



The USFSA Program Development Committee has announced the selection of Colorado Springs as the site for the 1988 National Collegiate Championships. The event will take place August 15 to 21 at the Mark Sertich Ice Center, as it did in 1987. Athletes will be housed at the U.S. Olympic Training Center and events will be offered in all disciplines. Any full-time student enrolled in a degree program is eligible to par-

ticipate. In singles' events, figures will be skated as an optional medal event. This competition has continued to grow in size and stature over the past four years. THE DEVELOPMENT OF DANCE THROUGH THE AGES

Today it seems the average tester is doing the prescribed ice dances merely to pass a test. They say they are dancing a waltz or a tango because that is the name of the test. I often wonder if any thought was given to the origins of the dance or rhythm to which it is danced. My guess is no, and I must admit, I was one of those more interested in just passing the test. Hopefully, the following will shed some light on this dark subject. Perhaps knowledge of the origins will help with understanding expressions required to interpret the dance.

The waltz period, although its roots were in Austrian and German folklore, began towards the end of the eighteenth century. Dances such as the Landler, Weller, Walzer that were forerunners of the waltz had incorporated the turning moves that would become typical of the waltz. The end of the eighteenth century was a time of revolution throughout Europe. The more formal dances of the aristocrats lost their appeal in favor of the freer expressive dances favored by the emerging industrial class. The waltz, a dance in 3/4 time with a significant first beat, was such a dance. A close hold was required for stabilization during the very fast turns. Of course, this close hold received criticism, as it was thought to be immoral and also a threat to the establishment. Dance teachers were threatened as the waltz was easier to learn and required less instruction.

The waltz survived, was introduced to Paris by Napoleon's armies, and arrived in England in the early nineteenth century. From England it traveled to America and was firmly entrenched by the middle of the nineteenth century. By this time there were two developing types of waltzes. The French danced a more classical style on tiptoe which started out slower but with increasing speed and hopping turning movements. The Viennese type waltz made popular by the music of Franz Lanner and Johann Strauss the


Younger was quicker with many turns done on the flat of the foot. This initially was called the Langaus, and its fast tempo placed a great strain on the dancers. Waltzing couples would try to out do each other by circling immense dance halls six to eight times at this fast pace. In England and America, a "valse a deux temps" (waltz with two steps) developed as a much less demanding style. In America, the "Boston" a slower more flowing dance and a movement called the hesitation was popular.

Folklore contains reference to a Bohemian girl named Anna Chladimova who is credited with inventing, so to speak, the Polka. A local dance teacher apparently documented the music she sang and the dance steps she performed on an afternoon in 1830 at a local dance fest in Kostelec. Many feel that what she was actually doing was an original combination of previously known folk moves. The dance was introduced to the ballroom in Prague and from there traveled to Paris, England, and finally to the United States. The Polka was a round dance utilizing a close hold which created even more public outcry than had the waltz. The Polka gave society what it wanted, and this was a happy, gay, spirited dance in 2/4 time.

The Two Step, perhaps a result of the "valse a deux temps," gained its place in history around 1890-1920. This was a dance with forward or backward chassés to 2/4 or 4/4 time. The "Washington Post March" by John Philip Sousa, a march in 6/8 time, was a two step with a skip in the steps. This was one dance exported to Europe from the United States.

The Spanish or Andalusian Tango originated in Spain as a solo dance for Spanish women. By the middle of the eighteenth century couples were dancing the Tango but it was not in vogue for long because the movements were thought to be immoral. The roots of the Argentine Tango

is a mixture of the Tangano, a African slave dance of eighteenth century Haiti and Cuba, and the Habanera of nineteenth century Cuba. This was introduced into Argentina by a black population and again mixed with the Milonga a dance of the slums of Buenos Aires of the nineteenth century. The result was an erotic suggestive dance done only by the lowest classes. The music that resulted from this mixture was introduced to Europe probably in Nice, France in the early twentieth century.

In Europe the Tango was refined and the suggestive moves removed. Argentinean orchestras were imported and the Tango danced by a more fashionable population. The English became fascinated after seeing it danced while they were abroad and it was soon introduced in London. The Tango, now more respectable, traveled from England to the United States and back to Argentina. The Tango lost popularity during World War I but came back strong as the "New French Tango." The beat was less pronounced and more subdued. This was Tango Valentino

style and certainly exotic in nature. Today the Tango is more staccato and not the sensual dance portrayed by Valentino.

The Blues is most definitely an American contribution to the world of music. The origins can be traced back to the African cultures of the slaves which were imported and integrated into their everyday life. A tradition of work songs developed, encouraged by southern plantation owners as a means of increasing productivity. The tempo of these songs was slow with a definite beat. The slave leader frequently would chant a line followed by the work gang repeating it to form a verse. The musical structure was unique as the main purpose was to accompany the movements used during specific work-related activities and certainly did not fit the western methods of music composition. Parts of the western music scale became changed or flattened producing what was to become known as the "blues note."

The church during this time was the only avenue available for slaves to express their feelings. Church and religious expression was encouraged as it was felt Christianity would civilize the slaves. The music from the different African tribes was preserved and mixed with music expressive of their demanding existence. From this spirituals developed. The chant began to take on rhythm and with it feeling.

During these trying times the slaves often were required to entertain their plantation owners. The music was the music of a white population but this activity certainly was instrumental in recognizing the intrinsic musicality of the blacks. The stage was set for the development of the minstrel show, ragtime, and the blues—all formulated by African cultures intertwined with slave history. W.C. Handy is thought to be the father of the Blues, and he is said to have heard what he later identified as the "Blues" as early as 1892. This was slow, very emotional music significant of slave life but based on strong tradition.

Another of our dance rhythms owes its origins to this period. Remember that ragtime has a syncopated beat. It was music to dance to, and dance everyone did. The minstrel shows frequently ended with what became known as a cakewalk. This was basically a competition between couples who would

promenade displaying innovative footwork to ragtime music. The couple with the most innovative moves was awarded a cake. The saying "that takes the cake" originated from this dance. The cakewalk was first danced by black dancers in the United States but soon became a fashionable dance here and in Europe.

The next dances to become popular with a nation intent on dancing were the so-called "animal dances." Dances named the "monkey dance, kangaroo dip, grizzly bear, bunny hug, turkey trot" became the rage and were thought to mimic the mannerisms of animals. The one dance frequently associated with the "animal dance" era that survived was the "Foxtrot." This became the popular dance between 1912-1914 and again was an American invention. Harry Fox is most often mentioned as the originator. He apparently was doing "trotting" steps to ragtime music in The New York Theater between shows as a vaudeville act. The press referred to this dance as "Fox's Trot." The moves were extremely jerky as the trot would suggest.

Webster's New World Dictionary states a Foxtrot is: "1. a slow, mixed gait of a horse in which it trots with the forelegs and paces with the hind legs; hence, 2. a dance in 4/4 time with a variety of steps, both fast and slow."

The dance "Fox's Trot" included the short jerky steps followed by a rest period of walking movements. As with the Blues this dance was introduced to Europe. Proper England did not like the so-called trotting movements and began to tame it. It eventually became the English Foxtrot which U.S. soldiers of World War I brought home as the light lilting dance certainly more familiar to us today.

The Paso Doble (a Spanish one step) originated in Spain around 1918 and was brought to England in the late 1920's. The music used was the entrance march of the matador and other dignitaries of the bullfight. The man is said to represent the toreador and the lady the cape. The toreador exhibits a very proud and distinct personality as he enters the bullring. The cape is used in various ways to guide the bull and as the fight proceeds various capes are generally used.

The Rhumba is a Cuban dance introduced to the United States in the late 1920's. Again


we see the mixture of African and Caribbean rhythms. This dance also started out with erotic moves which were very uninhibited. As a result this was a dance of the lower class. The exported version called the "Son" was certainly more refined and was danced to a more easily understood beat. The dance was brought to the States by American tourists.

Our ice dances evolved with this historical influence in mind. The next time you begin to dance think about the origins of that dance. Perhaps, just perhaps, this understanding will make it a little easier to express or at least understand the ice dances.

There has always been the question of when a skater should begin working with an artistic coach/choreographer. My feeling is "the sooner, the better," if the coaching is approached not only in a choreographic, but also in an academic, artistic way.

Learning various arm movements in conjunction with basic crossovers in a circle, on time to particular counts, will build coordination, control, and proper placement of arms and hands in relation to the head and torso.

An artistic coach can start teaching four and five year olds in this manner with very excellent results. Start young skaters doing crossovers in a circle. Give them a four-count arm movement that must be done to four steps in two crossovers. Have them repeat the same arm movement for three complete circles. If they are having trouble, they can stop and do the arm movement to counts in one place, before trying it on the circle again.

When they have accomplished the arm movements in one direction, they can then do it reversing arms in the opposite direction. After accomplishing this, a head focus can be added to one or two of the counts. Keep the four-count arm movement very simple, and have them do it in back crossovers in a circle in both directions also.

The following is an example to start with: Count 1—Step on left foot and bring arms to a ballet low fifth position (arms curved slightly with hands almost meeting at low center front of body).

Count 2—Cross right foot over left while curved arms rise to a high fifth position (arms above head, shoulders down).

Count 3—Step on left foot (this starts the second crossover), lower right arm to shoulder height, head looks to right.

Count 4—Finishing the crossover by crossing right foot over left, lower left arm to shoulder height, matching right arm, and look to left.

Keep repeating the two crossovers with the four-count arm and head movements, until



BRINGING PROFESSIONALS INTO CLUB MANAGEMENT

There is a popular myth among many figure skating clubs that anyone designated as a "professional" in skating cannot participate in USFSA activities. Not only is that not true, but it can be detrimental to the growth and development of a club to exclude persons of such expertise.

The USFSA Rulebook addresses professionals in ice skating under Eligibility and Membership Rules. The USFSA generally recognizes three kinds of professionals: teaching (coaches), performing (ice shows), and rink owners or managers. Rink managers and owners are designated as "restricted" persons. Coaches and performers come under the heading of "ineligible." What they are restricted from and ineligible to do is the misunderstood part.

Restricted persons (in this case, rink owners and managers—see ER 1.02, 4.01, 4.011, 5.021, and 5.022) cannot enter competitions, cannot judge or trial judge, cannot be a club delegate to Governing Council, and cannot become an officer or a committee member at the USFSA national level. Restricted persons can take USFSA tests, skate in carnivals and exhibitions, and can be an officer or member on the board of directors of a USFSA member club if the club's bylaws so allow.

Some club bylaws, written long ago when restricted persons were more limited, still prohibit some of these activities. They harken back to times before the Olympic and International Skating Union rules of eligibility

and amateur status changed. However, in order to be consistent with USFSA policy and rules, clubs should take a new look at the advantages of upgrading their rules and attitudes to include these knowledgeable people. In many cases, the club would have better service and a better relationship with the rink if rink management were represented not only in the club but also on the club board of directors.

Ineligible persons (such as teaching coaches and pros—see ER 1.04 and ER 5.04-5.042, and MR 8.10) cannot enter competitions, cannot judge or trial judge, cannot be a club officer, director, or delegate to Governing Council, and cannot become a national officer of the USFSA. However, ineligible persons can belong to and serve at large on the board at the club level, and can be a committee member at the national level of the USFSA. Ineligible persons may take USFSA tests, skate in carnivals and exhibitions to the extent allowed by USFSA Sanction Rules, and can even be a member of the USFSA national Board of Directors.

As our organization evolves more and more into one that benefits all of amateur figure skating, we are realizing the important need to interact in an equitable fashion with "professionals," who are also an important part of the ice skating industry. As long as the USFSA maintains amateurism at the skating level, there is room at the administrative volunteer level for the entire family of ice skating.

Take a look at your club's relationship with your rink. Is there any possible advantage to gain from making the rink a part of your planning and decision making? It's a good policy to make sure that your club does not become isolated from the people who control the ice where you skate. Whether your club skates at a privately owned or a municipal facility, chances are a good relationship with the rink and the teaching staff will be a real plus to you. If you do not have professional representation in your club or on your board, you may want to begin by inviting the rink manager to sit in on meetings, or to become an ad hoc member (no vote). You might want to try it for awhile, then if you like the results, make it a permanent part of things.

GRAND PRIX DE PARIS November 11-15, 1987 Paris, France

Since the final podium was too small for the whole American team, Angelo D'Agostino, Wayne Seybold, and Joseph Druar let their feminine counterparts receive the magnificent Lalique crystal trophy for the top national team present in Paris. Indeed, they all deserved it after the brilliant week of skating they offered to the Parisian audience.

It has been a long time since Paris last welcomed an international ice skating competition. An initiative of the City of Paris and of the Federation Francaise des Sports de Glace, the Grand Prix de Paris took place this year for the first time, at the time the Sugar Trophy used to be held before being discontinued in 1986.

Only three pairs competed with Americans Natalie and Wayne Seybold the obvious winners. More than any others, they have managed to integrate the various tempos of their free program into an exhibition of true art. Like ice dancers, they skate close to each other at high velocity. The numerous technical difficulties they displayed in their program were enough to make them win. However, they never disrupted the emotion and feelings of their innovative slow skating, which indeed also deserved first place. Every moment of their program was a pleasure to watch. Their variation to the death spiral in particular delighted the audience.

Behind them, Julya Bistrova and Alexandr Tarasov, from the Soviet Union, kept the lead over Lauren Collin and John Penticost, from Canada. In spite of the low number of contestants, the skills of these three pairs provided the event with a high quality of skating and a competition of great interest.

As is often the case in ice dancing, the rankings after the first compulsory dance remained unchanged throughout the dance event. Lia Trovati and Roberto Pelizzola, from Italy, emerged victorious, with an exhibition of a classical style in their free program, ahead of Susan Wynne and Joseph Druar, from the United States. The new Russian team of Larisa Fedorinova and Evgeny Platov finished fourth, behind the French Corinne Palliard and Didier Courtois, who delighted their home audience with very pleasant programs.

The Men's competition was the most undecided of all events. Petr Barna, from Czechoslovakia, finally won it, right ahead of American Angelo D'Agostino. Barna, France's Fernand Fedronic, and Switzerland's Oliver Hoener each won one compulsory figure. Barna took an early lead, D'Agostino taking a disappointing fourth, yet his brilliant and strong skating allowed him to win the short program, ahead of Great Britain's Paul Robinson. Barna finished third in this section. In the long free, Barna was not at his best; his creative program and strong technique still won him first place. D'Agostino was a close and warmly applauded second. Jaimee Eggleton, from Canada, overcame his early deficit in figures by a spectacular free program, and finished fifth overall, right behind Robinson and Hoener, respectively third and fourth.

Jill Trenary showed her determination to win the Ladies' event as soon as the first training session started. Her victory was a clear-cut one, as she won every part of the competition from the first figure to free skating. However obvious, her victory was nonetheless a magnificent one. Trenary made it clear that indeed an ice skating event is more a personal challenge than a mere competition. She completed a near perfect triple flip to double loop combination in the short program, but was less lucky with it in the long free. Still her strong technique and obvious class were unsurpassed.

Behind her, Agnes Gosselin, from France, successfully landed three triples in her free program to retain the second place she had obtained in figures. Patricia Neske, Federal Republic of Germany, finished third.

The Palais Omnisport de Paris-Bercy was quite successful in organizing this premiere, which can also be seen as a rehearsal for next year's World Championships, to be held in Paris. Current World champions, Canada's Brian Orser and the German Democratic Republic's Katarina Witt joined the final exhibitions. They have been among French favorites for a long time and gathered the en-

thusiasm of thousands of spectators in Paris and of millions of viewers watching the event on national television.

The American team received a deserved ovation when they were awarded the overall team Trophy. It is no doubt that they highly contributed to the success of the Lalique Trophy by giving it its first "Lettres de Noblesse"!

NO SURPRISES IN BRITISH CHAMPIONSHIPS

Elation and frustration walked hand in hand in the British figure championships at the four-year-old Lee Valley rink in London on November 23-25.

Joanne Conway duly won her third consecutive Ladies' title, at sixteen the youngest to do so since Yvonne Sugden thirty-two years earlier. That was something to celebrate, but she would have been happier to have passed the milestone without falling from a triple Salchow and failing to hold the landing of a triple loop. She included only one jump combination, double Axel with double toe loop.

Such shortcomings were disappointing at a time when she was anxious to impress a British crowd after training abroad, but little damage was done because she had earlier etched three good figures and skated the best short of her career.

Gina Fulton, a comfortable runner-up, also had misgivings, falling from triple toe loop and from triple Salchow, but the elements of a good, well presented program were evident.

Scotland's Fiona Ritchie, never a danger to the two leaders, took the bronze for a second time in three years.

The British championships are held two months before most other countries have theirs. However early, the routines planned for internationals to come have to be tried out and errors are hardly unexpected.

Paul Robinson, when retaining his Men's crown, landed two superb triples, Lutz and Salchow, touched down on two others, and fell from a fifth. He planned to polish all of them and add a sixth before February.

Ashley Moore, who switched to ice after three years as national roller champion, was a showy runner-up, followed by an improved David Reynolds, but fourth-placed Charles Wildridge, seventeen, who had outscored the champion in the short, served notice that he can be Robinson's heir-apparent if he brushes up his compulsories.

In the years when John Curry and Robin Cousins won their Olympic gold medals, each

made many errors in their preceding nationals. It all has much to do with planning to reach peak form at the time it matters most, which this season must be Calgary.

Cheryl Peake and Andrew Naylor gained their third straight pairs victory over the 1984 winners, Lisa and Neil Cushley.

The champions' fast-progressing talents in overhead lifts and jump throws were enhanced by their ideal difference in height—Naylor fractionally under six feet and his partner ten inches shorter. Last summer, Anglo-Soviet "glasnost" spread to skating when they spent six weeks in Leningrad with Tamara Moskvina, Soviet trainer of the current Olympic champions.

The ice dance championship was contested separately, on November 14 at the new Bracknell rink near Windsor. Sharon Jones and Paul Askham gained an impressive third successive win. Never seriously challenged in any section of the contest, the elegantly handsome twosome produced their best free dance, timed meticulously to lilting waltz music by Richard Rogers.

Also heartening was the unexpected breakthrough by the London runners-up, Annalisa Meyers and Justin Green, whose dramatic and daringly difficult free dance interpreted a dream ballet from the Flower Drum Song, also by Rodgers. But the effort of the bronze medalists, brother and sister Graham and Julie Linney, was skillful enough to press Meyers and Green all the way.

The British Olympic team comprises Paul Robinson (men), Joanne Conway and Gina Fulton (ladies), Cheryl Peake with Andrew Naylor and Lisa and Neil Cushley (pairs), and Sharon Jones with Paul Askham (dance).



MEDICINE

WHAT YOU CAN DO BEFORE THE DOCTOR ARRIVES

In 1987, a monograph, was prepared describing practical medicine for the figure skater. This publication was the effort of seventeen members of the Sports Medicine Committee of the USFSA. It was developed in response to requests from team leaders, coaches, parents, and competitors. It is a resource book for advice on the recognition and early management of common medical problems.

Health maintenance is each person's responsibility. Many people, whether they have a chronic illness or not struggle with questions such as: Am I sick? Can I manage my problem? Should I call my doctor? What should I tell the doctor when I call?

While not exhaustive, the following represents twenty-two quick, easy to follow, emergency health hints. Knowing when to help yourself and when to call your doctor can be life saving.

INJURIES

- 1. Cuts or lacerations. Apply direct pressure to control bleeding. Do not use a tourniquet. Call your doctor if bleeding persists or the cut is significant.
- 2. Burns. Apply cold water. Don't use butter or oil. Call your doctor if the burn is extensive.
- 3. Fractures or broken bones. Support the person in the position found. Do not straighten the extremity which is fractured. Call your doctor.
- 4. Insect bites. Wash the area with soap and water. Use cool compresses. Get help immediately if highly allergic.
- 5. Bruises. Apply ice packs and elevate the injured area.
- 6. Head injuries. If unconscious for any period, call your doctor or ambulance. Later,

- you should awaken the person every two hours if asleep to evaluate the alertness and behavior of the individual. Report any vomiting or change in behavior of the person to your doctor.
- 7. Eye contamination. Flush with water throughly for fifteen minutes. See an eye doctor.
- 8. Sun burn. Wash with soap and water. Soak in cool water, tea, or vinegar. You may use aloe vera solution or hydrocortisone cream if the sun burn is not infected.
- 9. Cold exposure. Do not rub or massage the body. Warm bath or warm hot water bottle to the body is often helpful in rewarming. If very cold or confused or unconscious, seek immediate medical attention.
- 10. Contact allergy (such as poison ivy). Wash the area thoroughly. For rash, apply compresses or other soothing lotion. Hydrocortisone cream is often helpful.
- 11. Tetnus Toxoid. Injections for tetnus protection provide protection for five to ten years depending upon the type and extent of injury.
- 12. Blisters. Prevention of blisters by using properly fitted boots and shoes is essential. Use tincture of benzoin to prevent blisters or treat areas which are reddened or sore, provided the blisters are not infected.

ILLNESSES

- 13. Nose bleeds. Lie down, pinch nostrils. Continue this for ten minutes. Seek help if the nose bleed is not stopped by this or if recurrent bleeding occurs.
- 14. Fainting or convulsions. Lie the person down and protect them from injuries. Get medical help.
- 15. Colds, sniffles. Drink plenty of water or other fluids. Rest in bed. Antibiotics do

not help viruses which are the major cause of colds.

- 16. Fever control. Do not over dress. Take Tylenol or aspirin as directed by your doctor. Drink plenty of water or other fluids.
- 17. Nausea or vomiting. Drink small amounts of clear fluids every twenty to thirty minutes. If vomiting persists, call your doctor.
- 18. Chest pain. Any unexplained chest pain, particularly in older individuals, should be evaluated by your doctor.
- 19. Abdominal pain. Avoid enemas. See your doctor if symptoms persist.
- 20. Excessive vaginal bleeding. Rest, elevate legs, call doctor if it persists.
- 21. Urinary problems. Drink plenty of fluids. If frequent or burning urination exists, call your doctor.
- 22. Poisoning. Poison proof your home. Do not take other person's medicines. Throw away or flush old medicines. Keep Ipecac on hand. Call your emergency room or National Poison Control 1-800-332-3073 if problems or questions exist.

Seek medical attention if there are signs of infection such as the following: redness, swelling, pus drainage or red streaks, painful area, fever, or skin feels hot in the area.

If any of the above problems are not controlled satisfactorily, you will need to seek medical help. When calling your doctor or emergency room, it is wise to do the following before placing your call: take your temperature before calling, know the names of the medicines you take, write down questions you need to have answered, and know your medical history.

Everyone needs to participate in his/her own health care. Being prepared to deal with emergencies as well as knowing your medical history, allergies, the medicines you take will make you a more responsible person and will improve the outcome of any health problem no matter how great.







Bountiful lies fifteen minutes north of Salt Lake City, nestled between the Wasatch Mountains and the Great Salt Lake. It was the site of the figure competition of the 1984 Nationals and will be part of the 1990 Nationals.

The Utah Figure Skating Club chose to have the optional Preliminary event this year as well as the Adult freestyle event which has become traditional over the last few years at Centrals. Because of this, a wide range of skating abilities and ages was represented. Some of the adult ladies expressed hope that other regions will begin to offer their adult skaters the chance to compete.

One thing lacking from Centrals this year was dance competition. There were entries in several divisions but only one entry in each, unfortunately. The audience was treated to an exhibition, however. Sabrina Rabil, Colorado SC, and Arthur Tripadush, St. Moritz ISC, performed their Junior Free Dance with lively Latin rhythms. Senior competitors, Heidi Hahn, Peninsula FSC, and William Aquilino, University of Delaware SC, presented a fast and flashy tango OSP, and then contrasted an upbeat rock and roll segment with a lyrical flute piece.

For those events not continuing to Pacific Coast, the winners of Preliminary Girls Groups A and B were Natalie Beaudry, Utah FSC, and Charyl Dalapit, Palomares FSC, with Terry Hayes, Palomares FSC, taking first place in Preliminary Boys. Pre-Juvenile Boys was captured by Kevin Garrett, Utah FSC, and the Pre-Juvenile Girls' titles went to Megan Clark, Peninsula FSC, and to Nichole Tatro, St. Moritz ISC. In the Juvenile division top honors went to Shirley Pang, Palomares FSC, and to Eddie Gornik, Cottonwood Heights FSC, Tiffani Tayler, Utah FSC, led the Pre-Intermediate Ladies and

Donna Fountain, Vallco FSC, finished first out of eight Adult Ladies.

In the Intermediate Ladies division, Alison Choppelas, Peninsula FSC, took the final round with second place in figures and a solid freestyle performance. Angie Lawson, Utah FSC, placed second overall after leading in figures, and Christine Nubia, Peninsula FSC, moved up to third with the help of her double Axel. Kimberly Morales, Stockton FSC, placed fourth.

Novice Ladies final round included a crowd-pleasing performance by Jennifer Verili, Palomares FSC, including two triples and two double Axels, but to no avail because of her eighth place in figures. Shanel Mayeshiro, Peninsula FSC, however, was able to move into second place with her strong jumps and polished style. Jennifer Curtis, St. Moritz ISC, won the event overall with a second place in figures and some surprising touches in her freestyle program which contained a double Axel landing into an attitude position, a dramatic suicide spin, and a powerful Russian split jump at the end. Melissa Murphy, St. Moritz ISC, and Shannon Smith, Utah FSC, finished third and fourth in the event. Joining these four ladies at Pacific Coast in Stockton will be Heather Sniteman, Utah FSC, who received a bye because of injury.

The Novice Men division consisted of six young competitors all of whom will be participating in Pacific Coast. The event was won by a vigorous performance on the part of David Delago, St. Moritz ISC. Clay Sniteman, Utah FSC, placed second with a balanced and consistent program. Third place went to Darren Ehrenburg, St. Moritz ISC, and fourth place to Kendall James, St. Moritz ISC.

Novice Pairs was won by Deirdre and Ross McMahon, Vallco FSC, with some exciting throw jumps. Not far behind came Kristina Feliciano and Jeffrey Weiss, Palomares FSC,

with their throw Axel and double Salchow. Third place went to Melissa Nelson and Brad Doll, Palomares FSC.

In Junior Ladies, Christine Adams, Utah FSC, after a fifth-place showing in figures, held nothing back on her opening combination double Axel, double loop to win the short program. She also won the long program including both a split flip and a split Lutz and placed first overall. Elizabeth Koepf, Peninsula FSC, came into the short in second place. She skated to march music in a costume reminiscent of a football cheerleader outfit—very appropriate for a fall Saturday. She came back in the long program with double Axels to finish second overall. And Jennifer Flock, Stockton FSC, with a triple toe and double Axel moved up to fourth after the long program. Cherie Callander, Peninsula FSC, and Jenni McKenna, Utah FSC, narrowly missed making it into the top four in this hard-fought event.

Cameron Birky, St. Moritz ISC, treated the audience to his rendition of *Dragnet* in his winning short program. Steven Smith, Peninsula FSC, placed second with an energetic performance although both skaters had difficulty with the combination jump. Birky held onto his lead in the long program with a triple toe combination and a triple Salchow, plus an unusual spin combination including a cross-foot position.

Junior Pairs lost some of its excitement when Alison Takamoto, Peninsula FSC, and her partner, Nicholas Castaneda, St. Moritz ISC, were unable to skate the long program due to Alison's shoulder injury. The remaining pair, Annette and William Abel, Santa Rosa FSC, skated alone.



NORTH ATLANTICS

The Skating Club of Lake Placid was host to the 1988 North Atlantic Regional Championships. The 168 skaters arrived in the Olympic village October 26, to a Halloween-decorated Olympic complex of four rinks. Corn stalks and pumpkins smiled and frowned from every corner. The judges' room had impish pumpkins sporting a variety of expressions, including a cut out 'North Atlantics' and a 'skate blade,' all created by skater, judge, and prospective referee/accountant, Derek Farrar. The events were held on the same ice as the 1980 Olympics, figures in the U.S. rink, free skating in the Olympic Areana, scene of the USA hockey triumph.

In the Senior Men's division, the first and second-place winners both represented the SC of Lake Placid. Brian Grant won figures, short program with a triple Lutz/double toe combination, and eked out a win in the free skating, over Kelby Riley. He opened his long program with a magnificent triple Lutz, followed by a high double Axel, then began running into trouble. This year his skating has more style. Riley, with his own cheering section pulling for him, landed a good double Axel—a triple Salchow combination and others, but had some two-footed landings which kept him behind Grant.

There were seven Junior men, all of whom had problems with their short programs and free skating. Philip DiGuglielmo, Essex SC of New Jersey, came out the winner. He was second in figures and long program, and first in the short. He didn't skate his best, falling on two triple Lutz attempts, but it was enough. Lance Travis, SC of Rockland, pulled from a seventh figure place to second overall, by placing second in the short and winning the free skating with excellent spins, triple toe loop and high double Axels. He skated with tremendous style. Jason Dilworth, Rye FSC, won the figures, but was fifth in the short, and fourth in the free skating, which held him in third place. Joe Bracken, SC of Lake Placid, finished fourth.

Fifth-place Christian Conte, Genesee FSC, skated the most difficult program, with great artistic style. A content-loaded program of double and triple jumps, including a double Lutz with arms overhead. With more maturity and mileage on his triples, to become consistantly landed, he bears watching for his future potential.

Winning both figures and freestyle, Michael Chack, SC of Rockland, was the clear winner of Novice Men. A strong free skater, he moved well over the ice, skating artistically, while executing multi-jumps including a triple and a good double Axel combination. Matt Stimac, SC of Lake Placid, was second and Sloane Yeh, South Mountain FSC, placed third.

Kelly Herrington, SC of Lake Placid, won figures and free skating to take the gold in Intermediate Men. A stylish skater, he had a good variety of double jumps and spins, ending with a death-drop spin, and firsts from all the judges. Jeffrey Adler, Rye FSC, was second and James Sherred, Westminster FSC, was third.

As the final day of competition dawned (October 31), spooks and tricks were everywhere. The audience was dotted with people in masks and wigs, while several of the young monitors came with painted faces, ready to 'Trick or Treat' as soon as their duties finished.

As the first group of Senior Ladies were warming up, the judges and officials marched into their places, each wearing an elaborate mask, witches and spooky hats, to the delight of everyone. After several bows to the spectators, the masks came off and it was down to business.

There were nine Senior ladies and the final outcome went down to the wire. Sheila Duggan won the figures and was second in the short program. Kathaleen Kelly, third in figures, won the short. Both girls were from the SC of Lake Placid. Danielle-Alyse Babaian, SC of New York, second in figures,

fourth in the short, was in third place. Duggan and Kelly both skated superbly in the final round. Sheila had good jumps and spins and solidly landed her double Axel/double toe combination, skating a clean program without triples. Kathy attempted two triple toe loops, one in combination with a double toe, which had faulty landings and also spun out of a double Axel. The final tally was too close to call at the finish. Sheila won the gold with five first places, to Kathy's four. Babaian remained in third with Dorothy Crowley, Rye FSC, taking the fourth spot to Easterns, from Jeannie Widlicka, SC of Lake Placid, in another very close race.

Julia Simkin, SC of Rockland, won Junior Ladies. An elegant, artistic skater, she demonstrated lovely spins with arm variations, and high jumps, including a double flip with overhead arms, all done to the exact beat of her music. Alyssa Joy Stith, SC of New York, took second place with her powerful, athletic free skating. She attempted two triple jumps, one in combination (landed in the run-off) with slight landing problems, to win this portion of the event. Samantha Hawks, SC of Lake Placid, second in figures, won the bronze with a program of double jumps and double Lutz combinations. Collette Lovullo, Genesee FSC, placed fourth. These Junior ladies should be commended for having to go through the mental and physical strain of a run-off and finals, skating six times, in a matter of days.

There were three groups of Novice Ladies, the top winners of each placed in the finals. Marianne Diliberti, SC of New York, won the figures, placed second in the free skating by moving extremely well and skating a solid program of double jumps. Her consistency throughout kept her in first place. Janet Marion Hoschek, SC of New York, skated fluidly, and had good program content to take the silver. Bronze medal winner Kristen Painter, SC of Lake Placid, came from a sixth place in figures to win the free skating with a solidly skated program that included a double Lutz/double toe combination and Ina Bauer into a double Axel. Bobbie Anne Flower, SC of Westchester, was fourth. This was a strong group.

Danielle Colacicco, SC of Lake Placid, emerged the winner of Intermediate Ladies, with a third in figures and second in free skating. Second place Melissa Monti, Cantiague FSC, won the figures and was fifth in freestyle. Jenna Dumond, SC of Morris, was third and Sheryl Mozur, Rye FSC, fourth.

Robin Heckler, Cantiague FSC, won Juvenile A; Beth Allen, SC of Morris, Juvenile B; and Erika Leah Piekarski, SC of Morris, Juvenile C.

There were no pairs entered and only eight dance teams. Junior Dance was won by Elizabeth Davidson, SC of Maine, and Collin Sullivan, SC of Lake Placid. Their World War II free dance had wowed Lake Placid during the summer dance competition and did it again at North Atlantics. Their costumes, music, and skating all intertwined for an outstanding visual presentation and interpretation. Andrea and Martin Chow, SC of Morris, with unison and lilt, won first place in the compulsory dances, but serious problems in the OSP dropped them to second place overall. Bronze winners were Ashlev Hunt, SC of Morris, and Richard Carinci, SC of New York.

Intermediate Dance placements remained the same for both initial and final rounds. First were Isabelle Rigaurd, SC of New York, and Jovanny Durango, Individual Member; second were Beth Allen and Christopher Fullagar, SC of Morris; and Nicole Aquiline, Amherst FSC, and Joseph Petri, SC of Western New York, placed third. Adult Dance winners were Lynn Hayes and J. Wixson Smith, followed closely by fellow Genesee FSC members, Harlene Lee and E. Richie VanVliet.

Co-chairmen Gail Kissel and Martha Brooks, plus all the volunteers, should be congratulated for not only a well organized championship, but also for putting a little fun into it for the skaters, officials, and everyone attending.







the skater can accomplish it forward and backward in both circle directions with ease. Create other simple arm movements broken down into counts to match the feet and proceed in the same manner. When the skater gets his/her first program, these practical arm movements can then be choreographed into the stroking sections of the program.

You can think of fun things to do, e.g., take the hand symbols that stand for "See no evil, hear no evil, speak no evil," and use them as practice arm movements for stroking. The children will love it. Encourage them to use facial expressions as they do their arm movements, by saying key words to go along with each movement such as "Hi," "Oh," and "Yeah!" Have them open their eyes big and smile broadly as they say these words.

Spending time with these exercises will more easily develop the timing, coordination, and expression of arm movements on young skaters, and give them an immediate sense of the artistic qualities that go hand-in-hand with the athletic maneuvers they are learning.




