

"I never actually set out to engage in the sport of figure skating. It accosted me, dragged me along . . . I was being propelled by a force beyond my control. Resistance was useless."

Louise Silver, of Arlington, Massachusetts, is talking.

"Ten years ago, my husband suggested that I come along when he took our older child, then five, skating on Sunday mornings.

'I hate skating. All I ever did as a kid was fall down and get cold?

'Maybe you'll like it better now.'

'I don't have skates'.

'Then get a pair'.

'It's a big waste of money'.

'No big deal—they're on sale this time of year'.

'Who'll watch the baby?'

'We'll get a sitter'."

Her husband came home with a pair of skates, she stepped on the ice and it felt "right" to her. ". . . long before that season ended, I decided that simply skating around the rink was getting a little boring. I had seen skaters doing back crossovers . . . observed a fellow in the center doing them. Could I imitate him? In the corner . . . I got the hang of it. (Center ice? Me? Heavens, no! That's for figure skaters; I don't figure skate) . . . Shortly before turning 30, I did my first waltz jump. Of course, I'm not figure skating! This is just something to do on the ice besides skate around in a boring oval. But it does have a nice feel to it, this business of springing into the air and then gliding backwards on one foot."

She began to find other times to skate. signed up for lessons, learned threes, mohawks. ". . . I could no longer deny that I had developed an interest in figure skating. I still protest. With a family, career, household responsibilities . . . Why? . . . Why do I subject myself to bruises that heal more slowly each year? Why do I still try to push back the limits of my skill despite 11 stitches in my face and some rather painful diagnostic work on an injured knee?


I feel totally alive when I skate . . . Once I put my feet into those boots, nothing exists beyond that rink . . . The sensation of mind and body totally immersed in one activity-working, learning, progressing,



achieving goals—more than counters any of the perfectly sensible reasons I can come up with for not skating?'

Mary Louise Speers, of Columbia, Maryland, writes that her involvement with skating began, at age 29, when her six-year-old son incurred osteomyelitis in one leg. After a "touch-and-go situation, first for his life, then to save the leg" and for guaranteed growth of the leg, there came surgery, a cast for one year, and therapy, followed by a search for a healthy activity for his legs. Figure skating got the call, but a roadblock occurred when it was found the Ann Arbor FSC has a waiting list for children. Mary Louise discovered a club clause permitting family members if a parent joined.

"My own goals for skating were very limited. I did not want to be moved from behind the 'cones' at the end of the rink where it was safe . . . I only wanted to have a small area of the ice to work 'slowly' on certain moves . . . and try to execute a 'silent' three-turn or safe mohawk. However, when the eldest son became more intensely involved in dance competition at age 13, he became embarrassed that our last names had a striking resemblance, and that my skating lacked power, strength, technical clarity . . . This came to light as he began to partner me through dance tests, and I failed more than I passed . . . he insisted that I become from behind the 'cones' and learn to develop power and presentation in ice skating." Her son told her to skate public sessions, amidst two hundred to three hundred others, to learn to " 'move' on the ice—faster, as well as around the obstacles (individuals) who might be in

#### FACTORS CAUSING POOR APPETITE

Good nutrition is important to the general health and physical performance of young athletes during their competitive years, as well as later on in life. Attaining the proper intake and balance for nutrients can be especially difficult for figure skaters because of their busy schedule. Also, the possibility of loss of appetite and need to control weight can cause further difficulties in consuming nutritious, well-balanced diets.

The loss of appetite or poor food intake can arise from one or more situations: psychological, physical, nutritional, or organic. Whatever the basis, prolonged loss of appetite can lead to severe malnutrition and susceptibility to infection and disease. A physician's advice should be sought if a skater experiences chronic lack of appetite.

#### Weight Control

Many figure skaters, especially females, are faced with the need to continually maintain or reduce their body weight. Most skaters, when they are on a weight control diet, tend as a first step to drastically reduce their food intake to the extent, and for a period of time, that creates a condition that deters from normal eating habits. A good counseling program, under supervision of a physician and

a dietitian, is needed in such a weight loss program.

#### **Poor Eating Habits**

Poor eating habits can contribute to malnutrition as well. The consequences of malnutrition can lead to an inadequate intake of nutrients and calories, thereby affecting appetite. Research studies have shown that one of the first effects of many nutrient deficiencies is a loss of appetite, general ill feeling, fatigue, pallor, lassitude, and anorexia. It is important that proper eating habits be encouraged in a skater's training program.

#### **Physical Activity**

Physical exertion to the extent of causing extreme tiredness can lead also to a disinterest in food. Taking the time to rest and relax before a meal will not only help restore appetite, but will also help in the digestion and utilization of food consumed. Getting the proper amount of rest and sleep likewise is just as important.

#### Stress

Stress caused by the pressure of competition can also lead to poor appetite. For young skaters, having to balance a rigorous training schedule with a hectic school program is a common reason for appetite loss. Sometimes appetite loss can be due to a more deep-seated stress problem, and in such situations, psychological counseling may be needed.

#### Illness

The general health of a person can have an effect on food intake as well. Infection and disease will affect overall food preference and intake. Having a cold, for example, can make a person disinterested in food. Frequent small, but balanced meals are especially helpful for the sick athlete or for the athlete



#### Sundae's Review

#### TEAM TRAVEL - PART II

On the day of travel, whether it be by bus or plane, team managers and the travel chairman should be present to take a head count, costume and skate check, and to be in charge of tickets and baggage receipts. If plane travel is your choice, the travel chairman should deal with the ticket agent and present all tickets at once. Boarding passes are then handed to the team members.

Skates and costumes should be carried on the plane. Keep tapes separate when going through the x-ray machine. In some cases tapes have been ruined by the x-ray machine. Don't take a chance.

No matter what form of travel your team selects, require skaters to be present one hour before departure time.

If anyone is prone to motion sickness strongly suggest they bring Dramamine or similar medication. If the travel is by bus, assign those people to the front. Team members choose their seating partners before entering the vehicle. They should line up in pairs as they board the bus. This keeps the boarding traffic moving smoothly.

If a team is not pleased with options open to them through a bus company or scheduled air flights explore the possibility of a chartered plane. If you have enough people who will *guarantee* a seat on the plane and the price is right-hire it. The travel chairman is responsible for figuring the price per seat. Again, go through a *reputable* agent to help you with your plans.

Rooms should be booked weeks in advance. Once again before deciding upon a particular hotel or motel the travel chairman should check prices. They may vary con-

siderably. There are many factors to consider in choosing the hotel/motel best suited for your team: price, distance from the rink, restaurant, and some type of recreational facility for the skater. (Game room, pool—after team has competed.)

After the hotel price has been determined, the travel chairman should collect the money in advance. A deposit may be paid promptly to the hotel and the remainder upon arrival.

Request all rooms on the same floor. This will simplify keeping track of members.

Parents wishing to chaperone sign up with the travel chairman in the beginning of the year, stating which competition or competitions they wish to attend. There should be one chaperone for every three skaters in a room. The adult in the room enforces the curfew and keeps things running smoothly. Each chaperone should carry some form of first-aid kit as well as the regular aspirin, cold remedies, etc.

If your group is fortunate enough to have the opportunity to billet the skaters with team members from the host club or surrounding club teams, the skaters will enjoy an enriching and rewarding experience.

These few steps will help plans run smoothly after the host and guest teams have agreed upon billeting.

One person at each end should be in charge of the transactions. The correspondent sends a list of the skaters, their ages, hobbies, phone numbers, addresses, and any important information (allergies, medication, etc.) In a few weeks your team members should receive a list of the families with whom they will be staying. Included will be the name,

### IS THERE A DOCTOR IN THE HOUSE? (Or How to Find a Good Practitioner When You Need One!) Part II

Education of sports medicine specialists is just beginning to catch up with the demand for services. Sports medicine seminars are increasingly available as continuing education offerings and a few clinical fellowships are beginning to appear. As yet there is no medical residency available to physicians who wish to prepare in a comprehensive, clinically intense way for a career in sports medicine. As educational programs develop, credentialing of sports specialists will certainly emerge. As yet, however, the American Academy of Sports Medicine does not play an evaluative role in certifying the qualifications of sports specialists.

Thus, the consumer of sports medical care must find other indicators of competence. Listings in the Yellow Pages can be a helpful first step for identifying names and locations of medical specialists in a traditional specialty such as orthopedics who have an interest in sports medicine. However, such listings really amount to self-advertising and do not necessarily imply expertise. Specialist credentials and experience in sports medicine are not verified by ad salesmen, and the only

qualification needed to list is a basic license to practice.

The referral service of a local medical association, however can verify the specialty credentials of individuals listed. A physician who is "board certified" in his specialty has successfully completed the full course of training and credentialing examinations. One who is "board qualified" has completed training only. A medical association referral service may also provide names of physicians listing an interest in sports medicine, although some associations as yet do not register such listings. Again, however, the referral service has no way of verifying experience in sports medicine.

Membership in the American Academy of Sports Medicine can be a measure of a physician's interest in sports medicine. However, memberships have been closed recently to new physicians entering the field. Thus, lack of such a membership may reflect neither on interest nor competence. Many orthopedists who concentrate their practices on athletic injury are members of the American Orthopedic Society for Sports Medicine. Although

it should not be used as a single criterion when selecting an orthopedist, membership in this association can be used as an indicator of some commitment to treating athletes. It is a good idea to ask about membership when you call for an appointment.

Credentials of non-physician professionals in sports medicine share the same problems. Qualifications for treating athletes are not certified currently. However, training and certification in the basic specialty can be verified by calling or writing the respective specialty association. (Information on these associations can be obtained from a public librarian.) For instance, you might check on the qualifications of a sports psychologist by contacting the American Psychological Association, 1200 Seventeenth Street N.W., Washington, DC 20036. Membership in sports specialty associations again can be taken as an indicator of commitment to treating athletes. Thus, sports-minded podiatrists may belong to the American Academy of Podiatric Sports Medicine, and this would be a positive feature to look for in the search for a suitable podiatrist.

Beyond these formal indicators, experts in the field seem to agree that one of the best ways of locating a good sports specialist is by talking to coaches. By asking which doctors their athletes are going to and what the results of treatment have been, you can quickly identify the names of sports specialists you wish to call. Word of mouth referrals by those who are satisfied with the treatment they received can be an excellent indicator. If the skating coaches you talk to don't have suggestions, you can call the coaches of local athletic teams. Some college and university athletic departments have their own sports medicine staffs, and these specialists may also have private practices. (Team affiliation assures that the doctor cares for many athletes and thus sees a wider variety of athletic health problems in his practice.) The professional team physicians interviewed by this author indicated that many of their patients come to them after hearing about them in the media.

In the past few years, sports medicine clinics have been cropping up. These clinics vary in the services they offer. Some are little more than "health clubs." Others provide comprehensive and excellent sports medical

care and have the team of professionals necessary to do the job. An annual directory of sports medicine clinics is put out by McGraw-Hill, publishers of the journal, The Physician and Sports Medicine. It can be obtained at a price of \$10 by sending a request to 4530 West 77th St., Minneapolis, MN 55435. This directory lists clinics alphabetically by state and notes each clinic's functions, facilities, services, and staff. Again information is self-reported and is not verified by the journal. You will want to be careful to verify the credentials of those who provide the professional care. Generally, sports medicine clinics attached to hospitals or large clinics which themselves have a reputation for excellence will provide good service and will also be a reliable source of information for making that important decision on which physician you choose to supervise your health care.

One of the most important suggestions that can be made is that you begin your search for a sports physician before you have a medical crisis to deal with. The process of finding the "right" doctor takes some time and takes an ability to concentrate on all the aspects that go into making a good decision. The tension and anxiety that accompany being injured don't usually assist clear thinking. The best strategy is to seek out a good sports physician—a generalist who is willing to supervise your overall medical care before being injured, and to let him assist you in finding the appropriate specialist referrals as you need them. The approaches mentioned above can help assure that the physician you choose will be competent. Should you sustain an injury when you are away from home and from your regular sports doctor, for instance at a competition, experts agree that emergency care is usually sufficient, and that for most sports injuries, surgery can be delayed until you get home. Beware of the quick advice, "You need surgery," and get a second opinion before proceeding.

How much should your doctor know about skating? The experts agree, as much as possible. However, physicians with an intimate knowledge of the sport are difficult to find. As part of your strategy for selecting a physician, you should ask about experience caring for dancers and gymnasts as well as skaters. These endeavors produce

who has to be bedridden because of physical injury.

#### **Traveling**

The interruption of one's normal eating time brought on by jet lag can affect appetite as well. Under such circumstances, it is best to eat light meals and gradually adjust to the new time zone. Skipping meals or eating a large meal at irregular intervals will not help, and may, in fact, delay adjustment to a new time zone, thus causing more physical fatigue.

Other reasons which may explain the loss of appetite include outside temperatures, dehydration, allergies, taste perception problems, gastrointestinal problems, and hormonal disturbances.



Have the courage to accept your mistakes instead of condemning yourself for not being perfect—and discipline your skating days towards the realization of your nearest goal.

SKATE AMERICA INTERNATIONAL '85

For the first time since its inception in 1979, Skate America was hosted outside the State of New York. The Twin City Figure Skating Association played host in St. Paul, Minnesota, at the cavernous Civic Center. The Center's enormous dimensions were both a plus and a minus.

The ample rooms made available for officials and competitors were a welcome departure from the usual cramped quarters, but the shear size of the arena with a seating capacity of 17,000 made the relatively small attendance of 6,000 or so seem insignificant.

The Campbell's Soup Company offered its sponsorship again, and their contribution was extremely helpful.

Also, ESPN televised the event, promising five hours of prime-time coverage during December, including Christmas Day.

More than seventy competitors representing nineteen countries converged on St. Paul to participate in this increasingly important international competition.

The Men's event would prove to be by far the most interesting and best level of skating proficiency.

The U.S. entered a strong contingent in Brian Boitano, 1985 U.S. Men's National Champion and World Bronze medalist, Christopher Bowman, and Paul Wylie. Both Boitano and Bowman had competed at National Sports Festival IV in Baton Rouge, earlier this year, and both had made Sports Festival history by earning a 6.0 each, Bowman the first to do so.

Jozef Sabovcik from Czechoslovakia forced the issue from the start, and set an early pace by laying down winning figures. Sabovcik, who had won a Bronze at the Olympic Winter Games in Sarajevo, placed fourth behind Boitano at the Tokyo Worlds, and was current European Men's champion, won all the figures convincingly.

The three required figures were ISU No. 21, left forward inside rocker; No. 36, right forward paragraph double three; and No. 31, left back outside change loop.

Fernand Fedronic from France, always strong in figures, edged Boitano to take second place in figures, Boitano settling for third. Likewise, Boitano had to fight off a determined Soviet skater Victor Petrenko,

who placed fourth. Christopher Bowman and Paul Wylie placed sixth and eighth, respectively.

Jozef Sabovcik continued his winning form in the short program. He did not, however, win over all the judges, two placing him third. Sabovcik skated a seemingly faultless short. Skating to music from *Chariots of Fire*, he linked a triple Lutz to a double loop in combination, and displayed excellent spins and footwork. Sabovcik did not have it all his own way, however, thanks to strong performances from Boitano and Bowman, and Petrenko.

Boitano was full of vim and vigor in his short, skating his usual well-balanced, fast program. His combination was a triple Lutzdouble loop, and his efforts placed him solid in second place, receiving a first and one third.

Bowman proved his worth also in the short, and his effortless, buoyant style won him uproarious support from the crowd.

His fourth-place position behind Petrenko, however, caused raised eyebrows and murmurs of discontent from many of the onlookers, as his program certainly seemed to have the edge over Petrenko's. Maybe his combination, triple flip-double loop, was not considered as good as Petrenko's triple Lutz-double loop. Who knows?

Christopher Bowman's long program was an absolute delight to watch. Bowman has "fun" on the ice, and his attitude mirrors itself in his program. He completed seven triples, one, a triple toe loop in combination with a triple flip, all combined with impressive spins and innovative footwork.

A firm favorite with the young ladies, Bowman was literally swamped by these young fans following his program, who showered him with gifts and flowers. He received only three second places for his efforts, a well-deserved first from one judge, and fours and threes from the remainder. He had to settle for fourth overall.

A battle royal was ensuing between Boitano and Sabovcik.

Sabovcik skated before Boitano, and it was soon apparent he planned on holding nothing back. He attempted, and successfully completed, a triple Axel, and skated three more triples—flip, toe Walley, and Lutz. Sabovcik is a strong, daredevil free skater, and his cavalier program, full of excellent spins and footwork, earned him the well-deserved marks of five firsts, two seconds, and two thirds. During the entire competition, he had only been marked lower than first six times, receiving twenty-one first placements.

Boitano had no option but to pull out all the stops. Boitano seems to thrive on this type of competition, and one senses he likes to be in a challenging position. He had bested Sabovcik at the 1985 Worlds in Tokyo with his gutsy skating, beating the Czech in the long program to take the Bronze.

Boitano also attempted a triple Axel, completing the revolutions, but double footing on the landing. This was his only error, however, and he continued to put on a dazzling display of his skating abilities. He completed five additional triples, one triple toe loop in combination, and triple flip in combination with a double toe loop. His competence on the ice secured him a second in the long, second overall.

Paul Wylie had problems in both the short and the long, and placed a disappointing seventh.

The Ladies' event was disappointing, especially for the U.S. National Ladies' Silver medalist Debi Thomas. Both Debi and her coach had looked forward to the contest with Tatiana Andreeva, the impressive young skater from the Soviet Union who had won dramatically the Gold medal at the 1985 World Juniors in Colorado Springs. But this was not to be as Andreeva withdrew injured.

The U.S. also lost a fine skater in Jill Trenary, a hometown favorite who had to

withdraw from injury also.

The third member of the U.S. team was Kathryn Adams, who had placed fourth at Nationals.

Debi Thomas managed to hold first place in figures although her marks seesawed, but from that point on she never looked back. Looking sleek and polished, and obviously brimming with confidence. Debi was the highlight of an otherwise lacklustre event. In the short, skating to the upbeat music from the group, Frankie Goes to Hollywood, Debi did everything just right. Using her music beautifully, she combined all required elements into a first-class program, even impressing the judges who awarded her 5.6's and 5.7's and one judge who gave her a 5.8, the first she has received in a short program.

Tracey Wainman from Canada, who had placed second in figures, skated a clean program, successfully linking the required double loop in combination with a double Axel.

The combination in the short proved to be the catalyst for placement, with many of the ladies failing to complete the requirement. Kathryn Adams in fact had problems with the combination, an attempted triple toe Walley-double loop, that kept her in fourth place.

Katrien Pauwels from Belgium fell on the required double Lutz, but her completion of the other required elements, including the double Axel-double loop combination, kept

her in third place.

In the long, Debi Thomas marched on unimpeded. Relaxed and supremely confident, Debi included only three triples in her program, more than sufficient, to secure the Gold medal. She received another 5.8 for artistic impression, and a tremendous standing ovation from the appreciative crowd.

Tracey Wainman fell on her only attempted triple, a Salchow, but her excellent interpretation of her music and solid program held her


up in second place.

Katrien Pauwels skated well, completing a triple Salchow-double Salchow and a double toe loop-double toe loop to maintain her third spot.


Kathryn Adams had problems with her triple Salchow, but the rest of her program was skated well, including a double flip-double toe loop combination, keeping her in fourth place.

The skating industry's concern over dwindling pairs teams was starkly emphasized here, with only seven teams competing. Four countries entered teams—U.S., USSR, Canada, and France.


Jill Watson and Peter Oppegard from the U.S. had made their mark in international competition by placing fourth at Worlds in Tokyo while still a relatively new team. Although they had some shaky moments, Skate America became another triumph for them.

In the short, they completed all elements, their flying jump camel spins were a little off, but not enough for them to not solidly win the short with seven firsts and two seconds.

The young pair team from the Soviet Union, Elena Bechke and Valery Kornienko, introduced a comic-type routine in their short, this combined with a smooth, well-timed routine earned them second place in the short.

Gillian Wachsman and Todd Waggoner, fresh from their Gold medal win at the Sports Festival in Baton Rouge, gave the U.S. another boost by placing third in the short. Their required double flips were on the money, and a good program with only mistiming on their spins obvious, did the job.

The third members of the U.S. team, Deveny Deck and Luke Hohmann, did not fare as well, both having problems. They placed sixth in the short.

An anxious moment for Watson and Oppegard during the long warm-up was soon dispelled once their program was under way. Although tentatively attempted, a trouble-some throw double Axel was completed, and this plus a good well-rounded program that included another throw, a triple Salchow, double flips, and excellent spins and lifts, earned the U.S. team the Gold medal.

Little had separated the Soviet team from Watson and Oppegard going into the long. Bechke and Kornienko skated an innovative, polished program that was marred by a fall on an attempted throw triple Salchow, an error that cost the Soviet team dearly, all but eliminating any chance of catching the U.S. pair. Their strong program, however, secured for them a Silver medal.

Wachsman and Waggoner had refined their long program, and taken out a clumsy portion since Baton Rouge, and the change was well worth it. Sprinkling their program with a variety of lifts, spins, and throws, including a throw triple Salchow and double Axel, they secured another medal for the U.S., a Bronze.

Deck and Hohmann struggled somewhat in the long and placed sixth, and sixth overall.

Refreshing to watch was a young pair from Canada, Christine Hough and Douglas Ladret. Together for only fourteen months or so, they put on an excellent skating performance that was above expectations for such a young team. Well done!

If Ladies was disappointing, then ice dance was dismal. One would wish to be delicate about criticizing such a beautiful discipline as ice dance, but here it was a disaster. Torvill and Dean had made historical inroads in dance, introducing virtually revolutionary ideas as only they could. When will dance teams stop emulating these two geniuses and begin to develop their own styles?

It was refreshing to watch the U.S. dance teams in this event. Credit the coaches or the skaters or both, but the three U.S. teams—Renee Roca and Donald Adair, Lois Luciani and Russ Witherby, and Kristan Lowery and Chip Rossbach—exhibited style and innovation of their own personality, indeed a refreshing uplift. This could also be said of the West German twins, Antonia and Ferdinand Becherer, who also have refused to be trapped in the Torvill and Dean influence.

Renee Roca and Donald Adair had placed second behind Suzanne Semanick and Scott Gregory in Baton Rouge, and if this had spurred this veteran team into action, it certainly showed.

Roca and Adair were superb. They swept all three divisions—compulsory dances, OSP, and free—with only two judges giving them second places in the compulsory dances. All told, they earned an incredible twenty-five first placements. Their free dance was completely new. Based on the life of Rudolf Valentino, "Valentino" had been written and composed especially for them, and it worked. Romantic, dramatic, and sensual, the music emphasized their flowing style and presentation techniques.

The Soviet team of Irina Zhuk and Oleg Petrov were more concerned with the eventual third-place team of Antonia and Ferdinand Becherer than they were with catching the U.S. team. Although it was close, the Soviets edged the West Germans.

The different styles in today's ice dancing were beautifully illustrated in these two teams. The Soviets prefer the more agressive, open program, whereas the excellently-matched West Germans prefer the more serene, classical approach.

Lois Luciani and Russ Witherby and Kristin Lowery and Chip Rossbach all skated well. Lois unfortunately was spiked during a warm-up, but this didn't seem to affect her too much. These U.S. teams placed seventh and ninth respectively.

This relatively fledgling event, Skate America, has great potential as an important contributor to international skating. It needs a lot of support if it is to succeed.

### Skate America '85.




Skate America was quite an experience in more ways than one. It was a beautifullyorganized competition and everyone involved certainly deserves a hearty congratulations. It was a pity that the St. Paul media didn't give it more, much deserved attention with all these young athletes giving their all. visiting us from as far away as Japan and Russia. I was very happy and pleased to see my own country Sweden finally, after many years of absence, being so well represented by two very fine skaters. Many comments were heard by the visiting participants. skaters, judges, and coaches about how much they enjoyed St. Paul admiring the cleanliness and freshness of this handsome city with its beautiful Civic Center, where I too have enjoyed giving exhibitions in the last ten years. I watched every phase of Skate America and found the the dancing the most enjoyable and, in my opinion, representing what skating is all about. Those pairs were all beautiful, stroking the ice with true edges and with the feeling of love. This is art skating. It was the highlight of Skate America.

The pairs came next and they were also a joy to see, daring and charming, wonderfully well-trained top athletes. The only real criticism would be some very unpointed toes and a few very "crotchy" lifts looking most inelegant. Unpointed toes were seen throughout the competition even, I hate to say this, by some of the dancers. This is mostly due to the inordinantly stiff boots which, by the way, are the main reason for so many foot and knee injuries. This, however, is another story I will touch upon later.

The men were excellent athletes with their unbelievable jumps, even turning four times in the air which, of course, demands a lot of height in order to achieve so much rotation. Very beautiful camel spins and sit spins were also done by all.

So, now for the girls! In the past, not so long ago either, girls were the ones who were so beautiful to watch. Not so anymore—the incessant demand by the ISU for jumps as the most important element in the free skating program is the ruination of most girls. Triples should not be a required jump for girls. It is too dangerous. It creates bad injuries when the edges are inevitably "hooked" on bad landings while learning. Ankles, then knees, and worst of all the pelvic area is affected. Women were born to give birth and therefore are very vulnerable in the pelvic area. Take the triples out as a required jump. Let those who want to do it, do it, but put in another requirement in the form of dance steps with rockers, counters, brackets, change of edges, "brilliant combinations;" etc. Perhaps the feminine beauty of skating would come back à la Peggy Fleming or Janet Lynn for example. Let the men do the triples and quadruples. They have the anatomy for it and wouldn't get injured, the way the girls would. During the Ladies' competition there were a lot of faults as a result of off-balance positions, lack of basic knowledge, and the incessant repetition of doubles and very poor triple Salchows as a result of taking off while scratching away on toepicks. There were a few, but not too many nice spirals and spins, but I don't remember

anything really original. I found out talking to the girls backstage that they are all terrified of the required triple jump and that this takes all the joy out of skating in a competition. Even the young lady who won and was really excellent admitted she wished she didn't have to be faced with the triple jump.

School figures! They were absolutely awful. I saw marks ranging from 2.3 to 4.1. The average was below a passing mark. How did these skaters ever pass their Gold Test which requires a minimum of 4.1? Most of the skaters looked angular and off balance with their legs held together, unpointed toes, hanging heads staring down to steer the skates for triple repetition. (I wrote an article in this magazine's October 1984 issue in which among other things I quoted Roger Turner in his very excellent book, Edges. "Too many competitive skaters at all levels attempt to skate the more difficult figures when they are not properly disciplined in basics. They simply have not learned the four skating edges. . . . Many teachers have failed to demand adequate discipline in the fundamentals, either because they consider them unimportant or because they themselves have been inadequately trained.... Certain teaching methods and some teachers' pretense to nonexistent skill and knowledge result in inevitable frustration. They can cause unforgivable loss of potential achievement and quality of skating.") There are rules clearly outlined in the USFSA Rulebook. If these were followed it would certainly improve the basics which were amiss by most in the competition.

The day before the competition during practice time I saw scribes being used. Circles laid out before skating them. No wonder skaters cannot skate their circles correctly as they have become so dependent on the scribes. They should be able to see when circles are correct or not. Judges don't use scribes to see if circles are correct or not. They can see it without. The scribe was meant to help skaters check circles for correctness, instead it is being used as a crutch and students are thus bending over to see the tracing right in front of the employed foot, causing an off-balance "steering," with a consequent unsteady circle. A good edge with which to





achieve a good steady circle can only be achieved with the body in a properlybalanced position.

When the quality of school figures improves, free skating will again rise from the grade of a circus performance to an art performance where it belongs.

similar athletic demands and medical problems. A good sports physician, lacking specific experience in caring for skaters, will inform himself on the sport and on your involvement in it by talking to you and by taking a careful history of the physical and mental stresses you encounter. Do not hesitate to educate your doctor about the sport. A good sports physician will welcome your input.





# BOSTON: BRIGHT FROM THE START

Be prepared. The organizers of this year's U.S. Precision Team Championships intend to make this year's nationals one you'll never forget. On April 10-12, The Skating Club of Boston and the New England Inter-Club Council will play host to precision skaters, coaches and chaperones from across the nation. They will be coming to one of the five most visited cities in the U.S.

Competitive skaters often get caught in the rink-to-hotel-to rink turnstyle and miss the real joys of travel. There's too much to see in Boston, too much to enjoy to allow that. Plans are being made to get you out and around. It all begins with a draw party at the fabulous Museum of Science on Thursday night. It will be an opportunity to mix with fellow competitors and enjoy the ambience of this fine facility. No practice sessions will be held during that period at the Boston University competition rink. A number of tours are being planned, and competitors and adults can also find their own way in this walkable, livable city.

The official hotel is the Sheraton Boston at the Prudential Center. You'll find a visitor center there, but you might begin with your own "overview" from the Skywalk atop the Prudential Tower, Boston's second tallest building. From here you'll be able to locate B.U. on the Charles, Cambridge across the river, site of Harvard, M.I.T. and Radcliffe; the downtown area, Logan Airport—only two miles from downtown, and the ocean to the east. Of course, if you can only be satisfied seeing things from the top of the very tallest building, the John Hancock Tower is a short distance away and also offers an observatory.

Minutes from the official hotel is Copley Place with its many shops, multi-floored atrium and glass facade. It's nearly new and largely upscale. Contrastingly old is the B.P.L.—Boston Public Library—just across the street. You may not have time to select a tome, but if you enjoy architecture, you ought to at least peek inside its Copley Square entrance with its Italian Renaissance

style. Beyond its intriguing carved portals is a magnificent open marble staircase guarded by two sculpted lions which ascends to a cavernous wood-paneled reading room. This older part of the building also offers a quiet courtyard with gardens and water fountains where you might stop to rest tired feet after your brief tour.

The Prudential Center is ideally situated for several short trips. On the Huntington Avenue side you could pay a visit to the Christian Science Complex with its mapparium. One block north of your hotel is Newbury Street, Boston's Fifth Avenue, with its elegant shops, art galleries, restaurants and sidewalk cafes.

Boston's proudest boast may be its Freedom Trail, a 2 1/2 mile walking tour of its unparalleled historic sites. Visitors can follow a painted line along the sidewalks to Faneuil Hall, Paul Revere's House, the Old North Church, Bunker Hill Monument and the U.S.S. Constitution. There are 16 stops in all.

If you tire of walking you could take the Old Town Trolley which conveys passengers to many of the most popular sites as do the Boston Doubledeckers which stop at Museum Wharf (Children's Museum and Museum of Transportation), the waterfront with its New England Aquarium, Charlestown Navy Yard (for the Constitution) and Faneuil Hall Marketplace. Boston also has a subway and public transit system.

Boats are another mode of transportation. There are harbor tours as well as Skyline Cruises on the Charles River. These begin at the Hatch Shell where the Boston Pops gives those glorius summer concerts—right across from the Science Museum. You'll hear an engaging narrative about the Boston and Cambridge sights.

Just upriver, Boston University occupies one bank while Harvard dominates the other. A trip through the Harvard Square area is a special experience. It too offers a diversity of museums with unusual and fascinating exhibits.

The Skating Club of Boston is also on the Charles, just beyond Harvard. It is the third oldest skating club in the country. The museum in its upstairs lounge houses one of the finest collections of skating memorabilia in existence.

Some of the practice sessions will be held in the suburban town of Lexington which vies with Concord for historical supremacy. These adjacent towns each have much to offer, especially their Revolutionary War battle sites.

The city is also a major cultural, medical and technological center, so whatever your inclination you can find something to suit. It has 1900 restaurants—every ethnic type imaginable, and several of them four-star. Theatre, the arts...it's all here. Selection is the toughest problem.

So treat yourself to more than the competition. Enjoy the invigorating atmosphere of a growth city, proud of its past; proud of its newness. Boston is affordable, it's knowable . . . and its's yours, April 10-12.

The written reports of the Officers and Committee Chairmen to the 1985 Annual Meeting of the United States Figure Skating Association Board of Directors are contained in the Report Book of the Meeting. Action taken by the Board on specific requests, and action on requests from the floor, are summarized as follows:

#### President

- Accepted the Minutes Committee Report approving the minutes of the May 1985 Board of Directors Meeting.
- Approved holding the 1986 Board of Directors Spring Meeting one day earlier than in previous years.

#### **Treasurer**

 Approved the deletion of membership in the USFSA any clubs delinquent in payment of annual dues.

#### **Amateur Status**

- 2. Approved the following persons as reinstated amateurs in figure skating: Julie Reese Abel, Northridge, CA; Jane Fauver Acker, Gorham, MA; Elaine Barth, Grand Forks, ND; Dorothy Duffy Bragle, Upper St. Clair, PA; Myra Chrien Dria, Austin, TX; Betsy Hauck, New York, NY; Michelle Hilliard, Rancho Palos Verdes, CA; Beverly Diener Kawakami, Fountain Valley, CA; Lisa Kinder, Westland, MI; Bob Lane, Whitsett, NC; Pamela Perry, Boston, MA; Heather Quencer, Albany, NY; Rosemary Santee, Park Ridge, IL; William ("Bud") Snyder, Rocky River, OH: Karen Snoddy, Middleburg Heights, OH; Margot Snyder, Ventura, CA; Cathleen Millett Verde, Seattle, WA.
- Approved a resolution that until the May Meeting, skaters may accept commercial sponsorship through contracts between the USFSA and the sponsor with the money earned being placed in escrow by the National Headquarters. Should the trust fund proposal not be approved in May by the Governing Council, the money remaining in escrow will go into the Restricted Fund of the Memorial Fund for the skater's club.

#### **Competitions**

- 1. Approved a resolution to subsidize the following 1988 competitions in the amounts of: \$4,000 to each of the nine regionals, \$2,500 to each of the three sectionals, \$500 to each of the three precision sectionals, and to underwrite any losses of the National Precision Team Skating Championships up to a maximum of \$2,500.
- Approved a resolution to underwrite any losses of the 1985 National Collegiate Championships up to a maximum of \$4,000.
- 3. Approved a resolution to underwrite any losses of the 1986 National Collegiate Championships up to a maximum of \$4,000 and to purchase Revere Bowls for the first, second, and third-place winners in each event.
- 4. Approved a resolution to purchase Revere Bowls for the first, second, and third-place teams in each event at the National Precision Team Skating Championships.
- Approved the issuance of a final sanction to the Skating Club of Boston and the New England Inter-Club Council for the 1986 National Precision Team Skating Championships.
- Did not approve a revision to CR 2.33, 2.35, 2.36, 2.52, and 9.02 to provide for appointment of Regional Referees and Regional Dance Referees.
- Approved an amendment to CR 2.52 to allow the Competition Chairman to set the date by which Referee and Accountant examinations must be returned.
- 8. Approved a revision to CR 7.02 requiring that announcements of competitions be submitted, prior to publication, to the chairman for all national competitions, the appropriate sectional vice chairmen for regional and sectional competitions, and appropriate regional vice chairmen for non-qualifying competitions with the final copy of the announcement being sent to the approving chairman and National Headquarters.
- Approved a revision to CR 24.015 stating that in non-qualifying competitions, dance events not having both an

- initial and final round must so specify in the announcement and include the method of mark and accounting.
- Approved the deletion of all factors for compulsory figures in computing competition results for all events with or without a Short Program.
- 11. Approved a revision to the rules that requires computations for placement of skaters in all events held at qualifying competitions to be the same as for National, Sectional, and Regional Senior and Junior events.
- 12. Approved a rule stipulating that for non-qualifying competitions the computations for placement should be in accordance with those for qualifying competitions; if not, the method should be detailed in the announcement submitted for approval.
- Approved a resolution to make Intermediate Dance events mandatory at Regional and Sectional Competitions and qualifying for Sectionals.
- Approved a resolution to make Adult Dance events mandatory at Regional and Sectional Competitions, but non-qualifying.
- 15. Approved an addition to CR 35.07 that all previous winners of Regional, Junior, Novice, and other lower events must enter Regionals again in order to qualify for the Sectional events, unless qualified under CR 35.071 and 35.072.
- 16. Approved the substitution to CR 25.13 of the words "and one additional round of the ice surface shall be skated," with the words, "under these conditions the European Waltz shall be danced for one minute and twelve seconds and the American Waltz for one minute and twenty-seven seconds starting from the first step of the dance."
- 17. Approved a revision to CR 25.14 as follows: "In the initial round of all dance competitions the number of sequences (patterns) of the dance to be danced shall be as follows: (a) two (2) sequences—Swing Dance, Argentine Tango, Starlight Waltz, Yankee Polka, Ravensburger Waltz, and Tango Romantica; (b) three (3) sequences—Dutch Waltz, Canasta Tango, Fiesta Tango, Willow Waltz, Ten Fox, Euro-

- pean Waltz, American Waltz, Paso Doble, Viennese Waltz, and Westminster Waltz; (c) four (4) sequences— Fourteenstep, Foxtrot, Tango, Rocker Foxtrot, Blues, Quickstep, and Rhumba; (d) six (6) sequences—Kilian."
- 18. Approved the addition of a new rule (CR 25.16) as follows: "In non-qualifying competitions the number of sequences may vary from those set forth above provided such variations are specified in the approved announcement and/or the referee may decide to vary the number of sequences to meet the current conditions. Any decision by the referee shall be announced to the judges and all entrants before the warmup of the first dance."
- 19. Approved the following substitution for CR 25.33: "When compulsory dances are included in the final round the referee shall determine whether the number of sequences to be danced is to be the same as those specified for the initial round or increased by one or two sequences taking into account the number of dances and couples and whether the couples are to dance one couple at a time or at the same time in flights of two to four."

Delete all detail of the number of sequences of compulsory dances to be skated in other rules and refer to CR 25.00.

- 20. Approved the following substitution for "Final Round Senior Dance (CR 25.20)": "Final Round General (CR 25.20) CR 25.21 The final round for qualifying competitions shall be in accordance with CR 37.00 or may consist of compulsory dances as set forth in the approved announcement."
- 21. Approved the substitution to CR 25.31 of the words, "In the Final Round of all dance events in non-qualifying competitions," with the words, "When the final round in non-qualifying competitions consists of compulsory dances,".
- 22. Approved an amendment to CR 37.05 to lower the Sectional and Regional Adult Dance minimum age from thirty-five to thirty years.

- 23. Approved a uniform age qualification date of October 1 for all regions.
- 24. Did not approve a resolution to draw and publish annually in the Rulebook the figure groups for Intermediate and Novice events.
- 25. Approved a resolution that the Board of Directors make the decision on awarding the National Championships following presentations by the applicants and upon recommendation of the Site Selection Committee. If there are more than three applications, the Competitions Committee shall select the three sites for consideration by the Board.
- Approved the recommendation of George B. Ludlow, Jr., Kent, Connecticut, as a Sectional Dance Referee.
- Approved the recommendation of David Smith, Colorado Springs, Colorado, as a Sectional Accountant.
- 28. Approved the recommendation of Ronald T. Pfenning, Hyannis, Massachusetts, to the International Skating Union as an International Referee.



ment fee shall continue to be 5% of the gross receipts received by the nonskating related organization."

## **Precision Skating Committee**

- 1. Approved the conversion of the Guidelines for Precision Skating into Precision Skating Rules. These rules will be published in the Meeting Book of the 1986 Governing Council Meeting.

"We didn't place ... but didn't expect to. We went for the sheer pleasure of being able to go." Before going, she phoned her daughter at college to let her know where she was going. Her daughter's comments? "You're what?! All those lessons I had, custom skates, costumes, patch, patch, 5:00 A.M.—who goes to Nationals—MY MOTHER!!!!"

age, address, and telephone number of their "host sister—or brother" (if there are boys on the team). Each skater before moving in with the "host family" must have the address and telephone number of their team manager's hotel.

Before you leave on any trip send home complete and specific instructions to the parents listing:

- 1. Time to be at the airport, rink (if that's where the bus leaves), etc.
- 2. Dress requirements, warm-up suits, practice dress, sweater, costume, etc.
- 3. Place where the team is staying with address and telephone number.
- 4. Time of arrival.
- 5. Time of competition.
- 6. Chaperones for rooms—(there should be one adult for three team members in a room).
- 7. A release form relieving the chaperone, manager, and coach of responsibility in case of accident.
- 8. Medical release form.
- 9. A sheet for the parents to list all the medications the child is on, or is allergic to.
- 10. Time of practice and competition.
- 11. Suggested amount of money each skater should bring.

Some teams combine a competition with a mini-vacation touring the city for an additional day or visiting a tourist attraction. These arrangements should be listed as well as the additional price. This is always enjoyable for the team and adds a finishing touch to an exciting weekend. This is also an opportunity for the team to relate off the ice and bring everyone closer together.

Skaters will be carrying with them a substantial amount of money when traveling to a competition. When team members are skating leave valuables and money with dressing room monitor or competition chaperone. Team members should bring enough money to cover eight meals and souvenirs such as competition pin, sweatshirts, banner, etc.

A conduct code must be sent home and signed by skater and parent and returned to the travel chairman. This code will state if there is any misconduct or disruptive behavior on the part of a skater or skaters. suspension will be in order for them at that competition. If problems occur after the team has skated, that member will be suspended from the next competition.




