



Was it only yesterday that Morgan Doyle. a 45-year-old lawyer from San Francisco, competed to "The Man On The Flying Trapeze"? Tongue-in-cheek, of course, but there were others about the same age, and some older, all serious and loving competition. At age 14 in my first competition, I was considered still in diapers. There weren't that many kids. Then competition was for anyone who wanted to compete. No one thought twice about age. Nowadays, even a teenager who say she wants to enter her first competition gets a funny look. It isn't done, my dear. Yet in the thirties and forties, competing was done by secretaries, clerks, housewives, lawyers . . . and my favorite, Felix Locher. About 53 at the time, he was known outside skating for being the father of Jon Hall who had starred opposite Dorothy Lamour in the movie, The Hurricane. Inside skating, he was known more for his personality, charm, wit, and enthusiasm. Oh, how he loved to skate! (When he found a competition was to be in Yosemite Valley and "skaters' rates" were being given by the grandiose Ahwahnee Hotel, he said, "Fine, I'll compete"—which he'd never done before—and proceeded to Yosemite. In the lobby, someone stopped him. "Felix, you need a routine" "Ach, nothing to it, he said, I'll do some of this and some of that-appropriate flourishes-and if I'm stumped I'll do one of those Axel Jacksons.")

Ages have been dropping steadily since. Two of Sonja's competitors in the midthirties, Megan Taylor and Cecilia Colledge, of Great Britain, were called "babies" as teenagers. Today, the word around is if you haven't begun skating by the time you're six, forget it. And also washed up at eighteen! Reminds me of that nursery rhyme: "Solomon Grundy, born on Monday, christened on Tuesday, married on Wednesday, took ill on Thursday, worse on Friday, died on Saturday, buried on Sunday."

T'aint so. Skating competitions are now coming full circle. Take LuLu Brooks, of Little Rock, Arkansas. "I didn't set foot on the ice till I was 53 years old," she writes. "One day, the kids at the rink asked me to go to a competition with them in Alpha (ISIA)... I really got some strange looks when I told my friends I was going to San Diego to skate for one minute... [Now] I'm



going to the ISIA Nationals in Detroit to compete in Free-Style Three." And Hugh Devore writes, "I'm 56 years old . . . will be in four events . . . It has been a whole new world. Getting out on the ice all dressed up in a nice outfit is a wonderful thing for me." Is adult competition odd? Hunh-uh. There's golf. And tennis. And World Veterans' Games track meets that occur all over the globe. (Bill Bigelow, in his mid-seventies, has run in Sweden, Australia, New Zealand, and Puerto Rico, as well as on many U.S. tracks.) And Charles Schulz, Snoopy's creator, hosts teams of middle-age-and-up hockey players from all over the country in his Santa Rosa, California, rink each year. (Hey, it's no-holdsbarred, too! They is rough!)

There have always been adult dance events—with some giggling about how colorful and "cute" they were—but the adults are now taking to the singles events (and pairs when they can be found) with glee. Carlotta Heed, of Fairfield, Connecticut, (age 40 plus), writes, "Performing a program for an audience is part of the experience of figure skating as in any other sport or art form . . . It is also a special time—a time to dress up . . . and having only one chance to do your best . . . a gamble rewarded by the audience clapping which . . . dissolves all feelings of tension and nerves . . . " And Garre Taylor, age 34, from Riverside, California, adds, "I have won several medals and trophies. These are great, but the actual fun is the active participation in a competition." Donna Fountain loves the regular USFSA competitions and enjoys the challenge of competing. She lives in Santa Clara, Califor-

A keen sense of balance is a gift that a lucky few seem to be born with. The rest of us have to turn to scientific means to acquire and develop it.

I do not agree with those who claim that you are born with or without certain talents, and must accept your fate passively. As long as a skater has the will to learn, and a pro has the desire to teach, very few problems should be considered insurmountable.

The development of good balance is more complex than the study of spins. It requires the training of a sense rather than the perfecting of an action. It is of prime importance in the control of poise, figures, turns, timing, jumps, etc. A good sense of equilibrium, whether inborn or acquired, is almost indispensable to skating.

During the early years is the time to start instilling the habit of warming up on the floor before beginning to skate. In my opinion, this should be done before figures as well as freestyle. This is because floor exercises can quickly warm up the equilibrium equipment in your body, giving you a better sense of balance then when the body is cold.

Instability is increased during times of stress such as competitions, when fear or worry may be present, preventing muscles from naturally performing their duties. Fear of losing balance is the surest way to lose it. Doing everything you can to stabilize your equilibrium, such as warm-up exercises, is only wise.

Another aid to achieving balance is to use directional focus; learning to focus on certain objects around the rink such as pillars, posts, speakers, people, chairs, music box, etc. This can be of great value coming out of spins, jumps, and a variety of steps.

The axiom, "an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure," is extremely fitting in regard to balance. For example, to insure better stability in a jump, care should be taken to develop balance in the preparation before the jump by having an even distribution of weight over the foot. Preparations



TEAM TRAVEL - PART III

A conduct code must be sent home and signed by skater and parent and returned to the travel chairman. This code will state if there is any misconduct or disruptive behavior on the part of a skater or skaters, suspension will be in order for them at that competition. If problems occur after the team has skated, that member will be suspended from the next competition.

Generally, a coach spends endless hours in the rink at a competition. Skaters, chaperones, and managers remain at the hotel. If a skater or skaters wish permission to leave the hotel for shopping, a movie, etc., permission must be obtained from the team manager. Off the ice and at the hotel the team manager is in charge. Permission given to a skater or skaters by the coach to leave the hotel unknown by the manager can lead to problems. Permission should be granted to all skaters by their team manager. Each team from a club has a separate manager. Skaters must ask the appropriate team manager.

For the safety of the children who wish to go shopping an adult chaperone should be present. It is suggested that teen skaters should go in groups of three or four.

When skaters are permitted to leave the hotel a check-in time is mandatory.

Finally, the dress code must be printed so that everyone is informed.


Team Pins

HOT LIGHTS AND COLD STEEL

At the National Championships in Kansas City in January 1985, an informal poll of the career aspirations of the International Skating Team showed that, second to a career in professional skating, a career in medicine was most appealing. My own experience with skaters has upheld this intriguing fact. The purpose of this month's "Sports Medicine Brief" is to explore this fascination skaters have with medicine and how pursuing a career in one affects the other.

Just what is it that attracts skaters to medicine? The most common response of physicians and former competitors would be the opportunity to serve others in need. This desire to help others is interesting in that skating, as essentially a sport of individuals (except for the newly developed precision skating), develops self-centered principles of discipline, motivation, and concentration. The wild cheering of a noisy ice skating arena after an exceptional skating performance is extremely different from the quiet self-satisfaction of relieving pain or discomfort of another. Is it that with the years of long hours focusing on one's own ability, achieve-

ment, and progression, skaters interested in medicine realize an overwhelming, underlying desire to give of themselves to others? The answer, I think, is partly yes. It is also true of a number of skaters not involved in a medical career with the evidence being the rapidly growing number of benefit skating shows across the country.

However, it is interesting to note that many former skaters who are M.D.'s are in practices involving surgical and/or technical procedures. An operation or technical procedure is indeed a performance that, based on both an immediate as well as long-term result, can be marked on a scale of 0 to 6.0. It is a performance that requires previous long hours of preparation, study, technical practice, concentration, and many times, endurance. The egocentric principles learned in the skating rink can then be directly applied in a field that not only brings the satisfaction of a spirited performance under pressure, but that also directly affects the life of a fellow human being! I believe this combination of the excitement of a "hands-on" type of practice with the realization of an underlying desire to help others is what most attracts skaters to medicine.

How, then, does skating affect one's aspirations in a career in medicine and, just as important, how does pursuing a medical career affect skating? As a practical matter, physicians and surgeons who were past skaters would substantiate the fact that being a competitive figure skater makes the application process to college, medical school, and residency a less formidable affair. From the standpoint of Admission Committees, competitive skaters are attractive people to read about and interview. The attractiveness begins with the respect they have in one's commitment, motivation, and physical ability to achieve. Skating provides the basic ideals necessary to survive the strenuous training and busy lifestyle of medicine.

If viewed from the perspective that a career in medicine is an extension of a person's skating career, then it is difficult to argue that pursuing one career inhibits another. It is unique that an actively competing skater would pursue medical training simultaneously, e.g., David Jenkins performed the tremendous feat of winning the 1960 Olympic Gold Medal while in medical school! Most physicians today had culminated their amateur skating career prior to beginning their medical training. However, the pursuance of pre-medical education is a matter of personal preference. This aspect of education requires thoughtful decision and discussion with peers, coaches, family, and counselors. In my opinion, the experience of a formal education (be it part-time, full-time, interrupted, or continuous) of reading, learning, solving problems, meeting other young people interested in politics, finance, management, history, drama, and art cannot but add a new dimension to a skater's perspective.

Although the focus of this article centers on skaters and their fascination with medicine as physicians and surgeons, there are innumerable opportunities in the health field. The above discussion can broadly be applied to careers in osteopathy, psychology, nursing, nutrition, technical positions, e.g., Operating Room Technicians, Emergency Medical Technicians, and Paramedics. Others may satisfy their need to help others by participating in research activities in human biology, chemistry, and physics. With medicine becoming more and more dependent on technology, persons with computer and engineering backgrounds have become directly associated with physicians and their techniques of patient care. I also cannot help but believe that the principles of motivation, self-discipline, concentration, and physical endurance learned on a 200 ft. by 100 ft. sheet of ice would be extremely useful in the professional careers of dentistry, law, or business.

If you have an interest in the health field as a potential career choice, do not hesitate to contact one of the Sports Medicine members listed in the USFSA Rulebook.

such as this can be practiced repetitively to achieve better balance.

One major factor that makes it possible to hold balance at the completion of a jump is to land at a slant. Landing from a long elevation, the body must incline at an angle that will result in counteracting the force of the momentum. The degree of body slant and the

amount of plié (knee bend) are determined by the velocity and tracjectory of the jump. Stability is established on the way *up* from the plié.

And, of course, posture plays an extremely important part in balance. If the pelvis is in line, knee over the toe in plié, stomach pulled in, shoulders down, and all muscles lined up properly, balance will be much easier to achieve and maintain.

Good luck this coming season and have fun!



"... we really stick together before, during, and after the competitions. We all call or write to each other to find out what competitions we want to compete in each year . . . Being adults, we can't take chances kids take because we either have to go to work right after we get off the ice in the morning, or go to work the next day if we skate in the evening . . . Our main objective is to prove that all facets of skating can be enjoyed by all ages, levels, capabilities, and persistence . . . For all the adults who have been wishing they could skate, 'get with it'; for all the non-working pros (not teaching or doing shows), reinstate as amateurs, you can compete again; and you skaters who guit when you were kids and miss it, come on backothers have . . . we all work together and encourage each other . . . nothing's impossible!" Deb Vestal, a 33-year-old Minneapolis skater, agrees: "Who says we're too old? Never!'

INTERNATIONAL SUGAR CRITERIUM

TOURS, FRANCE NOVEMBER 13-17, 1985

The U.S. skating team which competed in the 1985 International Sugar Criterium left Tours with four medals—one Gold, two Silver, one Bronze, and a fifth place—in addition to fond memories of a quite unique week in France.

The Pair event was won by the Russians Helena Kavitchenko and Rasnid Kadyrkaev. They took the lead in the short program ahead of Kristin Kriwanek and Doug Williams, from the U.S. In the free, Isabelle Kourie and Guy Trudeau, from Canada, skated first in the last group. Their program included tricky new lifts as well as traditionally difficult jumps and spins, and allowed them to keep their third place.

Kristin Kriwanek and Doug Williams skated right after the Canadians. In spite of a fall on a throw Axel, they completed their program with class. A convincing smile on Kristin's face, as well as their slow period to the music of *Cocoon*, especially won them the favors of the audience. They got 5.2's and secured their second place.

Helena Kavitchenko and Rasnid Kadyrkaev were skating to a favorite, "Carmen." Their powerful skating earned them from 5.2 to 5.5, and they won the event in spite of a missed triple jump. Last to skate were the French Sylvie Vaquero and Didier Manaud. They won strong applause from their home audience, and a deserved fourth place.

For the first time the Criterium included a Dance section, and it was no surprise that the beautiful rink of Tours was packed with skating lovers from all over the renowned Loire Valley, as well as from nearby Normandy.

The Russian dancers, Svetana Liapina and Georgi Sur, won the Original Set Pattern dance, ahead of Karen Knieriem and Leif Erickson, from the U.S. In the free, their inimitable Russian temper was expressed to Viennese music, an amazing number of steps per minute and a fantastic speed earned them warm applause—and first place.

It could be thought then that it would be hard to skate right after such a demonstra-

tion. However, another most brilliant show was ahead. What a thrill it was when Karen Knieriem and Leif Erickson started their program, raising from their icy grave to Saint-Saëns's "Danse Macabre"! Apparitions, resurrections, and even a gloomy eye pointed toward the audience: nothing was missing from their program, which, along with intricate moves, earned them second place overall.

French Isabelle Cousin and Martial Mette remained fourth. Jo-Anne Borlase and Scolt Chalmers, from Canada, concluded the event with a precise and clean program, and nicely completed the podium.

On the same evening, Katarina Witt, the East German Olympic champion, and Jozef Sabovcik, the Czechoslovakian European champion, skated an extra exhibition that would be long remembered, Jozef even demonstrating his powerful quadruple toe loop.

In the Ladies' competition, Cornelia Tesch, Federal Republic of Germany, was first after the short program. Her very artistic long free was not sufficient to secure her first place. She finished second overall. Skating next was Florence Copp, from France, whose strong program allowed her to beat Canadian Pamela Giangualono for fourth place.

Then came Debbie Walls, from the U.S. The lack of technical difficulties in her program was compensated by clean jumps and step sequences, her beautiful line and enthusiasm on ice. Debbie, coming from fourth place after the short, could earn third place on the podium—and she did.

Constanze Gensel, from the German Democratic Republic, undoubtedly won the event. Her delicate skating, and the constant devotion of herself both to her art and to the public, gave her an almost Asian grace. But when the time came for jumping, she also proved to be the strongest: triple toe loops, triple flip and triple Salchow gave her her second victory in a row at Tours.

Christopher Bowman, from the U.S., won both the short and the free with ease. In the

free, the Hungarian music he skated to was equal to his temperament. He executed a faultless program, including five different triple jumps and creative spins. Most important, it was a program in which his class in skating was always obvious.

Danish Lars Dresler completed a technically very strong program including two triple Lutzes, and finished sixth overall. Scott Kurttila, from the U.S., missed a triple loop and finished fifth. French Frederic Harpages landed all of his five triple jumps to finish fourth.

Leonid Kaznakov, the blond Russian, was prompt to gather unanimous applause for his

extraordinary step sequences and studied choreography. He finished second overall, ahead of Richard Zander, from the Federal Republic of Germany.

The traditional Sunday exhibitions were a good means to appreciate the nice job done by the organizers of the Criterium. In addition to the champions who had pleased, charmed, and convinced them, the audience applauded favorites Katarina Witt and Jozef Sabovcik, and the French Philippe Roncoli and Laurent Depouilly. And it was no coincidence if on Kristin Kriwanek and Doug Williams' exhibition T-shirts there was written a unanimous "J'aime Tours"!

THE BRITISH ICE DANCE CHAMPIONSHIPS 1985 NOTTINGHAM, ENGLAND NOVEMBER 16, 1985

Sharon Jones and Paul Askham from Altrincham are the new British Ice Dance champions. As the only contestants with World Championship experience, their graceful victory at Nottingham, England, on November 16 was unsurprisingly clearcut.

Much less predictable were the runners-up, Elizabeth Coates and Alan Abretti, who gained a vital verdict over their third-place fellow Londoners, Danielle Biss and David Crofts, to decide which couple would accompany the title winners to Geneva.

The smooth-flowing winners' cohesive free leg actions and neatly timed turns technically backed the charismatic appeal of this well-matched, handsome-looking couple.

Their Austrian Alpine theme in the Set Pattern Polka must have been a visual highlight of two hours of live Saturday afternoon TV coverage at the expense of soccer, Britain's national sport, which underlined the continuing wide interest which Torvill and Dean had so inspiringly fostered.

Jones, twenty-one, and Askham, twentythree, trained by Joan Slater, have stepped ably into the breech left by the retiring champions, Karen Barber and Nicky Slater, and

naturally now hope to spearhead the British overseas dance challenge up until the 1988 Calgary Olympics.

Diane Towler, the former World champion, doubtless will have different ideas. As coach of Coates and Abretti, she can feel justifiably optimistic and it is good for the nation that her charges are emerging so strongly.

For Biss and Crofts, whom many had expected to take the Silver, the outcome must have been a harsh setback after outpointing Coates and Abretti last season.

There was an understandable gap between the top three couples and the other four, the latter all making initial championship appearances, but the upsurge of Birmingham's fourth-placed Cheryl Rushton and Mark Poole was heartening.



SENIOR DANCE Laura Everngam & Jerry Santoferrara, Gold Barbara Buch & Peter Buch, Silver


James Bond music. Barbara and Peter Buch representing the SC of Wilmington were second. Their fluid, graceful style was complimented by delicate piano music in the free skating program.

An appreciative crowd at Solihull warmly saluted Joanne Conway, Britain's new queen of the ice, after some remarkable free skating which dethroned Susan Jackson, twenty, the far more experienced title defender.

Joanne, fourteen, from Sunderland, thus became—except for Yvonne Sugden in 1953—the youngest victor since the pre-war triumphs of Cecilia Colledge and Megan Taylor.

The manner of the youngster's success was cool, methodic, and clearcut, firmly outpointing Susan at every stage with all seven judges placing her first overall.

Susan was adjudged runner-up with equally consistent unanimity. The outcome was not so much a failure on the part of Jackson, as more the emergence of a new, increasingly irresistible force.

Conway, champion a year before most had dared to predict, demonstrated a style, confidence, and technical potential to suggest that, in view of her youth, she may eventually become Britain's most successful woman skater since Jeannette Altwegg, the 1952 Olympic champion.

The highlights of Conway's long free were three impressive triples-two Salchows and a triple toe loop-and a versatile repertoire of well-presented spins. To put her achievement in fair perspective, it must be stressed that this was only her second Senior competition, just two months after finishing third in the St. Ivel International. She is coached by Carlo and Christa Fassi in Colorado Springs.

Stephen Pickavance from Billingham retained the Men's title, with Paul Robinson again runner-up. The winner landed three good triples, not including the Lutz, which Robinson performed well before falling from a triple loop, which put the issue beyond doubt.

Cheryl Peake and Andrew Naylor of Nottingham became the new Pair champions, overhauling brother and sister Neil and Lisa Cushley after the title defenders had led in the short. It was the victors' second attempt as a partnership, but Naylor had previously competed three times with his former partner.

The new winners had made rapid progress during the preceding two months and their best elements were a throw triple Axel, a throw double loop, and a double twist lift.

The British team chose to compete at the European Championships in Copenhagen from January 27 to February 1, comprises: Men—Stephen Pickavance; Ladies—Joanne Conway and Susan Jackson; Pairs—Cheryl Peake and Andrew Naylor; and Dance—Sharon Jones and Paul Askham and Elizabeth Coates and Alan Abretti.
