quickstep produced a win for the Canadians, but as this section carried only twenty percent of the marks, the Russians still led on the combined results. Everything depended on the free dancing on the last night. Here there were lively performances from the two Japanese couples, original touches from the Hungarians, and some good, fast footwork from Susan Wynne and Joseph Druar, of New York, which took them to third place. But the result was determined by the last two couples to skate. Tracy Wilson and Robert McCall used music by a Ouebec composer, André Gagnon, and their skating exactly matched it—sometimes dramatic, sometimes lyrical, and always beautiful. By contrast, the Russians' choice of Rhapsody in Blue sounded trite. Their skating was of high quality, but not quite enough to win. The Canadians, therefore, triumphed, but by the narrowest of margins—four judges to three.

Exhibition skaters at Richmond included Robin Cousins, Karen Barber and Nicky Slater, and among the capacity audience were Mrs. Mildred Richardson (1924 Olympic pair skater, now aged ninety-one) and Benjamin T. Wright, of Belmont, Massachusetts (ISU Technical Committee member).

Fairbanks, Alaska, the second-largest city of America's "last frontier," is remote from the rest of the USFSA. Life at the top of the world is exciting, challenging, and out-of-the ordinary. The darkness of December's days is very dark, the light of the midnight sun is very bright, and the length of time between USFSA test sessions has always been very long.

Recently, opportunities for spectators and participants in today's most popular winter sports have flourished in Fairbanks, with the number of figure skaters growing right along with the community.

The Fairbanks Figure Skating Club, established by a handful of skating enthusiasts in 1980, has 200 members from over 100 families. The club's ice schedule offers members approximately 24 hours of year-round ice time a week in the newly-renovated 7.3 million dollar Big Dipper Ice Arena where there is currently no user fee.

As the club's membership grew, the need for resident USFSA judges became more and more pronounced. Having local figure and dance judges has been one of the major goals of the Fairbanks FSC for the last two years.

In four years, the Fairbanks FSC has sponsored only a handful of test sessions. The cost of bringing USFSA judges to Fairbanks was too high to allow more frequent testing here.

Although monthly test sessions are held in Anchorage, Alaska, the costs of participating, both in dollars and time, because of the distance between our cities, not to mention the distance to test sessions outside the state, have prevented most Fairbanks skaters from testing more than once a year.

The cost of fulfilling the standard USFSA judges' requirements from a Fairbanks residence are prohibitive. Only a few Fairbanks FSC members were able to make progess in trial judging and, although they had been involved in judges' training for up to three years, none had been able to participate in enough trial judging to earn an appointment.

Through the efforts of the club's Test and Competitions Committee Chairman, Randi M. Wagner, with strong support from the club's Board of Directors, an out-of-the-ordinary option was found for our out-of-the-ordinary distance from the rest of the USFSA. Practicability tests are the answer for Fairbanks.

With financial support from the USFSA and moral support from Anne Gerli, Chairman, Judges Committee, Ann Fauver, National Vice Chairman for Judges' Education and Training, and Ida Tateoka, Vice Chairman for Figure Judges, the Fairbanks FSC was able to sponsor a USFSA Prospective B Figure and Dance Judges' School on May 18 and 19, followed by practicability tests for Low Test Figure and Bronze Dance Test judges' appointments on May 20, 1984.

Ann Fauver, in a letter to Margaret Freepartner, Judge-in-Charge of the Fairbanks Judges' School, captured the spirit of the event: "To those of use so far removed from Alaska, your plans for a Low Figure and Bronze Dance School and practicability tests sounds like pioneering on the frontier! Blessings on you for spreading the USFSA gospel!"

Thirteen members of the Fairbanks FSC and three members of the Anchorage FSC participated in the school, attending six hours of on-ice training and eight and one-half hours of classroom instruction led by the Panel of Moderators for the He Judges' School and practicability tests, Mrs. Margaret H. Freepartner, Judge-in-Charge, and Mrs. Patricia J. Smart and Mr. Ben M. Wade.

Members of the Panel, assisted by Fairbanks professional skating instructors, Mr. Glenn Patterson, Ms. Teri Langman, and Ms. Judy Johnson-Bouts.

The visiting judges, for whom this was the first experience with practicability tests, agreed that, although the time spent in formal training sessions is short, this method of judges' training is perfectly suited to remote areas.

"We need to encourage people to build the sport," said Pat Smart, Gold Figure and Dance Judge, who has been a USFSA judge for twenty years. "We need judges to maintain the interest. Practicability tests must be used, because of the remoteness, to promote the sport."

About the prospective judges enrolled in the school, Ben Wade, National Figure and Silver Dance Judge, said, "We are refining what they already know." He also pointed out that the USFSA provides a great deal of material to refer to after the school. "The USFSA books are excellent," he said.

During the test session following the school, twelve of the participants in the Judges' School took practicability tests. While Fairbanks and Anchorage skaters were judged for the record by the official judges, the prospective judges tested their evaluative skills.

After consideration by the school's panel of judges and further evaluation by the USFSA Vice Chairman for Figure Judges and Vice Chairman for Dance Judges, the following Fairbanks FSC members earned judges' appointments as a result of the weekend activities: Mr. Alfred S. Atkins, Jr., Mrs. Lyn Fry, Sam A. McConkey, M.D., Mr. Robert L. McHattie, Mr. Randy Rice, Mr. Robert E. Schermerhorn, Mrs. Belinda K. Swift, and Mrs. Randi Wagner, Low Test Figure Judges, and Mr. Alfred S. Atkins, Jr., Ms. Linda Bursiel, Sam A. McConkey, M.D., Mr. Randy Rice, Mr. Robert E. Schermerhorn, and Mrs. Randi Wagner, Bronze Dance Test Judges.

The Fairbanks FSC now has eight figure judges and six dance judges. Test sessions are

being held regularly for the first time here, building enthusiasm and encouraging improved skating among our members.

The Fairbanks FSC plans to continue to grow by providing opportunities for its judges to keep up with the skating abilities of its members. "Practicability tests can be conducted for any level of test judging," said Margaret Freepartner, International Figure and World Dance Judge. "The club is on its way."

We *are* on our way. From the top of the world, the Fairbanks FSC is coming closer and closer to the world of the USFSA.

is regained. Find your "comfort zone," that is, find out how far outside your partner's tracing you, as the tracker, can go to increase the thrill and flow of the edge and still maintain your balance. Repeat this exercise with the other person doing the tracking. Develop this aspect of tracking to facilitate greater run on the edge, lean of the body, and excitement!

# 1984 PRECISION NATIONALS

n a bright sunny Sunday in May, the best precision teams in the United States assembled, in Bowling Green, Ohio, to compete in the National Championships.

This was a great day for precision skating as this was the first USFSA National Precision Team Championships.

Thirty-eight teams participated: six Juvenile, nine Novice, seven Adult, nine Junior, and seven Senior. The crowds were large. The cheering sections were in good voice.

The Juvenile division (eleven and under) took to the ice first. The Juveniles are the cute little ones that everyone loves to watch. The first two places were extremely close between the Fraser Mini-ettes (Fraser FSC) and the Wyandotte Rising Stars (Wyandotte FSC). Fraser won with a fairly difficult routine that was marred by a line break. Wyandotte skated to a second with a less difficult, but wellchoreographed, cute, and well-executed routine. The scoring was close, four 1's for Fraser, three for Wyandotte. The St. Clair Shores FSC's Ice Angels skated very well to third place.

The Adults were next. The Colonial Acton Ups (Colonial FSC) showed their dancing abilities as they took all 1's. The second-place Bostonians (SC of Boston) did an excellent job, but could not match the Acton Ups. The Midland FSC's Precision Patriots skated smoothly and consistently, but could not match the two eastern teams dancing.

The Novice event featured some strong, evenly-matched, but different-styled teams. The Buffalo FSC's Hot Fudge Sundaes took first with four 1's. They skated thirty-two skaters with excellent transitions and unison. The second-place Colonial FSC's Nashoba Valley Colonials had one 1, skated twenty-eight skaters, and were very strong, smooth, and consistent. The third-place Fraser Juniorettes (Fraser FSC) had two 1's, skated twenty-four, and appeared to be somewhat quicker than the other two, but were not quite as accurate. The flight really put the officials to the test and prepared them for what was to come next.

The Junior flight was really a tough one. All three top teams looked great. The style of these three teams were more similar than the top Novice teams. They all skated with authority, had good transition with difficult routines.

The Buffalo FSC's Hot Fudge Sundaes edged out the Hamden FSC's Figurettes (second) and the Hayden Recreation Centre FSC's Haydenettes (third). The flight was so close that Buffalo won with one 1 and six 2's. Hamden and Hayden had three I's each. The Eastern Section can be proud of these three fine teams.

The Senior division was won by the strong-skating Fraser FSC's Fraserettes, who showed power, good transition, nice dance steps, and consistency while securing all 1's. The Wyandotte FSC's Ice Crystallettes skated very well to dash up se-
