Alexander Fadeev from the 1990 Worlds fuels the rumor he will turn professional and may be seen on tour this spring.

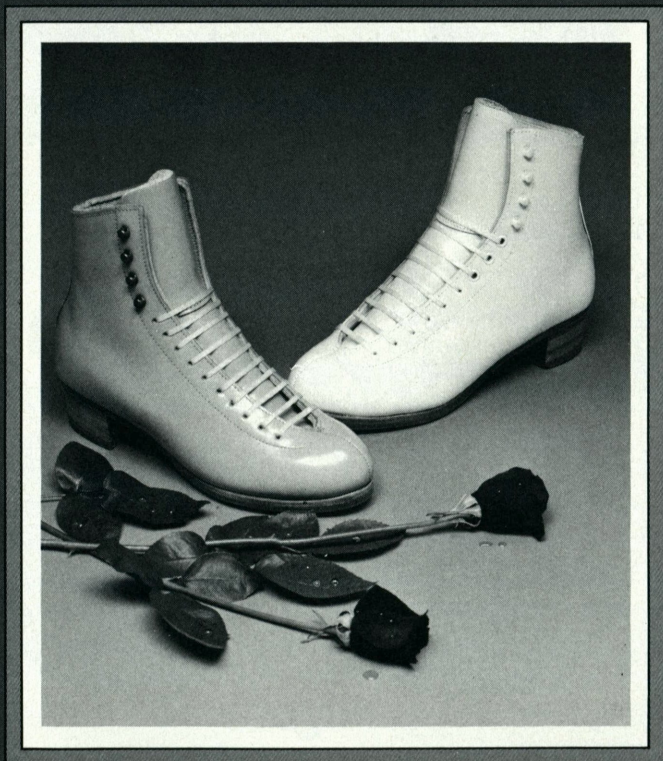

Theresa Weld Blanchard was inducted posthumously into the International Women's Sports Hall of Fame last fall. Mrs. Blanchard was the first U.S. Ladies' Champion in 1914 and again from 1920 to 1924; the first North American Champion, 1923; and won the first Olympic medal, a bronze, in figure skating for the U.S. in 1920. She was also a member of the 1924 and 1928 Olympic Teams and

an official at the 1932 and 1936 Games. She also U.S. Pair Champion 9 times; North American Pair Champion, 1925; and the first U.S. Waltz Champion, 1914, and again in 1920 and 1921, and won the Original Dance title in 1931. She was a member of the U.S. Four Champions in 1934, a truly remarkable career. Her pair and dance partner was Nathaniel T. Niles. Aptly called “The First Lady of Figure Skating,” she also founded *Skating Magazine* in 1923 and served as a World Judge and in numerous capacities with the USFSA.

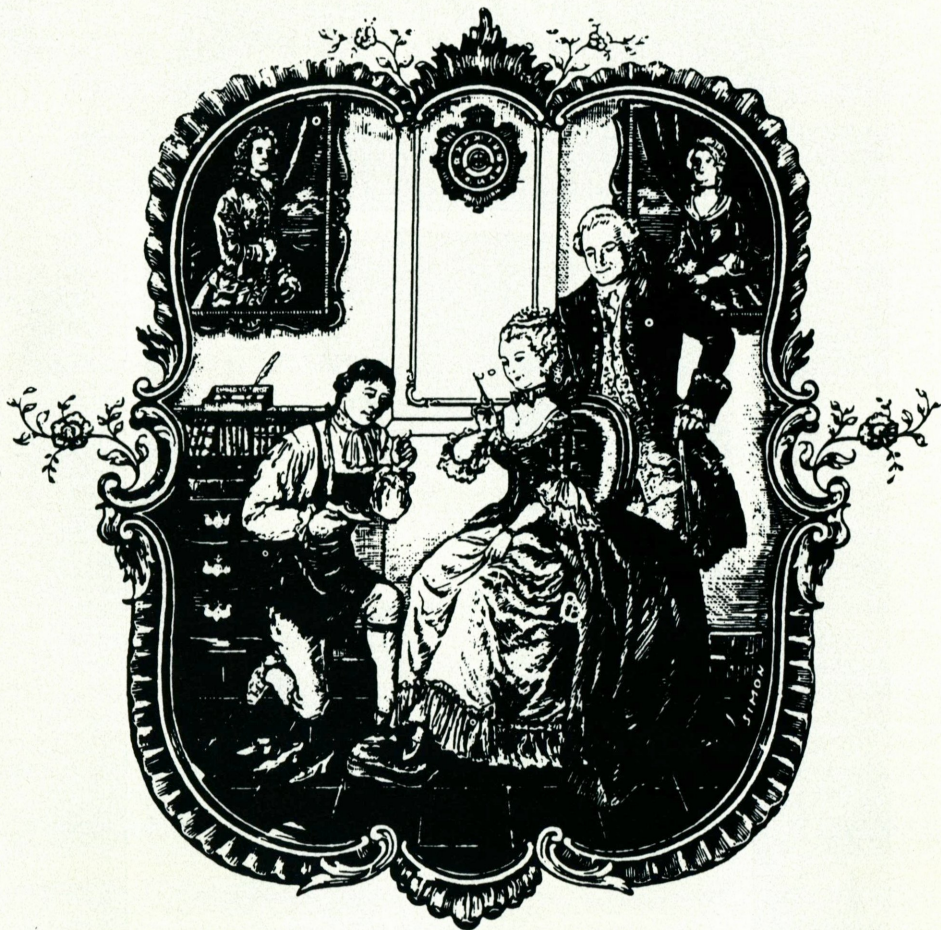

## 1990 GOODWILL GAMES TO SPOTLIGHT WORLD'S BEST

The figure skating competition at the 1990 Goodwill Games will offer a first glance of the world's best skaters as they head into the season.

Unlike the exhibition that was staged as part of the inaugural 1986 Goodwill Games in Moscow, the 1990 Games figure skating event will feature competitions in all disciplines, August 2-5 at the Tacoma Dome.

The 1990 Goodwill Games will be the first major international multi-sport event without compulsory figures or dances. Only the more spectacular original and freestyle programs will be performed. The result will be exciting, athletic routines.


"The 1986 Goodwill Games was a great success for us," said Chuck Foster, a member of the U.S. Figure Skating Association and secretary of the United States Olympic Committee. "The 1990 Games will be even better. In 1986, it was an exhibition. In 1990, we decided to make it a competition because of the sport's popularity and summer scheduling. We look forward to Seattle where the best figure skaters in the world will compete. Events such as this offer our athletes an unprecedented opportunity to be involved in a world-class, multi-sport competition."

Figure skating is one of only two traditional winter sports in the 1990 Goodwill Games, along with ice hockey, and is expected to spotlight stars from the USA, Soviet Union, Canada, Japan, France, Czechoslovakia, Poland, German Democratic Republic, Federal Republic of Germany, and Hungary.

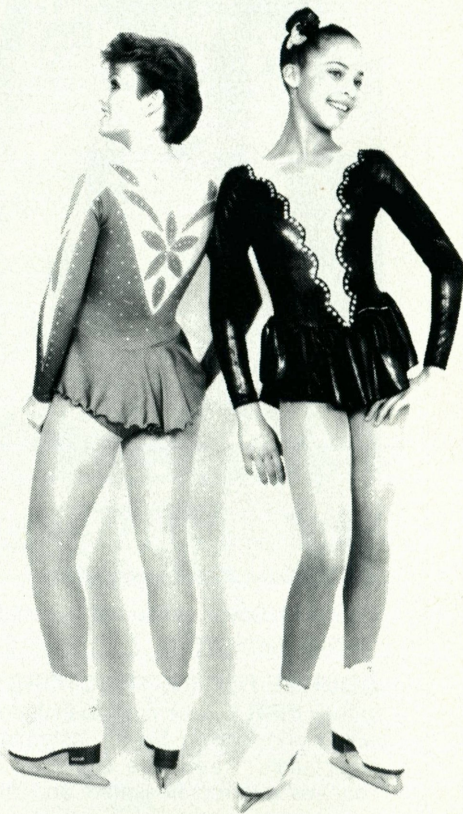
As a result, skaters such as Kurt Browning of Canada, Midori Ito of Japan, and Kristi Yamaguchi and Christopher Bowman of the U.S., are expected to compete in Tacoma.

Eight skaters or pairs will perform two programs in each of the events. All skaters will perform their original programs, which count for 30 percent of their total score, on the first night of competition (August 2). The next two nights will feature freestyle programs in two of the disciplines (men's and pairs on August 3; ladies' singles and dance on August 4). The final night will be an exhibition of champions.

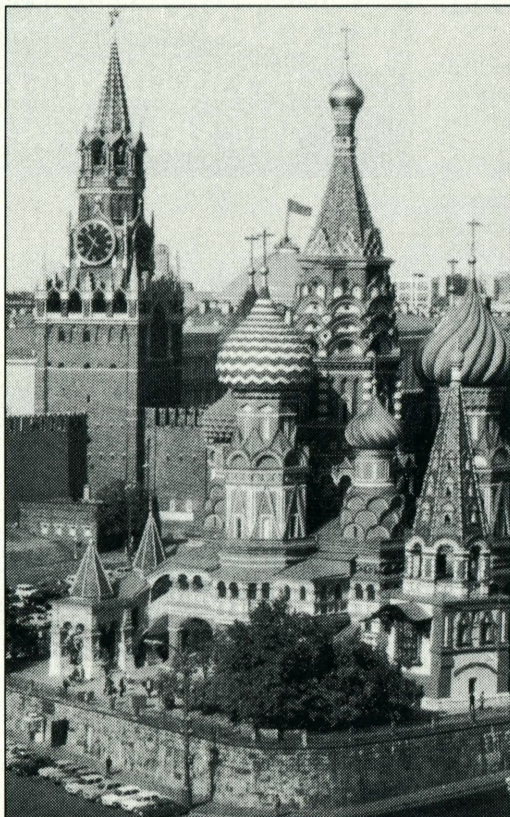

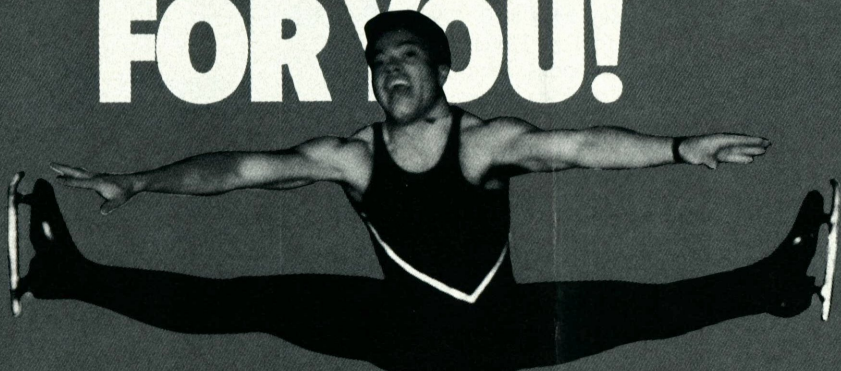

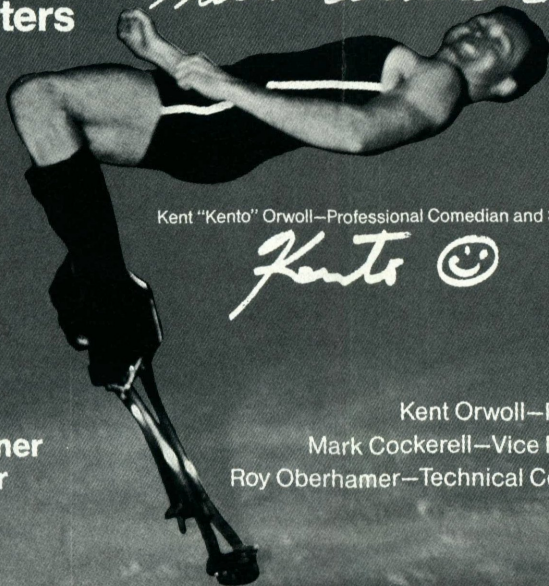

# Ricky

Part II*

Traditionalists hold on to old ways of teaching just because they have always done it that way. This is not wrong. Traditional ways are good to learn, but change is what makes progress. You do not stand still even in ballet, which is very set and classical. Ballet classes today are not like they were in the 19th Century. Techniques are more developed.

We change because of increased knowledge in physics and biomechanics and better training methods. Also, because of better health, and there are more people participating. Changes such as the number of revolutions in jumps are increased and new records broken. The first time a triple was performed, it was phenomenal. Now most skaters do them. One must be aware of change.

Since 1972, I have tried to convince skaters to do a "Pre-Warm-up," a series of exercises on the floor before getting on the ice (see *Choreography & Style for Skaters*, p. 119).\* You then get more out of your skating warm-up on the ice. Sometimes skaters are halfway through the session before they begin to feel that something is happening to their thighs.

Total movement of the body before a skater begins to jump or stretch is well advised. Physicians agree with that. The body is not ready to take on the stretching skaters do without warming up first. The idea of warming the body is that you quicken the pulse and the heart so that the blood starts moving through the bloodstream which warms the body quicker.

Some floor warm-up exercises:

1. *Tension and Relaxation*

Tension and relaxation exercises work as a pump to make the arteries and capillaries

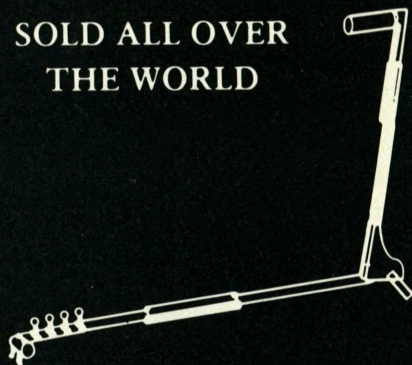

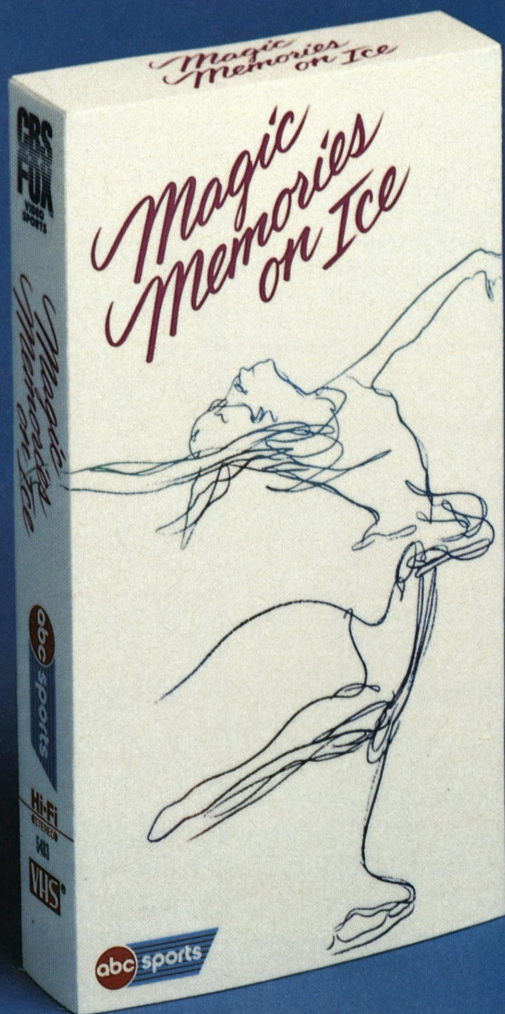

# DOUG WILSON

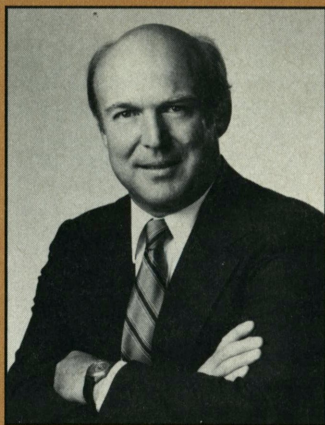
## The Maestro of Skating

*Salt Lake City, Saturday afternoon, February 10:* Tucked away at the back of the Salt Palace amidst miles of wires and cables, the ABC communications trailers are ready for the remote broadcast. The intensity in the control room builds as the countdown begins for the live telecast of the 1990 Nationals.

At the center of the main control console, Doug Wilson begins "conducting" the proceedings. His hands are in constant motion, weaving and flowing with the images on the screens before him and the music coming through the headset, as he calls instructions to seven cameras. Like the maestro that he is, he is not just directing an athletic event but creating, orchestrating a giant pictorial concerto.

Weeks of preparation on his part have led up to this moment: site visits planning camera locations, staff meetings, research, watching practice sessions, charting each program's choreography and placement on the ice. Like a theatrical director staging the action of a drama, Wilson pre-blocks and plans camera shots and angles to get the exact picture that will capture the smallest detail of a performance and bring it to millions of viewers. As little as possible is left to chance or error.

"The right camera must be on the skater at the right moment, not only to present the move but also to bring the viewer into the action, right onto the ice, if you will. At the same time, it must be unobtrusive. Once someone is aware of the camera work, or feels he is watching it through a camera, I have failed. I like to consider cameras as extensions of choreography; they should enhance the choreography. The performer's message is what is important. The director's job is to communicate the performance."



Since his first Nationals in 1964 in Cleveland, where he was assistant director, to his first directorial duties in the 1967 championships in Omaha, Wilson has become the foremost director of figure skating in the country, respected by his peers, athletes, and viewers alike. The name of Doug Wilson on a project assures a total understanding of the sport and a product of the highest quality, as his numerous Emmies prove. So sure is he of the sport and his preparation, that no one else would dare cut camera shots in a split-second between a jump-combination to catch each element. But Wilson dares, and did so last year between Christopher Bowman's triple Lutz-double toe.

As knowledgeable as he is about the sport and its people, he admits that outside of hockey pond skating "crack the whip stuff, I never really had a pair of figure skates with toe picks on until about 1976. I was working with Dorothy Hamill on her first special and went to a public session, trying to be incognito. I left a half hour later, soaked, with a black and blue nose! I fell forward on the toe picks every time. You wonder why I respect skaters? No, it's more than respect, there's a certain vicarious aspect to me. When directing, I almost feel I have skated the program myself." His laughter is warm and self-effacing, and it is this type of warmth and sincerity that has endeared him to skaters and other athletes through the years.



As a student at Colgate, Wilson's ambition was to be a performer, a singer-actor, despite the fact he majored in English literature. He started as a page at NBC and worked *The Perry Como Show* directed by Dwight Hemian whom he studied from a distance. One of Hemian's mottos that Wilson adopted was "simple is best."

He later moved on to ABC in 1958 and joined ABC Sports in 1963 and has been with them ever since. Besides over twenty-five Nationals, he has also worked ten Olympics, winter and summer, directing figure skating at the 1984 Games in Sarajevo and the 1988 Games in Calgary, as well as the Closing Ceremonies.

"In Calgary, we did 264 performances. We did our homework on every one of

them. I feel honor bound to treat every skater alike, whether they are gold medal potential or going to finish 35th."

Wilson has been involved in almost 85 to 90 percent of all figure skating presentations ABC Sports has done since 1963.

"The majority of the past 25 years or more that ABC has been doing the U.S. Championships, they have been the highest rated segment of *Wide World of Sports* in any given year. I would venture that the growth of *WWS* and of figure skating have paralleled each other over the years. In fact, the ratings for the Ladies' final in Calgary—with Debi Thomas and Katarina Witt—approached that of a Super Bowl!

"We feel the best way to televise skating is *live*. The U.S. Championships is a prestigious event that deserves live coverage. We intend to do it this way for many years to come. The two-day format makes it a better broadcast and a better presentation of skating."

In the late 70's Wilson wanted better knowledge of the programs before filming, and started mapping out routines on paper. "Skaters would bring their tapes and we would sit down together. I would start the stopwatch, and they'd map out the program on paper, indicating the placement of each element on the ice. It was the beginning of knowing exact locations, time into the routine, and planning which

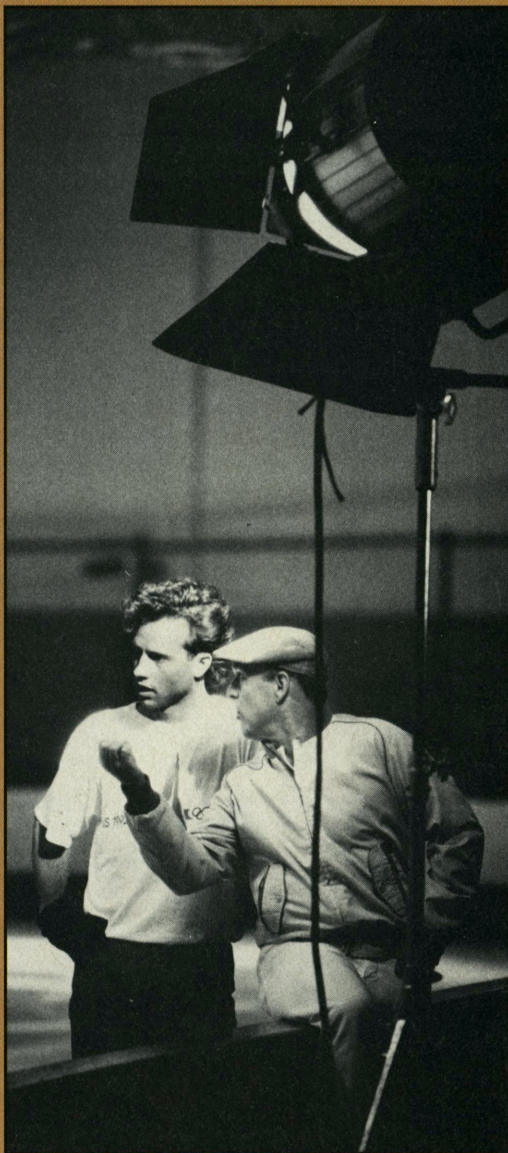
camera to use when. Long programs usually took two or three pages.

"I'd go back to my hotel and have about 47 pages of spaghetti lines which were hard to follow because the lines crossed so often. The system I use now of watching all practices and timing them is better. As the practice starts I begin to start planning cameras. My assistant, Meg Streeter who has made this into a science, notes the details of the routine as I plan camera coverage. But in a sense I do miss sitting down with each of the skaters. It was a great experience."

Wilson had saved all of these program diagrams and a few years ago had them bound and donated them to the World Figure Skating Museum. They are now rare reference documents, especially since many contain the details of routines that were never aired.

Another one of Wilson's innovations was developing a means to have a camera on the ice following the skaters. "I felt the ultimate expression of figure skating for the audience at home would be to have the feeling that they were on the ice with the skater," he explains. The device was used in many special segments and used extensively in specials like Boitano's *Canvas of Ice* on the glacier in Alaska.

After a twelve-year search, including "a thing that looked like a lawn mower and trying a steady-camera," the simple answer was a wheelchair. The chair is specially equipped with controls, braces, and power packs and is pushed by a knowledgeable skater. "You work it out, you really choreograph the wheelchair with the skater," he says and once gave awards to various people who pushed wheelchairs for him, such as Charlie Tickner, David Santee, Michael Seibert, but the ultimate "pusher" was choreographer Sandra Bezic Ricci in the Boitano special. "She knew exactly where Brian was going to be and pushed the chair in Alaska, Toronto, Paris, and East Germany . . . above and beyond the call of duty."

Special moments he remembers? “Calgary, of course, I get goose bumps when I think of it. Brian (Boitano) was at his best that night, and so was I and the crew. The difference was he was all alone out there and I had eleven cameramen and a technical director and support people. I had a team—and he was out there on his own. It was the biggest project, a pinnacle for me.

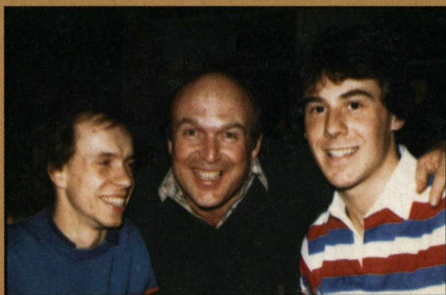
“Then there was Brian’s special *Canvas of Ice* . . . The first visit of American skaters to China, finding out five minutes before air time that we were broadcasting live to two-hundred million, and none of the cameramen spoke English . . . There are so many.”

One special moment Wilson recalls was the exhibition at 1972 the World Cham-

pionships. “Trixie Schuba had won the gold medal, but as everyone knows was not a strong free skater. (Figures then counted 60%.) She was skating an exhibition but not well and had fallen. My associate director said, ‘You know, she ought to do a school figure.’ I went goose bumps.

“I pushed the idea to Dick (Button) and said, ‘When she comes off the ice, tell her to go back out and do a school figure.’ Button wouldn’t believe me. ‘I know it will be all right,’ I assured him.

“He talked to her and she skated to center ice to silence. The music people were confused. Then she started a figure. The crowd was on its feet screaming appreciation. A standing ovation for the genius of school figures. This great champion, in her own right, had never had such an accolade. That was a special moment for me.

“But how do you capsulize over twenty-five years? You savor each wonderful moment. I’ve been the luckiest guy in the world to to be the one who’s been able to communicate or translate what the skaters are doing to viewers. To work with them, to know and have known them, to be there at their triumphs. How many people have had this opportunity? I really feel grateful to have been there and contributed in whatever way I did.”

And his contributions have been immeasurable in translating the beauty, technique, and excitement of the sport on-to the screens of millions of viewers . . . as only a maestro could.

## 1990 WEST GERMAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

by *Dennis L. Bird*

New champions emerged in three of the four events at the West German Championships at Oberstdorf, January 3 thru 6. Only the 1989 pair champions successfully defended their titles.

The singles produced some close finishes. Richard Zander, the Men's champion in the 1987 and 1989 seasons, sought strenuously to re-establish himself after last year's

disasters, when he had to retire from the European Championships after winning the figures and did not skate in Worlds. In Oberstdorf he had a great fight with his challenger Daniel Weiss. All depended on the final free skating, in which the German-American Zander produced the first cleanly landed triple Axel in a West German Championship, as well as triple Lutz, toe-loop, Salchow, and flip. But he suffered from the recent ISU rule change which in the event of a tie gives preference to the Artistic Impression mark. He tied Weiss on Technical Merit, but by a 5-to-4 judges' majority Weiss received better artistic marks, and won the title.

Since the West German girls did so well last year, they are entitled to send three to the 1990 Europeans. With the 1989 European Champion Claudia Leistner now a professional, main hopes rest on the bronze medalist Patricia Neske from Harbor City, USA. At Oberstdorf she won the figures and the original program, but in the free skating she had a great tussle with the 1988 Olympic skater Marina Kielmann. Patricia's fall on a triple Salchow put her chances in jeopardy. Marina is a fine jumper and also a notable roller skater who was third in the last World Roller Championships. However, Neske prevailed and is the new champion. In the Europeans at Leningrad, she will be accompanied by Kielmann and by Carola Wolff.

Last year's pair champions, Anuschka Gläser and Stefan Pfrengle, easily retained their title, but ice dance champions Andrea Weppelmann and Hendryk Schamberger were relegated to third place. The new champions are Saskia Stähler and Sven Authorsen.

The Deutscher Eissport-Verband, the West German governing body for ice skating, is entering discussions with its East German counterpart, the Deutscher Eislauf-Verband, with a view of holding all-German championships in the future.

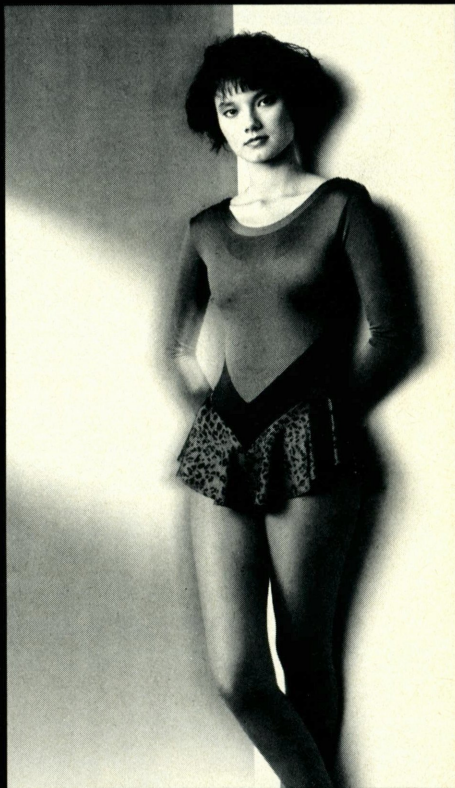

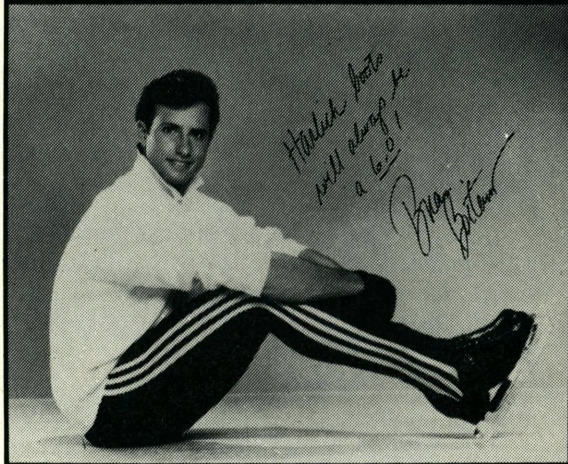

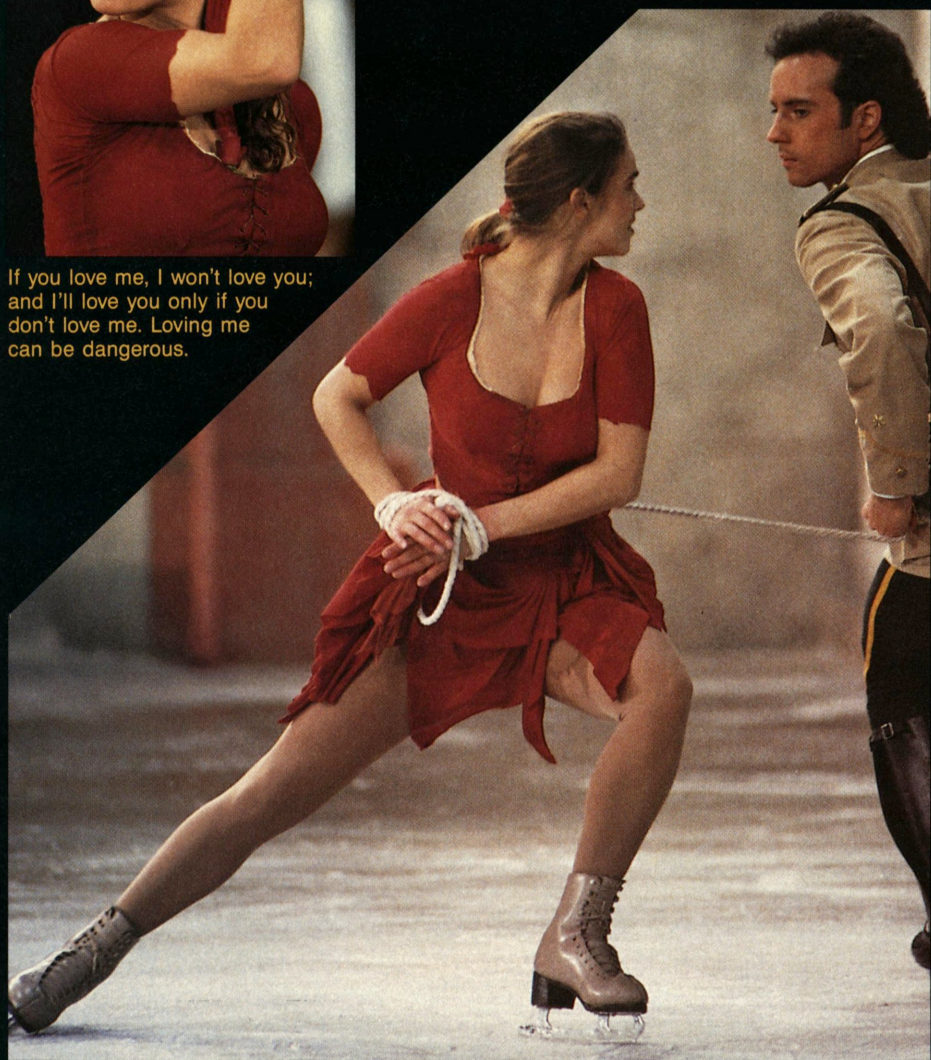

# THE HALL OF FAME

*This feature continues the accounts of the lives and distinguished careers of the most recent members elected to the World Figure Skating Hall of Fame.*

**I**n the annals of figure skating, the legendary Ulrich Salchow of Sweden, Sonja Henie of Norway, and Irina Rodnina of the Soviet Union have sometimes been compared. Such a comparison may seem curious on the surface, since Salchow and Henie were single skaters, while Rodnina was a pair skater with two different partners, Alexei Ulanov and Alexander Zaitsev.

The placing of Salchow, Henie, and Rodnina on the same pedestal in the pantheon of skating is, however, entirely valid, for they are the only skaters to win ten World Championships. In that regard, Henie stands first, with ten consecutive titles between 1927 and 1936. She also won three consecutive Olympic titles 1928, 1932 and 1936, as did Rodnina 1972, 1976 and 1980. Salchow won his one Olympic title in the first figure skating event in the modern games in 1908. There is, however, one statistic in which Rodnina stands alone: winning ten European titles in a row 1969-1978, to go with her ten consecutive World titles, and eleven overall. Salchow won nine European titles, but not consecutively and Sonja "only" six, the ladies event having been inaugurated only in 1930.

The emergence on the scene of Rodnina and her first partner Ulanov in 1968 was truly unexpected and meteoric, especially in an era when durability and continued participation over a period of years in ISU Championships (Worlds and Europeans) was usually the case and especially in pairs. Not even listed among the five best pairs in the Soviet Union prior to the 1967-1968 season, Irina and Alexei entered the European Championships in Vasteras, Sweden as their first international competition. At that time, there were few, if any, international competitions which included pair skating, such as there are today, so that the new pair was essentially unknown

outside the Soviet Union and would have been considered the fourth-ranked pair behind Liudmila Belousova and Oleg Protopopov, the reigning World and Olympic Champions, Tatiana Zhuk (the sister of their coach Stanislav Zhuk) and Alexandr Gorelik and Tamara Moskvina (the wife of the coach of the Protopopovs, Igor Moskvina) and Alexei Mishin.

In the European Championships in 1968, Rodnina and Ulanov placed fifth overall. The Protopopovs won their fourth and what turned out to be their last European title, with Moskvina-Mishin second, followed by Heidemarie Steiner and Heinz-Ulrich Walther of East Germany and Margot Glockshuber and Wolfgang Danne of West Germany. One judge only, from West Germany, foresaw the future, placing Irina and Alexei second, while their own judge tied them for fourth with Glockshuber and Danne. They were, however, third in the short program behind the Protopopovs and Steiner-Walther.

Rodnina and Ulanov were left home for the balance of the 1968 season, not participating in either the Olympic Winter Games in Grenoble or the World Championships in Geneva, in both of which events the Protopopovs retained their titles.

In the 1969 season, the USSR Championships in Leningrad in January first reflected the forthcoming "changing of the guard" that was about to take place in Soviet pair skating, when Moskvina and Mishin prevailed, defeating the six-time champions Belousova and Protopopov in the home town of both pairs. Rodnina and Ulanov placed third. The stage was thereby set for the first major confrontation on the international scene of the then three top Soviet pairs in the 1969 European Championships. Tatiana Zhuk and Alexandr Gorelik, who had been the second ranked European pair had retired, since Tatiana was to have a baby.

In the championships, held at Garmisch-Partenkirchen, West Germany, in the short program, which had been part of the European Championships since 1964, the Protopopovs continued their dominance, placing first with seven of the nine judges, but Rodnina-Ulanov narrowly placed second ahead of Moskvina-Mishin by a five-to-four margin. However, in the free skating, which represented 75% of the total score, it was essentially "no contest," with Rodnina-Ulanov earning a unanimous decision with a flawless performance over the Protopopovs, who were somewhat tentative and not quite at their best, Liudmila having been ill with the flu. Moskvina-Mishin placed third. The athletic difficulty and speed of the program of winners, especially in the single content, with multiple double jumps, represented the inauguration of a new era in pair

skating, although the incomparable artistic style of the Protopopovs still remained unexcelled but lacked content by comparison.

The 1969 World Championships at Colorado Springs presented the same "cast," plus Cindy and Ron Kauffmann of the USA, the bronze medalists of the prior year. The Protopopovs made a valiant effort to maintain their supremacy, despite their defeats in the USSR and European Championships, placing second in the short program, but it was not to be. Finishing third in the free skating with a relatively poor performance for them, they placed third overall, behind the new champions and Moskvina-Mishin, with the Kauffmanns fourth.

At the time of this, their first World Championship, Rodnina and Ulanov were 19 and 21 years of age, respectively, while in fairness to the Protopopovs, they were 34 and 37 and had been competing in ISU Championships since 1958! Thus must youth be served! While the win of Rodnina and Ulanov merely continued the Soviet dominance of pair skating begun with the Olympic win of the Protopopovs in 1964, it also could be said to mark the beginning of a new era for the discipline, in which the individual athletic skill of the partners would have to be the equal of that required of the top singles skaters, with double Axel jumps (first pioneered in Paris by Rodnina) being *de rigueur* and even triples being conventional today.

The 1970 season was a "routine" year for Rodnina and Ulanov, as they successfully defended their European title at Leningrad and their World title at Ljubljana, Yugoslavia. The year marked the appearance on the scene as silver medalists of Liudmila Smirnova and Andrei Suraikin, a couple which would have more than an ordinary impact upon the career of Irina Rodnina in the years to come.

The year 1971 was marked by the closest competition experienced by Rodnina in her entire career. Having successfully defended her European title with Ulanov at Zurich, with a unanimous decision in both the short program and free skating over Smirnova-Zuraikin, the competition for the World title at Lyons, France was unexpectedly close. Smirnova-Suraikin won the short program unambiguously with a flawless and artistic per-

formance from the defending champions, but were unable to sustain their momentum in the free skating, earning only two first places. Never again for the balance of her career would Rodnina lose even one part of a competition!

The Olympic season of 1972 was a banner year for Rodnina and Ulanov, despite both emotional and physical personal problems. It also marked the end of their partnership. Returning to Sweden, this time to Gothenburg, Irina and Alexei successfully won their fourth European title with Smirnova-Suraikin again second, followed by an emerging young pair from East Germany, Manuela Gross and Uwe Kagelmann. Then it was on to Sapporo, Japan for the first Olympic Winter Games in Asia. The result was the same as in Sweden, with the same three pairs on the podium. In the free skating, as well as in the short program, the decision was by a five-to-four margin only, giving Rodnina and Ulanov their first Olympic gold medals.

The Worlds of 1972 in Calgary were the last competition for Rodnina and Ulanov, for after the Olympics, Ulanov and Smirnova unexpectedly were married in Moscow. Despite an injury to Rodnina in a fall just before the competition, she and Ulanov performed brilliantly in the short program and adequately in the free skating to win their fourth and last World title together, with Smirnova and Suraikin second, followed by JoJo Starbuck and Ken Shelley of the USA third. Irina and Alexei will be remembered as a pair with a high degree of technical skill, featured by their rapid sequences of solo jumps performed in perfect unison.

With the recognized depth in the discipline enjoyed by the Soviet pair skating schools, it was not that difficult for a new partner to be quickly found for Irina by her long-time coach Stanislav Zhuk, himself one of the pioneers in Soviet pair skating and a three-time European silver medalist with his wife Nina in 1958, 1959, and 1960. Again, a virtual unknown without prior experience in international competition was found, in Alexandr Zaitsev who quickly took his place as Irina's new partner and eventually her first husband.

The 1973 European Championship in Cologne, West Germany, was the first major

international event for Zaitsev, although he and Rodnina had already won their first competition together, the USSR Championship at Rostov, an event in which Ulanov, with his new partner and wife Smirnova, placed third. In Cologne, Rodnina and Zaitsev easily won with unanimous decisions in both parts and no less than thirteen perfect marks of 6.0 in total, with twelve of them in the free skating. It was as if Irina had never missed a beat. Second were Liudmila Smirnova and Alexei Ulanov, followed by Almut Lehmann and Herbert Weisinger of West Germany, third for a rare Western medal.

The World Championships of 1973 in Bratislava, Czechoslovakia, were the scene of an incredible incident involving Rodnina and Zaitsev in the free skating. After two minutes of their program, their music was cut off, through some never explained malfunction in the music room. Rather than stop, despite urgent signals from the Referee to do so, the pair continued to skate without music to the end. Their coach Stanislav Zhuk demanded that they be marked on the actual performance, rather than to reskate, threatening to withdraw the pair otherwise. This request was finally granted by the Referee and despite the lack of music for more than one half of the program, the pair was awarded no less than seven marks of 5.9 and two of 5.8 in artistic impression, for a unanimous decision, thereby winning their first World title together and Rodnina's fifth.

In due course, the rules were changed to require a skater to stop under such circumstances when directed to do so by the Referee, a rule which in a recent European Championship cost the reigning World Champions their chance to win the former title.

In 1973, Smirnova and Ulanov were once again second, followed by Gross-Kagelmann of East Germany. Thus was launched the second half of the Rodnina "era," in which she and Zaitsev continued complete domination of pair skating for another five years, up to the start of the 1978-79 season, winning six European and six World titles, as well as the Olympic gold medals at Innsbruck in 1976.

A review of the protocols of the Olympic Games, World and European Championships for the period 1973-1978, shows that not one

of the championships involved was significantly close. The noticeable effect of the durability and dominance of Rodnina-Zaitsev during the period was the decline of a strong supporting cast from their own country and the emergence of outstanding pairs from other countries and especially from East Germany.

In nine championships between 1969 and 1972, Soviet pairs won 21 out of a total of 27 possible medals, with East Germany winning four and the USA two. By contrast, in the thirteen championships between 1973 and 1978, the Soviet pairs won a total of 23 medals out of a possible 39, with the remaining 16 being shared as follows: East Germany 13, USA 2, and West Germany 1. Looking at it another way, out of a total of 234 possible judges' placements, Rodnina-Zaitsev were placed first 227 times, with two seconds and in 1977 in the Worlds in Tokyo, five places tied for first (1½ under the then rules).

The string of wins by Irina and Alexandr over the period, in addition to the 1976 Olympics can be summarized as follows: Worlds—1974 Munich, 1975 Colorado Springs, 1976 Gothenburg, 1977 Helsinki, and 1978 Strasbourg. Only in the 1977 Worlds in Tokyo were Rodnina and Zaitsev seriously challenged in the short program by their compatriots Irina Vorobieva and Alexandr Vlasov.

The unbroken string of Soviet successes, at least in the World Championships, finally came to an end in the 1978-1979 season, not through any unforeseen event, such as an injury, but rather Irina announced her temporary retirement to await the birth of her first child due in February 1979.

In Europe, the Soviet winning streak continued, when Marina Cherkasova and Sergei Shakhrai won the vacant title over Irina Vorobieva, a silver medalist the prior year, but this time with a new partner, Igor Lisovski. The new champions were also coached by Stanislav Zhuk, the long-time coach of Rodnina. At the Worlds in Vienna, the title went to an American pair, Tai Babilonia and Randy Gardner, for the first U.S. win in 29 years, but Irina Rodnina informed the skating world that she and Zaitsev would return in 1979-1980 to recapture their championships and to defend their Olympic title.

Rodnina and Zaitsev returned to the competitive scene at the Moscow Skate competi-

tion in November 1979, skating the short program only, placing first and then withdrawing from the free skating, a common practice over the years of the leading Soviet skaters in that competition. Their closest Soviet rivals, Cherkasova and Shakhrai did the same, placing second in the short program. The competition overall was won by Vorobieva-Lisovski.

For their final season, Rodnina-Zaitsev were now coached by Tatiana Tarasova, perhaps better known as a dance coach, while their closest competitors were trained by their old coach Stanislav Zhuk. The 1980 European Championships returned again to Gothenburg, Sweden and once again Rodnina and Zaitsev completely dominated the field, with unanimous first places in both parts, winning their seventh title together and eleventh for Irina. Second were Cherkasova-Shakhrai and third were the rising new pair of Marina Pestova and Stanislav Leonovich, also coached by Zhuk.

In a sense, the 1980 Olympic Winter Games in Lake Placid, New York, which turned out to be the last competition of Rodnina and Zaitsev, were somewhat of an anti-climax. With the Games in the United States, ever since the Worlds of 1979 there had been a buildup in the media looking towards the eventual confrontation between the 1979 World Champions, Babilonia and Gardner, and the defending Olympic champions. Unfortunately, it was not to be. The U.S. pair had to withdraw from the Games due to an injury to Gardner. As a result, Rodnina and Zaitsev

easily won their second and Irina's third Olympic gold medals, with a unanimous decision throughout. Their compatriots Cherkasova and Shakhrai were second, followed by Manuel Mager and Uwe Bewersdorff of East Germany, third.

The following World Championships in 1980 were held in Dortmund, West Germany. Rodnina and Zaitsev were present and obviously fully expected to compete, but at the last minute were replaced, the reason given being an injury sustained by Irina after the Olympics. The title went almost by "default" as it were to Cherkasova-Shakhrai, since Babilonia-Gardner also did not appear. Placing second were Mager-Bewersdorff, followed by Pestova-Leonovich (the fourth-placed pair in the Olympics).

So the competitive career of Irina Rodnina really ended in Lake Placid, with the incredible record of ten World, eleven European, and three Olympic titles.

The years following her retirement from competition have not been completely uneventful for Irina. Embarking upon a career as a coach, she has been active in Moscow in that capacity. Eventually separating from and divorcing Zaitsev, she has since remarried and has a second child with her new husband. In 1990, she enters a new and challenging phase of her career as a coach in residence at the Ice Castle International Training Center in Lake Arrowhead, California. It is an example of the improved relations between the Soviet Union and the United States that Irina's stay in the U.S. has the full approval of the Soviet authorities. The presence as a coach in the United States of such a legendary champion can only lead to an improvement of the sport and especially of pair skating and we wish Irina well in her new endeavor.

In 1981, in recognition of her outstanding contributions to the sport, Irina was honored by the first award of the Jacques Favart Trophy, in memory of the late President of the ISU who had died unexpectedly in the fall of 1980. I am sure that Jacques, who was the leader of the ISU during Irina's entire career and was present at most of her triumphs, would have been pleased that she was the first recipient of the award in his name.

Irina Rodnina was elected to the World Figure Skating Hall of Fame in 1989.

open and close. Some form of this type of exercise should be done, in spurts, or slowly. The whole point is to get flexibility. Remember that all body movement is tension and relaxation in varying degrees, so it's good to do that.

### 2. *Some form of stretch*

Pulling out of the central part of the body.

### 3. *Warming the pituitary*

Work and exercise the seat of the pituitary glands, which effects balance, e.g. head rolls and snaps. This will warm the pituitary, and focusing the eye in snapping the head give balance and coordination.

### 4. *Shoulders*

Shoulder exercises are for warming and also for the skater to feel when you tell him or her "put your shoulders down and wide." They then will know what you mean.

### 5. *Hips or pelvic region*

If you want to get flexibility in a skater, get it in the hips. Working on turn-out will warm the hips. Many skaters do not have enough turn-out. Use gentle movement like swings of the legs, loosely, with no tension and hips open; or knees in and out in a swing, almost playing rather than tightening.

### 6. *Achilles tendon*

Stretch the back of the leg. Do not ever give an achilles stretch until the body is warm. The body responds to temperature. In coldness the body is congealed or pulled together, and if you do an achilles stretch too soon, there is a possibility of injuring yourself.

### 7. *Warming the feet*

When you are working on the feet you are also working on muscles through the whole leg, and they are all being exercised in a gentle manner. They are like groups of strings and fibers held together. That is the way our bodies

are made up. What you want to do is get the greatest amount of coordination where these fibers all move within one another. You want to get the greatest possible play between them. When you work the feet you are working the whole body (all nerve endings are in the feet), especially when you point the feet. So work on pointing the feet.

Warming up easily is really a matter of individual metabolism, which really affects muscular action and the vitality of the whole body. Some people do not need as much warm-up as others. When you are teaching, unless you are sure of your skater, you always assume that he or she has had no activity before and that the skater has a normal or below normal metabolism.

"You train all year for something like the Goodwill Games or a national championship, and you want to do your best," said 1988 Olympic Gold medalist Brian Boitano. "With the Goodwill Games, you really do get the top athletes in each sporting event. You get the cream of the crop."

The 1990 Goodwill Games will feature 2,500 of the world's best athletes and teams from more than 50 countries, July 20 through August 5, for head-to-head competition in 21 sports. Invitations are being issued to the world's best athletes and teams by the participating U.S. sports federations. Following international protocol, U.S. sports federations are working with their counterparts worldwide to ensure participation by champion athletes and teams.

The Goodwill Games are unique among international competitions. Only the top eight individuals or teams in each sport are invited to compete. Under the Goodwill Games format, the Best American and Societ participants are invited along with the best athletes/teams from around the world in each sport.

The Games are planned and staged by the Seattle Organizing Committee. Turner Broadcasting System, Inc., which will televise the Games as a cable-exclusive, is the official host broadcaster for the event.

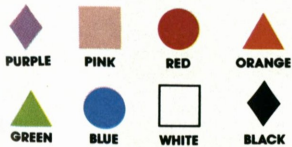
