## NEWS BRIEFS

Filming is underway this month on a new ice ballet of *Carmen* starring Katarina Witt, Brian Boitano, and Brian Orser. Following rehearsals under the direction of choreographer Sandra Bezic in East Germany, the film is being shot in Seville, Spain, setting for the original opera. Prominent international photographer, Dino Ricci, (husband of Bezic) will be covering the production from beginning to end. A book on the making

of *Carmen* may be forthcoming.

The film will have theatrical release in Europe and plans for U.S. television or theatres are under discussion. Release date has not been announced but is expected to be in early 1990.

Beacom, Denise Biellmann, Rosalynn Sumners, Kitty & Peter Carruthers, Tracy Wilson & Rob McCall, Elena Valova & Oleg Vasiliev, and Natalia Bestemianova & Andre Bukin. The event will be carried on NBC in multiple broadcasts, dates to be announced.

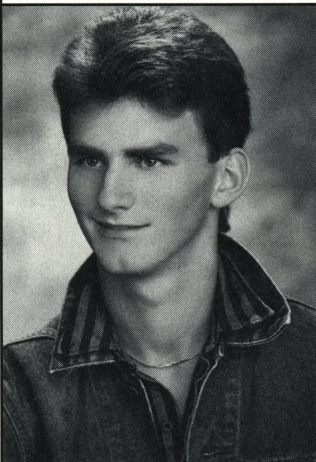
Following the Landover competition, the skaters will travel to Moscow for the NutraSweet World Challenge of Champions on December 14, marking the first professional figure skating championship ever to be held in the Soviet Union. The Luzhniki Stadium will be the site for the head-to-head battle where Boitano and Biellmann will defend their titles won in Paris last year. The group from Landover will be joined by Toller Cranston and the event will be televised on ABC and throughout Europe.

Prizes for each competition are \$40,000 for 1st, \$20,000 for 2nd, \$12,000 for 3rd, \$8,000 for 4th, and \$5,000 for 5th. Moscow News will award a special prize for the winners of both championships combined. The competitions are produced by Candid Productions, in association with Trans World International, and sponsored by The NutraSweet Company.

## CAMPBELL'S WORLD CUP

For the second consecutive year, the Campbell's World Cup of Figure Skating will be held in Ottawa, Canada on Sunday, December 10 at 2:00 P.M. headlined by an impressive list of skating professionals.

Last year's champion, Canada's Olympic silver medalist Elizabeth Manley will defend her title against Linda Fratianne, two times world champion and Olympic silver medalist; Tracey Wainman, two times Canadian champion; and U.S. champion and two times world bronze medalist, Tiffany Chin.

The men's event features a powerful field headed by Olympic and professional champion, Robin Cousins; four times U.S. champion and Olympic bronze medalist, Charlie Tickner; three times Canadian champion and two times world bronze medalist, Brian Pockar; and two times European champion and Olympic bronze medalist, Jozef Sabovchik in his first professional competition.

Defending World Cup Pair Champions Jill Watson and Peter Oppegard, Olympic and world bronze medalists, will face off against a field headed by former world champions Barbara Underhill and Paul Martini; Irina Korina and Viktor Yelchin, stars of the Leningrad Ice Ballet; and popular U.S. Olympians and world team members, Natalie and Wayne Seybold.

Judy Blumberg and Michael Seibert, five times U.S. Champions and three times world bronze medalists will meet in a showdown against former Canadian and world professional champions Lorna Wighton and John Dowding of Canada.

Under the new sponsorship of Campbell's, the competition will offer a total of \$214,000 in prize money. It will be telecast in Canada on December 25 and at a later date in the States on ESPN. # GUSTAVE LUSSI: The Man Who Changed Skating

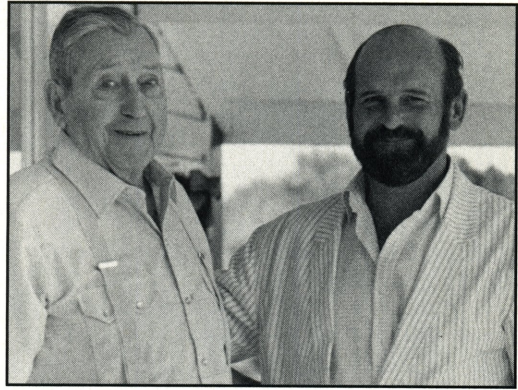

In November, a thirty-minute documentary, *Gustave Lussi: The Man Who Changed Skating*, will be aired in Plattsburgh, New York on PBS station WCFE. A skating legend in his own time, 91-year-old Gus Lussi has coached students to 23 World Championships, 6 Olympic gold medals, and countless national, sectional, and regional titles.

A native of Switzerland, Lussi turned to skating after a skiing accident cut short that career. Disappointed but unfazed, he determined, "If I can't be a champion, I'll make champions" . . . and that he did. Among the many: Dick Button, Dorothy Hamill, Hayes Alan Jenkins, Canadian pair Maria and Otto Jelinek, Eileen Seigh, and Gordon McKellen, Jr., whose nine years as a pupil led him to three national men's championship wins.

Lussi came to the United States in the very early 1920's, seeking the "American Dream" . . . that given talent, drive, and strength, a person could try anything and be anything he wished. In the 1970's Cecily Morrow of New York became one of his students. Now, also a coach, she was so inspired with his techniques she began a manual that she hoped would explain many of his methods and capture the spirit of the man. Lussi had settled in Lake Placid, New York because it reminded him of his native country.

Visualizing a local interest in the story, plus national and worldwide interest in figure skating, Cecily contacted WCFE with her idea for a program. The station became interested, and successfully sought a grant from the New York State Public Television Production Fund. Filming began with Morrow as consultant and Joanne Taylor, Executive Producer. All of the crew became so infatuated with the sport and its subject they thought a more fitting title would be, "I love Lussi."

The finished product—a year in the making—is a skating masterpiece. It skillfully cuts across time with rare, old film of skating champions, and recent interviews with some of them, including Button, Hamill, Ronnie Robertson, Eileen Seigh, Tenley Albright, Jenkins, John Curry, Toller Cranston, the Jelineks, and Don Jackson, who became a pupil after winning Worlds.

Comments from coach Carlo Fassi, echo the title and words from these champions. The program has appeal, for those dreaming of becoming a champion or those who just admire the skill and grace of figure skating. The core of Lussi's profile comes through strongly throughout.

Miss Seigh, former National Junior Champion, said, "He rewrote the book." Without a doubt, some of his multi-jumps were a first. A Lussi spin is easily recognized anywhere in the world, and he was first to choreograph skating programs to recorded music. He inspired his students with confidence just before performing by saying, "Go out there and show them how good you are." She added, "I thank him for my life, which you pursue a long time after skating."

Lussi and his wife Thelma served up large doses of family life during off-ice time. Etched deep in the memories of every one of his pre- and post-World War II skaters, are the Sunday nights at their beautiful chalet mountain home. There was fishing, swimming, games, and the never-to-be-forgotten rides on the "pulley" across the man-made lake. A highlight, still remembered, "the decision" to hang on and ride across, or drop off into the lake en route. No roller coaster today rivals that thrill. This was topped off by Thelma's spaghetti dinners, another memory that still whets the appetite of those skaters lucky enough to have been guests there.

Ronnie Robertson, who was famous for his blur spin of 240 turns a minute, said, "Gus made you feel you were his only student." About Robertson, Mr. Lussi said, "I knew I had a gem on my hands."

Dorothy Hamill was ten when she first met Lussi. "He made me the skater I wanted to be. All that I'm famous for—the delayed Axel, Hamill camel—were all Gus. He wanted you to be the best that you could, every time you did anything."

Dick Button claims, "Gus taught me to skate." McKellen's parents said, "He made Gordie *like* skating." The Jelineks worked with him to strengthen their solo skating. "You now needed single skating in pairs," replied Otto. Don Jackson: "He made us all enjoy not just skating, but life."

Seigh's remark summed it all up, "Gus Lussi taught us a lot of things off the ice as well. He told us that you're a person long after you're a figure skater. He helped me to become a better person."

From February 15-17th, 1990, the first "Gus Lussi Invitational Competition" for Novice, Junior, and Senior skaters, will be held in Lake Placid, during the 10-year anniversary celebration of the 1980 Olympics. Lussi has had a major hand in planning this event in his honor.

Recently WCFE hosted a lavish reception at the Grandview Hotel-Holiday Inn,

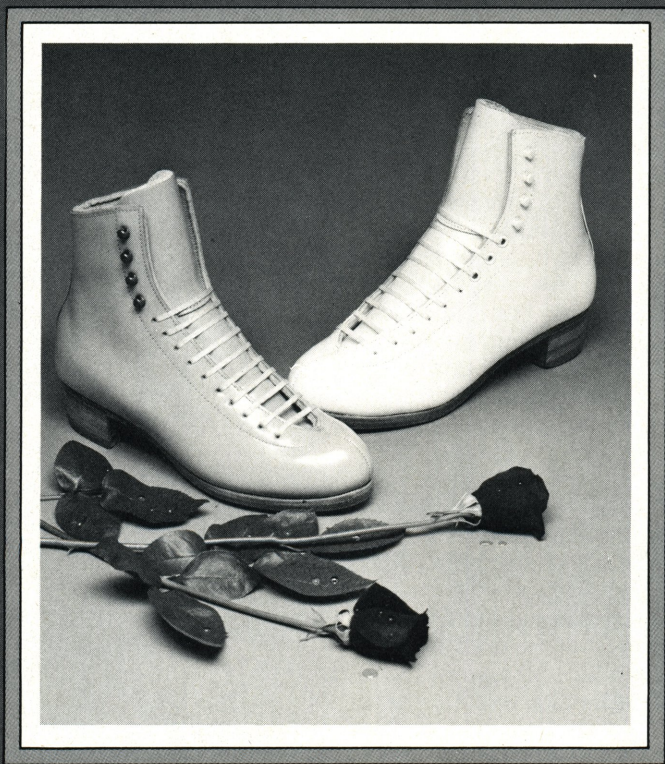

## IN REPLY

Dear Editor:

One can't help but remember the given reasons why the school figures were being eliminated from competitions in the first place. In the July 1987 issue of *Skating* on page 13, the ISU's proposals for eliminating the figures was to modernize the future development of the sport. It went on to read that without the training of figures, skaters would then have more time to contribute to the "further development of free skating with its beauty, artistry, and athleticism . . . skaters will be able to develop real artistic skating ability with glide, footwork, interpretation of the music with good choreography and body positions."

These are good reasons and are easy to understand. Why, then does pure athleticism seem to be the rage? All I see happening is if a skater is good technically all he or she has to do is a record number of jumps, and the title, like at Worlds, will literally be handed over on a "golden" platter while the other competitors who specialize in the presentation fail to get equal credit. There should be some kind of rule about this like limiting the jumps to 5 or 6, with certain artistic impression, especially in between jumps, mandatory.

Only then can the sport stress the completeness with equal attention to both artistic and technical abilities. At the current time, the ISU's proposals seemed to be getting ignored.

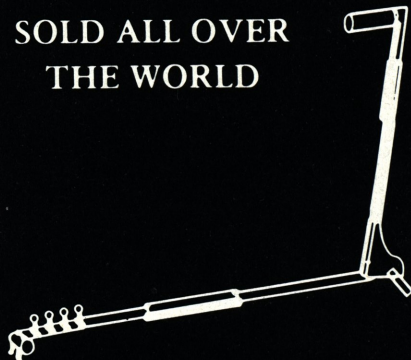

# HOW WE CAN USE EACH OTHER

My original title for this article was "The Media and How You Can Use Us," but I decided that the truth is that we can use each other.

Athletes and media members, at any given event or at any given time, have their own purposes. Skaters are trying for their best performance at the right time and the right moment. We, the media, are trying to present the best stories to our readers, whether it is an event story or a feature story, to keep them informed and get them more interested in amateur sports as a whole and skating in particular.

We, the media, deal with athletes all the time, both amateur and professional. Obviously you have read enough newspapers to know there are some stereotypes we have to deal with, such as monosyllabic fullbacks. Some people are negative towards sports writers, professional athletes in particular. That is why many journalists really enjoy covering amateur sports, especially skating, because of the athletes.

People are interested in what you do. They just don't want to read results. They want to read about you as individuals. That is our job as writers, and also those in television and radio—to try to dig a little under the surface and find out what people are really like as individuals.

Being interviewed is not necessarily easy. Some of you have gotten up before a press conference and don't know what to say. Somebody asks a question you don't understand, or maybe you wanted to say something but didn't know if it was the right thing to say. You need to

realize a few things before you get into a press conference or a one-on-one with a reporter.

When people talk about the "power of the press," it is true. Here in Colorado Springs, anything we write is going to be read by up to 300,000 people. Someone writing in Los Angeles is going to be read by three million people. In any given press conference you may think, "This is just a handful of people, no big deal." But at an event like Nationals, you may have an audience of 15 million people in one little press conference!

That is the power that you can use to work to your advantage. Many others have. Not only what you say but how you say it makes all the difference. What people think about you, your image, and also the sport as a whole is effected by your opinions and statements in these interviews.

Media people are not out to do a hatchet job, but if someone in a press conference makes a comment that is a little bit off-the-edge, something that is good copy, we are going to write it. That leaves a little bit of judgment up to you.

There are two basic ways we approach covering a competition or writing a story. One is the basic event story—the who won, why, and some technical detail. So, when you get to the press conference afterwards, we do not want to know why you decided to take up skating. We want to find out how you feel and your reactions.

We are trying to ask the best questions we can. The key is, do not answer questions with just one word. If someone

asks, "How did you feel before you skated?" and you say "Nervous," that won't make for much of a story. If you say, "I remembered my problem last year . . ." relating to something personal and adding human interest, you'll see people writing these comments down. That's what makes for a good story.

We will be writing a story as soon as we finish the interview, maybe 700 words in 30 minutes. If you waste time and are late coming to a press conference while everyone is waiting, it can have an effect.

Remember one thing: When it is late afternoon or early evening, every media person is in a hurry and has a deadline. Most of us don't have two or three days to write a story. The better the quotes we can get from you saying what you really feel, what the event meant to you, the better the story will be . . . and people will have a better opinion of you as a result.

Then there is the feature story. In addition to your own hometown, the host cities for competitions will want good interviews before an event like Nationals. These are really a great opportunity for you. You may not understand how much these stories get circulated. If you give a good interview to a Salt Lake paper before Nationals, that story is going to be read by every writer looking for story ideas. This could lead to more interest in you and more attention.

If you get a call from someone who does not know a lot about skating, it is not in your best interest to blow them off, because how that story might be written could affect how the media perceive you. It is important for you to do your best to be prepared for situations like that and be as cooperative and helpful as possible.

Sports writers have had our favorites. The media always enjoy being with Scott Hamilton, and now Chris Bowman—we know he is never predictable. Then there have been others who by their attitude and what they have said have been portrayed negatively in the media. (If you think about it you can come up with a few names.)

Too often I have seen skaters who do not realize this and do not use situations to their advantage and get into negative situations. Suddenly, millions of people know about their problems or attitudes, and they are unhappy because they did not think about what they were saying or how they presented themselves.

There is an inner-core of people who follow the Olympic movement. You may know Phil Hersh from the *Chicago Tribune*, Mike Janofsky of the *New York Times*, or Randy Harvey from the *Los Angeles Times*. I guarantee you they do not have to be at Nationals. They are there because they want to be. They know they have and can get some good stories from figure skating. What you are dealing with is the "cream of the crop," the best writers from some of the best papers in the country.

It is a golden opportunity for you and them to work together, to use each other to both's advantage and benefit . . . if you take the time, are honest and thoughtful, and do it right.

Next month, we will look at some "do's" and "don'ts" in dealing with the media.

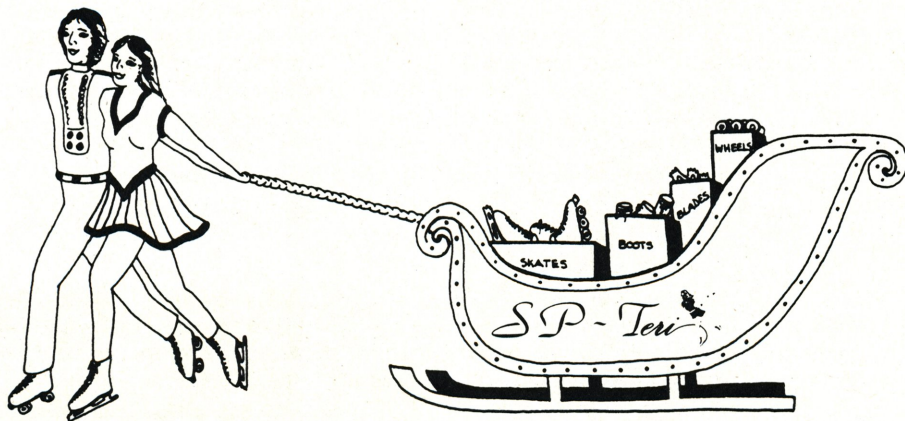

## On Discipline Part II

Besides the study of good technique, the training of the artistic skater should include a daily regime of body exercises for conditioning, flexibility, and grace. Ideally, these would be the exercises learned and practiced in the dance workroom. The benefits from classes in ballet and free movement to the skater are countless. They release and free the body through the discipline of regulated exercises to perform without self-consciousness movements demanded for any role or emotion. Whenever dance classes are not feasible, a system of "top to toe" exercises should be practiced daily, to develop coordination and control in every part of the body.

Under the category of physical fitness comes good health, and the most important factor in good health is diet. It is of extreme importance that a performance not be marred by colds, pains, headaches, and other common physical nuisances. These accepted "illnesses" need never occur when there is an active participation in a diet governed by individual blood chemistry. It not only will maintain all-around good health, but will keep the body at its proper weight without hunger pains. It is not a matter of "dieting," but of changing eating habits permanently. This type of discipline will result in high levels of energy needed for the abnormal hours and the type of demanding work required in skating. Suffice it to say, an attractive body is far more pleasant to watch than an unattractive one.

Not to be overlooked is the discipline of emotional control. There is talk of temperamental artists who lose control of their emotions. Contrary to what may be thought, the loss of this control hinders rather than aids the artist. An emotional response should never overpower the techniques so necessary for artistic perfection. Gaining this kind of control takes practice in everyday living. This does not mean that there must be no emotional responses. On the contrary, controlled emotions are more effective, more impressive than irrational outbursts.

Then there is the discipline of daily practice which is an indelible part of the life of an artistic skater. When daily practice ceases, or is lessened in any degree, the work of the artist becomes noticeably weaker. It takes great discipline to maintain a rigorous daily schedule of practice that is demanded by the artistic. But the person imbued with talent, ambitious for success, will develop the discipline needed.

Disciplining the mind and the body for artistic accomplishment builds steps on the ladder to success. These steps are directly or indirectly related to discipline. Draw a big ladder on a sheet of paper. Put lots of steps on it. Name each step with something you need to develop that will lead to the top of the ladder which is "Success."

For instance, on the bottom rung you might start with: *Industriousness*. On another sheet of paper, explain each word to yourself.

*Industriousness*: There is no substitute for work. Worthwhile things come from hard work and careful planning.

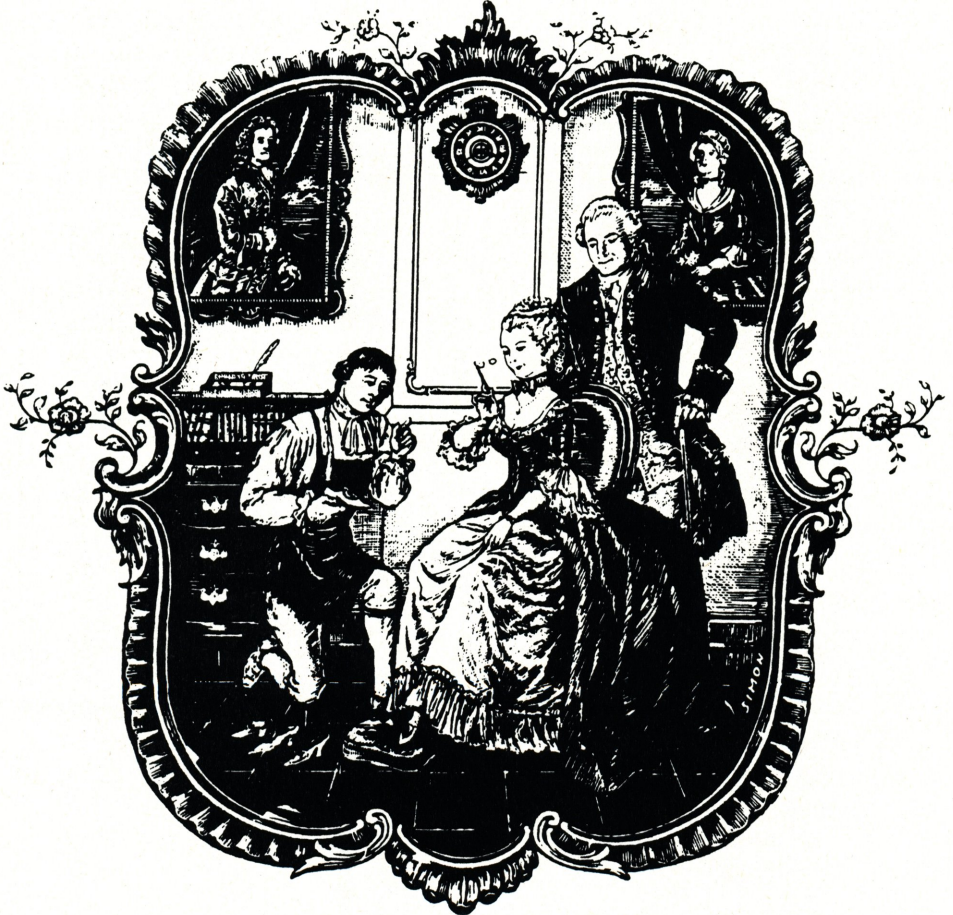
*Enthusiasm*: Your heart must be in your work. Stimulate others.

*Alertness*: Observe constantly. Be quick to spot a weakness and correct it or use it as the case may warrant.

Continue up your ladder in this manner, (I can think of at least 25 steps), until you reach "Success." Then explain success.

*Success*: Peace of mind, a direct result of self-satisfaction in knowing that through discipline, you did your best to become the best that you are capable of being.

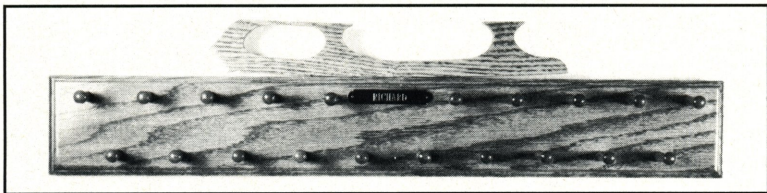

# AMERICANS TRIUMPH IN UK INTERNATIONAL

The tenth Skate Electric UK International provided two gold and two silver medals for the United States, with victories of particular distinction in the two singles contests. Twelve nations were represented by 43 skaters in the 4 events, held as usual on London's Thames-side rink at Richmond on October 2-5.

The pair's success of Quebec's Isabelle Brasseur and Lloyd Eisler reflected Canada's current role as a major challenger to the lengthy Soviet dominance in this category. The petite Brasseur, Eisler's third partner, is ideally built for pair skating, enabling him to excel in powerful overhead lifts and throw triples with consummate ease.

On this occasion, their closest rivals were Californians Kellie Creel and Bob Pellaton, who gave the third-placed Czechs, Radka Kovarik and Rene Novotny, no chance to catch up after asserting their authority in the original program. Creel, like Brasseur, stands barely five feet without skates and the well-matched Americans looked excellent prospects, no doubt owing rapid progress to the shrewd guidance of John Nicks, famous for training Tai Babilonia and Randy Gardner, the World Champions in 1979, and for winning the 1953 title with his late sister Jennifer.

The men's competition presented a memorable duel between Poland's Grzegorz Filipowski, the World bronze medalist in Paris who now lives and trains with Barbara Kossowska in Rochester, Minnesota, and Todd Eldredge from South Chatham, Massachusetts, who is coached in San Diego, California by Richard Callaghan.

The 23-year-old Pole, five years Eldredge's senior, convincingly won the figures, but made costly "short" errors, in the jump combination and the required double Axel, after Eldredge had missed no element in a program which set an appreciative crowd buzzing.

In the free, Eldredge produced a stunning combination of triple Axel and triple toe loop in a superb rendition, marred only when touching a hand down on a triple Salchow.

The pressure was on Filipowski, last to skate, and he erred in triple Axel and triple Salchow, to put Eldredge deservedly on top of the medalist podium. Vladimir Petrenko, younger brother of Viktor, took bronze for the Soviet Union.

The lone Russian victory of the meeting was gained by the little known Angelika Krylova and Vladimir Leliukh, coached by Natalia Linichuk, and their success underlined their country's continuing depth of strength in ice dancing.

The Soviets' fast interpretation of the set pattern Samba contrasted to the slower style of Jeanne Miley and Michael Verlich, the graceful American runners-up tutored in California by Darlene Gilbert, Kim Basle, and Peter Dalby. The third-placed French, Isabelle Sarech and Xavier Debernis, were believed to have lost marks for simulating a bare midriff, albeit covered by a flesh-colored body stocking.

Tonia Kwiatkowski, 18, from Cleveland, Ohio, faced as formidable a task in the ladies' event as had Eldredge in the men's, up against the West German, Patricia Neske, ranked fourth in the world, and the much respected East German, Simone Koch.

As widely expected, Neske scored top marks in both figures and appeared set to dominate before shocking in her original program with two jumping errors. This gave Kwiatkowski a chance she took well, with a clean display which positively sparkled.

The stage was set for a fascinating finale, but a nervous-looking Neske touched down on a double Lutz and made other mistakes in a generally disappointing performance. Koch did well enough to overtake her before Kwiatkowski skating last, conquered with a scintillating performance, elegant and lively

with four strong triples, well-centered spins, and great technical finesse which mirrored past glories of her celebrated coach, Carol Heiss, the 1960 Olympic and five times World Champion.

Heiss, who was accompanied by husband Hayes Jenkins, the 1956 Olympic champion and four times World winner, has trained Kwiatkowski for ten years, since she was eight, and was justly pleased with this significant outcome.

Afterwards, we enjoyed swapping nostalgic reminiscences, having first met at the 1950 Worlds in London, where Hayes reminded me that, instead of records, a sixteen-piece orchestra played live music for all the competitors.

Another former World and Olympic champion present was East German Anett Pötzsch, who judged both singles events and is the sister-in-law of Katarina Witt. "In Eldredge and Kwiatkowski, I think we have seen two big stars emerging," she told me—and few present would have quarreled with that statement.

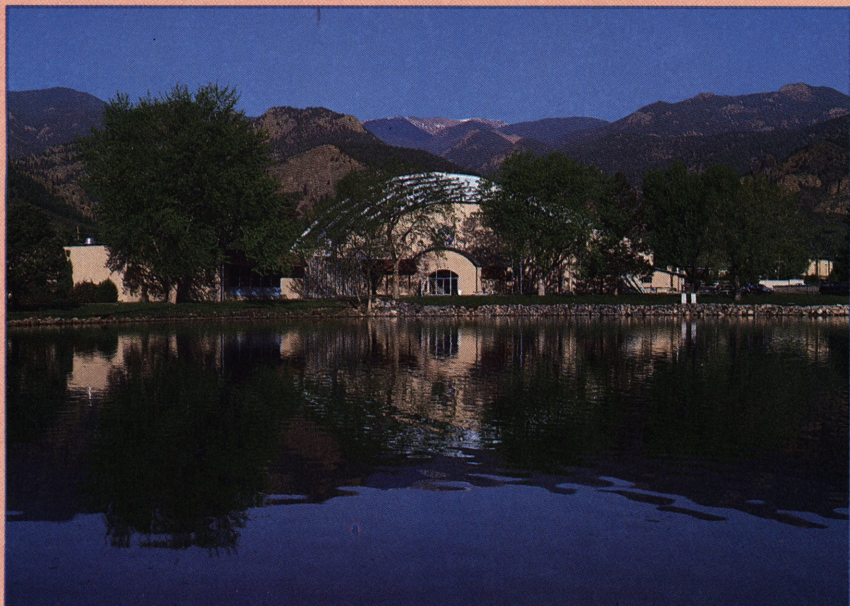

Pikes Peak or Bust!

## WORLD JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS RETURN TO COLORADO SPRINGS



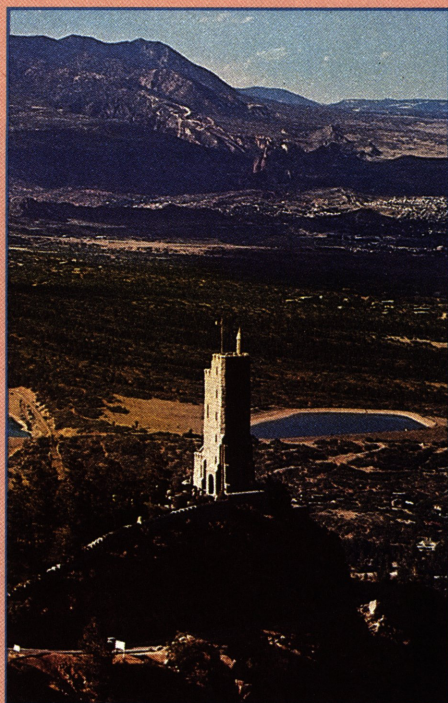
*The Broadmoor World Arena as seen from across the lake.*

In 1858, "Pikes Peak or Bust!" became a national slogan following the first discovery of gold in Colorado. It launched a massive rush of prospectors into the Pikes Peak Region in search of the elusive ore. This month a new generation takes up the quest for gold in Colorado, in the shadow of the famous mountain, at the 1990 World Junior Figure Skating Championships in Colorado Springs.

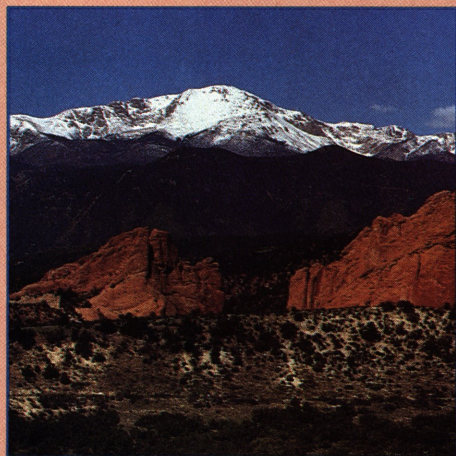
With the renowned Broadmoor Hotel housing the international delegations, the main competitive events will be held in the Broadmoor World Arena. Required competitive compulsory figures will be skated for the last time in a World

Juniors at the Sertich Ice Center, which will also be used for practice. From November 28 to December 3, the Broadmoor Skating Club will host the championships for the second time in five years, sponsored by the USFSA.

It is doubtful if participants will have the opportunity to travel to the top of the 14,110 foot Pikes Peak, but countless sightseeing opportunities await in the foothills and the 6,200 foot lower elevations of the city. The spectacular Garden of the Gods awaits exploring, as does Cheyenne Canyon, the U.S. Olympic Training Center, the U.S. Air Force Academy with its famous chapel and stunning panorama setting, along with

several prominent museums and galleries, including the World Figure Skating Hall of Fame and Museum and the Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame. Protectively located at the base of the Rockies with a semi-arid climate and sunny skies, mild temperatures can be expected during the event (if Mother Nature behaves accordingly to form).

Numerous special activities are planned in conjunction with the Championships which happen to fall the week after Thanksgiving.

The World Figure Skating Museum will host a welcoming reception for officials and mount two special exhibitions during the championships. One will

feature memorabilia from the collection of former U.S. and North American Champion Yvonne Sherman Tutt and her late husband, William Thayer Tutt. The other will focus on costumes of former U.S., Canadian, and Soviet world junior champions, including Christopher Bowman, Barbara Underhill and Paul Martini, Ekaterina Gordeeva and Sergei Grinkov, Todd Eldredge, Erik Larson, Kristi Yamaguchi and Rudi Galindo.

The ISU George Häslar Medal will be presented posthumously to Mr. Tutt for his dedicated service to the sport of figure skating at the closing banquet.

Competitors from approximately 23 countries are expected for the championships. This year's U.S. Team will be made up of John Baldwin, Jr. and Scott Davis in men. Jessica Mills, current 1989 Junior Champion, will defend her title against Kyoko Ina, and Tisha Walker in the ladies' competition. Jennifer Heurlin and John Frederiksen, Aimee Offner and Brian Helgenberg make up the pair's contingent, with Beth Buhl and Neale Smull, Katherine Williamson and Ben Williamson in dance. Hal Marron will act as Team Leader.

The competition will begin on Tuesday, November 28, with Men's Compulsory Figures in the morning, Compulsory Dances in the afternoon, and Opening Ceremonies, and Pair's Original Program that evening. The Men's Original Program will be held on November 29, Wednesday afternoon, and the Pairs Long Program that evening. The Ladies' Compulsory Figures will begin Thursday morning, November 30, followed by the Dance O.S.P. in the afternoon, and the Men' Long at night. On Friday, the Ladies' Original Program will be held in the afternoon followed by the Free Dance in the evening. The final event, the Ladies' Long Program, will be

skated Saturday night, and a gala Exhibition will bring the competition to a close on Sunday afternoon.

The 1990 Championships will be telecast on CBS. Check your local listings for time and dates.

## WORLD JUNIORS TRIVIA

Out of the 12 World Junior Championships that have been held, U.S. men have medaled in all but one (1980). They have garnered a total of 15 medals, 6 of them gold.

U.S. ladies have won the last three World Junior titles and collected a total of 8 medals, 6 of them gold, in 12 competitions.

In 1976 and 1977 the original title of the event was the ISU Junior Figure Skating Championships. Mark Cockerell and Suzie Brasher of the U.S. were the first champions.

Kristi Yamaguchi and Rudi Galindo are the only Americans to ever win the World Junior Pair Championships.

While Alexandr Fadeev is the only man to win both the World Juniors (1980) and the World Seniors (1985), two teams have done so in pairs: Barbara Underhill and Paul Martini (1978 and 1984) and Ekaterina Gordeeva and Sergei Grinkov (Juniors in 1985 and Seniors the following year in 1986 and again in 1987 and 1989). In ladies Elaine Zayak won both titles (1979 and 1982) and Rosalynn Summers (1980 and 1983). No dance team has won both.

Every World Junior Dance title has been won by couples from the Soviet Union, including Sergei Ponomarenko (1978 and 1979) with former partner Tatiana Durasova.

Sarajevo has hosted the World Juniors more than any other city, 3 times (1983, 1986, 1989). Next year the event will be held in Budapest for the first time, November 27 to December 2.

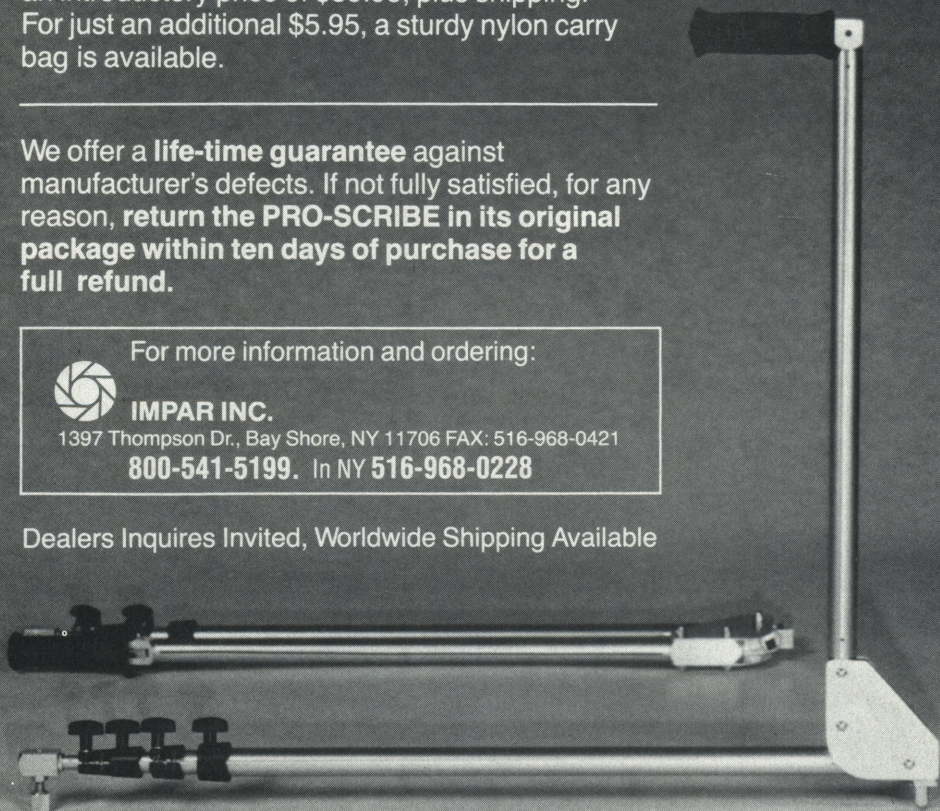

### **The NutraSweet Skate Across America Tour: Promoting Figure Skating Nationwide**

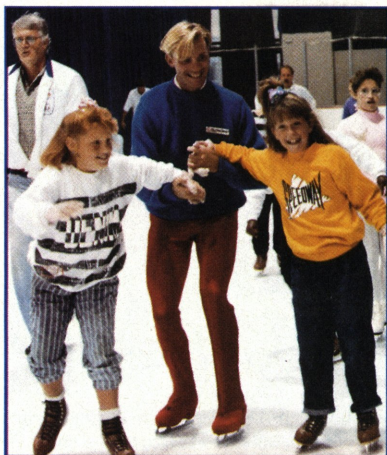

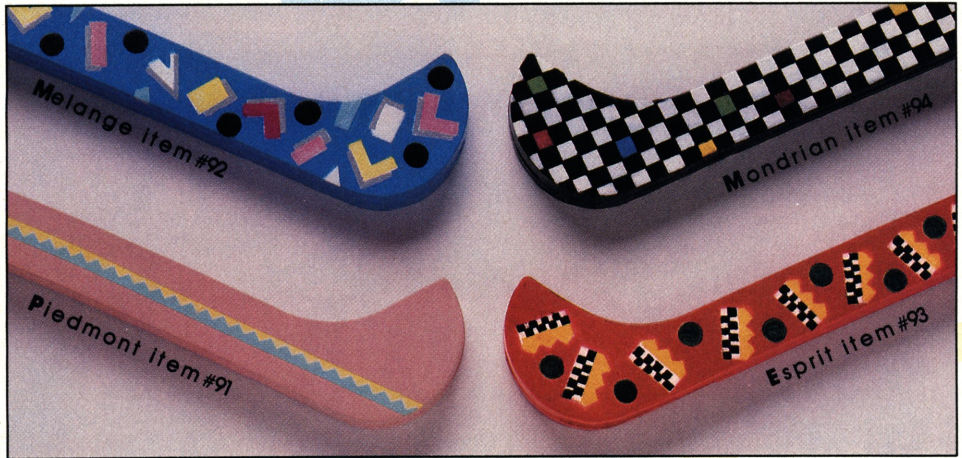

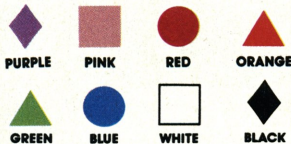

In June, *Skating* magazine published an article addressing adult participation in the Basic Skills program. The information used in that article, and other articles in the Basic Skills series, was compiled from a survey sent to a number of skating directors at rinks and clubs currently using the Basic Skills program.

The article focused on the various methods skating directors use to develop the adult portion of their program and how they generate interest among adults to participate in beginning skating lessons. Many skating directors reported they look to the "family" to bring adults into their programs. By offering "parent-child" classes and special "family activities," many skaters' parents have shown interest in the sport and have signed up for lessons. However, for those adults who do not have children that skate, the main problem is getting the adults into the rink in the first place. In this case, it becomes the responsibility of the skating director to find ways to reach these adults, attract them into the rink and onto the ice.

This point was brought out by an adult skater who is a Basic Skills participant in the Genesee FSC at the Rochester Institute of Technology in New York. Trudi Marrapodi, 27 and single, wrote to us with ideas which deserve to be brought to the attention of our readers. In her letter she wrote, "The suggestions (in the June article) were fine ideas for getting seniors to join in, and for recruiting parents to participate in the program along with their children. However, they (the authors) failed to seriously address another potential source of adult participants: young, single people."

Ms. Marrapodi goes on to say "I think that when the average American adult considers the possibility of going to an ice rink to skate, the first things he/she thinks of are falling, not being able to hold up his/her ankles, and being laughed at by a bunch of kids who already skate like Olympians at age ten. If you want more adults in your Skate With U.S. program, you will have to work at debunking this image among this age group. The way you conduct adult lessons can help."

"Just as skating can be promoted to parents as a fun family activity, it can also

be promoted as a fun, athletic singles activity. This means getting single adults to think of skating rinks the same way they would think of health clubs . . . as a means of getting fit and meeting new people at the same time. Skating can be incorporated into the "cross-training" trend just as easily as running, tennis, racquetball, etc."

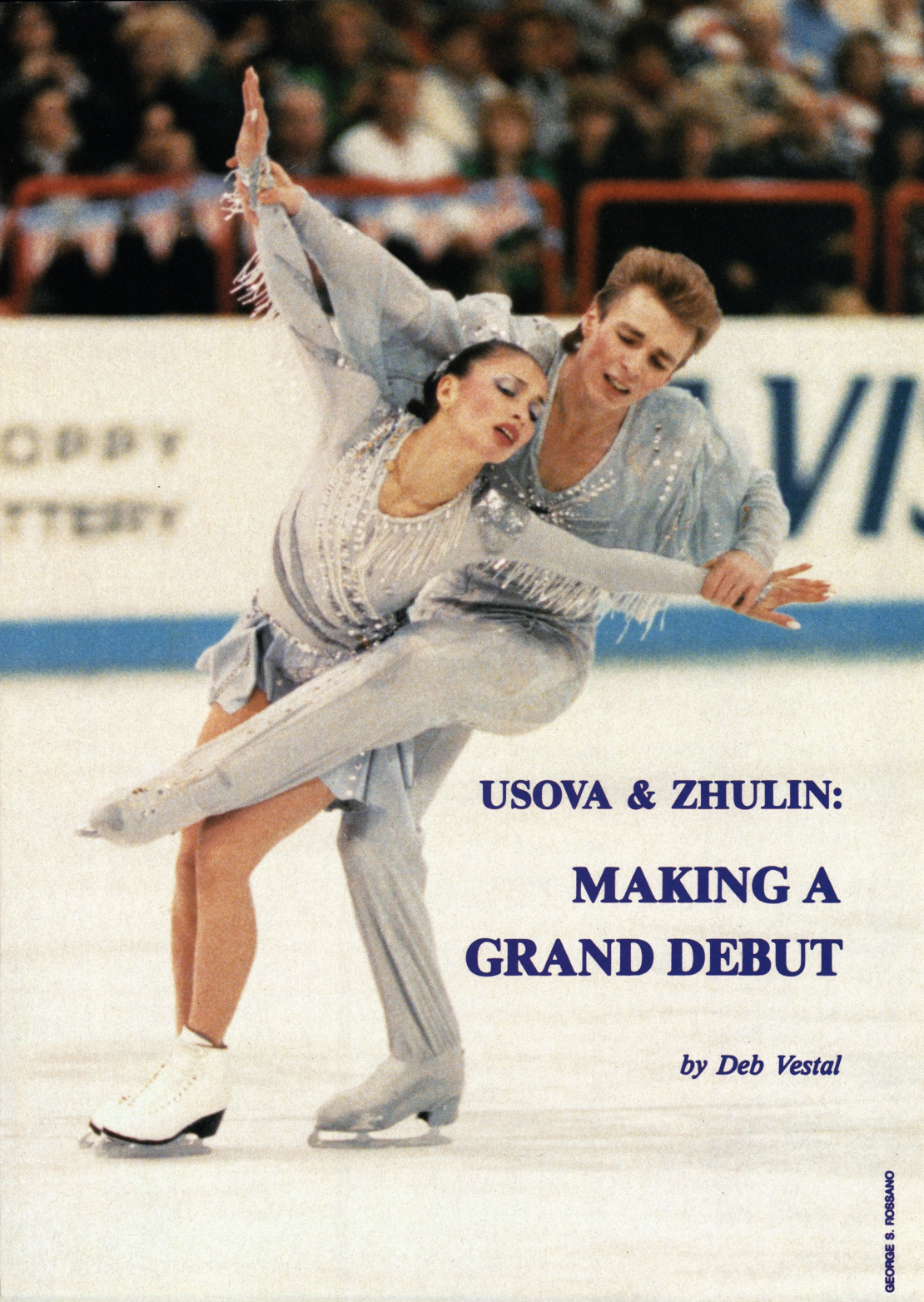
The USFSA agrees with Ms. Marrapodi that adult skating should be promoted as a fun singles activity. Many adults will take advantage of a situation where they can meet new people, learn a new sport, and have a good time in a safe setting. And, by keeping the adults separate from the younger skaters, they probably will be less inhibited as they become more familiar with the ice.

In the June article, we emphasized "corporate programs" that would offer local business people the opportunity to participate in adult skating classes, and as we mentioned, social organizations such as the Junior League, walking clubs, church groups, etc., should also be viewed as sources of potential adult skaters waiting to be tapped. Once you have captured the adult audience, Ms. Marrapodi brings up points about maintaining the interest of these adults.

She cites the constant need for praise and encouragement from the instructors and for their applause of the smallest triumphs of each adult to create a climate of positive thinking.

"The capacity in adults for self-deprecation is boundless, so they (the instructors) must counteract it. Instead of feeling like the class dunce if he happens to take the longest to learn a particular skill, your adult skater should feel that you are proud of him—honestly! And, although teaching the unglamorous basics is important, don't ignore the opportunity to teach the adult a few of

**USOVA & ZHULIN:  
MAKING A  
GRAND DEBUT**

Alexander Zhulin glides on to the Sun Valley ice with his hand outstretched behind him. Maia Usova gracefully places her hand in his and steps into place. Their heads are held high, toes pointed, backs straight, and legs perfectly extended together. The easy edges give way to deep stroking, but not even their hair moves out of place nor their clothes billow as they move quickly around the ice.

Their movements are strong and controlled but not robotlike. Their goal is to portray a feeling between the two, to tell a story. Usova explains what attracts them to dance.

"It is the interaction between the partners. There is a bigger possibility to portray an emotion. When you are alone it is more difficult."

Zhulin (pronounced Zshoo-lin) adds, "The relationship between the man and the woman is eternal. It is like Romeo and Juliet. It is like life itself."

The feeling between the 25-year-old Usova and the 26-year-old Zhulin is not only on the ice. Says Zhulin about Usova, "She's a wonderful woman. She is very beautiful. She is not very serious and she likes to help everybody. And she never gets angry." The last sentence brings peals of laughter from Usova and renowned coach Natalia Dubova.

"They are only angry with each other when they are tired," Dubova adds.

Usova thinks of Zhulin as the leader and says, "The feeling is good when Sasha (her nickname for Alexander) skates, sits, stays, or goes with me. But without Sasha, the feeling is not good."

Usova remembers the time before going to Moscow where she lives and trains. She is an only child and lived with her mother in the town of Gorky, just east of Moscow. Her mother works in the Soviet automobile company called Volga. When Usova first came to Mos-

cow, she was forced to live in a tiny one-room apartment because of the acute housing shortage.

Zhulin's family lives within a half hour of Moscow. He has one younger brother and his father and mother are both engineers who work together.

Usova and Zhulin were paired by Dubova, soon fell in love, and were married in 1986. Their Romeo and Juliet affair, without the tragedy, made for a very special wedding day.

Madame Dubova remembers the day well as she was one of the 100 invited guests. "It was a wonderful day. Maia had a beautiful white dress. It was very good for Maia. Sasha was very elegant, but Sasha was very serious and very strong—stronger than in competition."

The wedding day began with Usova and Zhulin preparing at home. Usova put on her dress, fixed her make-up and hair, and put on her headdress. Zhulin had a black suit and Dubova smiles, "Alexander tried to be beautiful, too."

Next there was a ride in a limousine, a tradition in Moscow, to the place of the official registration where the couple were questioned by the registrar. Dubova mimics the woman official,

Usova, and Zhulin, "The official says, 'Maia, do you want to be married with Sasha,' and Maia said (in a squeaky little mouse voice), 'Yes.' And then the official asked Sasha and he said (in a very, very deep voice), 'Yes.'"

Then it was time to exchange the gold rings which are not placed on the left hand as in the United States but on the right. Dubova says, "Everyone asks us why it is on the right hand. It is tradition." Champagne is then opened, the couple kisses and then speak with the official. Then it is back to the limousine.

Parents typically do not attend the wedding ceremony in the Soviet Union but wait at home to greet the guests when they return. Only Zhulin's father was in attendance at the wedding. At home friends and family had cooked all the foods. As Soviet skating official, Alexander Gorshkov, adds, "There were too many animals to be cooked."

Usova and Zhulin rode the limousine through the streets of Moscow, a tradition for good luck. There are special places to go on the wedding day. Many

couples visit Lenin's tomb in their wedding clothes.

Upon returning home, family and guests were seated at long tables and Usova and Zhulin sat at the short end of the table. Everyone wished them good luck. The couple must kiss, and that gives everyone else permission to drink champagne. It was a happy day, filled with emotion.

The positive emotion continues even now between the two as they spend nearly every moment of their days together. A typical day starts at 7:00 A.M. when they get up. Morning practice is from 9:00 A.M. to 11:00 A.M. Then it is home for a lunch break and a rest, then back at 1:30 P.M. for a choreography lesson followed by another practice from 2:30 to 4:45 P.M. If they are working on a new free program, then there is another evening practice after a dinner break.

In the evenings when they do not practice, Usova and Zhulin are at home in their apartment. Both insist their home is nothing like what they have seen in the United States. It is a small studio apartment with a kitchen, bathroom, living room, and bedroom.

In the evenings, they enjoy being together and doing what they love and that is cooking. When Usova is asked what she eats because she is so small, she says "Everything."

Dubova adds, "If I eat like Maia, I would be a bigger size than I am now." But Usova admits what she does not like is sweets.

Also sharing their apartment is someone very special to them—their cocker spaniel.

Although they occasionally have time to visit friends or go to the theater or a musical, most of their time is spent training alongside Marina Klimova and Sergei Ponomarenko. Madame Dubova coaches only the two couples. Zhulin ad-

mits that sometimes it can feel like a competition every day having the number one and number two couples in the world at the same rink.

However, Zhulin says, "We have skated together since 1980, and they are like one team together with us. It is not a problem because we have grown together. They are our friends, not our competitors."

Zhulin also thinks that he and Maia are very different from Klimova and Ponomarenko and are always trying to be very unique in their programs. "Last year we tried to be very dramatic. This year we try to do another performance."

Says Dubova, "I try to do for them what the personality is for Maia and Sasha and that is the dialogue between the man and the woman."

But who is better? Zhulin and Usova? Klimova and Ponomarenko? Both seem to have fans. "Who cares?" says U.S. Professional Pairs Champion, Frank Sweiding, "They are both really wonderful." Herman Maricich, skating director in Sun Valley for the past thirty-three years, would not choose either. "I am just impressed by their styles, and the quality of their skating. I think maybe they have surpassed Torvill and Dean in their technique."

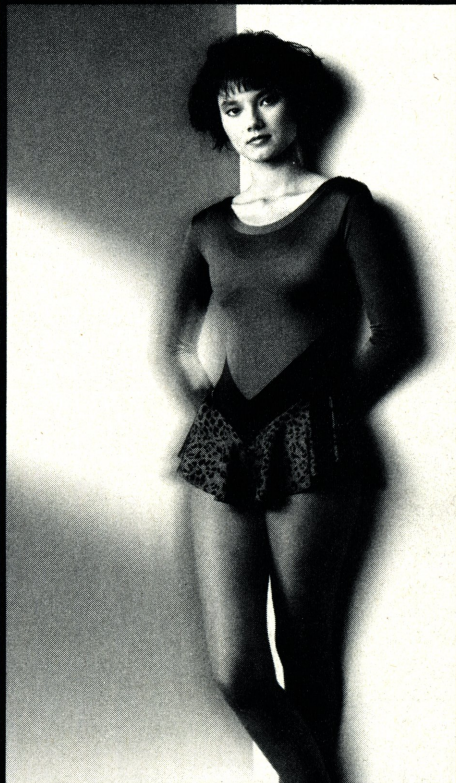
Zhulin reflects, "Everybody wants to win the World Championships and we think we know how to win . . . by very hard practice and train hard."

However, that does not mean that Usova and Zhulin were disappointed by their 1989 season. Zhulin says, "We were very happy to win a silver medal in our first World Championships. It was very special for us." Special yet only the beginning for them because they plan to compete until the 1992 Olympics and possibly longer.

Having a family is a future goal but both know it is many years in the future.

# SHEPHERD CLARK

## on the way to the top



Overcoming adversity is a trait of a true champion. It is a lesson which Shepherd Clark learned on his own and one which has begun to pay off handsomely.

After winning figures and the short program, at the 1988 National Championships in Denver, going into the long it looked certain he would be the new U.S. Junior Men's Champion. Instead, a performance marred with falls dropped him completely out of the medals. It was a shock to both Clark and the audience.

Today, he is able to see things in perspective. "My performance in Denver was very pivotal. It was probably both the high and low in my life," he reflects. "There were a lot of circumstances. I felt good going into the long and had been skating clean all week. I won all three figures which was like a dream. Looking back, what happened in the long eventually helped me tremendously. I will *never* have a competition go that way again.

"In a way, I suppose I feel fortunate to have had that experience. Now I know exactly how to go into my performance. It doesn't start twenty minutes before. It starts the night before. I mentally get myself centered. It's a little complex, but it all works together so I feel right when it's time to compete."

When Nationals in Baltimore rolled around the next year, he was more than ready and outskated all competition. He made a clean sweep of first place in figures, original, and long to become the 1989 U.S. Junior Men's Champion. He next placed third in his first U.S. Olympic Festival in Oklahoma in July against higher ranked skaters, and early this fall continued his winning ways by taking the silver at the St. Gervais Grand Prix in France and the gold at the Nebelhorn Trophy in Germany.

Born and raised in Atlanta, Georgia, Shep lived there until he was thirteen then moved to Colorado where he has trained almost five years, first with Don Laws in Denver and currently with Christa and Carlo Fassi in Colorado Springs. His older brother is a junior at

the University of Pennsylvania and is active in rowing. His parents live in Georgia though his father spends time with Shep in Colorado. Also aiding in his training is Mary Stayton, a long time friend who assists in choreography, costuming, and acts as strength training-nutrition-performance instructor.

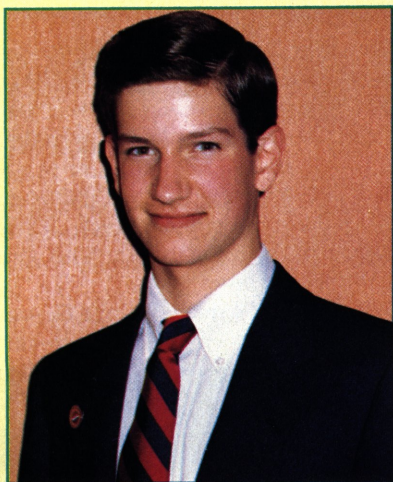
"I started skating when I was three," he states "and it wasn't long before I became serious about it, knowing it was something I really wanted to do. After seeing skaters on television I'd make feeble—and sometimes not too feeble—attempts to do what they did. I learned to do the butterfly when I was five, but I also was involved in gymnastics which helped my skating. I tried a lot of things when I was young: baseball, basketball, tennis, soccer, and horseback riding.

"But my real love was skating. And I found that my height (between 5' 11" and 6") was an advantage. I thank the Lord for my build. Some people are not as coordinated when they are tall. I feel I am as coordinated as I can be for my height."

His strengths proved themselves early as he was the South Atlantic Intermediate Champion, National Novice bronze medalist, Southwestern Novice and Junior Champion, and also Midwestern Junior silver and gold medalist.

Considering Shep almost gave up skating altogether because of his first figure test, it is surprising to hear one of his goals this year is to do his best figures ever at Nationals. "Probably the last time I will ever do them in competition," he adds.

"I started doing figures at age five and had trouble with them until I was eleven. It was really traumatic for me to take a test. I took the first figure test when I was seven . . . four times! It was awful.



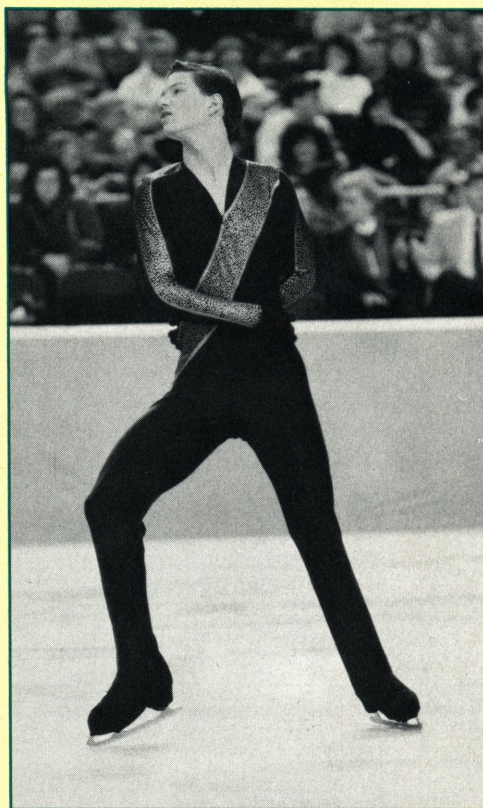
I did four circles on my serpentine. I kept missing centers. My figures used to be a nightmare. It was almost funny. It wasn't until I studied with Don Laws that he straightened them out."

A normal training day starts with a 10:45 A.M. freestyle, lunch, then two back-to-back patches from 12:40 to 2:20 P.M., followed by a lengthy stretching workout. After working on his correspondence courses, there is an early evening freestyle, followed three nights a week with weight lifting for upper body strength at home. In between, there are also three afternoons of weight training at the Olympic Training Center.

"I am not a morning person," Shep laughs. "I skated early mornings for seven years and finally said to myself, 'I'm wasting my time in the mornings. I'm not as productive! I don't really come alive until evening.'"

He approaches skating, as he does everything else, with great intensity and drive. So much so, that he has dropped to a part-time load in high school to concentrate his efforts on skating. "I can't see going back to school the way my skating is going. I'm taking one course at a time and trying to complete them as fast as I can. I'll probably graduate from high school within the year."

His main hobby for sometime has been gemology and jewelry making. "It's something I have a natural interest in and one that I can see my self doing the rest of my life," he states. "The study of gems and making jewelry is what I will be into well after skating." Anytime he wears jewelry, it is usually one of his own creations, combining different stones and beads into original designs.

Looking ahead, though he admits to having little free time, he would like to start trial judging to see "what it's like on the other side of the clip board." And of course in the future is the major goal, that of a National championship and a view towards the Worlds and Olympics. With the change in Olympic years between 1992 and 1994, he may have a double shot at the rings. With the power and determination that has brought him this far, there is no doubt Shep Clark may be on the way to the top.

the easier good-looking tricks while they are still in the early learning stages. Backward sculling is fine, but a skater who learns how to maintain a good forward spiral with her leg nice and high in the air will feel like Dorothy Hamill in no time flat. How can she resist signing up for the next group of lessons after that experience?"

To reinforce verbal rewards, we strongly suggest issuing test badges, certificates of achievement, and competition ribbons when earned. Chances are most adults won't sew their test badges on a sweater, but many will

sew them on a skate bag. Ms. Marrapodi agrees by saying, "It makes me feel good to have something concrete as a prize for passing even a Basic Test." Adults like to be rewarded. Don't hold back on something that could help your program prosper!

The USFSA would like to thank Ms. Marrapodi for the time she took to write such an insightful letter. The points she made were very good and I'm sure they will be well received by the skating directors reading this article. In closing, we have included one final note of inspiration from Mrs. Marrapodi's letter, "If you are successful in recruiting adults, you'll be responsible for turning many an 'ex-klutz' into a happy new skater. Take it from one of the 'ex-klutzes'—it's worth it!"

### Publicity Plus

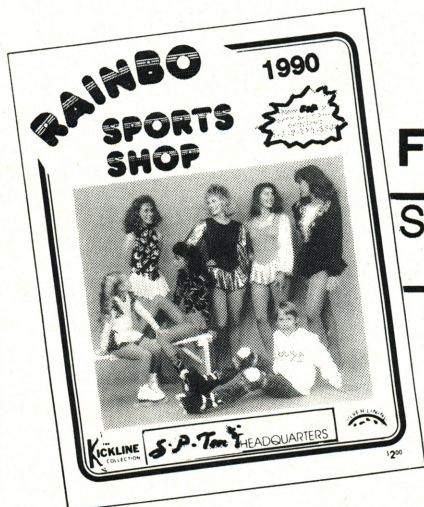
