Also on the list of new parents are Diana and Dustin Wolverton, noted figure skating journalists, who welcomed son Evan Alexander into the family on December 27.



FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

Figure skating has enjoyed tremendous success these last few years in TV ratings and attendance at Nationals, Worlds, and Olympics. It has been gratifying to see our sport as the premier event at the Olympic Games, but with all this success, participation by young men in our sport has not increased. A great deal of this problem is due to a mixed image that our sport has with regard to male skaters.

The USFSA has taken several steps to improve this image. The elimination of men receiving flowers on the podium and discouraging the throwing of flowers onto the ice should help considerably. The TV interview area in competitions that we control will project a sporting image rather than a frilly flower garden.

The new dress code for ladies and men should also encourage a sports image. I am continually amazed that skaters, coaches, and parents perceive sequins, beads, and strange outfits as an advantage to competitors. The reaction of judges is, indeed, just the opposite. Classic, well-fitting simple attire is by far the most advantageous. We must strive to push our image as the SPORT of figure skating.

I feel very strongly, also, that participation by young men in our sport will greatly increase when figures are no longer a mandatory part of our competition system. I have found very few boys who enjoy going around in circles, but many who enjoy racing about the rink, jumping and crashing into the boards.

Programs at the very beginning levels of basic skills instruction should encourage and channel boys into the competitive structure. Athleticism in the sport *must* be stressed. Parents, especially fathers, must feel this is a sport in which they would like their sons to participate. In the great majority of cases, that is not the case now.

The U.S. has been fortunate to have had great athletes in our sport. This has come from a much smaller base of men than women. To ensure this excellence continuing, we must enlarge the number of males at the beginning levels.

The participation of each and every member of the skating family—judges, officials, skaters, coaches, rink owners, and managers is mandatory if this sport is to survive and flourish as much and as rapidly in the future as it has in the past.

I look forward to the last decade of the century and on into the 21st century with great hope, optimism, and enthusiasm for skating and that working together we will reach optimal goals.

Dr. Graham was a skater in his youth, competing in Singles and Pairs and represented the U.S. in the World Championships in both events. He has served as Team Leader for the Worlds and Olympics, has judged the Worlds and Olympics, is a World Referee, and was a consultant to President Ford's Commission on Olympic Sports. He graduated from Harvard College, received his M.D. from the University of Chicago and did his postgraduate medical studies at the University of Oklahoma, where he now serves as an Associate Clinical Professor of Pediatrics. He has been USFSA President since May 1986.




Along with his National, World, and International figure skating titles and honors, add to the list of Paul Wylie's credits that of TV actor. Paul played a starring role in a WCVB, Boston ABC affiliate, broadcast of a special entitled *Breaking the Ice.* In it, he portrayed a high school student at odds with his classmates, subjected to abuse by those unaware of his athletic abilities. In an attempt to be accepted, he tried out for the hockey team with disastrous results. There is an upbeat ending after classmates discover his figure skating abilities.

ADULT LADIES

Looking Ahead

The problem most adult lady singles skaters face is diversity. All ranges of abilities, ages, and potentials are lumped into one category. An adult lady maybe be a 21-year-old who has passed her gold tests; a 60-year-old skating since the age of 2; a 25-year-old beginner; or a 35-year-old former professional who has regained her amateur status. All are considered adult lady skaters.

Adult ladies is a rather new category. The event was added to a few competitions about six years ago to allow adults to compete. The more the adults competed, the more they kept each other informed. A network of competitors developed who worked together to convince competition chairmen that an adult ladies event should be added whenever there were two or three or more competitors who would enter.

Two original networkers were Nancy Horton of San Francisco and Donna Fountain of Santa Clara. Fountain remembers, "Our group was really, really active getting networks in place and getting a lot of things added to competitions. Time will tell if the new group of skaters takes over and moves ahead, like getting adult ladies added to Sectionals. They might be happy with where it is and not push anymore."

Horton adds, "I hope that we have assured permanence in adult ladies. I would like to see the event accepted like adult dance."

Until now, defining the adult ladies category has not been necessary. The adult skaters have welcomed all who might enter. But with the addition of adult ladies to many Regional competitions, former novice, junior, and senior ladies 21 to 24 years old are entering who may never have won before but now see an "easy" gold medal in sight.

These new adults bring with them a different attitude, an attitude of winning at all costs. While adult ladies traditionally

have applauded and supported each other, the "new adults" seldom mingle with the other competitors. Deborah Yorke, 24, of Kansas City sums up the feelings of the new adult skaters. "I don't consider myself as an adult competitor. I compete in everything I do. People think we are out there for the fun of it. That is not me. I am out there to compete."

Traditionally, there has been no problem with new skaters joining the ranks. Now, as three new adults enter every competition and win every medal, the other adult ladies begin to get discouraged. The whole concept of the event, to let ladies compete evenly and fairly, is no longer there.

Who are adult ladies competitors? "We are a lot of friendly skaters who go out there to compete and do our best and don't worry about what the other person does. We clap for everyone, cheer for each other, and then go out together after the competition," said Medina Brown of Hayward, California. "There is a camaraderie. We all inspire each other no matter how we do," adds Charlotte Candida of San Francisco. "We are all friends, whether we place or not. People I have met only one time are friendly. There is a lot of togetherness."

Adult ladies are adventurous people in the eyes of Roberta Flygare of Salt Lake City. "Adult ladies aren't afraid to try something new, even though they may not succeed and it may not be easy for them. They are not hung up on being dignified and aren't hung up on acting their age. They are interested in having a good time." Dorothy Bowers, also of Salt Lake City adds, "I think they are pretty much all individuals and self-motivated. I think they like challenge and don't want to take the conventional route."

All adult ladies are different with full lives besides skating. Terry Kert of Sacramento, California, is director of engineering for a computer firm. Maureen Meier of Chicago, is a manager of consumer response for a large food chain. York is a registered nurse. Flygare is a mechanical engineer. Ann Bruner-Welch of Santa Rosa, California, is a fire fighter and describes her skating as "something to get

my mind off from work. It is more excitement, but a different kind."

The "excitement of competition" is mentioned over and over as the reason that adult ladies skate. Fountain says, "It makes you strive harder. It makes you improve and say to yourself that you can do better." Mary Scott of Denver tries to "Compete against myself and my goal is to make it a little better each time."

"I have always seen competition from one side of the railing and wanted to see it from the other," confesses Karen Sanchez of Los Angeles.

For some adult ladies, the idea of competing strikes terror in their hearts. Gena Ritchie of Aspen, Colorado, likes to "go out there and prove I can do it. When I first started, I would freak out and totally screw up everything. I kept competing until I knew I could do it." Carolyn Dow of Lincoln, Nebraska, admits, "It is a very scary feeling. Every time it is a personal battle to make it through."

For others, the joy of competing actually spurs them on. Terrie Stockemer of Thousand Oaks, California, states, "I love the applause. I can't perform in a show, so this is my chance. The more people in the audience the better. If someone asked me to perform in a stadium in front of 17,000 people, I wouldn't hesitate for a minute."

Mary Jo Spellman has a different idea. "I want to show my son that it doesn't matter if you win or lose. It is just how you did it and that you did it."

As adult ladies look to the future, there can only be more possibilities ahead. While the Central Pacific Region held its fourth straight adult ladies competition this year, some of the other regions have added adult ladies for the first time. Hopefully, the future will lead to the event being added to Sectionals, like adult dance. Then, perhaps, as the number of entries increases, two divisions, such as adult senior ladies and adult junior ladies would make the competition more equitable.

As Fountain says, "We want to be added to Sectionals. There possibly could be more adult freestylers than adult dancers, so why not?"



OFF-ICE REHEARSALS

We all know the scenario: it is drizzling, the Zamboni is broken, or the hockey team insists it reserved the ice two weeks ago for a crucial game. Do you cancel rehearsal? Of course not!

Off-ice rehearsals can be fruitful, if not challenging. Space is usually limited, and such rehearsals tend to get a little noisy as a small space amplifies sound. Additionally, if you are not careful, your skaters may find themselves running into walls.

Despite these restrictions, off-ice practices are a valuable addition to on-ice time. One of the first things you should consider using any unanticipated floor time for is a quick lesson in proper warm-up habits. Most skaters, of course, loosen and stretch muscles before practice, but chances are not all of your students do this regularly. Show them a few important exercises, such as knee bends, side stretches, arm reaches, and encourage them to include an off-ice warm-up routine as part of their regular practice schedule. Doing exercises to your show music can be fun as well as helpful.

There are some aspects of precision skating that are better taught off the ice, such as tricky footwork and difficult formations. Step sequences can be learned without the added difficulty of balance, and positioning on pass-throughs can be perfected without the inevitable on-ice collisions. Furthermore, maneuvers that require skaters to stand still often are easier to teach without skates, since skaters cannot resist moving or fidgeting on the ice.

Off-ice rehearsals are ideal times to pay attention to details which might be overlooked in regular practice. For less advanced groups, it never hurts simply to play the music and have your skaters first clap to the beat and then count the beats aloud. (Groups of eight beats are appropriate for most precision music.) Once



the rhythm has been established, you can have team members call out the step sequences to the music, i.e. step, step, kick, turn, etc. Encourage your students to discuss better ways to express the music and what it means to them.


You also can put the finishing touches on hand holds, head movements, and moves which require difficult uniformity, such as kick lines. If space is available, take time to work on the spacing of formations, making sure it is uniform.

Aside from rehearsing portions of the actual routine, unexpected off-ice time can be well spent planning costumes, setting practice schedules, arranging travel plans for shows and competitions, and discussing any fund-raising efforts.

As you can see, what might have been a wasted hour of rehearsal time can become a productive session. Once you get your skaters back on the ice, have them walk through the routine to ease the transition and remember the details. When they try the full routine, you may be pleasantly surprised by improved coordination and rhythm.





APS/MAY/ searching for new horizons

The Novotel Hotel, Paris, late at night: Paul and Isabelle Duchesnay (pronounced Due'sha-nay) sprawl on the bed and floor trying to relax after a demanding day. Once the two arrive in the city, they are in constant demand, an attention not new but highly amplified following last year's Olympics and Worlds. The hotel is just across the promenade from the Palais Omnisport where the 1989 World Championships will be held, and where the Duchesnays are

France's only hope for a medal. The irony of it does not escape Paul.

"We are Canadians, and the Olympics were held in Calgary. We skate for France, where I was born, and in backto-back years, bang, the Worlds are in Paris. It's going to be a real stomach twister, but if we handled last year, we can handle anything."

Undoubtedly, the pressures are greater in '89, after their superb OSP tango and sensational free dance last season. Yet even a year later, the two are still unsettled by the attention and controversy surrounding their free program.

"We didn't intentionally go out to 'break new ground.' We didn't intend to shock or terrorize. That was not our goal," Isabelle explains. "We wanted to create something different. It was getting boring. Are we going to do another waltz or tango free dance?"


"Christopher Dean came up with the free dance music after the Worlds in Cincinnati," Paul relates. "He said he had something for us to hear. He flipped the play button, and that was it. From the

first beat it was great. We loved it." (The music was "War Dance" by Vickets and "Kiss of Death" by Famey.)

Isabelle, the more outgoing of the two talks rapidly and frankly. Paul speaks slowly, carefully selecting his words. The balance between the two is one of somewhat opposite natures. Though Isabelle admits that their thoughts are so similar at times it is scary, a type of ESP, when one finishes a sentence the other began.

"We never anticipated the controversy," Paul admits. "We knew they might question a few moves when we first put it together, so we took them out. Chris laid down the basic skeleton of steps and we developed our own adaptation, to fit our style and expression. It took an unbelievable amount of work. We couldn't have done it without Chris and our coach, Martin Skotnicky.

"It was without a doubt the most technically difficult and physically demanding program we have ever done," Paul claims. "The truth is that we could not do a complete run-through more than once a day, it was that exhausting.

We were so far down in deep knees, it felt like a decathlon event."

"People laughed at us at first. Some told us not to do it, that it wouldn't work, that it was too big of a gamble to experiment. One referee saw it in practice but had not one thing to say. It was a very difficult year for us throughout our training."

Isabelle sighs. "One judge even asked us if we couldn't put in a couple waltz holds! In the jungle? We're doing a primitive routine, out there fighting for our lives, and she wants a Viennese Waltz hold? It doesn't fit. That is the type of thing we encountered. Even after Europeans or Olympics every time we would approach a judge or referee to discuss the program and see what was wrong, they had a meeting or didn't have time to talk to us. No one would. There was a press conference in Calgary and the judges were invited. I wish they

would have come to tell us where it went wrong. But nobody came."

"What I have never understood," Isabelle puzzles, "was that the same judge gave us 5.8 for technical merit in the first competition and 5.2 the second time. I don't see the logic in a .6 difference, especially when we skated much better in the Olympics than in the Europeans. It's hard to understand.

"Even the OSP Tango... We were waiting (and still are) for someone to tell us that step 13 or 64 was wrong, or this was not right, so we could fix it. But nobody did. So, if they couldn't tell us, we said we would keep it the way it was."

Their "Valentine's Tango" was not what they originally prepared to do. They had "Hernando's Hideaway" finished and realized they were going nowhere. Bobby Thompson came to them with music he had wanted to use but never had. It was one month before competition. They watched old films and tapes, researched the dance thoroughly and did a total Tango that brought standing ovations in Calgary and Budapest, but not top judges' marks. Placements ranged from fourth to tenth on both the OSP and free dance in Calgary and they ended up eighth in each and eighth overall. At the 1988 Worlds in Budapest, they rose to fifth in the free and sixth overall.

"It was the support of the public that got us through." Isabelle affirms. "When 20,000 people in Calgary stood applauding it was unbelievable. I told myself to savor the minute for it may never come again.

"The support of the American public was really great. They were there for us when we needed them and we'll never forget it. Even the Canadians supported us; though Canada is our home, we left, and it could have been sour grapes."

Paul, 27, and Isabelle, 25, started skating in Canada when each was about

seven. Paul started in hockey, as expected of a Canadian male, and only took up figure skating to improve his hockey skills. For a short while they trained in pairs before switching to dance.

In their first novice sectional competition in 1979, they placed last. The following years were ones of rapid progression and frustration. With the number of skilled dancers in Canada, they felt held back with a limited future. After having competed in the Coupes des Alpes in 1982, they began training in Oberstdorf, Germany, alongside Betty Calloway and her rising students Jayne Torvill and Christopher Dean.

Following the 1984 Olympics, they felt Canada made it clear that it was not time for them to advance. They placed third in the 1985 Canadian Nationals behind Wilson and McCall and the Garossinos. With the benefit of dual citizenship, they took the risk of leaving Canada and entering the French Nationals. They had to win, or all would be lost. Win they did, in both 1986 and 1987.

They placed twelfth in the 1986 Worlds and ninth in 1987. They were fifth in the 1987 Europeans and third in 1988. In between they won the Morzine International Ice Dancing Trophy in 1987 and Skate America in 1986, where even then there was some controversy surrounding certain moves, such as an upright death spiral.

"It really was a backward arabesque," Isabelle recalls. "We thought, if you can do it forward, why not backward, and Paul was never in a pivot position, so it was not really a death spiral. It was our variation." She laughs, "Kerry Leitch always said we couldn't do a death spiral for the life of us when we were skating pairs anyway."

They were kept out of the 1988 French Championships by a skating accident when Paul stepped on Isabelle's hand during a difficult section of the free dance lacerating her fingers. This year, following Isabelle's knee surgery, the two were again sidelined from their Nationals due to her sciatic nerve injury.

So, the new free program will be unveiled at the Europeans. Until it is performed, the two are hesitant to discuss details of the program or reveal the music, outside of saying that it is by a well-known composer and performer.

"It is going to be hard to beat last year. People are expecting something from us. That expectation wasn't there before," Paul muses. "But we proved our point, that's what matters. And it's done. We did what we wanted to do."

"And we will this year, too," Isabelle adds, "but it is a completely different idea and approach from where we were."


Paul adds, "There will be a very sharp contrast between us in the new free dance. Last year, we were a unit; this year, we are going in opposite directions. Last year we fought for our lives all the way through the program, and this year, it's totally in the opposite direction. It's a totally different thing, just as technically tricky as last year, and has to be precise or it will look like it's out of nowhere."

As for future plans, the Duchesnays will not project ahead. "As long as we continue to improve we will stay in competition," Isabelle states, "and that does

WORLD JUNIOR CHAMPION

Life is sometimes stranger than fiction. Jessica Mills of Northfield, Illinois, was not originally scheduled to compete in the 1989 World Junior Figure Skating Championships in Sarajevo, nor was she favored to win in her first international competition against more experienced skaters. At the age of 14, she originally had been named as an alternate, having another possible three years to compete under International Skating Union rules. The withdrawal of a named competitor, allowed her the opportunity to join the U.S. Team.

Beginning with a fourth in the compulsory figures, she moved into the lead after the

new original program and presented a dynamic long program to win that event and the 1989 Ladies' World Junior Championship. This marks the third consecutive year a U.S. woman has won the title. Mills follows 1988 champion, Kristi Yamaguchi of Fremont, California, and 1987 champion, Cindy Bortz, of Tarzana, California.

It's not that the Mills household has been short of excitement this year. Jessica is the younger sister of Phoebe Mills, Olympic bronze medalist in gymnastics. She also has an older brother. Nathaniel, and a sister. Hillary, who are both speed skaters.

In the men's division, Shepherd Clark, 17, of Atlanta, Georgia, who now trains in Colorado Springs took the silver medal, placing a strong second in all three phases of the competition. This is the ninth straight year that an American male has been a medalist in the championships.

The 1990 World Junior Figure Skating Championships come to the U.S. and will be held at the Broadmoor World Arena in Colorado Springs, November 28 to December 3. 1989.





I was at the Southwest Regional competitions last November watching a group of skaters warming up, when I heard a voice in back of me saying, "Look at those droopy toes!" Turning around, I found the voice coming from a National Judge of wide reputation, standing there with a look of utter disgust on his face. I had to laugh as I had been thinking: "Why don't they turn their free legs out and point their toes up?"

"Droopy toes!" That's wonderful! I thanked him for giving me a short, concise expression that would get the message across to the skaters with whom I work. You definitely get the picture and a clear message when you hear "droopy toes." I was impressed that this affected this fine judge just as much as poor jumping technique. It certainly is not "stylish" to extend a leg in a camel spin or a spiral and have the toe drooping down, pointing to the ice.


Many times this condition is caused by laziness on the part of the skater, or because this is not considered important. It is true that some skaters really have a problem of "turned-in legs" which makes it difficult to point the toes up. But by and large, most skaters are able to turn their legs out somewhat, and toes up through concentrated thought and exercise.

Exercise #1

Stand at the railing with one hand supporting you and with feet together. Concentrating deeply on not moving the hips, turn one leg from the hip joint in an outward direction so that the foot turns out and the toes are pointed to the side. Now move the foot back so that both feet are together again. Keeping the knees straight, continue moving the leg in the hip socket from a parallel position to an open position about ten times before changing to the other leg. Know that the leg can turn in the hip socket without the hips turning.

Exercise #2

Point one toe on the ice in front of you in a parallel position. Turn the leg in and out ten times before changing to the other leg. Be sure the turn is in the hip socket. Repeat this same exercise pointing the leg to the side and then to the back.

Exercise #3

After getting the control of Exercise #2, you can start Exercise #3, which is like a "battement" in ballet. With the leg turned out and knees straight, point one foot on the ice in front of you. Lift the turned out straight leg in the air as high as you can without moving any other part of the body, and especially not lifting or turning the hip. With control, point the foot back on the ice, turned out, then place it parallel to the other foot. Use a count of 4:

Count 1—Point foot on ice in front, turned out.

Count 2—Lift leg with control, turned out.

Count 3—Point foot on ice in front, turned out.

Count 4—Bring foot to support foot in parallel.

Repeat this exercise to the side and to the back. Be especially careful in lifting the leg in back, not to arch back or lean front. Keep the leg turned out, knees straight and the toe pointing upward.

Next month we will continue with more exercises to help the "droopy toe."



we want to do. Dance is really expressing your feelings through movement and doing what the music tells you to do," Paul believes. "It can tell me one thing and Isabelle one thing and you something else.

"There are rules to follow in competition, that may or may not be too strict. But if it can be expressed by anybody, then it is dance. If you go back to the stone age, perhaps the first things were drums and they were dancing to them. So, it all depends on how you look at it as to how you can define dance. Any kind of rhythm can be interpreted. Maybe some types we cannot do and somebody else can. It depends on what each person can do. And there are so many more things we want to do, and are waiting to do, so many." And their myriad fans are also waiting and wondering if the Duchesnays can or will lead dance into new directions.



SURPRISES AT BRITISH CHAMPIONSHIPS

The British Championships, held November 26 to 30 at the impressive National Exhibition Centre in Birmingham, served as a dry run for the European Championships in January at the same venue.

Joanne Conway duly won her fourth consecutive women's title—at 17 the youngest ever to do so—but only after a training accident threatened to end her chances. Six hours before the final free skating, she injured her right knee falling from a triple Salchow during practice. Coach Robin Cousins took her to a hospital where a torn ligament was diagnosed. She was told she could skate as long as she rested completely for a week afterwards.

The North Shields girl who needed laser treatment before the contest, looked ill at

ease, but a brave performance enabled her to triumph. Despite her handicap, she somehow managed eight good jumps, two of them in combination, and made no error. Wisely, she never attempted a triple.

Londoner, Jackie Soames was runnerup, achieving commendable height in her jumps during a performance marred only by a fall from a double Salchow.

Gina Fulton, runner-up in the previous two championships, fell twice attempting double jumps as she slumped to eighth. An inspired performance from Louisa Danskin earned the Nottingham girl the bronze.

Christian Newberry, 20, from Solihull, only a few miles from Birmingham, was the surprise new men's champion, taking the vacant title previously held by Paul Robinson. John Martin of Scotland was runner-up, with Swindon's David Reynolds third in a close contest between the three. Favorite Charles Wildridge ended fifth.

Cheryl Peak and Andrew Naylor, from Bracknell, retained the pair's title for the

fourth time, outpointing their only challengers, Neil and Lisa Cushley from Billingham, who won in 1984.

When Sharon Jones and Paul Askham glided serenely to their fourth straight ice dance victory, the elegant Altrincham duo revealed greatly improved technique. Heartening, too, was the performance of the unexpected runners-up Karen Ouinn and Alan Albretti who have been partners for only twelve months at London's Lee Valley Rink. Each excelled with theatrical set pattern Charlestons, reviving the rage of the twenties on ice in appropriate period costumes. However, it was the final free dance which set the champions apart with immaculate unison of free leg actions. Lynn Burton and Andrew Place, both 17 of Sough, looked great prospects as they clinched third spot.

Jackie Soames and Christian Newberry will be making their World Championship debuts on the British Team named for Paris next March.

Ironically, the second lead, that of the hockey player, was portrayed by Jonathan Niles, grandson of the late Nathaniel W. Niles, who was the three-times U.S. Men's single, nine-times Pairs, three-times Waltz, two-times Tenstep (or Fourteenstep) and national Dance Champion, as well as being one of the founders of *Skating* magazine. Niles participated in three Olympics and served as first vice president and a member of the USFSA Executive Committee in the early days of the USFSA. He was elected into the Hall of Fame in 1978.

There are no plans at this time to distribute the special to other ABC affiliates nationally.

Philip Edward Nelson passed away on December 27, 1988, after a prolonged illness. He was the older brother of J. Barlow Nelson and Franklin S. Nelson, M.D.




