the main events of the season are still to come.



DANCING WITH YOUR WHOLE BODY

Do you concern yourself only with the feet and steps when you dance? Does your free leg give the appearance of a wet noodle? Is the expression on your face like that of a runner making the last effort to complete the run?

If any of these apply then read on!

A lot of emphasis is always put on proper placement and execution of steps in ice dancing. This of course is an integral part, but a wonderful highlight to dance is interpretation and expression. Dance judges this year will be using two new categories for dance testing. The first has the heading of "dance style," which encompasses expression, form, and unison. The other is "execution," which includes timing, accuracy, and placement.

The purpose is to make everyone more aware of body movement, carriage, and interpretation. "Style" can be defined as grace, elegance, or polish in a person's manner or actions. Therefore much importance will be placed on creating a lyrical impression when viewing the whole body. So let's discuss some ways to work on dancing with our whole bodies.

The obvious place to start is with posture. The most attractive line of the body is achieved by upright carriage from head to toe. We have all heard, "tuck your tummy back, raise your diaphragm, shoulders upright, head up, etc., etc." all of which can also make us look and feel as if we graduated from West Point. While upright posture is important, an effort must be made to maintain flexibility so that a graceful and fluid look can be achieved.

Start with the head. It should be held comfortably as an extension of the spine. The neck and shoulders should remain relaxed. As we all know, it is very difficult to be aware of tension in this area. Try tensing, then fully relaxing the neck and shoulders until you become aware of the difference. The head, neck, and shoulders will now take on a appearance of confidence and motion which is

all important in keeping the body weight properly balanced on the skating side. The face should convey an animated expression. Work on eye contact and/or smiling to reveal to the audience and your partner the interpretation of the dance.

Stretching the rib cage and area above the waist (chest and shoulders) to make them more flexible and able to move is very important to achieve total body movement. Here is a Hatha Yoga stretch that I have found to be very helpful. Stand up straight, tighten abdomen and lift rib cage. Place hands together over your head, interlocking your thumbs and reach for the sky. Inhale and lean to the right. Exhale when you reach resistance; then continue to breath normally for ten counts. Come back slowly to center. Inhale and lean to the left. Stay in your best stretch for another ten counts breathing normally. Repeat once more on each side. This is also a helpful warm-up exercise.

For waist flexibility, try placing the feet parallel and hold your hips straight. Twist only the waist first to the left and then to the right. Repeat four more times. Flexibility of the waist line and rib cage in my opinion needs the most practice to create total body movement when dancing. This also will have an additional benefit in that it keeps the hips straight and pressed forward which helps to create a pleasing hip line and keeps the buttocks from sticking out.

When in dance position, the arms of the dancers should form a picture frame. Each time the edge direction changes the body weight and lean adjusts. The edges of the dance permit the skaters to work together to create a picture of unison while the hands are held in dance position. Practice the dance holds making the upper body move with the edges.

Next we must learn to move freely on the ice to achieve a fluid transfer from one foot to the other, one direction to the other, backward and forward. The free leg is very

CLUB LIABILITY INSURANCE ISSUES

When my telephone rings at National Headquarters, more often than not the person on the other end has a question about insurance. It's no secret that insurance coverage is a growing concern among groups who volunteer their time and who present special programs or events where the public is involved. Figure skating clubs are no exception. Club officials know they need liability coverage and protection for their club members, but they don't always know what is already available to them through the USFSA.

To start with, member clubs are automatically provided with third party liability insurance coverage by the USFSA through the PANOL insurance program of the U.S. Olympic Committee Comprehensive General Liability Policy, up to an amount of \$1 million. The USFSA provides this program at no cost to the clubs. USOC member organizations (of which the USFSA is a Group A Member) are entitled to join this special insurance program tailored for national governing bodies. The USFSA has a policy agreement with PANOL through 1993.

USFSA Clubs have the benefit of liability insurance coverage without cost and without any application or fee process. The insurance is included in the membership privileges provided by the USFSA at the time of registration of the club members with the USFSA. The club's certificate of insurance is sent by the insurance carrier after your annual registration has taken place. If you need proof of insurance and you have not received

your certificate, please call National Headquarters. You can see how important registration of *all* your club members is. If you have members who are *not* registered with the USFSA, they are not covered. Coverage is based on the number of members registered and their names.

In addition, clubs may name their home rinks, municipalities, etc., as additional insured parties upon request with no additional fee. This is a unique plus that rinks will find a true advantage. The application for this process is available from Headquarters. Many clubs name their home rink as an additional insured at the beginning of the year. Other clubs apply for additional insurance for their home rinks for special USFSA sanctioned events, such as shows, special competitions, or when outside sponsorships or contracts make it a requirement.

The policy is extended through the USFSA to include Member Clubs, officials, member coaches, registered administrators, and registered volunteers. In short, it protects the club and its USFSA registered members in liability issues resulting from activities that are directly related to sanctioned events and organized practices that are directly under the supervision of a member coach or trainer. Suits brought by athletic participants and spectators are covered.

If your activity has been sanctioned, it's covered. If in doubt, apply for a sanction and give your club all the protection possible. Any club activity that falls under routine club practice or ice time is covered.

The policy *does not cover* the following: (1) immediate medical payments to athletes, (2) claims arising from kidnap, ransom, or terrorism, (3) claims arising from operation or use of automobiles, (4) claims arising from operation or use of owned watercraft.

The Idaho Falls FSC, the Hickory Hill FSC, and Illinois Valley FSC called with some pertinent questions that are no doubt in the minds of many club officers. Through consultation with the policy authorities, here are several recent clarifications:

Question No. 1: If on a regular club practice session, a registered USFSA skater runs into another and injures that skater, is the offending skater covered for liability? Answer: Both yes and no. Yes, if the member is sued as a Member of the Club. No, if

he/she is sued in a personal suit. Clarification: The policy protects the club and the USFSA, not individuals personally.

Question No. 2: If a USFSA registered coach is teaching a lesson to a registered USFSA skater on rink public session ice, are the coach, the skater, and/or the club covered for third party liability if a public ice skater is injured? Answer: No. Coverage arises from regularly scheduled and supervised activities on club ice, or on ice used exclusively for the club's programs. This event would come under the rink's coverage.

Question No. 3: If a coach who is not a USFSA registered member has been using the USFSA's Skate With U.S. Basic Skills program independently of club involvement, is that coach covered for liability? If the skaters involved in one of our Basic Skills programs are not registered as Basic Skills Members of the USFSA, are they covered? Answer: No. Only those duly registered through the USFSA are protected. If a rink or an individual use our Basic Skills outside of club programs, they are on their own to provide suitable insurance coverages. If Basic Skills participants are registered with the USFSA, the USFSA is protected, and the participant is covered for liability. Therefore, it is imperative to register *all* Basic Skills skaters with the USFSA.

Question No. 4: If a member club plans to host a New Year's Eve party for its adult members at which the club serves dinner, gives exhibitions, provides skating time, and also serves alcoholic beverages at no charge, are there special insurance conditions that apply? Answer: No. If an activity is a duly planned and supervised function of the club's program, no special permissions apply. *However*, the club must not sell the alcoholic beverages. If the club is serving liquor, it must be given away to be routinely covered. Please note, if alcoholic beverages were being sold, special conditions, permissions, licenses, and insurance would apply and the event would *not* be covered by our insurance policy.

Question No. 5: If a spectator attending our winter ice show slips in the stands and is injured, is our club covered? Answer: Yes,

if the ice show is duly sanctioned. Remember, clubs are only responsible for their own acts of negligence. This situation probably would be a rink responsibility. Pay close attention to the agreements you make with the rink when you sign their contracts for ice.

Question No. 6: Does the USFSA liability insurance for clubs cover club "Officers' and Directors'" insurance? Answer: No. Clubs must purchase this insurance on their own. It is not available through the PANOL policy.

It should be evident that the liability insurance is extended to regular or sanctioned activities related directly to club programs and activities. The importance of sanctioning all special activities, and registering *all* members becomes very important in light of this information. A recent caller asked if that meant even tots, ages 3-5 years. Based on what we know about the maximum protection of the coverage, the answer is a resounding "yes."

If your club has a question, first ask yourself if the activity is a regular part of your club's program, or if it is sanctioned by the USFSA. If the answer is yes, you're probably covered. If you need more information, just write or call me at National Headquarters and I will send definitive information. If you have a burning question that hasn't been addressed here, call me at (303) 635-5163.

A future Club Management article will be written on what makes a club and municipal recreation facility's relationship a good one. We've had several requests for information about how to create the perfect "marriage" between club and city (or county). We need input from the clubs who are skating on municipal ice. Write, or call, and tell us what you've done that works, and what should be avoided.

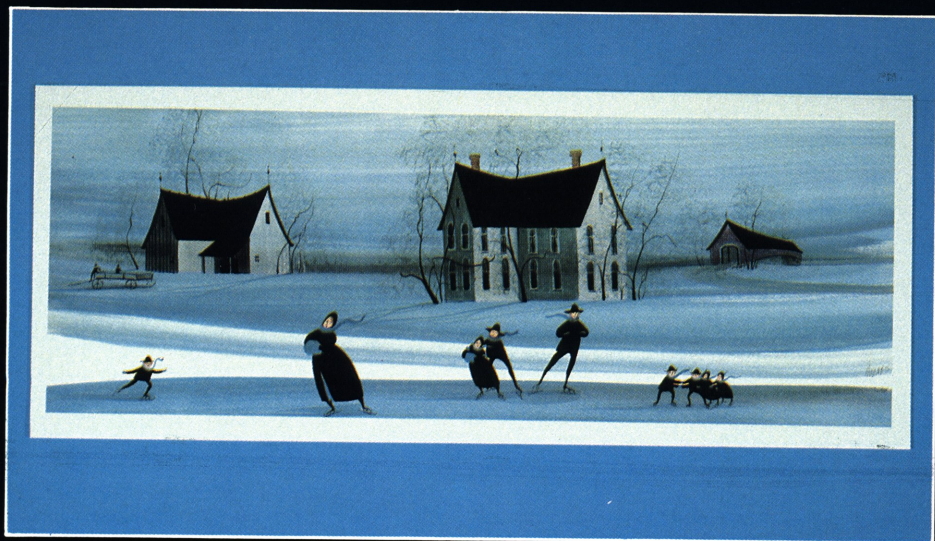

Skating In Art

Because of the interest aroused by the P. Buckley Moss print, "Skating Dreams," presented to Sonia Bianchetti-Garbato at the President's reception following the October Board of Directors Meeting, I arranged to interview Mrs. Moss during her visit to Atlanta in October. She is a gracious, soft-spoken woman who, despite a broken right arm suffered in a mid-October fall, stood uncomplainingly for a total of ten hours to greet hundreds of her admirers at Cove Gallery in Atlanta's Perimeter Mall. Although the broken arm would prevent her from painting for five to six weeks, she did not disappoint anyone who requested her signature on a Moss print, poster, plate, or catalog. Several of her original watercolors were also featured at the Atlanta showing. A particularly beautiful one, a skating scene entitled "Winter's Dance," was the last painting she finished before suffering the broken arm.

Ice skaters have appeared in artists' creations for hundreds of years, since intrepid folk first began to glide along the frozen canals of Holland. Perhaps the most enthusiastic proponent of ice skating in present-day art is the woman who signs her work "P. Buckley Moss."

Born Patricia Buckley in 1933 in Staten Island, New York, Mrs. Moss happily recalls having been "brought up on skates" on the frozen swamps and ponds near her home. "I can't remember not knowing how to skate," she says. "Sometimes we even skated from our house to the pond. Skating as a child, I felt wonderful! I felt very free, like a dancer who could dance, a singer who could sing."

Mrs. Moss had no formal training, but admired and tried to emulate a neighbor child who was a figure skater. "I was never a good student, but I was very athletic. It's too bad they couldn't have given me skating lessons—I think I would have been good at it."

Patricia Buckley's artistic talent became evident at an early age. She first attended Manhattan's Washington Irving High School, where art became the



focus of her studies, and later the Cooper Union, from which she graduated with a degree in Fine Arts and Graphic Design. For many years thereafter, following her marriage and while raising six children, she painted only for her own enjoyment and that of her family and friends.

In 1964 the family moved to the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia, an area which is home to colonies of the Amish and Mennonite people who now populate much of her artwork. A one-person exhibition, which was awarded after capturing first prize in a local art show in 1967, launched her career as a popular artist.

Mrs. Moss introduced her six children (who now range in age from twenty-one to thirty) to skating one particularly cold winter when the ponds froze near the family's home ("The Barn") in Waynesboro, Virginia. She was puzzled at their initially unsuccessful attempts, when they were unable to "stroke right off" as she recalled doing as a child.

While Mrs. Moss has skated occasionally on indoor rinks, it is clear that skating in her heart belongs on the frozen ponds of her childhood. All of her skaters are pictured outdoors, with scarves flying in the wind, on wintry landscapes of old houses and leafless trees, expressing the special joy of skating's original setting.

Although Mrs. Moss has never attended a figure skating competition, she does watch and enjoy them on television. "JoJo" and "Scott," the newest of her skating prints, are the result of her admiration for JoJo Starbuck and Scott Hamilton, neither of whom she has met.

Skaters are by no means the only subject of interest to this artist. Children and family groups, nearly all in Amish or Mennonite dress; animals; birds, particularly the Canadian geese who visit the reservoir near her Washington D.C., studio; trees; and old buildings all are favorite subjects.

Her paintings are characterized by a simple old-world charm. Peter Rippe, in the catalog for the Roanoke Museum of Fine Art's P. Buckley Moss exhibition in 1985, wrote, that her art is "the documented proof of a way of life and looking that doesn't exist and has never existed, but which is certainly valid and is always desirable.

The work of P. Buckley Moss, in a growing variety of media, is now available in well over five-hundred galleries throughout the United States. Most popular are her lithographs, each issued in limited editions of one-thousand prints, individually signed and numbered. Between 1974 and 1987, more

than forty P. Buckley Moss skating scenes were published as lithographic prints of original watercolors. The current P. Buckley Moss catalog (#8) includes six such prints: "Skating Away," "The Ice Show," "Skating Day," "Skating Party," "Family Winter," and "Flynn Mansion." Since the catalog appeared in the summer of 1987, "Skating Love," "Winter in Long Grove," and "JoJo" and "Scott" have been published.

The skating prints have such widespread appeal that 1,000-print editions are often exhausted within three or four months of publication. Most skating prints listed in earlier catalogs are no longer available and have become highly sought-after collector's items. However, because Mrs. Moss considers skaters "an essential part" of her art, new skating prints will continue to appear regularly. (A comprehensive list of P. Buckley Moss skating prints is found at the end of this article.)

In addition to prints, skaters appear in Moss's original watercolors (\$1,400 to \$10,000), etchings, and a silkscreen print; on a collector's plate entitled "Frosty Frolic" (\$75); in a porcelain figurine, "Skater's Waltz" (limited edition of

1,000, \$300); on three among her popular series of unlimited edition geographic posters: "Boston," "New York," and "Minnesota" (\$25); and in a counted cross-stitch needlework design called "Solitary Skater" (\$6). (Prices are approximate and may vary.)

Mrs. Moss spends a surprising amount of time on the road visiting galleries which feature her work, a practice which has taught her to paint wherever she finds herself. Between May and November 1987, she was scheduled to appear at forty-five galleries in twenty states and one in Montreal. She will visit Japan in April of 1988. Mrs. Moss is accompanied on her travels by her second husband and business manager, Malcolm Henderson. A native of Devonshire, England, he moved his art gallery from London to Washington, D.C., in 1976, and met Mrs. Moss when he began to sell her paintings.

P. Buckley Moss has donated many of her artworks to charitable organizations, particularly those which promote children's welfare. Many thousands of dollars have been raised through the auction or raffle of her paintings and prints. On March 5, 1988, Mrs. Moss will appear at the Viennese Waltz Ball in Denver,



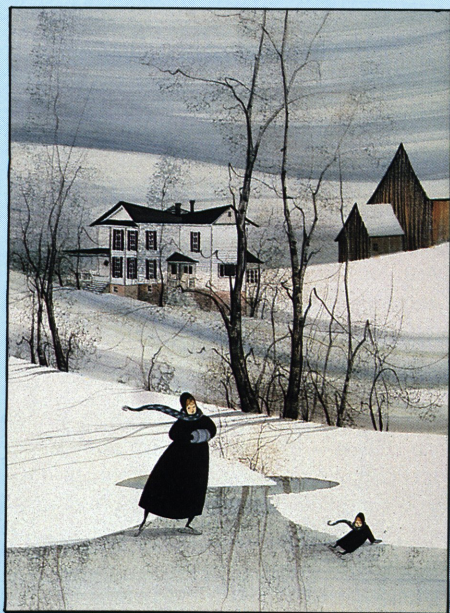

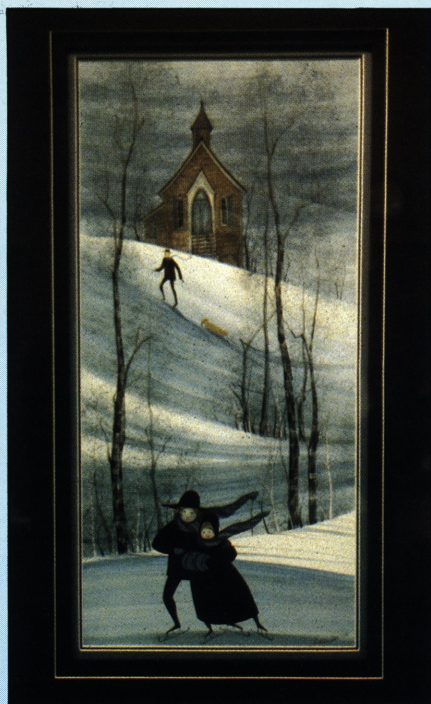
where the donation of a major painting will benefit the Excelsior Youth Center.

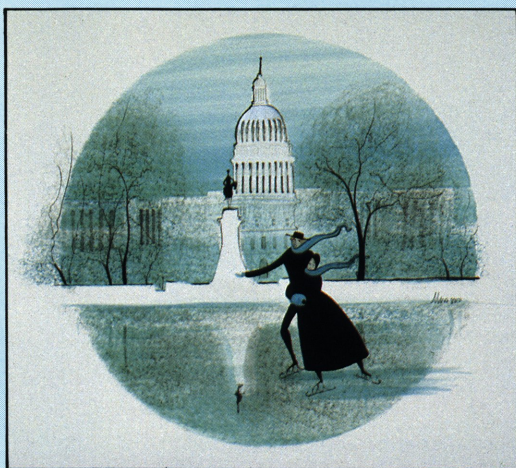

Original watercolor of "Winter's Dance"



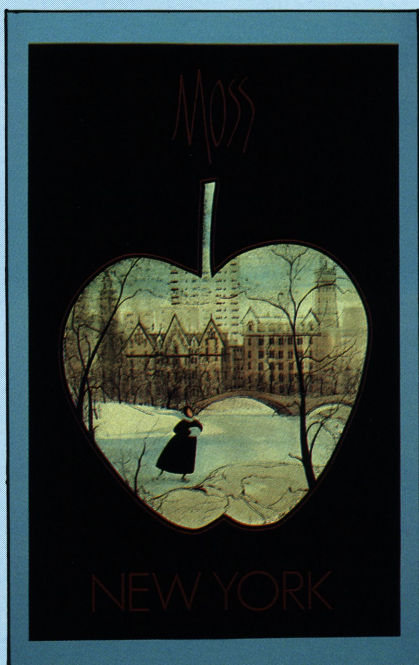

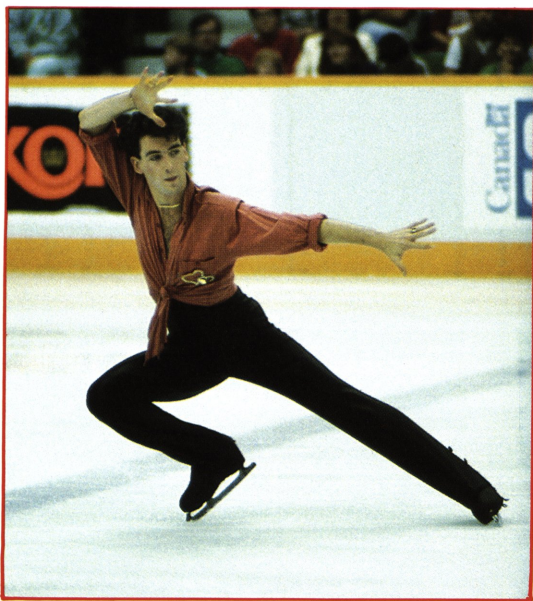

The focus throughout the week was unavoidably on the two Brians—Boitano and Orser—as the media tried its best to make the meet into a battle of major proportions, which it was not. In the compulsories, which included a rocker, paragraph double three, and a change loop, Orser laid down some of the best figures he has ever done in com-

petition, taking all three by a majority vote. Boitano was second, followed by Victor Petrenko, USSR, and Richard Zander, Federal Republic of Germany. The Father David Bauer Olympic Arena was the same venue that will be used for the Olympic Games.

The short program was skated in the cavernous Saddledome, site of the championships events in February. Spanish and big band seem to be the themes of the year in both the men's short and long program, as well as do-or-die triple Axels.

Kurt Browning, completed the Axel but three-turned before the double loop and popped the double Axel for a sixth-place finish. Boitano, uncharacteristically, three-turned in the combo in an otherwise perfect presentation, to finish second. His new short to "Les Patineurs" in a classical style is almost as a tribute to the history of figure skating. Skating in the style of the early 1900's, the program contains authentic movements, including tracing a grapevine to racing the full length of the ice at top speed.

Orser also had trouble in the short stepping out of the double loop. For both Brians it was an unusual evening. Orser claimed it was his first missed combo in the short since 1980, and

Boitano said it was only the second time in his career that he had not skated a clean short.

In the long program, Kurt Browning, from nearby Edmonton, who stood sixth after compulsories and short, came through with an outstanding freestyle, setting claim as the heir-apparent to Orser. Skating to the music from "The Grand Canyon Suite," he opened with a triple toe-triple toe and just held on to a triple Axel, and despite a fall on a triple Lutz, still managed to receive marks of 5.3 to 5.7, to finish third in the long and fourth overall.

Petrenko slipped from a triple Axel, which had given him trouble most of the week in practice, and fell twice later, once on a triple Lutz, but with his majestic style and presentation, still managed to finish fourth in the long for an overall bronze medal.

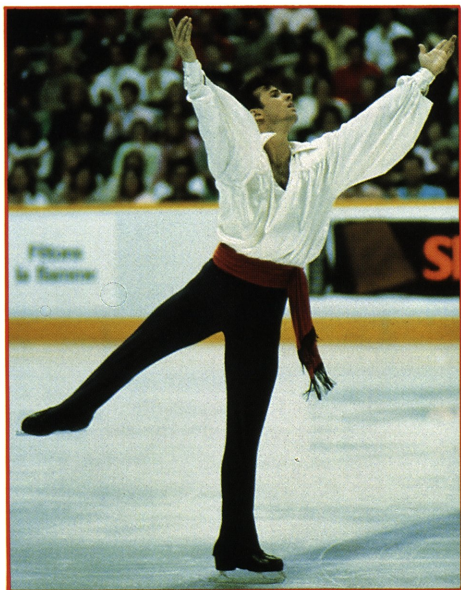
The audience eagerly had been waiting to see the new programs of both Boitano and Orser. Skating first of the

two, dressed in a maroon and gold-trimmed military uniform, Boitano captivated the imagination of the audience. In addition to his extraordinary strengths, there was a new maturity and presentation, a return to a style which he had established several years ago. In interpreting the music from *Napoleon*, Brian demonstrates a full range of emotions, showing courage in battle, remorse and grief the following morning, love of woman, and pride in victory. Opening with the "Tanno" and following with a triple Axel-double loop, and four other triples, he was given a thunderous standing ovation. Marks were all 5.8's and 5.9's.

Orser had drawn to skate last, and the vibrant music from "The Bolt" gave more than sufficient opportunities for the "Canadian sanction" to display his versatility and a variety of interpretation, though his nonstop high energy style varies little between sections. Opening

with a hard-landed triple Lutz, he completed two triple Axels, one in combination, to set off a flurry of excitement in the audience and another standing ovation. His marks were also all 5.8's and 5.9's, besting Boitano by only three-tenths of a point in the long. When scores are that close, school is far from out between these two friendly rivals in the months ahead.

Ladies' Singles

The early morning figures saw Elizabeth Manley of Canada take the lead and maintain it for the event, with Debi Thomas finishing second, ahead of British champion Joanne Conway, with Suzanne Becher of the Federal Republic of Germany fourth.

The short program became a contest more of staying upright than one of successful technical execution.

Of the early skaters in the short, Masako Kato of Japan proved herself an excellent jumper by placing fourth. Stephanie Schmid of Switzerland has a young refreshing style with good communication, and Natalia Skrabnevskaya would appear to be the most elegant and promising Soviet skater to be seen in recent years.

Joanne Conway, showing a great maturity in style and presentation missed the combination and finished fifth in the short but remained third overall. Simone Koch, German Democratic Republic, wearing black tights and gloves landed a triple toe-double loop and included a Biellmann in the spin combination for third in the short, and to fourth overall.

Manley fell on the combination, as did so many others, and held a somewhat awkward camel position with upright shoulders and head. Her double flip with both hands overhead gave her a second-place finish by only one judge, but still maintaining the lead. Thomas appeared the most confident and secure of the night, using a double loop-triple

toe in the combination and although skating cautiously, took unanimous first place.

The long program again was marred with more spills than one would expect from this level of competitors, despite the early season jitters.

Koch, possibly costumed by Frederick's of Hollywood, sought to move into medal position. Her program was excessively choreographed to unsuccessfully cover weak technical content, and held her in fourth place.

Conway, again was impressive with her maturity of style and presentation, belying her sixteen years, and though the program may have been a bit weak choreographically, many felt she was not marked adequately on artistic impression. She took a unanimous third, and held for the bronze.

Manley's long program was one of constant motion, somewhat in the Orser style, with opening and closing music from *Irma La Douce*. A popped Salchow did not deter firm landings on triple toe, flip, and loop, and final marks for second place.

Thomas looking slim and sleek in a new black, silver, and red dress, opened with a stunning triple toe-triple toe followed by three other triples, with a Salchow combination for a majority of firsts and the gold medal. She now has won six international competitions, a record not currently matched by any competitor.

Pairs

A small field of only seven couples from six countries made up the pairs competition. If medals were given by audience response America's Katy Keeley and Joseph Mero and Great Britain's Cheryl Peake and Andrew Naylor would have been favored.

In the opening short program, Elena Kvitchenko and Rashid Kadyrkaev, of the USSR, stepped out to an early lead,

winning by only one judge over Keely and Mero. With three first placements and three second placements, the British judge, for unknown reasons, placed them fifth, with marks over 1.0 below other judges.

Christine Hough and Doug Ladret finished third, after she fell from the required double flip jump. (Placed fourth by their own Canadian judge, the British judge set them in first.)

Peake and Naylor performed a fast-paced short to piano rag music, dressed in brilliant yellow short sleeved outfits, and finished fourth.

In the long program the excitement Peake and Naylor had in the short was lost. Minor slips throughout, out-of-sync spins and a touchdown on solo jumps held them in fourth, unable to overtake the bronze position.

Kvitchenko and Kadyrkaev using (another) Spanish theme, slipped from first when he fell on a triple flip, and their program weakened in the final minutes from lack of experience. A nice press lift set down immediately into a death spiral was distinctive, but the best they could do was a one-judge majority for second and a final second place.

Keeley and Mero were in good position to overtake the leaders and opened with fine side-by-side double Axels. A

bad catch on a twist lift was offset by a fine lateral, but a fall from one throw jump and a touchdown on another, gave them a third-place finish in the long and third overall for the bronze medal. Their new program is one of power, style, and excitement, displaying pair skating at its best.

Hough and Ladret overcame a touchdown on a throw Salchow and a slip on the throw Axel, with a strong program skated to music from "Slaughter On Tenth Avenue." A step-over death spiral and a variation on a star lift were special audience pleasers as were side-by-side triple toes. They were rewarded with the only standing ovation of the event and first place in the long to capture the gold.

Ladret is also rightly due a special comeback award, following a serious skull fracture suffered in practice last year. Even at Worlds, he skated the warm-ups wearing a football helmet. He now appears fully recovered and in good form.

Dance

A small field of nine couples from seven countries made up the dance entries. The Compulsory Dances drawn included the Viennese Waltz, the Tango, and the Paso Doble.

As usual, the results of the Compulsories set the general pattern for the remainder of the competition. Canadians Tracy Wilson and Rob McCall took the lead, followed by Kathrin and Christoff Beck of Austria. Sharon Jones and Paul Askham of Great Britain edged out Lia Trovati and Roberto Pelizzola for third. Susan Wynne and Joseph Druar were sixth.

The new OSP for the season, the Tango, proved popular, though most of them seemed to be more in the nature of a parody on the rhythm than a true exploration of it. Once again, McCall and Wilson placed first, followed by the

Beck's. Trovati and Pelizzola outscored Jones and Askham to place third but remained in fourth overall. Wynne and Druar received the best marks in their flight, despite the fact they drew to skate first, and remained sixth.

The free dance, as an event somehow seemed lacking in overall excitement and fully developed programs. Wynne and Druar, unable to overcome the luck of the draw, again skated first, but their up-tempo program, including "Fever," "Mack the Knife," and "Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy" was dramatically offset to the richly interpreted "Kiss Me Once." They were warmly received by the audience. Despite winning their group again, and three fifth placements, they finished sixth overall.

There was little doubt as to the outcome after Wilson and McCall's fast-paced jazz program charmed the audience and judges. One 6.0 was received, accompanied by a standing ovation.

Beck and Beck, in more of a traditional style to big band music, displayed elegant body lines and held firmly in second place for the silver medal.

In the battle for the bronze, Trovati and Pelizzola presented a Latin folk program, that was pleasing overall despite some trouble with the footwork and rather weak choreography. However, it was judged good enough to move them into third and the bronze medal over Jones and Askham's rather refreshing program to Broadway music.

As a "preview" to the fireworks to come in '88, Skate Canada more than met the challenge. Some of the cast had its first rehearsal on the stages that will host the Winter Games. None of the performances were as finished or as polished as they will be in February, so there is nothing to do now but to wait for the curtain to rise on opening night in Calgary.

SKATE CANADA **Preview '88**

Footnotes

The 1988 Skate Canada pin is a large epoxy domed hexagon, reminiscent of the World pin from Calgary. There was a limited number produced, and supposedly, all were sold out before the competition was over. It is sure to have special collector interest, as special trades were being made for the pin before the week was out.

☆ ☆ ☆

Olympic pin trading fever had already begun to envelop Calgary. Official Canadian pins will not be imported into the U.S. for sale, and vice-versa. But sponsor pins seemed to have top interest, with the handsomest among the lot being the large CBC pin, one of three they have issued, as well as the Canadian Petro pin for the torch run and the Opening Ceremonies pin from the University of Calgary.

☆ ☆ ☆

The Canadian Olympic Committee (OC0) used Skate Canada as a test for some of its

security, credentialing, access, and transportation procedures that will be employed at the Games in February. In most instances they failed. Restrictions changed daily, if not hourly. Needless to say, there are many bugs to be ironed out in the months to come. The problems seem to be in the execution and personnel, not in the general plans.

☆ ☆ ☆

Despite the fact that Skate Canada was also intended to be a try-out of the facilities prior to the games, only two of the three rinks to be used in February were utilized. As it was, the Saddledome surface was not the same size it will be at the Olympics. The Saddledome is a marvelous facility, and despite its size, there is an intimacy in the proximity of the skater to the audience. However, there are sightline problems in seeing both ends of the rink from the first twelve rows or so, due to the slope of seating.

☆ ☆ ☆

It was interesting to hear Liz Manley say that she had only performed at "about seventy-five percent" of her ability, and then hear Brian Orser say that he had performed at only "about seventy-five percent" of his

ability not long after. The media picked up on the identical statements as more than a coincidence.

☆ ☆ ☆

The withdrawal of Marina Klimova and Sergei Ponomarenko, USSR, due to the flu, and of Grzegorz Filipowski of Poland due to a pulled groin muscle prior to the event was regrettable, as was the withdrawal of Richard Zander, West Germany, due to an injury during the event.

☆ ☆ ☆

One of the highlights of the exhibition was Doug Ladret's entrance through the audience, supposedly because the guards would not allow him in the competitors' entrance without his credentials (a frequent happening during the week). Accompanied by the Olympic theme music, carrying a Bic lighter aloft down the steps, he added a tongue-in-cheek touch to the week that at times seemed to be taken all too seriously.

Ticket scalpers were already at work outside the Saddledome, offering Olympic seats for \$100 per event. Surprisingly, there were more customers than tickets.

☆ ☆ ☆

The new Sunlife Trophy presented to the winning Canadian team was only a replica of the original. Unfortunately, as the last engraving was being done on the fine crystal trophy by the artist, it shattered into a hundred pieces. A new one is now being made to replace the original.

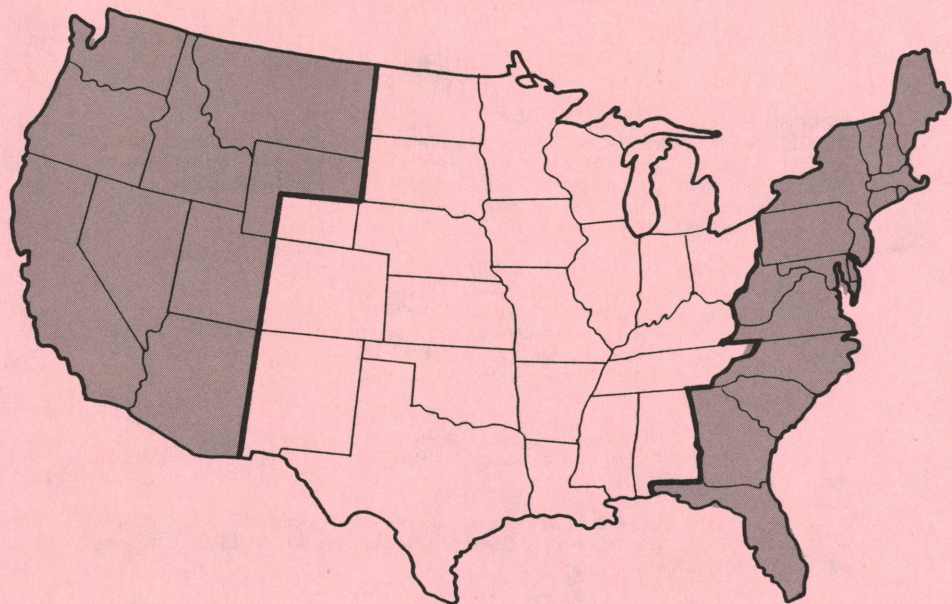

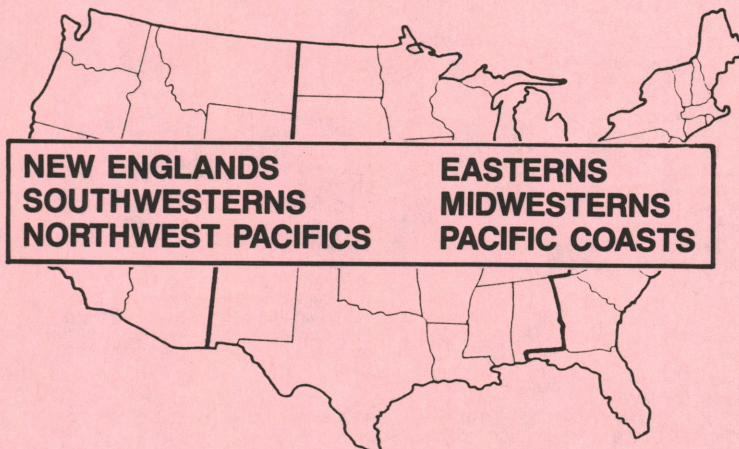

All nominees for the World Figure Skating Hall of Fame are selected by the general public. Nominees are not limited to living persons nor to U.S. citizens and need not be members of the USFSA. Any person meeting the qualifications below is eligible.

Use this form to nominate those persons that are worthy of election to membership in the Hall of Fame and who meet the qualifications in any one of the categories listed below. Only one nomination form per person each year will be accepted and no more than ten nominees in total may be included on each form.

1. Skaters from throughout the world who have compiled an outstanding competitive record and who have made a noteworthy contribution in style or technique and have been retired from competitive skating for at least ten years.
2. Persons who have made a noteworthy contribution to figure skating in a non-skating capacity through service to an amateur figure skating association and have not been active in such capacity for at least five years.
3. Persons who have made a noteworthy contribution to figure skating in a non-amateur capacity. Non-teaching professionals must have been retired at least five years, while teaching professionals must have at least twenty-five years of experience as such.

Following compilation of all nominations received by the closing date of February 1, 1988, the 27 Hall of Fame Electors will vote for the eligible nominees in each category. The announcement of the nominees elected will be made at the Annual Meeting of the USFSA Governing Council in May 1988:

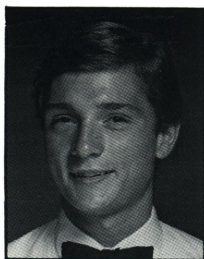

Americans in Paris

On Monday, November 16, the American entourage arrived in Paris for the first International Grand Prix Competition. It was overcast and cool but still early in the day.

After mulling through Paris traffic in a crowded bus, the team finally arrived at the official hotel, the Pullman St. Jacques. Our team consisted of Jill Trenary, Angelo D'Agostino, Natalie and Wayne Seybold, and Susan Wynne and myself. The team leader was Margaret Faulkner along with judge Roger Glenn.

On the plane to Paris, we were told to stay awake during the day we arrived and then sleep only at night to adjust to the time change. Roger Glenn and his lovely wife Anne decided to keep everyone awake by taking us sightseeing. The tired, slap-happy team took the Paris metro system to the Arch of Triumph, our first of many sights. The metro system is quick, clean, and inexpensive in comparison with the systems of New York and London. Many of us thought it was the most efficient system we had seen.

From the arch, we walked down the Champs Élysées with designer shops surrounding everyone, taunting travelers checks and credit cards. After a quick lunch at a typical French restaurant (expensive), we walked to the Cathedral of Notre Dame.

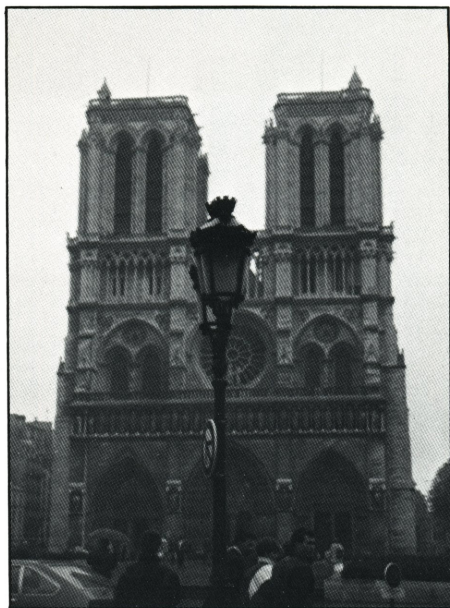

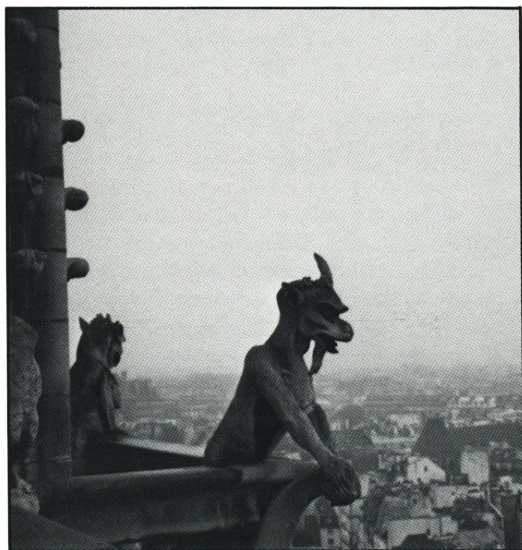

The wind was so strong you could feel the structure swaying under your feet—kind of like the end of a free dance.

After we descended from the tower, it was time to go to the queen of museums, the Louvre. This priceless keeper of time houses so many artifacts, paintings, and sculptures that to see it all would take days. Our main point of interest was the "Mona Lisa." Everyone was awestruck as the lady of Leonardo da Vinci seemed to stare at you from anywhere you stood.

The closing gala of the Grand Prix was a spectacular display of exhibitions by all the medalists. The skaters were allowed to relax and entertain a large, enthusiastic audience. Every American skater was so well appreciated that each was brought back for an encore. As a special surprise, Katarina Witt and Brian Orser were guest exhibitors, christening this first Paris Grand Prix. The American team was also honored with the first Grand Prix team trophy.




That evening after a long week of competition and sightseeing, many skaters went to a French disco called "La Scala," to have fun and relax. This would be the last time that friends and competitors would see each other for a long time, so it was nice to leave on a friendly note.

All the U.S. team fell in love with Paris; the fashion, the history, the romance. The team was honored to be guests of the French people and were extraordinary ambassadors for the States.

In parting: international competitors are a special part of figure skating. They allow people to travel the world and make new friends from many countries. Many people would not experience these special adventures without the sport of figure skating.

**REPORT OF ACTION
taken by the
USFSA BOARD OF DIRECTORS
at its
ANNUAL MEETING
held in
COLORADO SPRINGS, CO
October 9 & 10, 1987**

The written reports of the Officers and Committee Chairmen to the 1987 Annual Meeting of the United States Figure Skating Association Board of Directors are contained in the Report Book of the Meeting. Action taken by the Board on specific requests and action on requests from the floor are summarized herein. Actions creating changes in the Official Rules (marked *) will become effective with the publication of the 1988-89 *Rulebook* unless voted otherwise at the May 1988 meeting of the Governing Council.

President

1. Accepted the Minutes Committee report approving the Minutes of the May 6 and 7, 1987, Board Meeting.
2. Approved by acclamation a resolution in memory of Roy Winder, a former Executive Director of the USFSA.

Treasurer

1. Approved the budget as amended.
2. Approved the continuation of the CPA Firm of Grant Thornton as auditors through June 30, 1988.
3. Approved the placing of funds, in an amount considered feasible by the Investment Committee, into the U.S. Olympic Foundation: this not to include short term operating funds or Memorial Fund money.

Competitions

1. Approved a resolution granting \$2,500 to the 1990 National Precision Competition.
2. Approved underwriting any losses by the 1988 National Collegiate Championships up to the amount of \$4,000, and that the National Collegiate Championships be continued under the Program Development Committee for one more year.

- 3* Approved the adoption of ISU Rule 366, "Call to Start": "Every Competitor must begin each part of the competition (compulsory figure, dance, short program, original set pattern dance, free skating, and free dancing) no later than two minutes after his name has been announced, failing which such competitor shall be considered withdrawn." to replace present wording (CR 16.022).
4. Did not approve a change in the distribution of net profits of the National Championships.
- 5* Approved the establishment of two divisions of Adult Dance at qualifying competitions: Senior Adult Dance (one or both partners has passed one Silver Dance or higher) and Junior Adult Dance (neither partner has passed a Silver Dance).
- 6* Approved the requirement of only one trophy to be presented to the USFSA for Dance or Pairs (TMR 1.07).
7. Approved the appointment of three persons to travel to Reno, Nevada, for a final site inspection for the 1988 National Precision Championships. (Final sanction approved.)
8. Approved the issuing of a provisional sanction to the Skating Club of Lake Placid, Lake Placid, New York, to host the 1989 "Skate America" competition.
9. Approved by ballot the issuing of a provisional sanction to the Warwick Figure Skaters, Warwick, Rhode Island, to host the 1989 National Precision Championships.
10. Approved the appointment or promotion of the following: *National Referee*-William Wall, Shaker FSC; *National Dance Referee*-Theodore G. Clarke, The SC of Boston and William Wall, Shaker FSC; *Sectional Referee*-Charles E. McGee, SC of Wilmington and Dick Lean, Palomares FSC; *Precision Referee*-Nancy Archie-Meyer, SC of Lake Placid; William R. Beharrell, Colonial FSC; Mrs. Benjamin W. Fauver, Kennebec SC; Lee Ann Miele, Providence FSC; Donald E. Mumper, San Diego FSC; William K. Munns, Diablo FSC;

Ronald T. Pfenning, Yarmouth IC; Louis J. Rossoni, Detroit SC; Les Seale, All Year FSC; William S. Smith, Tulsa FSC; Betty Sonnhalter, Arctic Blades FSC; Albert D. Viviani, Detroit SC; William Wall, Shaker FSC; and Virgil L. Widler, Buffalo SC.

Dance

- 1* Approved a resolution that the music for Intermediate and Adult Variation Dance be selected in May of the year preceding the year of competition.
2. Approved a resolution that the USFSA's endorsement of the retention of three compulsory dances in World Championships be conveyed to the ISU Council.
- 3* Approved a reduction in the number of patterns required on certain *dance tests*, as follows: Fourteen Step, 3; European Waltz, 2; American Waltz, 2; Starlight Waltz, 2; Ravensburger Waltz, 2; Yankee Polka, 2; and Tango Romantica, 2. (Note: all other dances would remain the same.)
- 4* Approved a revised description of a "twizzle" to appear as DG 6.18.
- 5* Approved an insertion in DD 3.24 describing the lady's swing three turn.
- 6* Approved replacing the description of the standard of the International Dance Test (TR 24.09) with the following: "The Candidates must give a truly superior performance, displaying accurate timing, appropriate style and expression, excellent unison, and precise technique. While absolute perfection is not required, candidates will be expected to give a performance of very high quality."

JUDGES

1. Approved the recommendation of James Disbrow to the ISU as both an International Judge and an International Dance Judge.
2. Accepted the resignation of William P. McPike, St. Moritz ISC, as a Gold Test Judge and a Senior Competition Judge.
3. Approved the appointment or promotion of the following: *Gold Test*

Membership

- 1* Approved a revision of the Membership Rules to permit a Full Member

Club that has been granted inactive status to return to active status as a Full Member.

- 2* Approved the deletion of the requirement for recommendations from USFSA members or reliable non-skating persons for Individual Members (MR 10.02).
- 3* Approved in concept the revision of the dues structure for Individual Members, making the purchase of a *USFSA Rulebook* optional. (Change of Article XXV of the USFSA Bylaws in the call of the May meeting of the Governing Council.)
4. Approved a resolution which directs the Membership Committee to allow a second USFSA club to establish principal headquarters in a rink already the principal headquarters of another USFSA club as long as ice is available.

Precision

- 1* Approved a resolution changing the maximum number of alternates on a precision team to an unlimited number.
2. Approved the inclusion of not more than \$10,000 in the budget for the cost of a professionally produced video tape to generate interest in precision skating.

Sanctions

1. Approved the following as "eligible persons in figure skating": Jackie A. Addis, Tarpon Springs, FL; Dymrna L. Bakhshay, Stockton, CA; Lee F. Brink, Santa Monica, CA; Gary Alan Clark, Ypsilanti Township, MI; Jonathon S. Fishbein, Westfield, NJ; Lori N. Foster, Oak Park, IL; Terrie J. Kerth, Fremont, CA; Jean G. 2. Approved the return to eligible status of Louisa MacPhail.

Singles and Pairs

- 1* Approved the following resolution: that in all school figure tests "a and b" (meaning right and left foot start) be changed to "a or b," with the exception of loop figures. Prior to the test warm up the Judge in Charge will conduct a draw for the starting foot for the first figure, thereafter, the starting foot will alternate.
- 2* Approved the addition of another pair test to the structure, to be called the "Novice Pair Test," preceding the Silver Pair Test, which would then be renamed the "Junior Pair Test" and upgraded to its comparable competition level; also the renaming of the Bronze Pair Test to "Intermediate Pair Test" and the Gold Pair Test to "Senior/Gold Pair Test." (The Preliminary Pair Test would remain the same.)

Tests

- 1* Approved a resolution requiring professionals in skating who wish to take USFSA tests to be current USFSA members at the time of testing.
- 2* Approved the revision of TR 5.05 to drop the \$5 professional fee from the test structure, making the test fees for professionals the same as for all USFSA members.

Sports Medicine

1. Approved mandatory education on the subject of drug testing at the 1989 National Championships and at every Nationals thereafter. The cost of drug testing to be borne by the USOC.

ISU

1. Authorized preparation of bids for the 1992 World Figure Skating Championships, and directed the President to appoint an appropriate bid review and preparation committee.

Major Grants & Acquisitions Committee (A Special Committee)

1. Authorized an employment search for an in-house professional fund raiser to be called "Resource Development Director."
2. Approved the cancellation of the existing and future loan program of the Memorial Fund.

3. Approved an additional \$5,000 be given to each of the current World Team members from the unappropriated funds in the Memorial Fund.
4. Approved the allocation of \$26,325 to the academic scholarship program of the Memorial Fund.
5. Approved the conversion of the current loan program funds to outright grants.

Figure Review Committee (An Ad Hoc Committee)

1. Approved an official statement to the ISU that the USFSA is in favor of the retention of compulsory figures in ISU Championships. (Note: An alternate proposal will be made to the ISU providing for starting the short program first, two compulsory figures next, then the free skating.)

New Business

1. Approved a resolution that it will no longer be necessary to declare a matter urgent in order for it to be brought before the Board of Directors at any future meeting.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

Selections of figure skaters to the Olympic and World Teams is based on several factors, culminating in the Nationals immediately prior to the Olympic Winter Games. The USFSA does *not* select the Team based on one qualifying competition. At the conclusion of the 1988 National Championships, the Olympic and World Teams are selected.

Only due to illness or injury of the previous year's world medalist would a skater placing in the top three of the '88 Nationals possibly be displaced by another skater.

This is the same basic selection plan that has been used since the 1952 Olympic Games, and is also the plan used by the USFSA in selecting its team for the World Championships each year.

important in achieving balanced body weight, quick transitions, and the completion of a pleasing body line. It should always be held straight when extended but ready to quickly flex for the next step.

Practice shifting the whole body weight quickly from lean to lean as needed when doing Fourteenstep or Kilian transitions. Practice long sustained edges holding the body weight properly in order to stay as long as needed for an American Waltz edge.

Here are some drills to use. For fast transitions, practice left chassé then right chassé to Fourteenstep music around the perimeter of the rink. Then change to triple step progressive sequences. For long sustained edges use swing rolls on all edges, backward and forward to Dutch Waltz music. The effort should not be visible and the impression must be of ease. A little practice gives a very pleasing look.

Try to choose music that helps you with body motion and interpretation. Let the musical rhythm and beat inspire free movement without concern about whether the feet are absolutely parallel at the transition or the foot placed exactly at right angles to the in-step when executing a Mohawk. Learn to play on the ice. Attempt to allow your whole body to follow the edge with a free and easy motion. Feel the joy of letting the skate, *skate*.

Many "modern day" dancers are able to express and emote with their interpretations of free dance and original set pattern dances. There is a freedom of movement and expression we all like to watch and should emulate. With a little practice we can experience this kind of enjoyment ourselves when skating the compulsory dances or experiencing the fun of original work. Remember to practice dancing with your whole body but most of all, *enjoy!*

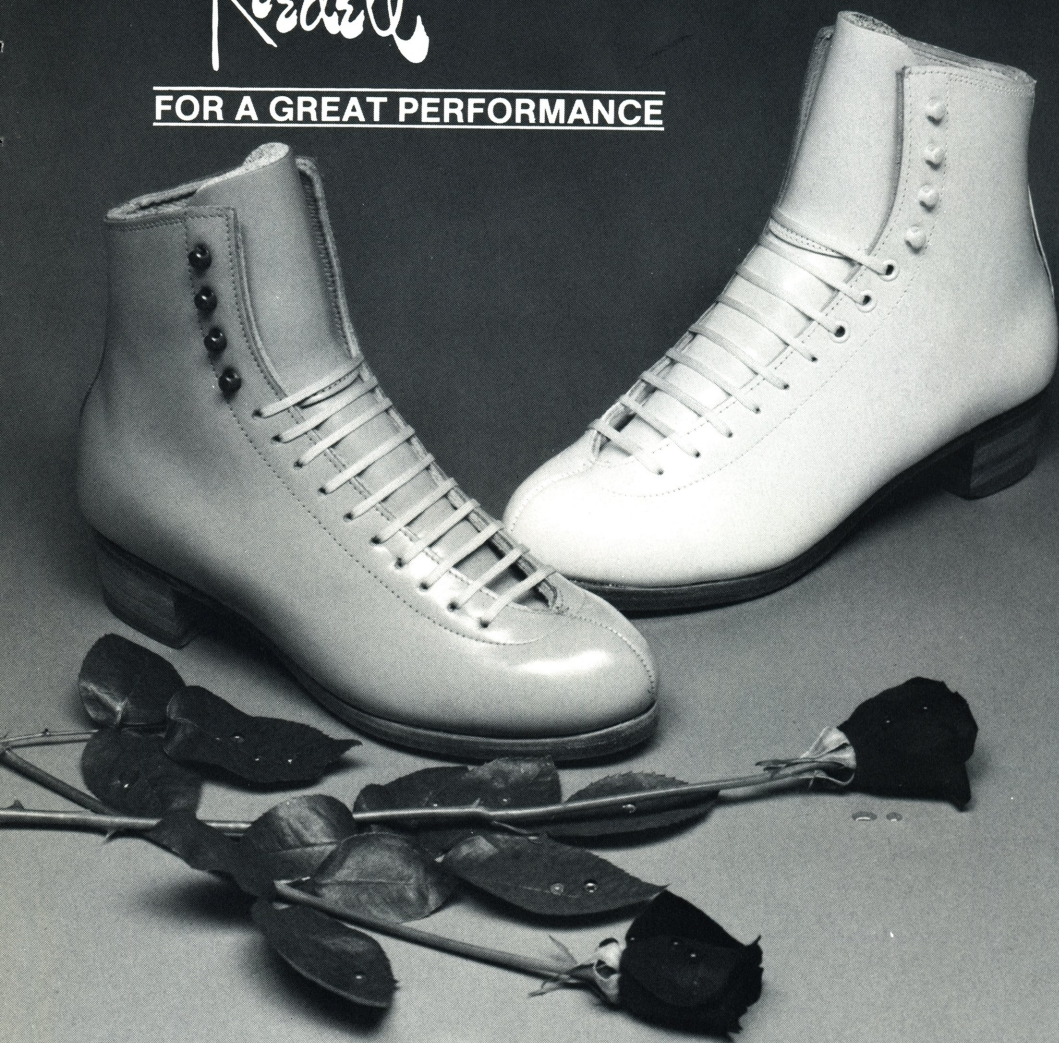

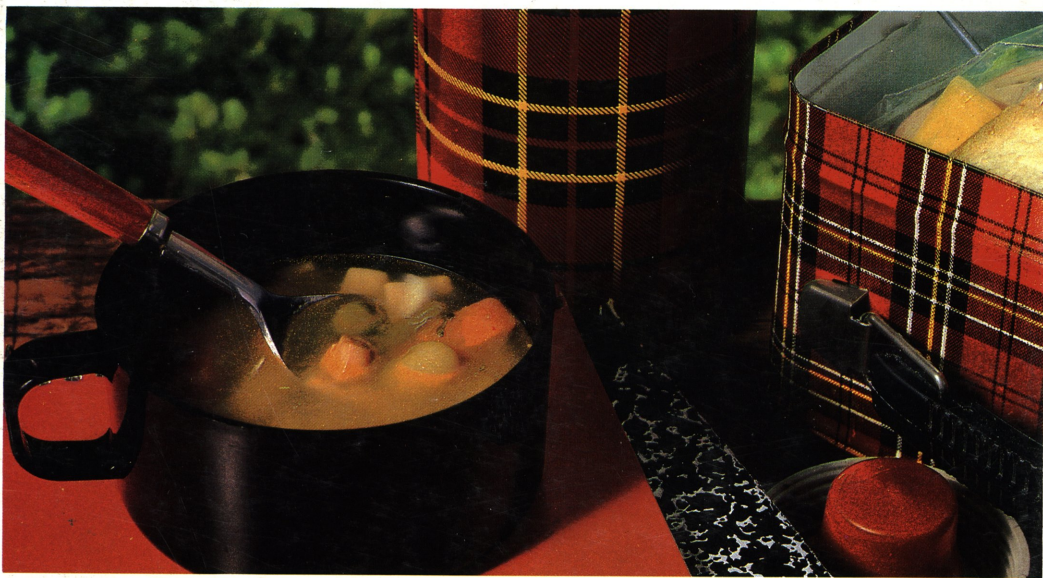
