



Letters from Readers

Dear Ricky,

Can "Contra-Choreography" be interesting?

"Learning to Choreograph" Yakima, Washington

Dear "Learning,"

My answer is a definite YES! It is not the easiest way to choreograph by any means, but when accomplished, it can be very exciting.

The choreographer must be able to understand the structure and form of movement, so that movement can be made it a more profound manner. Learning the theory of composition, along with the theory of movement, enables the choreographer, as well as the skater, to expand and find new avenues in which to move and express ideas. One way is to use Contra-Choreography:

- 1. Interpreting a slow piece with fast skating; or a fast piece with slow skating.
- 2. Using modern stylings to classical balletic music. For example, when you hear Mozart, you realize that you must do a piece in that period, as he reflects the period so much that you cannot go against it. On the other hand, when you hear Bach, you can do quite contemporary things to him as he is very universal.
- 3. Contra-Choreography used when working with emotional qualities, can be very challenging. Your piece may involve music that would signify anger, and the expected choreography would be almost violent movement to correspond. You can change suddenly to movements of "quiet anger" to the same music, and create some very dramatic effects.

It truly takes a good artist to do such Contra-Choreography as *piano* movements



Canadian Dance Champions Martin Smith and Jo-Anne Borlase also announced their retirement from amateur competition.





CAPTURING THE MOMENT!



by Michelle Seavey Harvath

Part I:

- Do you have a friend, neighbor or child who competes in skating events?
- Do you want to have more than just a program to remember the skating competitions and ice shows you attend?
- When the latest issue of Skating arrives. do you scan all the photos first before ever reading a word?
- When you look at the photos in Skating do you think "I wish I could do that?" Or even "I know I could do that?"

If you answered yes to one or more of the above questions (particularly the last one), you have probably at least thought about picking up a camera and trying to capture a skater's moves on film. If you have actually tried it, your first attempts were probably disappointing. It's not easy to get magazine quality photographs. But if you are willing to acquire some good, basic equipment, and invest some time practicing and experimenting with it, you too can take skating photographs you can be proud of.

I am going to assume that you know how to load a 35mm camera and set the film speed, shutter speed, and aperture. If you don't, I recommend you find either a good introductory book or an experienced friend and become familiar with the basics of photography. Once you are comfortable with the basics, we can move on to the common questions about photographing skaters.

What Kind of Camera Should I Get?

The brand of equipment you use depends on personal preference, and every experienced photographer has his or her favorites. Many press photographers use Nikon equipment, and many of those who don't use Nikon use Canon. My preference is for Contax equipment because it can be used with Carl Zeiss lenses, which are renowned for their excellent color accuracy, resolution and contrast. It also helps tremendously if your camera body is equipped with a winder or a motor drive to advance the film to the next frame. This not only frees you to concentrate on taking the shots, but also advances the film faster than you can by hand, thus increasing the number of shots you can take in a given period of time.

What About a Lens?

When selecting a lens, you have a choice of focal lengths (which determine how close the skater seems when you look through the lens) and f/stops (which determine how wide the maximum lens opening is, and consequently how much light the lens lets into the camera.) There is no one "best" length—the individual situation determines which lens length is most appropriate. The longer lenses are more expensive, heavier to hold, and more likely to yield a blurry image due to "lens shake," but if you are up in the stands you need a long lens to bring the skater close.

On the other hand, if you are standing next to the boards and the skater is close to you, you need a shorter lens to avoid cutting off the skater's head or feet. Most skating photographers use two or three lenses so they can capture skaters in all corners of the rink; the most popular lens lengths are 135mm, 180 or 200mm, and 300mm or longer (which should be used with a monopod to minimize lens shake). Since skating rinks are notorious for not having much available light, it is essential that you have a "fast" lens—one that can open up to f/2.8 or f/2.0 to let enough light enter the camera. A zoom lens gives you a variety of focal lengths, and may be an option for the person who prefers to use only one lens. Recent advances in zoom lens technology make it possible to have the speed necessary for use in an ice rink.

Prints or Slides? Color or Black and White?

This all depends on personal preference and what you plan to do with your results. Prints can be displayed in an album or enlarged and hung on the wall, plus if you damage a print you can have another one made as long as the negative is available. Slides are made directly from the exposed film, so a damaged slide is irreplaceable. It is possible to make prints from a slide, but it can be an expensive and time consuming process. On the other hand, projected slides are easier than prints to show to a large group, and some magazines prefer slides to prints when publishing an image.

How Do I Select the Right Film?

Whether you choose prints or slides, the limited amount of light inside a skating rink means that you need to use very light sensitive, or "fast," film. In an indoor rink this means you need film with an ASA rating of 400 or higher. In general, the faster the film, the grainier the image, although new film technology has produced films rated at 1000 or 1600 (as well as slower films that are designed to be "pushed" to a higher ASA rating) that

yield high quality images without an unacceptable amount of grain. There are many different films available, and it is important that you experiment with different speeds and brands of film to see which your eye prefers.

For color prints, Kodak offers Kodacolor Gold 400, Ektar 1000, or VR Gold 1600; Fujii has 400 as well as 1600 speed print films; and Agfa has 1000 speed film. For color slides, high speed options include Ektachrome 400, Fujichrome 400 and Agfachrome 1000. Kodachrome 200 pushed to 500 gives beautiful detail. It is more expensive, but well worth a try.

If you're interested in black and white prints, try Kodak's Tri-X and Tri-Max, or Fuji's NeoPan 400. Ilford's XP1 rated at ASA 400 is also a useful choice. It is unusual because it is developed in the same chemicals used to develop color film, but this means you can shoot a test roll to check your exposure and have it developed—although not printed—at the nearest one-hour lab. (If you do this, be prepared to explain to the counter person that it is developed using C41 processing just like color film, and it will not ruin their chemicals. Most counter people automatically say "Oh, we don't do black and white!" when they see the black and white Ilford canister, but if you show them the C41 imprint on it they will generally go ahead and process the roll.

So Far, So Good, But What Camera Settings Do I Use?

Your choice of exposure settings is limited by the small amount of light in most arenas, as well as by the need to use a shutter speed not longer than 1/250th second if you want to "freeze" the skater's motion. The whiteness of the ice will fool most in-camera meters, so you may want to buy or borrow a hand-held meter, or ask someone at the rink who is using one what readings he or she is getting. At large competitions like Nationals or Worlds where the lighting is comparatively bright, a

guideline exposure would be a shutter speed of 1/250th second at f/2.8 with ASA 400 film. If your lens opens up to f/2.0, you can shoot at 1/500th second and be sure of stopping the action, or you could use ASA 200 film. If your widest lens opening is f/4.0, you better use ASA 1600 film; you don't want to use a longer shutter speed or you will get blurred images unless you only shoot when the skater is standing still.

My Camera is Loaded, Set and Ready. Now What?

Even the best equipment can't guarantee you a great photograph, or even a good one! This is where technique, experience and skating knowledge come into play. One of the most difficult aspects of skating photography is focusing on the moving target and the only way to improve your ability is to practice. It helps to go to the practice sessions and work on your focusing (even if you never shoot) while the skaters run through their routines. This also gives you a preview of the skaters' routines so you can anticipate good shots during the actual event. An autofocus camera is an option you may want to explore, although you should not expect it to guarantee an in-focus photo 100 percent of the time. The camera can't read your mind, and may focus on the ice or the audience if the skater is far away or outside the autofocus target.

Any More Tips?

When I began photographing skaters in earnest, an experienced friend gave me three valuable tips:

I. Shoot vertically. With occasional exceptions—a death spiral, certain dance moves, or a fall—people skate vertically. If you hold the camera horizontally, you run the risk of cutting off the skater's head or feet. Even if you get the whole skater, you will still have a lot of wasted empty space on either side. Cameras are designed to be held horizontally, so holding yours vertically may feel awkward at first, but in the long run you will get better results.

- 2. Fill the frame. Try not to press the shutter unless the skater takes up at least half of the viewfinder area. This will decrease the total number of shots you take especially if you use only one lens. You will get more useable shots since a close-up shot is preferable to one in which the skater is a distant unidentifiable speck. Yes, you can enlarge and then crop the image if you shoot print film, but the more you enlarge, the grainy the result. It's more efficient to fill the frame the first time around.
- 3. Film is cheaper than opportunity! Don't waste your film, but don't be afraid to shoot a lot, particularly on a skater you really like. At the World Championships this year I saw one press photographer go through three rolls of film on Jill Trenary's long program. There are no instant replays, so you have to take advantage of your opportunity. Even if you use Kodachrome 200 at \$11 a roll and have it pushed processed at \$12 a roll, it's still cheaper than airfare to Halifax!

One professional photographer once estimated that even under the best circumstances, only 10 to 15 percent of exposures will be great ones. On a 36 exposure roll that is only three to four photos. A few more will be good but not great and the rest will be out of focus, or will catch a grimace or unflattering pose or backside. When you are just starting out, your percentage of "opps" shots is even higher. Don't give up and don't be disappointed if you have to weed out a lot. Even the best do.

Whether your goal is to be published or to record a memorable performance, with appropriate equipment and a willingness to experiment and learn, you, too, can take photographs to be proud of.





Wylie's efforts are encouraged by longtime coaches Evy and Mary Scotvold. "He's got a ton of energy," said Evy Scotvold, "He's like a bundle of molecules that are just moving along at a very high rate."

Scotvold supports Wylie's dual concentration on school and skating and says "He is actually happier with both. There's nothing more important than education for anybody. If anything, Paul would maybe give up skating competitively this year, finish school, and then shift back to skating after that," he added.

Originally from Dallas, Wylie began skating at age three while first watching his two older sisters on the ice—now they watch him. "They're very supportive. They are at competitions whenever they can be," said Wylie. "We are a close family, although geographically it's very difficult."

While training with the Scotvolds in Vail, Colo. this past summer, he had eight weeks where he was again "geographically close" to part of his family. His sister Claire lives in Denver and in July she and her husband had their first son whom they named after Paul.

When he was 11-years-old, his father's company moved the Wylie family to Denver. It was here that he found himself amidst a world class skating environment and what he says was the first turning point in his skating career.

"I think whenever you are around all these great skaters you can't help but learn from them. I was watching John Curry and Dorothy Hamill and all these big people warm up and skate their day," Wylie added. "I think it really had an effect on me and gave me a bigger perspective."

Within that first year in Denver Wylie began taking lessons from Fassi and was soon paired with Dana Graham on what the two referred to as a "whim." They began training together and by the end of 1977, they captured a first place finish in Novice Pairs at Southwestern Regionals and second place at Midwestern Sectionals. Moving up to Juniors in 1978, they placed second at Southwesterns and Midwesterns, ninth nationally, won Midwesterns the following year and placed fifth at Nationals. In 1980 they won the National Junior Pairs' Championships.

Meanwhile, Wylie kept up in singles skating and took the '79 Novice Men's


crown and '80 Junior Men's silver medal. In 1980-81, at age 16, he won the World Junior Men's title and the National Junior Championships.

After a major sponsor fell through, Wylie and Graham dissolved their pairs relationship and Wylie focused on his singles career.

He spent a total of nine years in Colorado; five of those skating at the Colorado Ice Arena in Denver and another four at the Broadmoor World Arena in Colorado Springs. He commuted from Denver for two of those years.

Between 1983 and 1987, Wylie accumulated a frustrating four fifth-place finishes at Nationals and one fourth.

He graduated from Colorado Academy in Denver in 1984 and then skated



full-time at the Broadmoor. During the summer of 1985, he left for Janesville, Wisc. to skate with the Scotvolds and then moved on to Boston with them where he has been ever since.

He started at Harvard in 1986 at a mature 21 years and, in 1988, he broke his fifth place spell and took second nationally. With that finish he was named a U.S. competitor to the Calgary Olympic team where he finished 10th. He had a frustrating year in 1989 trying to work school and skating into his schedule and he also missed making the World Team that year. At '90 Nationals, however, he came back and made the team.

"It hasn't been easy," remarked Wylie in reference to keeping his pace with skating and school. "The school part of it has been very difficult for me. I tend to take school very seriously, and if there is a paper due, I usually don't go skating. It tends to be a real conflict in priorities."

A conflict indeed when both are a priority. This is where Wylie stretches his abilities and performs the juggling act he still tries to perfect.

"It's hard, but you know I always find it really interesting when the chips are down, what my decisions are.

"Even if Nationals are in a week, I'll take a day off (from skating) to take an exam. I know if I'm not mentally focused on school, and then, mentally focused on skating, I sort of rob myself the concentration on both. That one day isn't going to kill me."

Wylie doesn't weigh one aspect of his life more than the other, however.

"They are both really competitive worlds. I have to balance them one off the other."

He will graduate in June of '91; leaving seven months to prepare for the '92 U.S. Nationals and Olympic Games. Not much time in the minds of most skaters

but for Paul Wylie, that's dedicated time—the first time he has dedicated solely to skating in about seven years. Skating will finally tip his balance for that seven months.

"I have dedicated myself before," says Wylie referring to the period he spent after high school at the Broadmoor World Arena.

"I wanted to be into skating then but I couldn't do it. I don't know what it was, but I guess at that point in my life I just wasn't disciplined enough to do it. Or things weren't happening that made me feel it was worth doing just that. So then, when I really dedicated myself to skating, it actually hurt my skating a little bit at that point."

Wylie doesn't plan for it to negatively affect him this time.


"My theory is because I wasn't moving on with anything. I think that once I graduate from Harvard, I am going to feel a lot better about the rest of my life. I will have accomplished that."

And then, he can shift the weight again.

"I think that everybody points toward the Olympics in terms of where they want to be in their projections.

"I would love to be on the podium at Worlds and Olympics, it's just a matter of putting the performances together and learning the stuff that needs to go into that program. The 'stuff' to make me of that caliber. I think Evy and Mary are going to do whatever it takes to help me learn that."

"He has the ability. He has to set enough hard training time aside and developmental time," Scotvold added. "He has to improve and has to learn more. Whether or not he is willing to act like a Junior skater and still learn at this point will determine whether or not he wants it."



Wylie's motivation is simple—he has fun when he skates well. He used to feel differently, though.

"Before '88, I couldn't have imagined what my life would be like had I not made the Olympic Team. There was such a burning desire in my heart. That was everything.

"It's very important to me to move on in my life because I think that I have been given a variety of talent, and I think it is really important for me to mobilize in order to achieve all the different talents in my life."

He does continue to move on in his life. He is in the midst of his senior year at Harvard. And, in reference to the '92 Games, "If I don't think I'm going to be in the ballpark, then I'm not going to continue on. I want to be sure that whatever I do, I'm maximizing what I'm supposed to be doing."

Wylie does express some anxieties about his career. He plans to use his degree and confesses he will probably always be involved in skating in one sense or another. Currently he serves on the USFSA Executive Committee, USFSA Membership Committee, is Vice Chairman of the USFSA Athletes Ad-

THUMBS UP! The Elizabeth Manley Story

Prior to the 1988 Olympics many fans, fellow competitors and the press had counted Elizabeth Manley out. Hers had been an up-and-down career, unpredictable at best. But they didn't know Manley. Overlooked in the media blitz of the "Battle of the Carmens," she pulled off the upset. An explosive performance gaver her first place in the long program in Calgary and the coveted silver medal. A repeat performance at the ensuing Worlds in Budapest made her a national Canadian heroine and now a successful professional in high demand.

The public assumes to know athletes based on a few performances, interviews and sound bites. But the true story of this "girl next door" and her roller coaster personal life and career has not been told until now.


Thumbs Up! traces the no-holds-barred story of her struggles with her coaches, family, the skating establishment, other competitors and her personal battles including a debilitating depression that almost ended her career at the Junior level. "The difference between winning and losing is more often mental than physical," she claims.

Written with Elva Clairmont Oglanby (who also authored books with Toller Cranston and Dorothy Hamill), this autobiography unlike some others is not peaches and cream. It delves deeply into unraveling the conflicting pieces of Manley's life, her anxieties, problems, futile romances, successes and joys in all honesty and without pretension.

The bright little "army brat" pixie from Ottawa had a shining career underway before she was sixteen. Hardships had been met and dealt with but things began to go awry. "Somewhere along the line, in the summer of 1982, my life began to spin out of control. Nobody seemed to notice, least of all me..." From this point through the following years to that February 1988 night in Calgary, the autobiography makes for highly interesting reading.

The book will probably be one of the hottest items of the fall and winter seasons. Some sections are bound to surprise; others ring so true that competitors may see a reflection of them-

Seattle/TBS Host Off-Season World Class Competition

West's prettiest cities, ranked right up there with San Francisco and San Diego. Seattle has an abundance of tall fir trees, is lush and green and the topography is very hilly. Sea planes dot the Puget Sound and the inland waterways. The sea planes are a major mode of transportation from small northern Canadian towns as well as Alaska. Normally temperate even in summer, Seattle was having a heat wave with temperatures in the mid-90's—a little "unbearable" for the Soviets who are used to much cooler climes.

The Goodwill Games offered a summer competition for elite level skaters, and as a result, most of the competitors were not in top form. The Soviets attended a training camp in Leningrad for several weeks before arriving in Seattle, and held a 10 day training camp in Washington before the actual competition. They seemed best prepared to duel for the medals.

Men

The men's competition was sporadic. All top five men in the world were there but like Halifax, the fight for the gold was a two way battle between Browning and Petrenko. The competition followed the old rules, so two triple Axels were allowed in the original program. Only Petrenko used two triple Axels however, and his performance to a jazz and rock number was nothing short of brilliant and gave him the lead. "I'm very




pleased," he said "but I can think about it only a couple of minutes."

Browning's new Turkish number was well suited to his high energy style. He had to follow Petrenko, which wasn't easy. He did a triple flip, but his triple Axel combination was dicey and he had to settle for second place behind Petrenko. "It's a risk doing it—it's a risk coming to these Games. But I accepted and decided to go ahead and have fun with it. It's a challenge for me."


Third place went to triple Axel specialist Viacheslav Zagorodniuk. The rest of the men had nothing but problems in their respective programs with the triple Axel giving everyone lots of grief.

American Paul Wylie's fall on his triple Axel attempt could only place him fourth, while U.S. champ Todd Eldredge had a problem with his combination to place fifth.

Christopher Bowman was admittedly not in competition form. He was having all kinds of difficulty with his triple Axel, so he substituted a triple Lutz combination which he practiced in the program exactly once. He singled it to finish sixth.



Kurt Browning, Canada, Men's Gold




Viktor Petrenko, USSR, Men's Silver

"I'm not surprised at all the marks," he said afterward. "I missed the combination and that's what happens. It's a new program and I'm doing a little experimenting, but I'm doing the best I can as an American ambassador."

Canadian Michael Slipchuk was seventh and Grzegorz Filipowski of Poland had a dismal performance to finish last.


Eldredge drew first to skate in the long program, but though he had some problems in the program, he landed the triple Axel combination he missed in the original program and four other triples to receive marks good enough to take home a bronze medal. "It's so hard to get up for a competition this time of year," Eldredge said. "But with skaters of this caliber, at this level, the pressure is always there."

Bowman was the next American to skate. He salvaged his bruised ego somewhat with a fairly strong performance in the long program to "Tico-Tico," landing five triples and getting the audience

behind him. Unfortunately, the judges weren't behind him and kept him in sixth place. The audience booed the marks loudly but Bowman said, "I had a good time here but was scared I would not learn anything from this competition or that I would have a negative feeling. I'm glad I turned the tables tonight."

Zagorodniuk's lackluster performance gave the 17-year-old Soviet high marks but in the end, Zagorodniuk was placed one slot above Bowman in fifth place.


Wylie had an opportunity to medal with a good skate. The long program has always been his strongest event. He had received four 6.0's for his performance at the 1990 Nationals, but this was not to be his night. Mistakes on the triple flip, triple Axel, and triple Lutz in the first half of the program took out all the technical difficulty and even a comeback in the second half could not bring him higher than fourth. Wylie said he was disappointed, but not discouraged. He plans to keep both programs for the com-

ing season and is still looking to compete in the 1992 Olympics in Albertville, France.


The fight for the gold was left to Petrenko and Browning. Petrenko seemed to have the edge as he had been skating so well all week in practice. He opened with a triple Axel combination and several other strong triples, but halfway through his program he lost energy and stamina, doubling or falling out of the rest of his jumps. The marks were good though with three first placements.

Browning, working with yet another new program, did have some problems, but proved he was in pretty good shape by even attempting the quad. The effort was not successful, but the program as a whole with five strong triples gave him the majority of first placements from the judges for a win.


"I was so excited (about the triple Axel) that I took it for granted," said Browning later. "I didn't know I had won

Jill Trenary, USA, Ladies' Silver


until I saw the artistic marks." Browning's gold left Petrenko with the silver.

As a gesture of goodwill, Browning announced that he was giving a substantial donation from his prize money earned at the Goodwill Games to the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center. "The Goodwill Games seemed to be the appropriate place to do this," he said.

Ladies

In the ladies event, the U.S. had a powerhouse team. World Champion Jill Trenary was the favorite, Kristi Yamaguchi wasn't far behind bringing with her a bag full of triples; and Nancy Kerrigan, a late replacement for World Bronze Medalist Holly Cook, had just won a gold at the U.S. Olympic Festival a month before.

The Soviets brought Natalia Lebedeva, who at 26 may be looking at the end of her amateur career, and a hitherto unknown skater, Tatiana Rachkova. Surya Bonaly of France was there and the Canadians sent their 1989 National




Surya Bonaly, France, Ladies' Bronze

Champion Karen Preston and the Junior National Champion Margot Bion.

Trenary showed championship form in the original program with a solid triple toe/double toe combination to win this portion of the competition. The program was a new one and Trenary was pleased to have skated so well after only three weeks of training and added she was also happy to have skated well for coaches Carlo and Christa Fassi who left for Italy in September. "They mean so much to me," Trenary said, "But goodbyes are not forever."

Yamaguchi had a more difficult combination of triple Lutz/double toe but double-footed the second jump which put her in the third spot. Kerrigan took second place with a strong double Lutz/triple toe combination. "I found out two weeks ago I would be skating here," Kerrigan said, "You could say I was warmed up (for the competition)."

Bonaly of France had a triple Lutz/double toe to take fourth and though



Nancy Kerrigan, USA, Ladies' Fifth


Karen Preston's program was very strong, skating first in the draw held her down to seventh.

It seemed likely that the Americans would sweep the event, but the long program is always fraught with danger. Preston's *Sleeping Beauty* was one of the strongest presentations and the judges rewarded her with a third placement in the free, though she could only move up to fourth overall. Newcomer, 17-year-old Rachkova of Moscow was second to Lebedeva in the Soviet Union recently, but outskated her teammate to place a notch above her at sixth.

Bonaly had a shot at a medal and a long list of difficult jumps that included a quad. She had problems early in the program, falling on a double Axel, but only barely missed the quad and landed most of her other triples to secure fourth place marks and move her up into bronze medal position. "It is good luck that I have this opportunity," she said, through an interpreter. "I felt weak at first, but stronger as I went along."

Yamaguchi was the first of the leaders to skate, and she skated an excellent program, completing five out of seven triples. She doubled a triple Salchow and turned a triple Lutz to a single, but otherwise had plenty of difficult content with four of her successful triples done in combinations. The marks were high, but beatable and Yamaguchi had to wait for Trenary and Kerrigan to skate to see what medal she would win.

The pressure was on Trenary, and she had to skate a clean program. She didn't have the technical difficulty of Yamaguchi and could not afford to miss more than one of her planned five triple jumps. The opening combination triple toe/double toe was scrapped to just a triple toe. She had another one planned in her program but in order for it to count, she would need to tack on a double toe since

rules do not allow repeating a triple jump unless it is done in a combination. She landed the triple again but without the required combination and a touchdown on her normally secure combination of one foot Axel to triple Salchow left her without a successful combination jump in the program. Three judges gave her first place marks, but the majority marked her down on technical merit and she lost the gold to Yamaguchi.

"I'm not disappointed considering the season," Trenary said, "Kristi skated better tonight. This is summer. That's life."


Yamaguchi who split with Rudi Galindo in pairs, trains in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada concentrating on her singles career. Yamaguchi had never beaten Trenary in overall standings before and said she felt a lot more rested now that she has a less hectic schedule. "It helped that I used last year's program."

Kerrigan had a chance to not only medal but win the gold. She drew last to skate and nerves got the better of the performance as she fell three times and left the ice in tears. She dropped from second to fifth place overall.




Elena Bechke & Denis Petrov, USSR, Pair Bronze


Natalia Mishkutenok & Artur Dmitriev, USSR, Pair Silver

Calla Urbanski & Mark Naylor, USA, Pair Seventh




Pairs

The Soviets sent their top three pairs for this event. Canadians and World Silver Medalists Isabelle Brasseur and Lloyd Eisler were not competing nor were the East Germans, and the rest of the field of competitors were unlikely to challenge the Soviets.

Four time World Champions and Olympic Champions Ekaterina Gordeeva and Sergei Grinkov took the lead in the original program with a super high double twist and clean double Axels. Their samba program was not in their usual classical style and didn't grab the audience, but the only pair to give them any real competition, teammates Natalia Mishkutenok and Artur Dmitriev coached by Leningrad's Tamara Moskvina, had problems on their side-by-side double toes. Their Swan Lake was beautifully interpreted but the error put them in second place.




Marina Klimova & Sergei Ponomarenko, USSR, Dance Gold




Susan Wynne & Joseph Druar, USA, Dance Bronze

Despite being sidelined for three weeks with a lower back problem, Todd Sand and partner Natasha Kuchiki skated an excellent performance. They were able to hold onto the double Axels to place fourth. Teammates Sharon Carz and Doug Williams were not so lucky. A spill on the double Axel by Carz dropped them down to sixth, while Calla Urbanski and Mark Naylor skated clean but were first in the draw and were held to seventh. Canada's Michelle Menzies and Kevin Wheeler were fifth, and Patricia MacNeil and Cory Watson were eighth.

The marking of the long program was somewhat controversial. Gordeeva and Grinkov's *Romeo and Juliet* had more than a few problems. Gordeeva fell on the double Axel and stepped out of the triple toe loop and even their famed unison was affected. But it's not easy to upset World and Olympic champions and they received five first placements from the judges to win the gold medal.

"This proves they can do well in summer, too," said coach Stanislav Leonovich, although he admitted that they didn't skate as well as they could have. A summer competition does "mess them up" he said.

The audience had been rooting for the second Soviet team, Mishkutenok and Dmitriev. They didn't skate a clean program either although their mistakes were not as pronounced. Their innovative spins and lifts drew gasps from the audience, but not the judges and Mishkutenok and Dmitriev settled for silver.

"This is like our holiday," Tamara Moskvina said. "They should be on the beach. This was our good will, but still I had hoped to win." Moskvina's second team Bechke and Petrov had no difficulty holding the third spot with a program that didn't have quite the difficulty of the other Soviet teams, but was nevertheless performed very well.

Americans Kuchiki and Sand had only been working on their "Prince Igor" long program for a week because of Sand's injury. The lack of training time showed up with technical problems. "I was most worried about just getting through it," said Sand, who fell on the side-by-side double Axels. "I was not fast enough getting out of it." They were able to hold onto their fourth placement.

Teammates Carz and Williams and Urbanski and Naylor had their share of problems too, and were unable to improve their sixth and seventh place rankings, respectively.

Dance

The dance competition at the Goodwill Games had to go by the 1990 rules because there was not enough time for the competitors to choreograph a new original dance. (Rules have been changed for the 1991 season which eliminates the need of a pattern.)

There was only one compulsory dance—the Starlight Waltz. There were no surprises here. Two time World Champions Marina Klimova and Sergei Ponomarenko of the Soviet Union won this portion of the competition handily. Teammates Maia Usova and Alexander Zhulin were second. Americans Susan Wynne and Joseph Druar prevented a Soviet sweep by placing third. "They are so good," Druar said of the leaders, "especially with a waltz. In fact, they did their compulsory waltz so well in the 1987 Worlds, it has been made a compulsory routine." Druar added that the compulsories were the worst part and least favorite of their routines. "We do not have a lot of input. We like the free dance because we can do what we want to do."

Though Ponomarenko said the team had only been skating three weeks, they easily took first place for the second portion of the competition, the Samba OSP. "The routine was easy," he said, "because it was the same as last year. But physically we are not ready yet."

Usova and Zhulin remained in second place after the OSP, but Wynne and Druar dropped to fourth despite an audience-pleasing Samba performance. The third Soviet team, Oksana Grishchuk and Evgeni Platov skated a technically difficult dance and though their performance didn't have Wynne and Druar's presentation skills, the judges put them third.

April Sargent and Russ Witherby held onto the fifth spot with a clean routine in the OSP; and Canada's Michelle McDonald and Mark Mitchell were sixth and Jacqueline Petr and Mark Janoschak were seventh. Hungary's Klara Engi and Attilla Toth withdrew several weeks prior to the start of the competition.

Sargent and Witherby introduced a new free dance at the Goodwill Games, but their "Exotic Birds" presentation was not choreographically polished yet. They had a stumble midway through the program and dropped to sixth. Petr and Janoschak had very interesting and different positions in their *Last Emperor* program which was choreographed by Toller Cranston, but as the new kids on the block they placed last.

McDonald and Mitchell's jazzy "Fever" production pleased the audience, and moved them up a slot to the fifth spot. Grishchuk and Platov had some fancy footwork with *Zorba the Greek*, receiving four, fourth place finishes, a second from the Hungarian judge, and two thirds from the Soviet and Canadian judges.

But Wynne and Druar's tap dance free dance was nothing short of brilliant. The crowd didn't know it, but it was to be their last amateur performance. Wynne and Druar skated with their hearts, bringing the audience to fever pitch with




music to Singing in the Rain and 42nd Street. For their tap dance routine, they received the only standing ovation given during the entire competition. The crowd was hungry for silver, the judges gave them bronze, but to Wynne and Druar it was pure gold. "What a way to end a career," Wynne said tearfully. "This is an audience you live for, you kind of break out of orbit. I'll never forget this night."

Druar added, "I didn't think of the steps at all—I just flowed."

In contrast Usova and Zhulin were unable to communicate any emotion generated by their variations of a Tango. Despite the heavy drama, the audience seemed bored. It may have been simply a case of skating after the popular routine of Wynne and Druar. The judges liked it though, and awarded them the silver.

Klimova and Ponomarenko waltzed their way to the gold with music from the score of My Fair Lady. But even the world champions had to take a back seat in popularity. Ponomarenko said he was happy with the win but felt sad that Wynne and Druar will leave the amateur ranks. "We have been skating with them since 1983. It's sad to see friends leave."

Ice dancing was the final event of the competition and it was somehow fitting and right to see Americans Susan Wynne and Joseph Druar atop the podium along with the great Soviet dancers. It was the first bronze medal for any American dancer in World level competition since Judy Blumberg and Michael Seibert won the bronze at the 1984 and 1985 World Championships.





selves. What is unveiled is one person's triumphs over adversities and her growth as a person and as a world competitor against all odds. The realization that "Winning is the best revenge," helps wash away the turmoils and we are brought up-to-date on the life of the Ice Capades star.

As in Oglanby's Hamill book, the obsession with chronology and minutia at times interferes with the flow of the story. There is little creativity in the style of writing. It is a flat, cold-turkey presentation, yet easy to read and engrossing, once you get past the first 50 pages.

We do get to know Manley and find a thoroughly likeable, fiesty competitor and person who now deserves all the rewards coming her way.
