

many interesting and often humorous situations.

As mail arrived at 20 First Street in buckets, the postal carrier was greeted at the door by a small army of USFSA staffers whose job it was to sign the sizeable stack of certified mail receipts that accompanied the daily mail call.

"The postman would leave and continue his rounds and come back for the green postcards...otherwise he'd miss dinner," Crowley said, adding that postal regulations that require each piece of certified mail be logged twice by the USPS already had created logiams in the post office.

Postmarks were then verified, as hand deliveries are prohibited by USFSA rules. Crowley recalled one entry surfacing without a postmark.

"I took it down to the desk at the local post office, paid the postage and asked the desk clerk to mail it to myself. He postmarked it, I asked to pick up my mail and he handed it back to me," Crowley said. "When I left, he still was shaking his head."

Once received and sorted, the entries were then forwarded to the USFSA accounting department for processing of fees. Deciphering the information (or, in many cases, misinformation) for data entry purposes was then the challenging task of the Member Services Department. Following are some of the more interesting responses to seemingly straight-forward questions on the entry forms:



# Salt Lake City, Cleveland land 1999 & 2000 Nationals

The sites for the last two U.S. Figure Skating Championships of the millenium are set, as Salt Lake City and Cleveland have been selected to host the 1999 and 2000 Nationals respectively.

The host cities were announced Oct. 5 by USFSA President Morry Stillwell following a vote by the USFSA Board of Directors at its annual fall meeting in USFSA Colorado Springs, Colo. Both cities have twice hosted U.S. figure skating's crown jewel event - Salt Lake City in 1984 and 1990 and Cleveland in 1940 and 1964.

"We are pleased and excited to bring the U.S. Championships to our city," said Anne Marie Jensen, chair of the Salt Lake City Organizing Committee, which will be a joint effort between the Utah FSC, the Junior

League of Salt Lake City and the 2002 Salt Lake Olympic Organizing Committee. "The strengths of Salt Lake, including our experience in hosting U.S.

figure skating events, the enthusiasm for sports within this community, the dedication

of the three groups

involved and the hospitality of our city will guarantee a spectacular, memorable event."

The 1999 event will

be staged in the 14,000seat Delta Center, which also will serve as the figure skating venue for the 2002 Olympic Winter Games.

The 2000 U.S. Championships will be hosted by the Greater Cleveland Council of Figure Skating Clubs, which consists of 12 USFSA member clubs, and will be conducted in Cleveland's new 20,500-seat Gund Arena.

"Cleveland is very pleased to have been selected to host the 2000 U.S. Figure Skating Championships," said Bill Coyle, chair of the Cleveland Local Organizing Committee. "With Gund Arena being a new facility, the proximity of the hotels, the strength of the 12 figure skating clubs and 5,000plus skaters in the greater Cleveland area along with the support of the community, we believe Cleveland and the U.S. Championships are a perfect fit."

Portland, Ore., with a bid prepared by the Portland ISC. the Portland Metropolitan Sports Authority and Peter Jacobsen Productions, also was a finalist to host the 1999 event. Houston, Texas, was a finalist for the 2000 Championships with a bid prepared by the Greater Houston Skating Council and the **Houston International Sports** Commission.

## A Challenge of Champions

U.S. World Champions from three decades will come together for a one-day competition Dec. 18 at the U.S. Postal Service Skating Challenge in Philadelphia's newly-completed CoreStates Center.

The World Champions scheduled to compete in the USFSA-sanctioned pro-am event are Dorothy Hamill (1976), Rosalynn Sumners (1983), Michelle Kwan (1996) and Todd Eldredge (1996).

Rounding out the ladies' field are 1995 U.S. champion and World bronze medalist Nicole Bobek, current U.S. silver medalist Tonia Kwiatkowski, 1987 World bronze medalist Caryn Kadavy and current U.S. bronze medalist Tara Lipinski.

Joining Eldredge in the men's competition are current U.S. bronze medalist Dan Hollander and 1992 Olympic silver medalist Paul Wylie.

Tickets for the U.S. Postal Service Challenge are now on sale at the CoreStates Center box office and all Delaware Valley Ticket Master outlets or by calling any one of the following numbers: (215) 336-2000, (609) 338-9000, (302) 984-2000 or (717) 693-4100.

## Coaches nominated for U honors

Former Olympians and accomplished skating coaches Carol Heiss Jenkins and Peter Oppegard recently were nominated by the USFSA for the USOC's inaugural Coach of the Year Awards.

Heiss Jenkins, who since 1978 has coached Lisa Ervin, Tonia Kwiatkowski and Aren Nielsen among others to the U.S. Championships medal platform, was nominated as the USFSA's Elite Coach of the Year. Heiss Jenkins currently

Oppegard, who coaches 1995 U.S. Novice pair champions Tiffany and Johnnie

Stiegler and the 1996 fourthplace Senior pair of Stephanie Stiegler and John Zimmerman at Lake Arrowhead, Calif., was nominated as the USFSA's Developmental Coach of the Year.

The 78 nominees from the various Olympic and Pan American sports governing bodies will be announced at a Nov. 16 awards banquet in Tampa, Fla., where the Coaches of the Year will be named.

Address. Some entrants omitted city, state, zip code and listed a street name only.

Sex — M/F. Seems simple, but several entrants actually circled the wrong letter.

Tests Passed. On the question that asked for highest tests passed in figures, free skating, dance, pairs and Moves In The Field (MIF), one entrant circled the "F" in "MIF" and wrote "female" next to it. To her credit, she did have her gender correct — see above.

Region. On a question meant to determine which of the nine USFSA regions the entrant was competing in, numerous responses came back with religious affiliations listed. For the record, there are 10 known Catholics, three Protestants, two Episcopalians and one Muslim competing in this year's regionals.

Event. One pair team had its members entered in different regions, while one dancer entered two events with a different partner. At last count, more than 10 people had registered for Juvenile Open Figures — a non-existent event.

Age. The computer found many people too old to enter age-restricted events. Crowley recalled one entry being placed on his desk with a sticky note reading, "This Catholic is too old!"

After USFSA staffers completed the herculean task of receiving, sorting, deciphering, inputting and proofing all of the entries, postcards were mailed to entrants confirming receipt of their materials. Reports detailing the fields were generated and shipped to the local organizing committees, referees and accountants for all nine competitions — all by September 30.

"I know that there is a list of things that will be done differently if we (Headquarters) do this again next year," Crowley told the Board of Directors. "But, overall I was very pleased. The Headquarters staff was tremendous!"

The USFSA Dance Committee and Professional Skaters Association (PSA) have announced plans to host an Ice Dancing Seminar focusing on choreography for ice dancing from noon to 1:30 p.m., Sunday, Feb. 16 at the Centennial Sportsplex in Nashville, Tenn. The seminar, which will feature twotime and reigning U.S. Dance Champions Elizabeth Punsalan and Jerod Swallow as presenters, is open to all judges, professionals, skaters and interested persons. The seminar will feature discussions and demonstrations on Original Dance and Free Dance

choreography, as well as comparison of program elements and other areas to increase appreciation of the finer points of ice dancing, according to USFSA Dance Committee Chair Bob Horen. Admission is free and transportation will be provided.

Just prior to the ice dancing seminar, the PSA will conduct its annual Partner Tryouts and Auditions at the Centennial Sportsplex. Now in their 10th year, the PSA Partner Tryouts and Auditions have been marked by increasing participation in recent years. More than

80 skaters attended last year's event in San Jose, Calif., as well as coaches looking to scout potential partners for their students. Applications, along with a \$25 registration fee, are due Jan. 16. There is a \$35 charge for applications received after the deadline and all applications are due no later than Feb. 15. Walkins will not be allowed to participate.






New England has long been a popular destination for those looking for a change in scenery. Perhaps, then, it was only fitting that when two-time U.S. champion Scott Davis went in search of new surroundings he would come here to Simsbury, Conn. However, unlike those who come here to witness the brilliance of the fall foliage, Davis came looking for an environment that would breathe new life into his competitive skating career and he came intent on staying longer than an extended weekend.

Davis' decision to leave the comforts of his longtime training base of Colorado Springs, Colo., and his coach of nine years, Kathy Casey, was one of the toughest choices the 24-year-old Great Falls, Mont., native has had to make throughout his 15-year competitive career.

"The last couple of years of skating have been a challenge. I have been struggling with being on top and not being on top, so I figured a change might be what was necessary," said Davis. "It was a very hard thing to do."

To fully understand the difficulty of Davis' decision, you need only look at the record he and Casey amassed during their successful partnership — a U.S. Junior title in 1990, back-to-back U.S. Senior titles in 1993 and 1994 and top eight finishes at three World Championships (1993-1995) and the 1994 Olympic Winter Games. From his initial move out of Great Falls at age 15 to train with Casey in Tacoma, Wash., and then to Colorado Springs in 1990, wherever Casey went Davis followed. Together, they shared the competitive highs and weathered the lows.

"She (Casey) really brought meaning to my skating. She is one smart lady struggling with being on top and not being on top, so I figured a change might be what was necessary.


who really knows her technique," Davis said, adding that his fondest memory of the past several years was winning the 1994 U.S. title over a recently reinstated Brian Boitano. "But, sometimes you reach a point in life where you need a change even though you might resist it."

That point in Davis' skating life came at the end of the 1995-96 competitive season — an admittedly uninspired campaign that culminated with a fourth-place finish at the 1996 U.S. Championships. His absence from the U.S. World Team for the first time since 1991 left Davis with the opportunity to weigh his options before he embarked on the summer-long Campbell's Soups Tour of World Figure Skating Champions.

During that time, Davis began periodic training at the International Skating Center under the tutelage of Galina Zmievskaya and in the company of her former Olympic champions Viktor Petrenko and Oksana Baiul. Davis was so impressed with the Simsbury facility and encouraged by his initial work with Zmievskaya and choreographer Nina Petrenko (Galina's daughter and Viktor's wife) that he physically moved to nearby Granby, Conn., in July.

"It was a major change, but it came time for me to make a transition. I really enjoy skating and living here in Connecticut. It's very different, but interesting," he said following a practice session in September.

While much around Davis has changed, much within him remains the same — most notably his characteristic style of fast, energized, high



triple jumps and blur-like spins.

During that recent practice session,

Davis exhibited both finesse and

strength in executing numerous triple

Axel-triple toe loop combinations,

triple Lutzes and triple flips.

Seemingly timid and mild-mannered upon first meeting him, Davis displays a fierceness, strength and determination when it comes to his skating.

"This year looks good. I'm happy with my skating. I'm just working hard so I keep getting better," he said.

Davis is indeed working hard, as evidenced by his training regimen that includes on-ice sessions five days a week for three to four hours each day with Zmievskaya overseeing his technical development and overall programs. He supplements his on-ice work with three days of off-ice conditioning, calisthenics and weight training each week. A new emphasis in his training since moving to Connecticut has been his approach to developing his presentation.

"I've really been working on the presentation of the programs and looking up while I skate," Davis said, adding that he now spends two hours each week in a dance studio with Nina Petrenko. "I'm not classical or balletic by nature, I just love to jump and spin...so this has been a whole new thing. It's really different when you see how you move in front of mirrors (at the dance studio)."

Davis' first major international competition since relocating to
Connecticut will be in his new backyard at the end of October when he takes the ice at Thrifty Car Rental
Skate America International '96 in
Springfield, Mass. There, Davis will deliver the U.S. debut of his new programs that he hopes will show the first glimpse at the improvements he is making in his skating and presentation.

In his short program, Davis will skate to the jazz piece,

"Constantinople." Bluesy in its artistic context, this routine includes a triple Axel-triple toe loop combination, footwork into a a triple Lutz and a double Axel. "I like this program and I'm having fun with it," he said.


Davis' long program is an interpretation of the music from the Robert DeNiro film, "Once Upon A Time In America," a documentary about the life of a Chicago gangster during the first half of the 20th Century. Davis opens with his rendition of DeNiro as the old, seasoned crime figure who is reflecting on his life, then he moves into a waltz segment which acknowledges the impact of the female counterpart and concludes with a happy, upbeat ending that exhibits the positive elements gained through experiencing a full life. In addition to the intriguing storyline, the program is packed with triple jumps, footwork and Davis' trademark combination spins. "We set the program in July and have been working on jumps, timing and presentation. It's interesting and I enjoy training here," he said.

Davis seems to be settling into his new environment off the ice as well as

"Scott has really been a great role model for the young skaters here," said Bob Young, Director of the International Skating Center. "He seems to be working hard and settling in well."

Much of his leisure time is spent in his new townhome in Granby, just a five-minute drive from the rink, where he indulges in typical bachelor pursuits like "channel surfing" on his television, rollerblading, feeding his habit as a self-confessed "chocoholic" and preparing his standard fare of grilled cheese sandwiches and pasta after a day at the rink. Davis include visits to Hartford for dinner with a few friends from the rink or an occasional weekend in Boston.

"I enjoy the history of Connecticut and I like the area. The people have been really friendly," he said, adding that he recently joined Zmievskaya and some of the Russian skaters training at Simsbury for an authentic Russian meal. "It was fun to eat some Russian food. She (Zmievskaya) served a lot of fresh fruit."


For all of the recent major changes in his life, many things remain constant such as his close relationships with family and friends — even though many are now halfway across the country.

He remains in close contact with his mother, Wallie Joan Taber, who retired from her career as a surgical nurse in Great Falls and now resides in Branson, Mo. "My mother has been a real inspiration and strong example to me. I guess she saw that I wanted to skate and was willing to support me," he said, adding that she often worked overtime to pay his skating expenses.







It is all about time-honored traditions as well as cutting-edge innovations. Nashville is the embodiment of many facets, and for this reason, it defies stereotype.

For visitors looking to plumb the depths of Nashville's appeal, the nicknames of the city provide a starting point. The city's most well-known moniker is Music City USA. For countless musicians, Nashville has long been the mecca of creative energy and opportunity needed to spark a career. From country to bluegrass to blues to rock 'n' roll, Music City had a hand in anointing those who would become legends through their talent.

One venerable institution which has stood the test of time as a musician's showcase is the Grand Ole Opry. Hundreds of thousands of music lovers come every year to hear Opry members such as Vince Gill, Garth Brooks, Little Jimmy Dickens and Lorrie Morgan continue the tradition.

Another musical monu-



ment is the famed Music Row. One of the most famous is RCA's Studio B. A veritable "who's who" of recording artists are part of the studio's history. The allstar roster includes Elvis, the Everly Brothers, Waylon Jennings and Dolly Parton.

Visitors to Music Row will find an eclectic mix of old homes converted into publishing houses and management companies as well as the high rises of all the major record labels. Studio B has been newly renovated to reflect its original purpose as a state-of-the-art recording facility.
Appropriately enough, the Country Music Hall of Fame is also in this area. With its priceless memorabilia and interactive exhibits, it exists both as a chronicle of the "Nashville Sound" and as a harbinger of what is to come.

There are other ways to experience Nashville's musical legacy. A visit to any one of the area's clubs, honkeytonks or "listening rooms" provides an insider's view of the latest breakthrough The bright lights of Nashville have long attracted performers of all types.

artists. Bela Fleck has been known to stop in at the Station Inn to get a bluegrass fix. Tootsie's Orchid Lounge was the watering hole for the Grand Ole Opry stars when the Opry was performed at the historic Ryman Auditorium. Today, the faded pictures of legends line the wall while new musicians reach for stardom.

The Bluebird Cafe's "Writer's Night" brings hundreds of hopefuls out to try for the golden opportunity to play on a Sunday night. However, only a select few earn a place on the line-up. Other "don't miss" venues to visit include 12th & Porter, the Bull Pen Lounge, Barbara's, the Pub of Love,

the Sutler and Douglas Corner Cafe.


The blues have been a mainstay in Nashville since the 1950s when Jefferson Street nightclubs boasted Little Richard, Muddy Waters and Ray Charles, and the Supremes played in Printers Alley. Rhythm, blues and soul still emanates from area clubs including Bourbon Street Blues and Boogie Bar, Cafe Milano and Mere Bulles.

Alternative rock rounds out the music scene. Billy Joel played at Exit/In in his early days, and recent acts include the chart-crossing Mavericks and Better Than Ezra. 328 Performance Hall and Lucy's Record Shop are also always sure to have the latest big names as well as breaking talent.

Another title conferred on Nashville, "Athens of the South," reveals a flip side of the city. Nashville is an educational powerhouse with its more than 15 universities, among them Tennessee State University, Vanderbilt University and Fisk University.

The city's art museum is housed in The Parthenon, a complete replica of the one in ancient Greece. Anyone who doubts the authenticity of detail need only step inside and come face-to-foot with Athena Parthenos, a 42-foot statue which happens to be the tallest indoor sculpture in the Western world.

Another famous gallery is located in Fisk University. The Van Vechten Gallery



Home of President Andrew Jackson, the seventh President of the United States, the Hermitage has been preserved so that visitors may enjoy the era of this colorful political personality

contains more than 100 works of art from the famed Alfred Stieglitz collection.
Stieglitz's widow Georgia
O'Keeffe donated some of her own paintings, as well as those by Picasso,
Cezanne and Renoir, in her husband's memory. Also at Fisk is the Aaron Douglas Gallery with its impressive collection of African art.

The many carefully maintained historic homes in Nashville are objects of beauty as well as insights into the antebellum past.

The Hermitage: Home of President Andrew Jackson offers an in-depth look at the nation's seventh president. Belle Meade Plantation is known as "Queen of the Tennessee Plantations" for good reason. Belmont Mansion is as famous for its headstrong mistress as for its period furnishings and artwork.

Nashville's nicknames are not the only way the city shows its colors. Visitors flock every year to the entertainment sectors to see

what's stirring during the day and into the wee hours. One of the city's biggest playgrounds is The District, a 16-block downtown area packed with eclectic restaurants, trendy boutiques, and hip nightclubs and concert venues. The Wildhorse Saloon, Ace of Clubs, the Hard Rock Cafe, Planet Hollywood, Tootsie's Orchid Lounge and The Underground are all options for those with an appetite for action.

A focal point of the area is the Ryman Auditorium. "The Mother Church of Country Music" was the home of the Grand Ole Opry from 1943 to 1974. The pews would be packed week after week, not for a sermon, but for a soulinspiring ministry of music from all the country greats. When the Opry moved to Opryland in 1974, the Ryman became a pilgrimage for many fans of country music, but its halls were silent.

Twenty years and \$8.5 million later, the music has begun again at the Ryman. Star-studded concerts with Mary-Chapin Carpenter and John Pryne and the Martha White Bluegrass Series are all part of the current crop of musical offerings.

The grand opening of The Delta is the big news at the hotel, and no wonder since it adds 979 new guest rooms and a 4.5 acre "interiorscape" under glass with shops, restaurants, waterfalls and an indoor riverboat system.

Conveniently located across the street from Opryland is Music Valley Village. Here you can pick up some vintage recordings at Ernest Tubb Record Shop, visit the Nashville Palace, well known for its live music as well as for the fact that Randy Travis was discovered there, and attend a show at the Texas Troubadour Theatre. The Texas Troubadour also plays host to the Ernest Tubb Midnight Jamboree every Saturday night. The Jamboree holds the distinction of being the longestrunning radio show in the nation after the Grand Ole Opry. When Elvis was turned away from the Opry, the Jamboree was there to welcome him with open arms.

Although Nashville's entertainment choices make up a large piece of Nashville's pie, the culinary offerings also play a substantial role in summing up the city's allure. There are count-

less choices to tempt even the most discriminating palate.

For a gourmet meal in elegant surroundings, the Wild Boar fits the bill. It has a 15.000-bottle wine cellar and will even serve its sumptuous continental food on 18K Gold plates if desired. Mario's Restaurante has won every major restaurant award with its Italian fare. Jimmy Kelly's serves up steaks, veal and lamb in a picturesque Victorian home. Arthur's in the historic Union Station Hotel and the Capitol Grille in the Hermitage Suite Hotel are two other equally lavish options. Many restaurants are experimenting with Southern cuisine and the results are truly savory. Cafe 123, Jules in Cummins Station and the Bound'ry are all popular for their new twist on old favorites.

So in the end what is Nashville? Music and art, glamour and grit, open spaces and bustling streets, culture and history, food and fun. The reasons for visiting Nashville are as limitless as the possibilities once you arrive.





## **Board of Directors**

## The USFSA Board of Directors took the following action:

- 1. APPROVED the Minutes of the Board of Directors meeting held in Colorado Springs, Colorado, May 8-9,1996.
- 2. APPROVED the following prioritization of the Long Range Planning goals adopted by the USFSA in 1994, to provide guidance to the Finance Committee during the coming year:
  - World Competitive Position
     Eligibility
     Competition Management
     External Representation
  - 2. Responsibility to Athletes
    Officiating
    Membership and Participation
    Governance
  - 3. Finance
    Human Resources
    Public Reputation
    Umbrella Organization
- 3. APPROVED a motion to instruct the Rules Committee to formulate rules and/or Bylaws amendments to be presented at the next Governing Council meeting that require non-disclosure of any of our [USFSA] contracts without express approval of the Executive Committee.
- 4. APPROVED a motion to do whatever is necessary to preserve confidentiality of contracts between the USFSA and any other parties.

## COMPETITIONS COMMITTEE

- 1. APPROVED to amend CR 35.02 (A) to read that one referee must be selected for a non-qualifying competition. Additional referees are to be selected at the discretion of the host club.
- 2. **APPROVED** to amend CR 35.02 (C) to read that one accountant must be selected for a non-qualifying competition. Additional accountants are to be selected at the discretion of the host club.
- 3. APPROVED to amend the seeding rules following CR 12.94 to include provision for those competitors who move up more than one competition level in a year regardless of their previous placement. These competitors would be placed in the random group of skaters and drawn with other unseeded skaters.

- 4. DID NOT APPROVE to amend CR 15.01 and CR 15.02 to add that deviations from the defined systems of judging must be approved by the Chair of the Competitions Committee.
- 5. APPROVED to amend CR 12.91 to state that a qualifying round for Pairs will be required when there are more than 18 entrants.
- 6. APPROVED to add Pairs to CR 12.31 to be included among events using only the Free Skating program in the qualifying round.
- 7. APPROVED to amend CR 18.04 to delete the phrase "shall immediately forward" and substitute with "within 48 hours."
- 8. APPROVED to eliminate Skate America and Snowflake International from CR 6.01.
- 9. APPROVED to amend CR 12.91 to add qualifying rounds to Sectional Championships when more than 15 skaters enter a figure event.
- 10. REFER BACK TO THE COMPETITIONS COMMITTEE the motion to amend CR 8.08 to read "any registered skater (as defined in SR 2.11) who knowingly takes part in an unsanctioned Carnival or Exhibition or other event requiring a sanction or contract under the Sanctions Rules shall be subject to disciplinary action by the Chair of the Sanctions and Eligibility committee which may include up to and including loss of eligibility."
- 11. REFER BACK TO THE COMPETITIONS COMMITTEE the motion to remove any reference to the need for attendance at referee schools for any level of referee (Singles/Pairs, Precision and Dance.) This would include amending CR 22.05 (A)(2); CR 22.05 (B)(2); CR 23.02 (A) and (B) and CR 61.07 (C).
- 12. APPROVED to amend CR 36.06 (C) to delete the necessity of USFSA Headquarters maintaining a clean souvenir program from non-qualifying competitions.
- 13. **APPROVED** to amend CR 48.02 (D) to increase the age of Intermediate precision teams from 15 to <u>16</u> years or younger for 75% of the team and the remaining 25% may be 18 years or younger.
- 14. APPROVED to amend CR 48.02 (D) to change the size of Intermediate teams to 12 to 20 members. Currently it is 12 to 18 members.

- 15. APPROVED to accept the application of the Broadmoor Skating Club to present a trophy in honor of Yvonne Sherman Tutt and William Thayer Tutt. The Broadmoor Skating Club hopes to present this trophy for the first time at the 1997 United States Junior Olympics.

Demonstrate a command of the following required elements to be skated without music:

- a. Crossovers forward and backward (either direction).
- b. Lunge or spiral.
- c. Two Jumps, either one-half or one full revolution.
- d. Two spins (minimum 3 revolutions in position)
  - 1. One must be a one-foot upright spin
  - 2. One must be a two-foot upright spin

The entire test shall be marked on a "Pass" or "Retry" basis only and individual marks are not awarded. The "Pass" or "Retry" shall be arrived at by consideration of the composite of each element in relation to the whole. The Judge-in-Charge may request a retry of two different elements, if necessary, upon the request of a member of the judging panel should it potentially change the overall evaluation of the test from a "Retry" to a "Pass."

## Adult Bronze Free Skating Test (new TR 23.10)

Demonstrate a command of the following required elements:

- a. At least three single jumps.
  - 1. One must be a Salchow
  - 2. One must be a toe loop
- b. One jump combination consisting of a waltz jump and a toe loop with no turn between jumps.
- c. Spins
  - 1. A one-foot upright spin (minimum 4 revolutions in position).
  - 2. A one-foot back spin entry optional (minimum 3 revolutions in position).
  - 3. A sit spin (minimum 3 revolutions in position).
- d. Steps, edges and connecting moves throughout the program.

Duration: Not to exceed one minute forty seconds to music of the skater's choice. Two different elements may be retried, if necessary.

Passing Average: 2.5

Passing Total: 5.0

#### Adult Silver Free Skating Test (new TR 23.11)

Demonstrate a command of the following required elements:

- a. At least three different single jumps.
  - 1. One must be a loop
  - 2. One must be a flip
- b. One jump combination consisting of two single jumps with no turn between the jumps.
- c. One jump sequence consisting of one-half revolution or single revolution jumps of the skater's choice.
- d. Spins
  - 1. One camel spin (minimum 3 revolutions in position).
  - 2. One layback, attitude or sit spin (minimum 4 revolutions in position).

- 3. One combination spin with only one change of position (change of foot is optional) (minimum 3 revolutions in each position).
- e. Connecting moves incorporating spirals, strong edges, fair use of the music and full utilization of the ice surface.

Duration: Not to exceed two minutes ten seconds to music of the skater's choice. Two different elements may be retried, if necessary.

Passing Average: 2.7

Passing Total: 5.4

## Adult Gold Free Skating Test (new TR 23.12)

Demonstrate a command of the following required elements:

- a. Axel
- b. Lutz jump
- c. Two additional single jumps of the skater's choice.
- d. One jump chosen from the following:
  - 1. Split
  - 2. Stag
  - 3. Falling Leaf
  - 4. Half Loop
- e. One jump combination consisting of two different single jumps with no turn between jumps.
- f. At least three spins
  - 1. One must be a combination spin consisting of at least one change of position and only one change of foot (minimum 4 revolutions on each foot).
  - 2. Solo spins must have a minimum of 4 revolutions in position.
- g. One step sequence either straight line or circular.
- h. Connecting moves incorporating spirals, strong edges, good use of the music and full utilization of the ice surface.

*Duration*: Not to exceed two minutes, forty seconds to music of the skater's choice. Two different elements may be retried, if necessary.

Passing Average: 3.0

Passing Total: 6.0

2. APPROVED to allow adult skaters (25 years of age or older) who have passed the Adult Gold Free Skating Test to take the standard Intermediate Free Skating Test without testing the standard Pre-Preliminary through Juvenile Free Skating Tests first. (TR 2.053)

## SPORTS MEDICINE COMMITTEE

1. APPROVED to adopt the Guidelines for Medical Care as developed by the Sports Medicine Committee for use at the U.S. Figure Skating Championships.

- 2. REFER BACK TO THE SPORTS MEDICINE COMMIT-TEE the motion to require a pre-participation physical examination of each competitor in qualifying competitions, the completed history and physician's form to be due at Headquarters by the same date as the competition entry deadline. This would go into effect for the 1997-98 competition season. Final logistics concerning confidential receipt and medical review of the forms will be completed by the end of 1996. The pre-participation physical examination form developed and endorsed by the major U.S. pediatrics and sports medicine associations will be utilized, with the addition of some specific questions added to assist Sports Medicine/Sports Science in identification of problems that need to be addressed, and to evaluate needs and effectiveness of the Outreach programs.
- 3. DID NOT APPROVE the motion that the Selections
  Committee take into consideration current Red Cross
  first aid and basic life support certification as enhancements to an individual's credentials when making Team
  Leader selections for teams with which no physician is
  traveling. This recommendation applies to only one of
  the team leaders, when a team has two.



## Goodbye To A Dear Friend

Many in the U.S. figure skating community were saddened by the recent news of the Sept. 1 death of world-class physiotherapist Haik Gharibians at his home in Vancouver, B.C., Canada.

As physiotherapist for numerous U.S. figure skating teams since 1984, Gharibians, 61, served a vital role in tending to the overall health and well-being of hundreds of U.S. skaters appearing in major international competitions.

But, it was perhaps his calming presence, warm personality and numerous and diverse talents outside of the training room that endeared him most to the athletes, coaches and officials with whom he worked.

"Haik was a wonderful, kind man who always treated the athletes equally," said 1988 Olympic Champion Brian Boitano. "In the middle of all the pressure and stress of a competition week, Haik was a source of calm for the skaters."

Because he was such a multi-faceted individual, Gharibians' prescriptions for stress and tension came in many different forms.

As a gourmet chef, co-owner of a Vancouver health food restaurant called "Tomato Fresh Food Cafe" and co-host of a Saturday morning cooking show on Canadian television, Gharibians was just as likely to cook up a gourmet meal as offer a rubdown to ease a skater's tensions. In his informal role as Team Comedian, Gharibians knew that sometimes laughter was the best medicine and he always came prepared with an ample supply of jokes and pranks.

"He was a great guy. His door was always open to the skaters," said reigning U.S. Pair Champion Todd Sand. "Certainly, I've had my share of (physical) problems over the years and he was always there for me. I remember him giving me daily massages just so I could make it through the (1995) Worlds in Birmingham."

Sand added that Gharibians was the first person he told of his wedding proposal to his pair partner and now wife Jenni Meno. Gharibians served as the House Manager at a rented home in Lillehammer that served as the U.S. Team's getaway during those Games.

In a show of thanks and admiration for his



longtime association with the USFSA, Gharibians was honored at the 1994 USFSA Governing Council Meeting in Providence, R.I.

Gharibians was born Feb. 4, 1935 in Iran to Armenian-born parents. His father was a textile engineer and factory owner and relocated frequently. He was educated in Germany and Lebanon before graduating from the University of Zurich (Switzerland) in 1961. He later attended the University of Southern California in Los Angeles. After practicing physiotherapy in Los Angeles, Gharibians moved to Vancouver in the 1960s, where he lived until the time of his death. Gharibians' death is believed to have been caused by cardiac arrest.

This picture of Nancy Kerrigan, Gharibians and Kristi Yamaguchi was one of Gharibians' favorites and it hung on the wall of his physical therapy clinic in Vancouver.

He is survived by a son, Mark, 25, and a daughter, Pam, 27, both of Vancouver.

The Gharibians' family has requested donations in memory of Haik Gharibians be made to: The Heart and Stroke Foundation of British Columbia and Yukon, 1212 Broadway, Vancouver, B.C. V6H 3VN Canada.

Brian Boitano perhaps summed up the feelings of all those who knew him, by saying, "I was fond of him, I respected him and I appreciated his supportive personality. I will miss him."

#### Hey Buddy,

Remember when I met you and you said, "Little presents make big friends, always remember that," and you gave me a book? How right you were. There are no words to describe our incredible friendship, and I loved you without reservation, as all of us did.

When I learned you were gone, I ran to find some reminder of you to hold on to. I wrapped my warm-up suit jacket around my waist; the one you gave me at '92 Worlds...Amid my inconsolable sadness, I laughed at all the wonderful times we had.

Should I tell everyone how mischievous you were, trying to con me into "stealing" the leftover table decorations once Atlanta Skate America was over for your catering party? You were too "distinguished" to try yourself. I never had so much fun watching you fall down the escalator from laughing and hiding as I yelled. "Thief Thief" in


Burden "works on" Gharibians, who in turn works on an unknown skater at the 1992 Worlds in Oakland.



#### Colorado Springs' seamstress Karen Mortenson outfits skaters around the world

aren Mortenson stands in her office and opens up a photo album filled with pictures of skaters she has outfitted through the years.

"Oh, look at her!" she says, pointing to a picture of a 3-year-old girl in a pink-and-white skating outfit. "She was so cute, when she put on her dress for a fitting. We couldn't get her to take it off!"

Turning the pages of her photo album, Mortenson points out more skaters she has outfitted. National and world competitors Jill Trenary, Elizabeth Punsalan and Jerod Swallow, Renee Roca and Gorsha Sur and Scott Davis to name just a few, grace the pages of Mortenson's albums and appear in pictures on the wall of her Colorado Springs, Colo., store — M&M Designs.

While Mortenson is proud of the outfits she has designed for many of the world's most recognized skaters, it is often the reaction of the less accomplished skaters that bring her the most joy.

"The little kid who is a preliminary lady comes in, looks in the mirror with her

new dress on and is on top of the world," she said.


Mortenson is the seamstress to the skaters. In her small shop, she creates designs for skaters competing at the World Figure Skating Championships and the local non-qualifying competitions. She has made outfits for skaters from Australia, Greece, Canada, Korea, Japan and has often never met the skaters that she sews for. Her business has grown by word-of-mouth and has forced her to move her operation, once housed in her garage to a four-room store close to the Colorado Springs World Arena.

"It has really grown over the years," she said while looking back through more photo albums that she keeps in her store. Her list of clients is lengthy and she keeps an index card of each of them filed in a Rolodex with their measurements listed.

But Mortenson doesn't like to single out skaters she has made outfits for.

"There have just been so many through the years," she said. "Each one of them has been special."

But the pictures that line her wall are a happy reminder of who has worn her originals, so is the United States map with thumbtacks marking the cities where skaters wearing her designs live and train.



Her outfits have come a long way since the beginning. Mortenson started making skating outfits for her daughter MeLeah while living in Troy, Ohio. Without a lot of skating patterns on the market or lycra fabric available Mortenson went to work on outfitting her daughter for skating.

"I took just regular patterns and pieced them together," she said. "MeLeah would go to the rink and the mothers would say 'Where'd you get that?"" Soon she found herself not only sewing skating dresses for MeLeah, but for other kids at the rink in Troy. She took orders from roller skaters in Dayton, Ohio, and began to design the costumes for the ice show in Troy.

Mortenson's husband was transferred to New Orleans and that is where Mortenson continued to make skating dresses. She bought fabric at the carnival marts and when they were about to move again, she packed up her sewing machine and headed to Colorado Springs, Colo.

MeLeah skated at the Broadmoor World Arena and her dresses caught the attention of the other elite skaters there.

"With Carlo and Christa Fassi at the Broadmoor, so many wonderful skaters came through and some of them would ask me to make them outfits," she said.

When MeLeah quit skating, Mortenson said "I have to do something."

So, she kept making skating outfits and her client list continued to grow. MeLeah's former skating coach Christy Krall took note of her student's dresses and outfitted her three daughters with some of Mortenson's creations.



said Krall, now the USFSA's National Program Director. "Often we would stop by Mrs. Mortenson's house to pick up skating dresses on our way out of town to go to a skating competition and at the competition they always looked so darling."

Krall also credits Mortenson with creating flattering outfits for male athletes like her former student, Senior competitor Jere Michael.

"Gentlemen are so difficult to fit," she said. "But, she really makes their physical appearance look wonderful on the ice."

Besides creating skating outfits, Mortenson also has assisted in Skaters' Services at the U.S. Championships. At the 1988 U.S. Championships, she recalls helping Brian Boitano with his outfit before he took the ice and actually sewing one skater into his costume.

Before Mortenson made skating outfits, her originals included draperies and her husband's suits. She learned to sew in school "like everyone else," but never took a class in pattern making.

"They never offered such a thing," she said.

Instead, Mortenson has learned to make her own patterns, making small adjustments to them through the years.

When a new or old client calls her to make an outfit, Mortenson tells them she needs six to eight weeks to complete the outfit. Each athlete fills out a measurement sheet and for the athletes who live in town, she is able to conduct a fitting session.

Often Mortenson never meets the athletes for whom she designs. In those cases, the clients mail her a copy of their music and she begins to contemplate skating outfits.

"I listen to the music, send them some drawings and then go to work," she said. "When I mail it out, I take a chance and pray."

Mortenson describes herself as lucky for never having had a disgruntled athlete return an outfit.



Skaters who stop by Mortenson's shop for fittings have made a game out of sticking a thumbtack in the location of their hometown on the map that hangs near the front door. Since it's only a map of the U.S., Mortenson says overseas clients have resorted to sticking their thumbtacks "somewhere in the ocean."

"Sometimes there are minor adjustments to be made like a sleeve needing to be loosened or a skirt hemmed, but otherwise the skaters have liked their outfits," she said.

Once Mortenson begins working on an outfit she will put countless hours into completing it. She works in her store from early in the morning until 6 or 7 p.m. At home, she beads the skating outfits until 1:00 or 2:00 in the morning, "just to stay on top of things," she said.

"You put in a lot of hours," she said. "Really, there is a lot of strain. Sometimes, people don't realize what it takes. They think you can do it in one day."

But Mortenson says she feels most satisfied when a young skater comes in and doesn't know what she wants because in the end, "you can make them feel like a million bucks," she said.

The average cost of one of Mortenson's outfits is between \$400-\$600.

"By the time you figure in the cost of the fabric, beading and labor, it is impossible to make a competition outfit for less than \$250," she said.

Mortenson's pleased customers span the globe. She has sewn for British Ice Dancer Christopher Dean and created Olympic outfits for Australian pairs team Danielle and Steve Carr. She made competition outfits for six athletes competing at the 1997 World Junior Selection Competition in August.

That meant crunch time for Mortenson who was getting ready to mail out Brittney McConn's long program dress and finish up on Derrick Delmore's outfits with just 2 1/2 weeks before the competition.

Delmore, who has been wearing Mortenson's originals for two years now, said that the time Mortenson puts into his outfits is obvious.

"They fit perfect, they are exquisite," he said. "She has great imagination and attention to details."

Delmore said he was anxiously looking forward to seeing his new short program outfit.

"She kind of scared me at first because she and my coach were talking about using pink fabric," he said. "I really didn't want to skate in pink."

But Delmore's concerns were alleviated when he learned that his short program outfit would be made from a wine-colored fabric.

Mortenson's years of experience making skating outfits have given her a unique insight into the sport of figure skating. She said that "dancers always come in with a good idea of what they

want." And she has a prediction for how skating outfits will look in the future.

"I see it going back to more traditional, getting away from the high necks and open backs. I think we'll see more straight sleeves, scoop necks and scoop backs," she said. But, as far as the men's fashions are concerned, "Guys really don't change too much."


"I don't think any of the outfits are famous, they are just skating outfits," she said. "A skating dress is a skating dress."

It's the people whose images appear in Mortenson's photo albums that make her smile. "It has been just so wonderful meeting all of these people. And it's not just the skaters but their parents and coaches that are so interesting."

And the parents and coaches are appreciative of her efforts to make their athletes look good on the ice.

"You can hear them 'oohing' and 'aahing' when Derrick stepped on the ice. Her outfits looked so good," Delmore's mother Yvonne said.





## Robin Lee


U.S. Junior Men's champion (1932), National bronze medalist (1933), National silver medalist (1934), U.S. champion (1935-1939).

Robin Lee won the first of his five consecutive National titles at the age of 15 and was a member of the 1932 and 1936 World Teams and the 1936 Olympic Team. He had been named to the 1940 Olympic Team, prior to the cancellation of the Games due to the war.

Following his stellar competitive career, he skated with Ice Capades and Ice Cycles as a professional before turning to teaching in Winnipeg, Chicago, St. Paul and Minneapolis. He taught for more than 35 years before retiring and now lives in Golden Valley, Minn., where he enjoys fishing, playing golf and writing poetry.

Both of his step-children Robin Craig and Sharon skated and taught skating, which Sharon continues to do.

Robin Lee has the distinction of being the oldest living U.S. Men's champion; he turns 77 in December. He was inducted into the U.S. Figure Skating Hall of Fame in 1995.



## Ronald Robertson

U.S. Novice champion (1950), U.S. Junior champion (1952), U.S. Senior silver medalist (1953, 1956), bronze medalist (1954); North American bronze medalist (1953); Worlds silver medalist (1955-56); Olympic silver medalist (1956).

Robertson was the center pin of the powerful U.S. triumvirate that made a clean sweep of the Men's medals at the 1955 and 1956 Worlds and at the 1956 Olympics, along with Hayes Alan and David Jenkins. It was the last time U.S. men achieved such overwhelming success.

Robertson began skating at the famed rink in Paramount, Calif. His father helped Frank Zamboni design the very first ice machine, and Zamboni helped sponsor Robertson's training. He later studied

with both Gus Lussi in Lake Placid and Edi Scholdan (who died in the 1961 airplane crash) in Colorado, during what he calls "the early Golden Age of the '40s and '50s" at the Broadmoor in Colorado Springs.

Known as one of the greatest and fastest spinners in the world, he gave the "blur" spin its name with his incredible rotations.

Robertson became a popular performer with Ice Capades and Holiday on Ice through 1971. He began teaching, then returned to skating to win the World Professional title in Tokyo in 1974, retired again to teach and returned to star at Knott's

Berry Farms ice shows in 1978 and 1979. He moved to Arizona and was involved in real estate. He returned to California in 1991 and again started coaching part-time. He has conducted seminars in Hong Kong every year since, as well as classes throughout the country. "Two highlights of this return to coaching," he says, "was the opportunity to work with Brian Boitano and Kristi Yamaguchi. This was very thrilling." He makes his home in Irvine, Calif.

Ronald Robertson was inducted into the World Hall of Fame in 1993.

Tenley Albright Blakeley's brilliant skating career brought her international fame and resulted in her being the first U.S. woman to win both the World and Olympic titles. The fierce competition between her and Carol Heiss resulted in some classic matches during the 1950s.



Shunning major professional offers, when she retired from competition, she continued her education at Radcliffe and Harvard Medical School from which she graduated in 1961. She joined both her father and brother in medical practice, specializing in general surgery where she also has had an outstanding career.

She is the recipient of eight honorary Doctor's degrees from various universities for her many contributions to both medicine and society. She currently has affiliations with 21 organizations and previously with 14 others, including the U.S. Olympic Committee, Harvard Medical School, NAACP, Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution, Whitehead Institute for Biomedical Research. American Heart Association, American Medical Society, New England Cancer Society, Soviet-American Medical Student Exchange, President's Council on Physical Fitness, and others.

Married to Gerald Blakeley, Jr., she has three daughters, Rhys, Elin and Elee Emma, and continues to live and practice in her hometown of Boston.

She has been honored by the Harvard University Hall of Fame, the U.S. Olympic Committee Hall of Fame and was inducted into the World Figure Skating Hall of Fame in 1976.

U.S. Pair silver medalists (1946-47), U.S. Pair champions (1948-52); North American bronze medalist (1947), North American Pair champions (1949, 1951); World Pair silver medalists (1947, 1949, 1951-52), World Pair champions 1950; Olympic silver medalists (1952).

The Kennedys have the distinction of being the first Americans to ever win the World Pair title. Members of six World and two Olympic Teams, no other U.S. Pair has ever equaled this brother and sister's record on the international scene.

Three years after his Olympic silver medal, Peter Kennedy entered the 1956 Olympic Trials in skiing, his other passion. He has been



in the ski industry as a sales representative and manufacturer for the past 40 years. He and his wife Sally have three children, Tom, Sarah and Susan and live on Mercer Island in Washington.

Karol Kennedy Kucher has been married for 43 years and has six children: John, Kathryn, Suzanne, Charlie, Mary Jane and Heidi. She enjoyed being a "stay-at-home mother and

wife" in Seattle until three years ago. "My eldest son talked me into opening a children's store," she said. "My youngest daughter works and buys with me." When time allows, she can usually be found playing duplicate bridge.

In recognition of their outstanding achievements, the Kennedys were inducted into the U.S. Hall of Fame in 1991.

## Holly Cook Tanner

U.S. National Ladies bronze medalist (1990); World bronze medalist (1990).

Training in Utah, away from the major centers, Holly Cook Tanner made her way through the ranks of National Junior and Senior Ladies, with a fourth at the 1987 World Juniors and a fourth at the 1989 U.S. Championships. In 1990, she joined Jill Trenary on the world podium in Halifax, Nova Scotia, marking only the sixth time two U.S. Ladies had medalled in the same year. Following that successful season and a summer on the Tour of World Figure Skating Champions, Holly Cook retired from competitive skating. She married Jason Tanner in 1992 and the couple have two children: Payden, 2 years, and infant

Montana who was born in March 1996.

Born and raised in Bountiful, Utah, Mrs. Tanner now teaches skating at the same rink in which she trained to become a national and world medalist, sharing her knowledge with those who would follow her lead. The family makes its home in nearby Kaysville, Utah.

## Elaine Zayak

U.S. Junior Ladies champion (1979); World Junior champion (1979); U.S. Ladies champion (1981), bronze medalist (1982, 1984), silver medalist (1983); World silver medalist (1981), World Ladies champion (1982), World bronze medalist (1984).

One of America's most popular skaters of the '80s, Zayak was notable for her mastery of the triple jump which carried her to national and world titles, being the first woman to capture both the World Junior and Senior crowns. Following the Sarajevo Olympics and the withdrawal of Rosalynn Sumners and Tiffany Chin, and due to an entry form error, she was the only lady to represent the United States at the 1984 Worlds, a situation which had not occurred since 1948 and has not happened since.

In 1994, she was one of

the very first professionals to reinstate and return to eligible competition at the Detroit Nationals. After a 10-year absence, she was greeted with an overwhelming ovation and continues to be an audience favorite.

Following her earlier triumphs, the I.S.U. passed what generally has been referred to as the "Zayak Rule," stating that a jump cannot be repeated except in combination in the long program.

Today, she continues to skate professionally and coaches up-and-coming skaters in the New Jersey area, near her Ridgeway home, while planning her forthcoming wedding.

## David Santee



U.S. Junior Men's champion (1971), National bronze medalist (1973, 1977, 1979, 1982), National silver medalist (1976, 1978, 1980-81); World silver medalist (1981).

Few people will forget David Santee's signature "Rocky" program or his tightly fought battle for the gold at the 1981 Worlds in Hartford, Conn. "Standing on the podium at Worlds in '81 with Scott Hamilton, becoming the first Americans to finish 1-2 in 23 years, was one of the highlights of my career," he says, and adds, "I am also proud of the fact that I competed in seven consecutive

World Championships and two Olympics."

The mid-'70s to the mid-'80s were a turnaround era of the sport athletically in the United States and the names of Santee, Hamilton, Charlie Tickner, Gordon McKellen, Terry Kubicka and Robert Wagenhoffer dominated the sport for almost a decade.

Following his retirement from the amateur ranks, he toured for three years with the fabled John Curry Skating Company and competed on the professional circuit. He then moved back to his hometown of Park Ridge, Ill., to begin coach-

ing and eventually became Director of Skating. "My community was so supportive during my career, I really wanted to come back to build a skating program here," Santee explained. He has also been active with the Illinois Special Olympics for the past seven years.

He has two sons, Christopher, age 9, and Michael, 6, who is just starting to compete in USFSA competitions. His younger brother James was also a popular amateur and professional skater.

Editor's Note: Following is an excerpted letter by skating parent Apryl Mohajer-Rahbari of Van Nuys, Calif., that appeared in a recent issue of the Los Angeles FSC newsletter. It is reprinted here with the permission of the author. While the letter details the activities of the Colorado Springs, Colo., training camp June 1-2, the accompanying photographs show attendees at the USFSA Regional Training Camp, July 21-23, in Minneapolis, MN.

My daughter, Mariam, and I had one of our most fruitful and delightful skating experiences when we recently attended the new USFSA Regional Training camp for Preliminary to Novice skaters hosted by the Broadmoor Skating Club in Colorado Springs, Colo. I cannot urge you enough to try and attend one of the regional camps. The Colorado Springs camp included on-ice sessions specializing in areas of spins, jumps, Moves In the Field, power stroking, footwork and choreography/style.

The USFSA's three inaugural

The skaters were divided into groups by test level with the largest group being 23 Juvenile skaters but the rest of the groups were about 20 skaters each. Even though the skaters were grouped by testing, since they came from many states with a variety of competition practices, there was a diversity in abilities.

For example, in the Juvenile group, many skaters were inconsistent with their double toes, and most did not have a double loop strong enough to take into a competition yet, and a handful did not have a double loop at all. In the Intermediate group, about five skaters could land a double Axel. However, the varying levels did not really impact the classes since the



coaches were instructing good form essential at any level.

In addition, there were so many coaches that they would breakdown into smaller groups to work on more individual skills. Even Kathy Casey spent the weekend teaching on-ice classes to all the levels attending.

The off-ice classes were for both parents and skaters, but they were given separately. The skaters had classes on nutrition, weight training, strength/flexibility, psychology, judges' view and life issues.

The parents had classes in nutrition, psychology, judges' view, life issues, costumes/makeup and accounting.

The judges class was particularly wonderful giving everyone an opportunity to ask those burning questions. It was interesting that in some regions, the judges encourage the parents to ask them questions during the competition regarding how their child scored. The parents were told to see the referee, whom would then arrange a meeting with several of the judges, the skater, and the parents and/or coach.

The nutrition class was great in that it stressed moderation rather than deprivation as the key. They also said that a skater's diet should be about 70 percent carbohydrates since that is the type of energy burned in skating.

Costuming suggested simple but elegant outfits that tie into the music, and are appropriate for the age, level and body type of the child. They were concerned about over decoration and definitely no low bustlines or bare midriffs.

In psychology, they encouraged the parents to ask their skater what makes them most comfortable before, during and after a competition, and then try your best to fulfill their reasonable requests to enhance their competition performance.

In the life issues class, they were very emphatic about the skaters needing to stay in school. Also, they particularly stressed the need for the child to have a balanced life that included activities outside of skating. It was nice to see that they were concerned about those who skate as a hobby, as well as the competitive skaters.

Most impressive was the numerous volunteers (even Shelby Lyons) that were everywhere trying to be helpful in any way.

Agreed on by many, the most outstanding activity was an hour motivational talk given by Kathy Casey. She is an incredibly positive personality that insists that the entire arena operation should be cooperative. Coaches freely interchange lessons of students and are asked to leave if they cannot work positively with their fellow staff members and skaters. She firmly believes in a positive frame of mind and says that it takes 11 positives to counterbalance just one negative

thought. Kathy strongly felt that summer competitions are the time to tryout one or two new things in a program in order to have the opportunity to perfect them. She said that if a student was landing a jump 40 percent of the time or more, that it could go in. It was then at the fall competitions that a lower risk pro-9500 2nd Ave. gram should be finalized. to compete in the professional ranks. "I've enjoyed my competitive career and want to continue because I believe that my ultimate performance is still out there," he said. He maintains that

he would still like to earn a degree in sports medicine someday, but that skating will always be a part of his life.

But, what really keeps me motivated is that I know I haven't reached my potential, so it is both challenging and exciting to continue working toward that goal," he said. "I feel really happy and comfortable here. I guess that's the most important thing."

In the end, that's all anybody could wish for a proven champion who came to New England looking for a little change in scenery.

## The Application of Plyometric Training for Today's Figure Skater

Figure skating at the elite level involves a tremendous amount of athleticism that requires a unique blend of cardiovascular endurance and the ability to generate great force and power during the execution of a variety of jumps. Skaters must complete triple and even quadruple jumps during a program while maintaining heart rates of 90-95 percent of maximum heart rate reserve.

Judges and fans alike constantly look for higher and faster jumps. The challenge for the strength and conditioning professional is to help the athlete jump higher and skate faster throughout a short and long program. Plyometric training — when implemented in a responsible, sensible manner — can greatly improve these abilities. However, before we discuss the scientific principles and program design for plyometric training, I need to caution skaters, coaches and parents as to the risks involved with this type of training.

A skater's leg strength should be assessed before embarking on a plyometric program. Athletes should generally not attempt a moderate or highgrade plyometric routine unless they are capable of squatting to 3/4-depth with a weight of 1.5 times their body weight. To reach this strength level typically takes six to 12 months for an adolescent who performs strength training programs three times a week. Insufficient leg and trunk strength will lead to breakdown in form during the execution of jumps, which could lead to low back and knee injuries.

Plyometric training should never be

implemented like a cardiovascular training routine — more is not better with regards to plyometric training. Full recovery between sets is essential while keeping the number of foot — contacts to a minimum.

Fatigue should never be a part of plyometric program design.

The coach must also know his/her athlete. Kinesthetic proprioception (the sense of where each body part is in space) when doing a collection of hops, bounds and jumps is critically important. The skater must constantly be coached as to core (trunk) stability awareness and proper execution of the plyometric exercise being done. The number of total foot contacts for a particular plyometric training regimen must also be monitored carefully as an overtraining syndrome could quickly result.

The most critical point for a skating coach and strength and conditioning coach to realize is that plyometric training is a complex motor skill which should be taught progressively and conservatively.

Frequency of plyometric training should not exceed twice per week and should never be done on consecutive days. The more intense the training protocol, the longer the recovery period should be. In training our elite athletes, we will usually perform plyometric training on Tuesdays and Thursdays with one day being a light to moderate intensity day and the next being a moderate to high intensity day.

Pre-pubescent skaters should never engage in moderate- to high-intensity plyometric training. More mature skaters should progress from low- to moderate- to high-intensity exercises over a conservative period of time. Damage to the soft tissues and the growth plates within the long bones can occur if the jumping load is too high.

We generally periodize and progress our skaters in a plyometric routine over several microcycles with each cycle lasting nine to 12 weeks. We may utilize low intensity exercises for nine to 12 weeks working on kinesthetic proprioception.

Once the athlete has mastered exercises in the low-intensity range, we will advance them to the moderate exercise category. We may stay in this range for six to nine weeks. Finally, if we feel the athlete is capable, we will advance them to high and very high intensity exercises. High to very high intensity exercises will be done for three to five weeks — corresponding to and peaking for the skater's competitive cycle.

Some low-intensity plyometric exercises can be found below (National Strength and Conditioning Association's Adaptation of the Plyometric Stress Continuum). We suggest using these exercises when initiating the program although there are a myriad of other exercises which can also be done.

Low Intensity Plyometric Activities Note: All are performed on two feet, except skipping

- Jump rope
- Hip twist bounce
- Lateral bounce (side to side)
- Lateral bound (in skating position)
- Tuck jump (knee to chest)
- Parallel squat jump
- Standing long jump
- Skipping, emphasizing height

Finally, a thorough set of warm-up exercises should be performed before beginning a plyometric training session. Footwear and landing surfaces must have good shock absorbing qualities.
