

About a half dozen years ago a skating professional friend of mine, Sid Moore, of Los Angeles, told me about *The Inner Game of Tennis*, saying it was worthwhile, be sure to read it, etc. Oh, sure, I said, and promptly forgot about it. Recently, while trying to revive my golf game I chanced upon *The Inner Game of Golf*, same author, Timothy Gallwey. I read some of the contents and was so entranced I looked up Gallwey's *Inner Tennis*, noting at the same time his third book, *Inner Skiing*. After devouring the three of them all I can say is, for anyone who ice skates these are a must. Actually, they apply to all sport—and to most of life itself.

His message in all three books is simple; trust your body. Don't let your thinking interfere with your physical ability. Most books related to sports are instructional manuals designed to teach fundamentals, the how-to-do basics. These are not. Instead, Gallwey takes us further, into our minds, to show how to turn off that which inhibits learning. As such, Gallwey answers an important need, for nothing gets in the way of learning more than out-thinking oneself.

I confess I was a bit skeptical during the first pages. There seemed to be no meat to chew on. Then it dawned on me that this was how I learned to skate, to play tennis, and play golf. Gallwey says let your body do it. Visualize, feel, let the body go—the way children, the greatest learners of all, learn.

At the finish of one book he sums up all three in this paragraph (the italics are mine). "We begin with the observation that many of our difficulties in tennis (read skating) are mental in origin. As tennis players we tend to think too much before and during our shots; we try too hard to control our movements; and we are too concerned about the results of our actions and how they might reflect on our self-image. In short, we worry too much and don't concentrate very well. To gain clarity on the mental problems in tennis we introduced the concept of Self 1 and Self 2. Self 1 was the name given to the conscious ego-mind which likes to tell Self 2, the body and unconscious computer-like mind, how to hit the tennis ball. The key to spontaneous, high-level tennis is in resolving the lack of harmony which usually exists between these two selves. This requires the learning of several inner skills, chiefly the art of let-



ting go of self-judgements, letting Self 2 do the hitting, recognizing and trusting the natural learning process, and above all gaining some practical experience in the art of concentration."

He quotes Fritz Perls, father of Gestalt therapy: "Human beings are the only species of life which has the capability of interfering with its own growth." Then he goes on to say, "Fortunately, most children learn to walk before they can be told how to As a result, children not only learn how to walk very well, but they gain confidence in the natural learning process which operates within them When a child loses his balance and falls, the mother doesn't condemn it for being clumsy. She doesn't even feel bad about it; she simply notices the event and perhaps gives a word or gesture of encouragement. Consequently, a child's progress in learning to walk is never hindered"

Gallwey insists we all still have this natural process. "Let it happen," he says, stressing the word "let." He feels our bodies are often smarter than we are. My best golf shots occur when I don't think. A deeply-leaned backward outside edge or fast mohawk are not thought-out motions. Heaven help us if we had to think about them first. Or as the late Hans Johnsen told it: "One day, I'd nearly finished describing some complicated move to Hayes (Jenkins, 1956 Olympic Champion, umpteen World titles) when he interrupted. 'Hans' said he, 'if I had to think of everything necessary to get my hand out of my pocket to scratch my head, I'd never make it?"

SPORTS MEDICINE SEMINAR FOCUSES ON HEALTH AND FITNESS ISSUES FOR FIGURE SKATERS

After a long workout, skaters often rush to the vending machine to grab a snack. It might fill them up—but does it really help them nutritionally? Snacks can provide important nutrient and caloric contributions to the total day's intake. It's important that snacks are planned with this in mind.

We conducted a survey of USFSA skaters' eating habits to determine their snacking habits and the nutritional contribution of snacks eaten by figure skaters. Our findings will be presented at "Well-Being: The Competitive Edge," a *free* seminar for skaters, parents, and coaches, planned for Saturday, February 2, during the 1985 U.S. Figure Skating Championships in Kansas City, Missouri.

"Well-Being: The Competitive Edge," sponsored by Campbell's Soups and Kansas City's Baptist Medical Center, will address many important health and fitness issues for figure skaters in addition to nutrition.

Ricky Harris, a figure skating choreographer, author, and former professional skater, will share her expertise on the benefits of warming up and stretching before taking to the ice. "Skaters don't realize that they can actually save valuable ice time by warming up off the ice for about two minutes," said Ms. Harris. "You can increase your pulse rate

by doing a set of exercises on the floor before beginning to practice." Ms. Harris also believes that warming up and stretching can protect skaters from unnecessary injuries.

When skaters do become injured during practice at the rink, it is important to know what steps to take. Dr. J. Douglas Bradley, a certified family physician active in high school athletics and the team physician for his local figure skating club, will present tips on first aid at the rink and treatment of injuries that are realized after the skater leaves the ice.

"There are a lot of needless injuries at the rink because many skaters don't understand the basics of first aid. There are certain things to look for when a skater is injured—and it's not really that hard to know when you can simply help someone up or when you should call your team doctor or an ambulance," said Dr. Bradley.

In addition, Dr. Claudia Berenson, professor of psychiatry at the University of Utah at Salt Lake City, will present her thoughts on "growing up on the ice." "There are ways in which coaches and parents can help skaters focus on overall development during training. All children have typical 'rough spots' in development that can either be smoothed over or made worse by the attitudes of the adults that deal with them," Dr. Berenson said.

Dr. Howard Silby, Chairman of the USFSA Sports Medicine Committee, will serve as moderator for the seminar and lead a concluding panel discussion and question-and-answer session.

"Well-Being: The Competitive Edge;" will take place in the Liberty Room of the Westin Crown Center in Kansas City, Missouri. Registration begins February 2, 1985, at 8:30 A.M., and the seminar will be over at noon—in time for the afternoon's competition.

We hope to see you at the seminar.

THE CAUSES AND PREVENTION OF INJURIES

There has been growing interest in determining and understanding the factors which are responsible for lower extremity injuries in ice skaters. Despite this, little objective information exists. What follows is a study of skating-related injuries during a summer session in 1982.

Several factors may contribute to the development of a significant injury. There are skater factors which include: the age of the skater, the training habits of the skater, the equipment of the skater or the boots. Office training habits may influence the possibility of significant injury. Finally, the complexity and level of skating, particularly the type of jumps, are thought to be important factors in whether a given skater is more prone to develop a significant injury.

The purpose of this study was to evaluate the following:

- 1. To determine the frequency and nature of skating injuries.
- 2. To determine factors responsible for the injuries.
- 3. To assess the effect of off-ice training on the incidence of injuries.

During the summer of 1982, data were collected on 258 ice skaters who were training in the Colorado Springs area. Of these, 170 were training at one rink (Rink A) and 80 individuals were training at a second rink (Rink B). These rinks differed in that Rink B had an active off-ice program in which all skaters were required to participate. Rink A, on the other hand, had no organized program, although some of the skaters at Rink A did participate individually in off-ice training activities.

All the individuals who were injured were injured enough to miss at least three days of ice time. They also requested and were granted financial credit for the time off the ice. This financial credit was given only if a physician confirmed the injury.

The following table lists the reported injuries by ice rink.

We are really growing! We have graduated from skating dresses to unitards in practice. What a boon to skaters and coaches alike.

Leotards and tights have been the accepted costume for dancers in classrooms for many years, as well as in performance. This is because it is the most practical attire for body work. Also, it helps the teacher to immediately see when the positions are "off" in the body, as nothing is there to constrict the view, the dancers (who are constantly looking into a mirror), can also correct their positions better.

A few years back I suggested to some skaters the wearing of leotards and tights for practice, but this idea was vehemently rejected. But when this type of attire became fashionable outside the rink because of the influx of exercise classes, it became an "in" fashion for skaters also.

I love it! They are attractive. You can see the line of the body, and you can't hide the fat! It has been a great inspiration to many a skater who wants to stay "in fashion," to also stay slim. You can't hide the bulges in leotards and tights or unitards.

As for the men, Scott Hamilton set the skating world agog when he first appeared in close-fitting beautiful unitards. I remember him remarking when he first wore one, that he felt he "had nothing on!" But he loved skating in them.

Bathing suits for competitive swimmers are constantly being changed to materials and cuts that allow the swimmer the greatest ease and speed in the water. In swimming every second counts. Speed skaters have adopted the close fitting one piece costume that also helps them achieve the greatest comfort and speed.

Although figure skaters are not racing against each other and the clock, they still have speed to consider, and the comfort of the lightest weight clothing for jumps.

"But what will we do about beading?" I can hear some mother wail! Think of the hours you will have to do something for your-







SPORTS MEDICINE SEMINAR FOCUSES ON "LIFE SKILLS"

Most people realize that competitive figure skating requires a great deal of dedication and time. Young skaters develop tremendous discipline—but they sometimes put aside other important life experiences that are critical to becoming an adult.

Dr. Claudia K. Berenson will share her expertise on "Developing Life Skills While Skating" at "Well-Being: The Competitive Edge—Health and Fitness Issues for Figure Skaters," a *free* half-day seminar for skaters, parents, and coaches to be held during the 1985 U.S. Figure Skating Championships in Kansas City. The seminar is being cosponsored by Campbell's Soups and Baptist Medical Center, February 2, 1985, from 9:00 A.M. until noon at the Westin Crown Center, Kansas City. Registration will begin at 8:30 A.M.

Dr. Berenson is a professor of psychiatry at the University of Utah in Salt Lake City and specializes in child psychiatry. She is also assistant dean of student affairs for the university's school of medicine. Dr. Berenson believes that there are ways in which coaches and parents can help skaters focus on overall development during training.

"All children have typical 'rough spots' in development that can either be smoothed over or made worse by the attitudes of the adults that deal with them," says Dr. Berenson. "Certain differences in a child's temperamental style—or way of solving problems—may hinder the way they handle competition and also hurt their self-esteem.

"I have seen kids struggle with frustration and sadness when they are trying a number of ways to overcome a problem or achieve success in areas that don't even relate to their mastery of skating. These frustrations sometimes leak over into their attitudes and motivation on the ice," Dr. Berenson says.

At each age level, Berenson says that children master certain "growing up" tasks. If they fail to develop skills typical of their age, they may carry a feeling of inferiority. Some psychologists call this a problem in establishing "identity" which can lead to "role confusion."

"For the most part, in the growing up years, these skills are accomplished by a broad range of experiences with parents, peers, and the environment," explains Dr. Berenson. "The dedication and discipline required in skating limits the skater's chances of having as many of these experiences as the average child.

"If children don't experience or master each area of personal development, they will be unable to make the next step in the complicated task of becoming a competent adult."

During her presentation at the seminar, Dr. Berenson will discuss some of the important growing up tasks that skaters in all age groups should accomplish. In addition, she will present ways that the adults who work with skaters can help them develop these skills.

Other topics and speakers for the seminar are: "Good Nutrition: A Key to Developing the Competitive Edge," Dr. Arnold E. Denton, Campbell Soup Company; "Keeping Figure Skaters Healthy," Dr. J. Douglas Bradley, St. Joseph, Missouri; and "Warm-Ups and Stretches: The Key to Quality Ice Training," Ms. Ricky Harris, figure skating choreographer, author, and teacher.




Eva Hunyadi & Jay Pinkerton, USA Dance Fourth



Kathryn Adams, USA Ladies' Fifth





Skate Canada '84 played to capacity audiences in Victoria, British Columbia, the province's capital city on the southern tip of Vancouver Island—Canada's "California North." Neither rainy weather nor schedule delays dampened the enthusiasm of five thousand spectators who packed Memorial Arena to see skaters from thirteen nations compete in all four figure skating disciplines.

Pairs made its debut at Skate Canada this year and, true to tradition, the third-ranked Soviet couple defeated the first-and-second-ranked Canadian and American teams. Deservedly so. Elena Bechke and Valery Kornienko skated a clean short and, apart from a hand down on a throw triple Salchow, a clean and attractive long program with good variation, creative spins, and a refreshing style.

Both Canadian pairs gave performances marred by mistakes and falls. Cynthia Coull and Mark Rowsom had the most difficult program, including side-by-side stag jumps followed by triple toe Walleys and side-by-side camel spins into a pair camel without putting a foot down. But the mistakes were disruptive.

Canadian Champions Kathy Matousek and Lloyd (Herb) Eisler suffered a couple of stumbles in the short program. Then in the long, Kathy fell from two triple throw jumps and in side-by-side double Axels, she did a single while Herb put his hand down on the landing. The program itself, skated to music

from *Ben Hur*, is most appealing and should serve them well when they skate to potential.

Both American couples had their problems as well, though the newly-formed team of Tammy Crowson and Jay Freeman skated a good short—and their striking bright blue body suits with matching boot covers, one red sleeve and white trim seemed well suited to their music, "Power," by Bill Conti. However, Tammy had a fall in the long and a couple of other minor slips left the pair in fifth place overall.


Natalie and Wayne Seybold of the Fort Wayne SC executed a high split double Lutz twist lift with arm overhead and an unusual pair spin in which she is horizontal under his leg. They finished fourth in both programs.

Skating "at seventy percent of what I can do," Tiffany Chin easily won the Silver medal in the Ladies' competition, defeated only by a truly startling display of jumping ability by Japan's Midori Ito. Without the hint of error, Midori landed her triple flip/double toe loop in the short and five different triples in the long, including a double toe/triple toe combination. Her double Axels and other jumps were also executed flawlessly and she brought the crowd to its feet after each performance.

Though she completed her triple toe/double toe combination in warm-up, Tiffany had had some trouble with it during the week and she fell on the triple in the short. A valiant attempt to save the double proved unsuccessful. She completed the combination in the long program, but missed her triple Salchow and singled out on a planned double Lutz. However, her overall program, including beautiful double Axels, lovely spins, and pleasing choreography left some feeling Tiffany should have won despite the jumping problems.

Tiffany said she and coach John Nicks had been working very hard on the figures since the Olympics—and she did win this portion of the competition over Natalia Lebedeva of the Soviet Union and Carola Wolff of the Federal Republic of Germany. Midori was fourth.

Kathryn Adams, from the St. Moritz ISC, placed sixth in figures and seventh in the short, probably because she did a double toe/double toe combination instead of her planned triple. Otherwise her program was

clean and pleasing to the eye. Her free program, including triple toe/double toe combination, was well skated and good enough for fourth spot, placing her fifth overall.

In Dance, Olga Volozhinskaya and Alexander Svinin of the Soviet Union took the lead after the first compulsory dance, the Yankee Polka, and held it throughout the competition. Petra Born and Rainer Schoenborn of the Federal Republic of Germany were solidly in second spot throughout, but Kelly Johnson and John Thomas of Canada had to pull up during the Blues and the Viennese Waltz after Kelly fell on the first round of the first dance. They achieved third place by the end of the compulsories and remained there.


Joseph Druar fell in almost the same spot during the first round of the Yankee Polka, but by the end of the compulsories he and partner Susan Wynne had claimed fourth spot while Eva Hunyadi and Jay Pinkerton were right behind in fifth. These placements did not change.

Both American couples gave pleasing and creditable performances in all phases of the competition. For their free dance, Eva and Jay chose red-and-white folk costumes to skate to a selection of Hungarian dances in


a program that offered some spirited dancing with nice changes of mood. Susan and Joseph exhibited good speed and some unusual moves in their free dance set to music from *La Cage Aux Folles*, "On Your Toes," and "Harlem Nocturne."

Free dance programs ranged from avantgarde (Kelly and John) to classical (Olga and Alexander) to the very dramatic Balletto by Petra and Rainer in which they attempt to tell the story of love and despair in the forest. In striving for originality, many couples showed a tendency to bend rules with separations and over-the-shoulder lifts. But the judges seemed to accept the controversial moves, perhaps as further evidence of the inevitable evolution ice dance is experiencing; it is no longer simply ballroom dancing, but modern dance and ballet that are being transferred to ice.

Brian Orser of Canada took the Men's title as expected. He was second to Heiko Fischer in the figures, but Heiko had to withdraw from the rest of the competition because of a groin injury sustained in practice. Brian had no problem repeating his *Cats* short program from last year—and his new long program seems to expand and enhance

his catlike image. It was a strong, well-choreographed, and packed program, though he did overrotate a triple Salchow and his famed triple Axel became an unplanned double.

The Men's free skate was delayed for two and a half hours when paint was discovered seeping through the ice. The event didn't begin until midnight and the late hour took its toll on all the skaters.

Daniel Doran of the Colorado SC was first up and, except for one fall, he skated a solid performance, including four triple jumps. Daniel skated a clean short with triple Lutz/double toe combination and was satisfied with the figures he traced. But skating first (in both short and long) and his lack of international experience held him to an eighth-place finish.

Mark Cockerell of the Los Angeles SC wasn't too pleased with his figures results:

"The judges must have seen something I didn't." But a good performance of his everpopular Lone Ranger earned him second spot in the short and despite opening up on a planned triple Lutz and omitting the second half of his triple toe/triple toe combination, he placed fourth in the free and fourth overall.

Silver medalist Grzegorz Filipowski of Poland landed the only successful triple Axel of the competition while Bronze medalist Masaru Ogawa of Japan missed his attempt. Canada's Gary Beacom, while displaying the most innovative choreography of the competition, did not skate near his potential.

The Nova Trophy went to the Soviet Union with two Golds and a Silver medal, edging out Canada which earned one Gold, one Silver, and two Bronze medals.


with four triples (two faulty), but Jamison emerged the winner with his modern, artistic program.

Colin Vander Veen, Atlanta FSC, won Novice figures and free skating to win that title. Smooth-skating, thirteen-year-old Todd Eldredge, Philadelphia SC & HS, was second and Doug Webster, SC of Northern Virginia, third.

Strong free-skater Johnny Stephens, Stone Mountain FSC, won the Intermediate title, and Clifford Retamar, SC of Wilmington, won the Juvenile Boys Gold.

The top three Senior Pair and Dance couples were all National quality. Sandy Hurtubise and Craig Maurizi, Philadelphia SC & HS, were a solid team who won both the short program and free skating. Gillian Wachsman and Todd Waggoner, SC of

Caryn's balletic style coupled with excellent spins and well-executed jumps including triple Salchow and triple toe enabled her to win the long program and the Gold medal. Staci McMullin won the Silver, Kris Morzinski the Bronze. Sara House, Colorado SC, was the fourth-place qualifier.

This year's rule change allows the fourth place to move on to Midwesterns as well as Nationals.



THE BRITISH CHAMPIONSHIPS 1984

The British Figure Skating Championships, held at Solihull, near Birmingham, in 1982 and 1983, this year returned to the rink which has been their venue almost continuously since 1967—Richmond. On November 27 and 28, a record number of twenty-one girls contested the Ladies' singles title; this was by far the largest entry since the championship was instituted in 1927.

Last year's winner, nineteen-year-old Susan Jackson from Basford in Nottinghamshire (Jayne Torvill's hometown), began a spirited defense of her crown by winning the compulsory figures. Last year she had been only fourth in this part of the event. This time Maria Geier-Haylock, the 1983 figure leader, took the first figure, but then slipped back into second place. Third was Karen Wood, former World competitor and British champion in 1980 and 1982, who was skating in sad circumstances, for her grandfather had died that morning.

In the short program, Miss Wood began well with a dazzling double Axel, but fell heavily on an attempted triple toe loop in the combination jump. Miss Geier-Haylock too was disappointing, leaving Miss Jackson to score best with a sparkling but safe performance (her combination jump consisted of two double toe loops). Surprisingly, her Axel was a single instead of the required double. There was an unexpectedly fine program from Fiona Hamilton, who has been skating since she was three; she looked as if she was thoroughly enjoying herself, and she took second place in the short free.

Seventeen-year-old Rachel Ravenhill, competing at Senior level for the first time, made an impressive climb up the results list. Tenth in figures, she was fourth in the short program, and third in free skating. Karen Wood, skating sixteenth, took a bad fall on her triple toe loop and landed none too surely after her triple Salchow; after the championship she announced her retirement from the amateur sphere, and turned professional.

Fiona Hamilton did one triple jump and presented her program attractively; she was fourth in free skating and third overall. Susan Jackson, skating last but two, decisively proved her superiority, she looked in a different class from all her rivals. "She skates with real aggression," said TV commentator Simon Reed (brother of film star Oliver Reed). She opened with a double Axel/double toe loop combination, and followed it with a good triple toe loop/double toe loop. There were no other triples, but a good double Lutz and double Axel. She gained a well-deserved victory, and became the first Lady champion since Karena Richardson in 1977 to win consecutive years.

The Men's event was crucial for Britain's Olym-

pic representative Paul Robinson. In 1983, he had been runner-up to Mark Pepperday in the British Championship and had been selected for the international team instead of the title-holder because he was thought to have more potential. Now he wanted to prove himself by winning the national title. He made an inauspicious start, being beaten in compulsory figures by the youngest competitor, Spencer Durrant. Stephen Pickavance was third.

Durrant was unable to consolidate his position in the short free; he over-rotated the triple jump in his combination and landed his double Axel on two feet. Nor was Robinson able to take advantage of Durrant's default, for he too was in trouble with his jumps. He did an unsteady Axel, and his combination jump was unsteady, making him put his hand down on the ice. Nor was it what the rules required: he did a triple toe loop combined with a single instead of a double toe loop.

This left the way clear for Stephen Pickavance, whose elegant style and masterly triple toe loop/double toe loop brought him the highest marks. This was a very different skater from the one who finished last in the St. Ivel International only two months earlier. Torvill/Dean trainer Betty Callaway said of him: "I'm very impressed; we are going to see great things from him."

The combined results still left Durrant with a small lead. He had 1.8 points to Robinson's 2.0, with Pickavance third (2.8). Paul Robinson knew he had to try everything in the long free, and he made a valiant effort. A high double Axel opened his program, and he successfully landed all his triples—toe loop, flip, and Salchow. But his presentation lacked style; his marks included a solitary 5.6. Stephen Pickavance (rather like Christopher Dean in his looks and carriage) excelled himself with a high triple toe loop, combination including a cherry flip, and a double Lutz that should have been a triple. His graceful style and interpretation of the music (which included Debussy's haunting "Prélude á l'après-midi d'un faune") pleased the judges, who awarded some 5.7's and a 5.8. Spencer Durrant, the last skater, over-reached himself; after a good triple toe loop and triple and double toe loop combination, he began to make errors; his triple Salchow was a stumbling affair with the last turn on the ice. Pickavance was the winner by a narrow margin.

The Pairs' title, held for the past six years by Susan Garland with two different partners, this time went to the brother and sister from Billingham, Lisa and Neil Cushley. They are both good solo skaters too: Lisa was British primary champion in 1982, while Neil won the Junior Men's title in 1981 and was third in the Senior event the following year.

Fortunately, the majority of the injuries were relatively minor. Some of the injuries, however, were not minor. They included: two knee ligament injuries, two tibial stress fractures, one laceration with a tendon injury, and a re-injury of an area of a bone cyst. These injuries did result in significant time lost from skating.

Several conclusions seem warranted by the data. In Rink A, the number of injuries was quite significant. An average of 12.5 percent of the skaters during that summer experienced a significant injury requiring at least three days away from their training schedule. As listed, some of the injuries were even more significant. In addition, there appeared to be an increased risk of injury for skaters at higher levels. This may be due to the more complex jumps at the Senior and Junior levels. Since there is not a correlation between the age of skaters and the levels of skating,

this increased potential of injury at the higher level does not mean that older skaters are more likely to develop injuries.

There is a significant difference in the incidence of injuries at the two rinks in this study. There are several differences between the rinks. Although it is attractive to conclude that the off-ice program is responsible for the reduced incidence of skating injuries at Rink B, a firm conclusion that this is the major reason is not possible from this study.

After completing the study, it was learned that there were at least three skating injuries which were not reported or were covered up. This illustrates the hazards of doing this kind of study.

Some problems exist with this study which may limit its accuracy. Data collection is difficult and verification of injuries is not always satisfactory even with physician confirmation. Secondly, defining an injury is important. I chose to define an injury on the basis of time lost from skating even though the injury was not permanent in most cases.

CONCLUSIONS

1. The majority of injuries reported were minor.

- 2. Lower level skaters are less prone to injuries.
- 3. A rigorous off-ice program was associated with fewer injuries.
- 4. The effects of equipment and jump complexity cannot be answered from this study.
- 5. Coaches and skaters tend to under report injuries.

There are several excellent references which advise skaters regarding the prevention of injuries. Skating will never be free of injuries. It appears, however, based on this study, that

off-ice training, consisting of stretching and an exercise program, can decrease the chances that a significant injury will limit your skating future.
