An Idea Whose Time Has Come

Newly instituted I.S.U. Athletes Commission will give athletes a voice

tion of sports has become an important issue of late. With the enormous increase in financial sports revenue worldwide, athletes need to play a more substantive role in the decision-making process of their respective organizations. While the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) and our own USFSA have taken pioneering positions in this area, internationally the role of the athlete has not been fully recognized. Just this year, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) has decided to reinvigorate the role of the IOC Athletes Commission by opening a majority of the Commission positions to direct election. During the Atlanta Olympic Games, participating athletes voted for their respective Summer representatives, and in Nagano 1998, three remaining positions will be filled by direct athlete vote.

Following this lead, the I.S.U. at its 1996 Davos Congress favorably agreed to the formation of an I.S.U. Athletes Commission for which I was honored to accept the role as chairperson. The geographically diverse Commission will be comprised of athletes representative of the disciplines of singles, precision, dance, pairs, speed and short track. I am proud to announce that three-time Olympic Champion Tomas Gustafson of Sweden has agreed to assist me on the speedskating side.

Our goal will be to become the liaison to the I.S.U. Council and Congress on behalf of all I.S.U. athletes so as to ensure that their views and opinions are considered in administrative policies, as well as to act as an interpretive

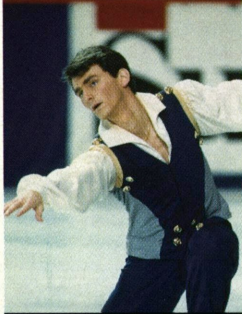

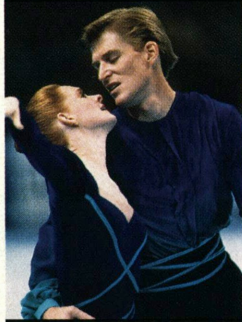

I.S.U. President advocates use of instant replay

Remote controls and VCRs may soon be tools of the trade for judges at international skating competitions, if International Skating Union President Ottavio Cinquanta has his way.



CINQUANTA

Cinquanta said recently he favors judges having videotape or "instant" replay at their disposal to assist them in assessing the individual elements of a program.

"The judge is being judged by TV replays," Cinquanta said at a Skate America news conference. "Why not

give it to the judge?"

He said instant replay should be particularly useful to judges of the technical programs in ladies' and men's singles. He said he favors a system whereby the videotape footage of a program could be marked at the point that a required element is executed to facilitate a quick review.

Such a system would place higher expectations on judges, Cinquanta acknowledged.

"First, we have to convince the judges, but we will make it," he said, adding that he would like to see instant replay used on a trial basis as early as next season.

Skaters sought for international event

The USFSA currently is seeking applications from skaters under the age of 13 interested in participating in a new international club competition, March 28-29, 1997, in Milan, Italy.

The USFSA-endorsed event, being conducted under the auspices of the USFSA Program Development Committee and sponsored by the Park FSC, will feature competition among skaters from France, Italy and the United States in girls' and boys' singles free skating. Skaters must not have reached the age of 13 by March 27, 1997, in order to be considered. Four

U.S. boys and four U.S. girls will be selected from among the applicants based upon test and competition records.

Airfare, housing and meals are the responsibility of the participant(s) and costs are estimated at \$1,500 per person.

The application deadline for the Milan competition is Dec. 20, 1997.

Two top U.S. pairs announce plans to retire, split

Two top U.S. pair teams recently have announced plans to split or retire.

Romina Baron and **Richard Alexander**, both of Hollywood Hills, Calif., announced plans to retire from eligible competition in October. Baron and Alexander finished seventh in

both the 1995 and 1996 U.S. Championships.

More recently, **Sara Ward** of Montclair, N.J., and **Lance Travis** of Greensboro, N.C., announced plans to split after a sixth-place finish at Skate America. The pair was fifth at the 1996 U.S. Championships.

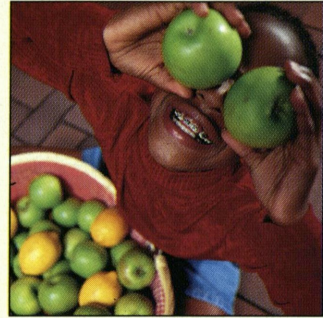
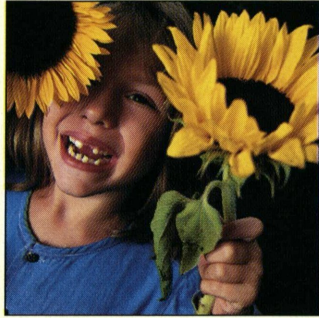

Thrifty Car Rental Skate America International '96

The Campaign Begins.

In the waning days of the U.S. election season, international figure skating kicked off its 1996-1997 campaign with a three-day New England primary that featured strong outings by a couple of well-established frontrunners and surprise showings by a few darkhorses.

But, after all of the votes were counted at Thrifty Car Rental Skate America International 96, Oct. 31-Nov. 3, it was a landslide victory by the American ladies that generated the greatest excitement inside the Springfield (Mass.) Civic Center.

The 1-2-3 finish by U.S. ladies Michelle Kwan, Tonia Kwiatkowski and Sydne Vogel respectively was both historically and immediately significant. It marked the first time since 1982 that the United States had swept the ladies' event at Skate America. Moreover, the sweep vaulted the United States over Russia, 6-5, in the final medal count.

While nagging injuries and 11th-hour withdrawals kept the slate of competitors in its usual state of flux up to Opening Ceremonies, 60 of the world's best skaters were on hand for the first major event of the international skating season.

For the second consecutive season, the spoils for the victors were enhanced by the event's designation as the first of six Champions Series of Figure Skating competitions. While the politicians battled for votes, skating's best were challenging for lucrative cash prizes (\$30,000 for first place; \$18,000 for second; and \$10,000 for third) and the first available qualifying points in this season's Champions Series.

Among those expected to reap the maximum rewards at Skate America were Americans Kwan and Todd Eldredge — both making their first appearance in a major international competition since capturing the world titles in March. Both were looking to successfully defend their 1995 Skate America titles and get off to the same quick start that proved so beneficial last season.

A landslide victory by the American ladies highlights the first major event of the international skating season.

While Kwan was simply meeting the heightened expectations that come with the title of world champion, Kwiatkowski and Vogel — by outskating Top 10 '96 Worlds finishers Maria Butyrskaya of Russia and Hanae Yokoya of Japan — were delivering

the strongest statements about the current depth of talent in the U.S. ladies ranks.

Vogel was particularly impressive in only her second international competition as a senior. Skating just before Kwiatkowski, the 17-year-old Vogel appeared stronger than ever before in the execution of her short program to "Me and My Girl." Her presentation marks ranging from 5.4-5.6 were a timely reward for her ongoing efforts to improve her style.

Next, Kwiatkowski endeared herself to the audience by exhibiting a great deal of confidence and personality in her performance to "There's No Business Like Show Business." A 4.9 mark for required elements and 5.1 for presentation from a Czech Republic judge were clearly out of the range of the other marks (5.3-5.6 for required elements and 5.4-5.6 for presentation) and were heartily booed by the crowd.

"I was happy with the way I skated," Kwiatkowski said following her performance. "I did my job and the judges have to do their job. I was pleased with the marks."

Four skaters later, Kwan also was marked comparatively low by the same judge for required elements in

her seemingly flawless program to "Dream of Desdemona" by Jules Massenet. The low mark, however, was not enough to keep her from earning all nine first-place ordinals. While others may have had difficulty finding fault with her performance, Kwan did not.

"I wouldn't say it was perfect. There were little mistakes...some of the head and arm movements and a finger was a little bent," said Kwan.

Despite Kwan's admissions of imperfection, the real suspense entering the free skate was not centered around who would win, but whether the Americans could hold off any foreign invasions onto the medal platform.

Vogel, skating third in the final group of six, did little to diminish the drama in her free skate as she opened strong by solidly landing her first eight jumps, including three combina-

tions, but finished by falling on her triple Lutz and triple Salchow and singling her double Axel. Her marks of 5.4-5.6 for technical merit and 5.3-5.6 for presentation were enough to push her into the lead with Yokoya of Japan as the only non-American left to skate.

Next on the ice, Kwan transformed the Springfield Civic Center into the Taj Mahal with her portrayal of an Indian queen for whom that legendary palace was built. Set to music by Azerbaijani composer Fikret Amirov and French film composer Maurice Jarre, Kwan's "Taj Mahal" again exhibited her love for combining an intricate, exotic storyline with highly technical skating elements. While telling the story behind the making of the Taj Mahal, she reeled off six of her seven planned triple jumps (singling her

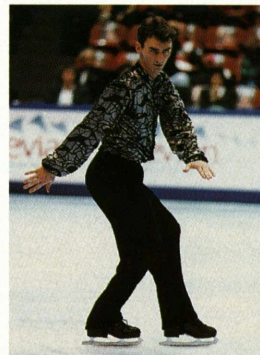
triple loop) with three of those coming in the last 40 seconds of the program. Her marks of 5.6-5.8 for technical merit and 5.8-5.9 were easily enough to secure her second consecutive Skate America title.

"A lot of jumps were a little shaky and I'm not in top shape yet," Kwan said. "But, I had a goal to go out and pull in all of my jumps and feel good when I stepped off the ice and I think we succeeded at that. I did try my best."

With her fellow Americans in first and second place and Yokoya out of medal contention by virtue of her disappointing free skate, Kwiatkowski took to the ice as the final skater of the evening knowing a solid performance would seal the sweep for the United States. Debuting her "Hungarian Rhapsody" program, the 25-year-old U.S. silver medalist delivered on both counts with the second-ranked performance of the night to finish in the silver-medal position ahead of Vogel.

Men

In 1994, Todd Eldredge watched on TV as Russia's Alexei Urmanov skated to Olympic gold in Lillehammer and wondered if he would ever again have the opportunity to compete at Urmanov's level.

Two years later, Urmanov watched Eldredge in Springfield and wondered aloud what might be needed to overtake the reigning world champion.

"It's a very difficult question," Urmanov said when asked what it would take to beat Eldredge these days. "I think it would take a quadruple jump, if he didn't complete one of course, or another more difficult combination."

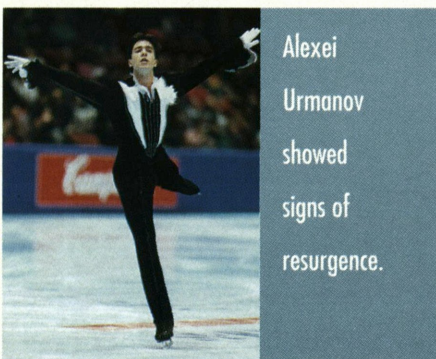

Urmanov's bewilderment is understandable, particularly given the dominating performances Eldredge exhibited in his first major international competition since Worlds.

Eldredge applied the pressure early with a seemingly flawless short program performed to "Walk on the Wild Side" from the movie "Casino." From his soaring opening triple Axel-triple toe loop combination to his steady triple Lutz and double Axel, he exuded the confidence and consistency that brought him the world title in Edmonton. The 25-year-old South Chatham, Mass., native was rewarded with a standing ovation from the Springfield Civic Center crowd and all

nine of the judges' first-place ordinals.

"I could have done a couple of things better, but it's obviously early. Things will get better and more polished as the season goes along," Eldredge said of the short program.

While that confidence is what has made Eldredge the most consistent and formidable men's skater in the world today, it's a quality that has eluded Urmanov ever since that week in Lillehammer. While it remains to be seen whether Urmanov can shake the demons that have kept him off the medal platform at Worlds for the past three years, the Olympic champ did show signs of change in Springfield.

Urmanov's fast-paced short program to a techno-pop medley of dance tracks from the group "Yellow" was a stark departure from his usual classical offerings. A stumbled landing on the back end of his triple Axel-triple toe loop combination kept his marks for required elements in the 5.4-5.6 range, while his eight 5.8s in presentation placed him squarely in second place heading into the free skate.

Rounding out the top three heading into the free skate was 15-year-old Takeshi Honda, who in 1996 became Japan's youngest-ever men's champion after skating only five years. While he lacked some of the polish of the veterans Eldredge and Urmanov, Honda clearly demonstrated promise of quickly improving upon his 13th-place at the 1996 Worlds.

In the free skate, Urmanov set the early standard among the leaders by landing all eight of his planned triple jumps cleanly in his performance to "Princess of Circus." His technical marks of 5.6-5.8 for technical merit and 5.8-5.9 for presentation would require a stellar effort on the part of Eldredge.

Fortunately for his home state fans, Eldredge clearly met the challenge in the debut of his free skating program to music from the blockbuster summer movie "Independence Day." Eldredge's energy and the excitement in the arena seemed to crescendo with each successfully landed triple jump — eight in all. Ten seconds before the end of his program, the crowd was on its feet. Eldredge had left himself with little room for improvement in this program as he garnered 16 marks of 5.9 and two of 5.8 to secure a record fourth Skate America title.

"I wasn't surprised I skated well," Eldredge said. "I've been practicing hard here and I just wanted to put it out like I had in practice. It was as good as I could do."

For Urmanov, the experience simply illustrated what he's known for some time: "Now, we are in a time where you can't make any mistakes at all on jumps or on steps including straight-line footwork. It's hard to compete because you have to be perfect."

Joining Urmanov on the medal platform was yet another young Russian in the long line of those who will ultimately unseat him — 16-year-old Alexei Yagudin.

Yagudin, who shares Urmanov's coach (Alexei Mishin) and training rink (Yubileiny in St. Petersburg), catapulted from sixth place after the short program into third overall with a technically ambitious free skate to "Carmen."

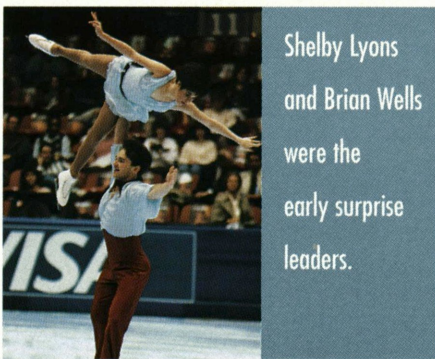
Americans Dan Hollander and Scott

Davis had a rougher time at the first competition of the season — as miscues in the short program left them in seventh and eighth respectively heading into the free skate.

Davis, who now lives and trains in nearby Simsbury, Conn., managed to move up to seventh overall with a seventh-place free skate to "Once Upon A Time In America." Hollander slipped to ninth overall with a disappointing 10th place finish in the long.

Pairs

In a field decimated by injuries, Oksana Kazakova and Artur Dmitriev of Russia overcame several errors in their short program to capture the

pairs title, while two young U.S. pairs rounded out the medal platform.

What began as an internationally accomplished field of 11 pairs had dwindled to seven before the start of competition. Among the teams that were forced to withdraw due to injury in the final weeks leading up to the competition were three-time U.S. champions and two-time World bronze medalists Jenni Meno and Todd Sand as well as 1994 world champions Evgenia Shishkova and Vadim Naumov of Russia.

With Meno and Sand both nursing hand injuries and Naumov suffering from a back injury, the reigning European champions Kazakova and Dmitriev were odds-on favorites to capture the title in Springfield with the remaining medal spots seemingly up for grabs.

One of the three American pairs that figured to seriously contend for one of those medals was the 1996 U.S. bronze medalist team of Shelby Lyons and Brian Wells, appearing in their first Skate America.

While their short program performance to “El Condor Pasa” was not flawless, Lyons and Wells were the only pair to manage marks of 5.0 or better in both required elements and presentation. By default, the Colorado Springs-based pair took a surprising lead into the free skate.

For Kazakova and Dmitriev, the “La Cucaracha” short program was a disaster as Dmitriev fell three times — once during a footwork sequence. So disgusted were they with their performance, the Russians did not wait to see the scores. Their wide range of marks from 4.4-5.3 for required elements and 4.9-5.6 for presentation translated into ordinals from first—to fifth-place. The majority, however, placed them in second.

“I felt bad for them,” Wells said later, adding that he, Lyons, and Dmitriev had trained together briefly in Colorado Springs during the past few summers. “It was surprising to me. He’s my mentor. I looked up to him and still do.”

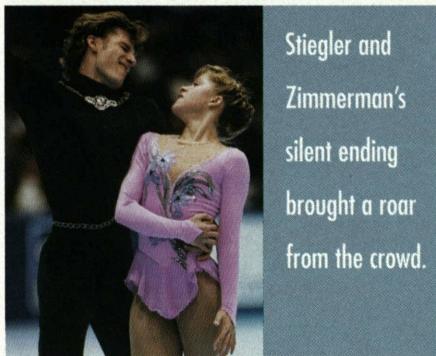
Nevertheless, Wells was pleased with he and Lyons’ position heading into the free skate.

“It’s a brand-new ballgame,” Wells said. “Our coach Irina (Vorobieva) told us to celebrate tonight, but forget about it tomorrow and concentrate on Saturday.”

Americans Stephanie Stiegler and John Zimmerman, competing in only their third international competition together, also put themselves in a position to challenge for the podium in the free skate with a fourth-place finish in the short program.

Meanwhile, compatriots Sara Ward and Lance Travis struggled to a seventh-place finish in the short.

Skating first in the final group of the free skate, Stiegler and Zimmerman were 40 seconds from the end of a superb skate to “Sorcerer’s Apprentice” when the music inexplicably stopped. Without a pause, the pair skated the conclusion of their program accompanied only by the applause of the audience. After a rousing ovation and ruling from the referee, Stiegler and Zimmerman were allowed to reskate the final portion which brought them their second ovation of the night. The pair’s plight and

performance were rewarded with top three marks from eight of the nine judges.

Stiegler and Zimmerman’s silent ending brought a roar from the crowd.

Stiegler and Zimmerman’s medal hopes were realized when the next pair — Marina Khalturina and Andrei Krukov of Kazakhstan, third after the short program — failed to top them in the standings. Next up, Lyons and Wells took to the ice in hopes of sealing the upset.

Skating to “Moldavian Suite,” the young American pair opened strong with side-by-side triple loops, a split triple twist and a throw double Axel. But, when Lyons touched down on

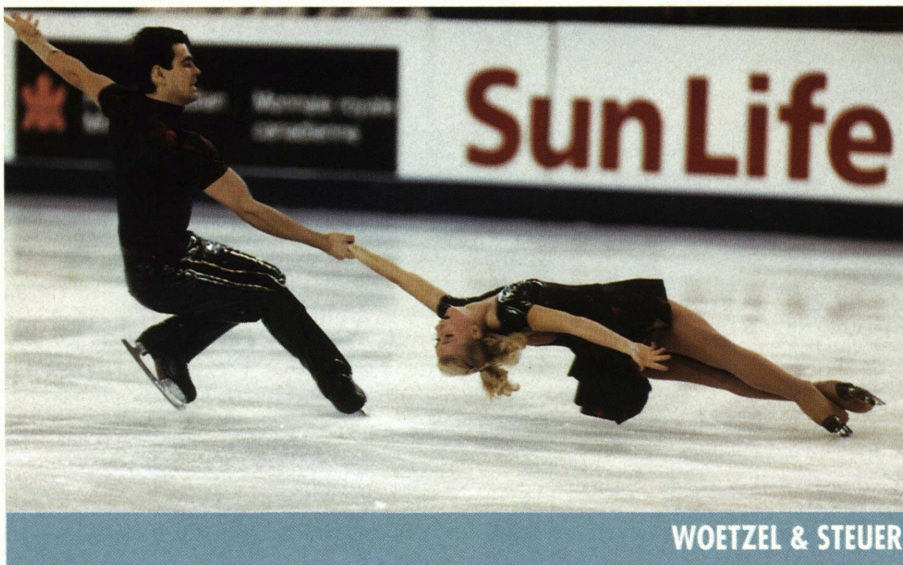

Stojko, Bourne & Kraatz lead Canadian charge in second Champions Series event

Canadians Elvis Stojko and dancers Shae-Lynn Bourne and Victor Kraatz gave the partisan crowd much to reason to cheer as they skated to first-place finishes at Skate Canada International 1996, Nov. 7-10, at the Kitchener Memorial Auditorium in Kitchener-Waterloo, Ontario.

In addition to the titles, Stojko and Co. earned the \$30,000 first-place prize money in this second stop of the six-event Champions Series of Figure Skating.

Russians Marina Eltsova skated first in the first event of the competition and held the lead throughout the short contest.

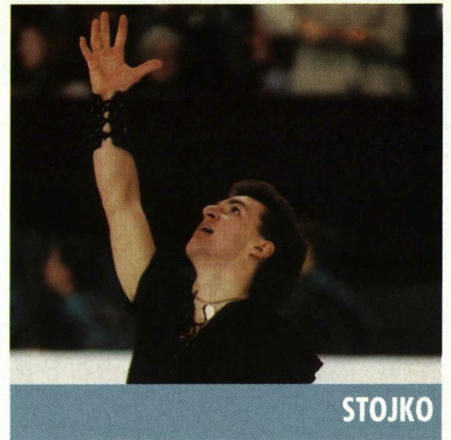
Their fast, though not rushed program to "Sixteen Tons" by Tennessee Ernie Ford, rested heavy on those who

followed.

America's challengers Kyoko Ina and Jason Dungjen pressed the Russians on every element, but between those elements they lacked the flash and the fire needed to take the commanding lead. Germany's stately looking team of Mandy Woetzel and Ingo Steuer placed third, but were close on the Americans trail.

The pairs long programs were characterized by fall after fall. Skating last, leaders Eltsova and Bushkov both fell on side-by-side triple toe loops. Later, Bushkov fell on side-by-side double Axels. The result was a second place free skate that dropped them to second overall.

Woetzel and Steuer, who skated next to last, had one obvious fault. On a throw triple, Woetzel slid off the top of Steuer's boot, aborted the jump and crashed to the ice. There were minor problems with unison, but overall, this new program — choreographed by Diana Goolsbey — was skated well

enough to take the gold.

Ina fell on an opening throw triple Salchow and landed with a hand down on a subsequent side-by-side triple toe. Despite respectable marks, they dropped to third place overall.

Men

Skating last in the order, Stojko went through the elements of his "Rocketeer" short program with confidence and the resulting solid performance gave him the lead.

Russian prodigy Ilia Kulik followed close behind with an excellent program to "Faust." A two-footed triple Axel combination did little to mar his effort. Kulik artfully made up for it with both a triple Lutz and a double Axel out of footwork.

The U.S. men Michael Weiss and Scott Davis placed third and fourth in the short respectively.

The free skating event was dominated by Stojko. His quad was not perfect, but six other triples (two in combination) gave him the golden edge over the competition.

Ilia Kulik kept his place to win the silver medal in spite of a bit of technical tarnish and a question of presentation. His triple count was lower than expected and his appearance as Romeo belied the difficulty of interpreting "Romeo and Juliet" as a single.

Scott Davis moved into third for the long and won the bronze. Five solid triples and a sparkling eye to the crowd did the trick. Michael Weiss dropped to sixth overall.

Dance

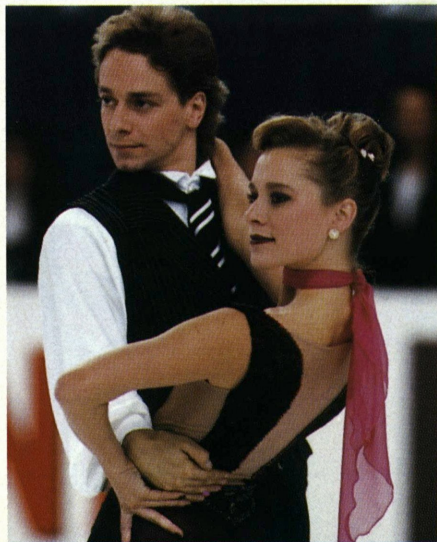
The only complaint heard during Skate Canada that the ice was 10 feet shorter than at most competitions. This coupled with the recent changes to the Golden Waltz compulsory gave all of the teams a case of the adjustment blues.

The best to cope were Bourne and Kraatz. Marina Anissina and Gwendal Peizerat from France did well for second place and were followed by Barbara Fusar Poli and Maurizio Margaglio of Italy.

Bourne and Kraatz took a greater lead over the French with their Tango. The Canadians accented their deep turns and smooth knee action at a moderate rather than fast pace. Anissina and Peizerat, who appeared more dramatic at a slightly faster pace, kept the second spot. The Italians slipped a notch in the original and were upstaged by Lithuanians Margarita Drobiazko and Povilas Vanagas.

Bourne and Kraatz finished with a flare. Their fast and energetic free dance suited their style; and though it was not technically the most difficult dance of the evening, good steps and a flowing line won them the gold.

Second place went to Anissina and Peizerat; the couple who charmed the audience with a new, lively and difficult dance while pushing the costume critics to the edge. Fusar Poli and Margaglio moved back to third for the bronze.

Ladies

Misfortune struck American Tara Lipinski and skating second did not help. Before she had a chance to launch her combination, her take-off foot slipped out from under her. A quick recovery and the continuance of her difficult program placed her third.

Irina Slutskaya from Russia got off the ice for her combination, but crashed before completing it. That something rather than nothing placed her in the lead. Second place went to Azerbaijan's Yulia Vorobieva; fourth to Swiss skater Lucinda Ruh.

In the free skate, there was nothing to hold Slutskaya back. Her "Phantom On Ice" was solid. Element by element, and six triples later, she won first place ordinals from eight judges and took the gold.

Lipinski's rebound was excellent. Though the two triple/triple combinations and one double/triple cinched her second place ordinals, there was evidence of her gaining composure to handle the pressure of international competitions. Lipinski's silver was well deserved.

Vorobieva's uninspired sixth place long dropped her to fourth overall, and made room for Switzerland's Ruh to win the bronze.

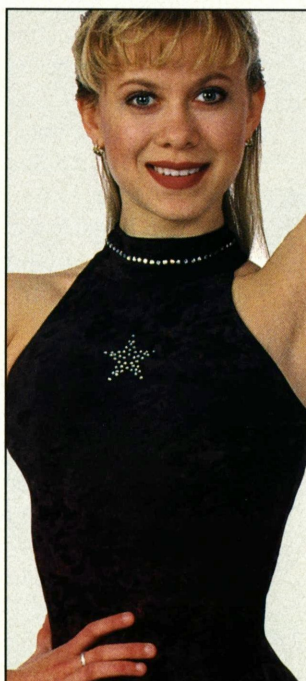

Luddy.

Through four decades of coaching, Ron Ludington is still living his dream.

Unlike Barbara Roles Williams, Frank Carroll, Richard Callaghan and Carlo Fassi, Ron Ludington has never coached Nicole Bobek. Like Dennis Rodman of the Chicago Bulls, he has donned a bridal gown for a wacky photo op.

Despite the joke shot of him and tuxedo-clad wife Karen on a shelf inside his University of Delaware Ice Skating Science Development Center office, Ludington does share more

with the aforementioned skating coaches than with the NBA's baddest tattoo aficionado. The man known to most as "Luddy" — a father of two adult children who feigns reluctance when admitting he turned 60 in September — has experienced everything expected of someone who's been in skating as many decades as he has.

The one-time competitive roller skater whose on-ice proficiency went from beginner to Olympian in about six years also has encountered the unexpected.

Like Roles Williams, Ludington won Olympic bronze for the United States in 1960. He did so with then-wife Nancy Rouillard after they'd captured four U.S. Pairs titles and a third-place finish at the 1959 World Championships. However, the medals garnered through these successes aren't among the memorabilia exhibited in his office.

"I keep them at home in a display case for trinkets I've accumulated over the years," Ludington says from behind his desk on a weekday morning. "I can't remember the last time I looked at them."

Among the more prominent keepsakes in his office is a black-and-white portrait of 1932 Olympic bronze medalist Maribel Vinson Owen. Like Carroll, the Massachusetts-born Ludington trained under Vinson Owen in Boston. The picture of his former coach, who perished along with the

entire 1961 U.S. World Team delegation in a plane crash, is a constant reminder of the impact she and others on that flight have had on his life. He notes that Vinson Owen's daughters — national champions Laurence and Maribel — and his best friend — Maribel's partner Dudley Richards — perished too.

"(The plane crash) was something that was so devastating to me," Ludington recalls in his still-strong New England accent. "Dudley and I were the best of buddies. Maribel's two daughters and I were close, like family."

Also killed were his first students,

husband-and-wife dancers Patricia and Robert Dineen. So why hadn't Ludington been on that jetliner?

"I couldn't afford to go because the United States Figure Skating Association didn't support coaches financially like they do now," he explains. "The incredible part is that I've been a world coach for 36 years and only missed that one year."

While coaching the Dineens, Ludington lived in Connecticut and taught there and in New York. A call from the wife of crash victim Danny Ryan took him next to Indianapolis to handle Ryan's coaching duties for four years. That move brought him close to another fatal accident.

"There was a terrible propane explosion in that building during a Holiday on Ice show, and 96 people were killed," Ludington says. "I was in the building when it happened, which was about three weeks before President Kennedy was assassinated."

With damage and legal problems plaguing the site, Ludington procured another position after coaching future national pair champions Cynthia and Ronald Kauffman into the 1964 Olympics. Like his relocation to Indianapolis, his next move was possible mainly because of the 1961 tragedy.

"A lot of young coaches like Frank Carroll and myself basically fell into a very fine position from the coaching standpoint," Ludington says. "I always

felt that the plane crash had a positive impact on me from the standpoint that I ended up with a lot of good skaters who were without coaches.”

He, Carroll and the others worked toward proving themselves worthy of their inheritance using what they'd learned from their predecessors.

“The important thing is that a coach has got to be a role model,” Ludington says. “I think that's extremely essential because the years we're training them are their growing years, where they're developing as people as well as skaters.”

The former Northeastern University engineering student encourages his pupils to work hard at school, attend college if possible and plan for lives beyond Olympic eligibility. His skaters have included at least three high school valedictorians and a teen who attained a perfect SAT score.

“The kids we get who are willing to put out the kind of effort needed for this sport are usually really good students,” Ludington says. “So what we're dealing with is a gifted child. We have to get them to where they can go on with their lives and, no matter what they do, be successful.”

Like Callaghan, going on with his life entailed relocating to the Detroit Skating Club. He did so in 1965 and spent four years creating more Olympians and more U.S. champions, including dancers Judy Schwomeyer and James Sladky.

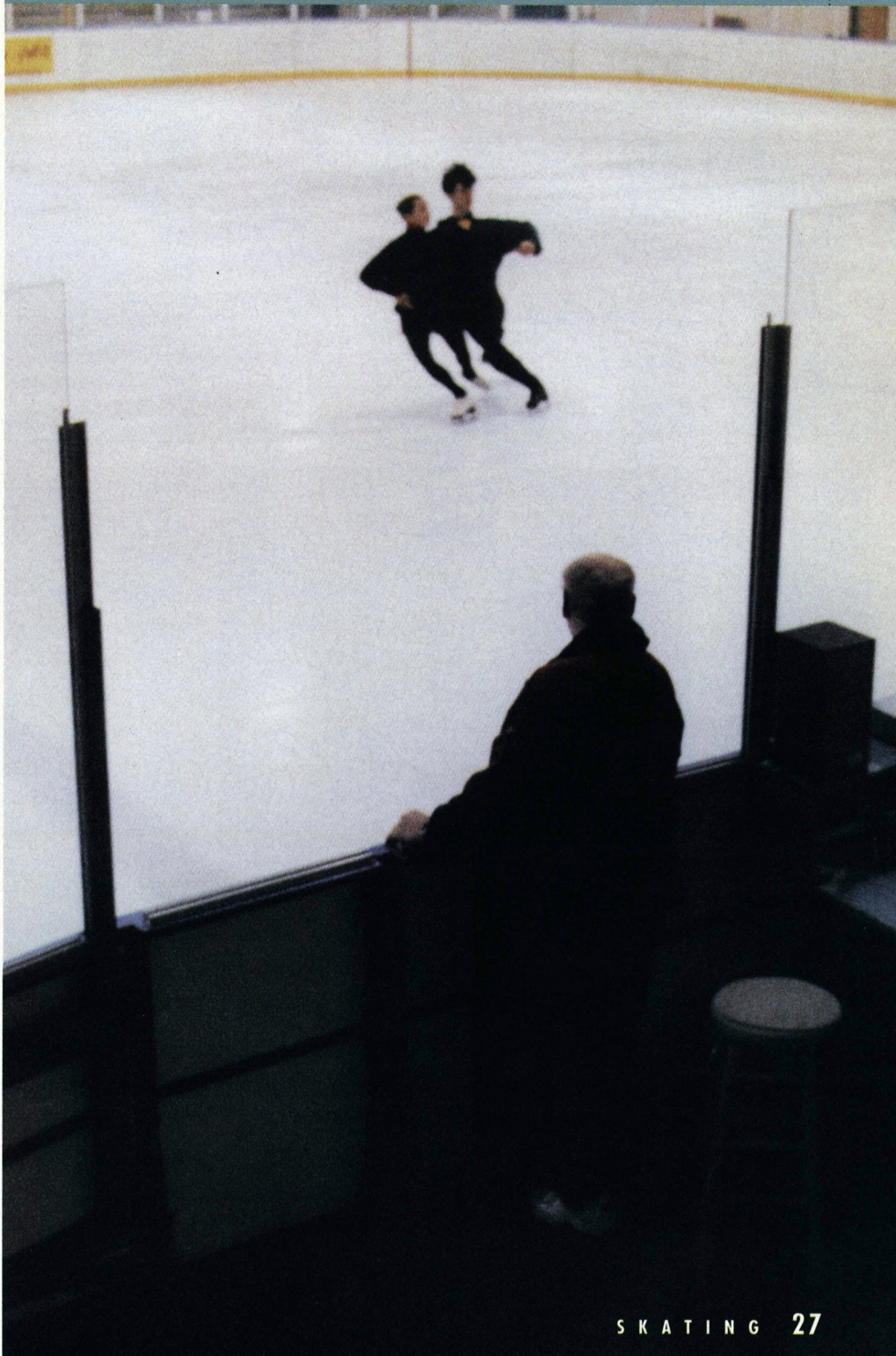
Olympic dance gold medalist Natalia Linichuk competed against members of what came to be known as “Luddy's Army” throughout her amateur career and joined its officer ranks in 1994. She speaks highly of her boss while he gives a private lesson.


“I first knew Mr. Ludington many, many years ago, when he was with many, many American skaters like Schwomeyer and Sladky and a lot of others,” she says. “He's like a super coach.”

The opportunity to develop his own super program emerged for Ludington in 1970. Visiting Delaware and viewing a “quite empty” Skating Club of Wilmington led him to migrate east with about 40 students late that year.

USFSA, ISI AND PSA STATEMENTS OF POLICY

USFSA — ISI Statements of Policy

In October 1974, the USFSA and the Ice Skating Institute (ISI) jointly adopted mutual statements of policy for cooperation between the two bodies. (The two statements are reprinted below.)

The primary objectives of the two organizations are to normalize their relations and to achieve full cooperation between them in the mutual interest of insuring full participation in skating of each individual recreational skater and figure skater without interference or restriction. In order for these goals to be achieved, it is vital that all Member Clubs of the USFSA implement fully the spirit of cooperation contained in the statements of policy; we are confident the members of the ISI will do the same.

It is the belief of the USFSA that the adoption of the statements of policy represents a progressive step on the part of both the Association and the ISI, which will be of great benefit to the thousands of individual skaters whom both organizations serve.

USFSA Statement of Policy

The United States Figure Skating Association (USFSA) recognizes the primary role and interest of the Ice Skating Institute (ISI) in promoting the activity of ice skating for the recreational skater.

Consistent with such recognition, the USFSA agrees to cooperate fully with the ISI to further that objective. To that end, the USFSA further agrees that the participation of USFSA members in exhibitions and carnivals endorsed by the ISI shall not be deemed to be a violation of the rules

of the USFSA, nor shall it be deemed a violation for USFSA members who are also registered with the ISI to participate in ISI tests and competitions, subject only to the limitation that such participation does not result in any direct or indirect financial benefit to the participant.

ISI Statement of Policy

The Ice Skating Institute (ISI) recognizes that the United States Figure Skating Association (USFSA) has been and is the governing body of the sport of figure skating on ice in the United States and that it is so recognized by the International Skating Union (I.S.U.).

Consistent with such recognition, the ISI agrees to cooperate fully with the USFSA and its Member Clubs to promote the full participation of the members of the USFSA in the sport of figure skating. To that end, the ISI further agrees that the participation of skaters registered with the ISI in activities sponsored by the USFSA shall not be deemed to be a violation of any applicable rules of the ISI.

USFSA — PSA Statements of Cooperation

The Professional Skaters Association (PSA) recognizes that the United States Figure Skating Association (USFSA) has been and is the National Governing Body (NGB) of the sport of figure skating on ice in the United States and that the USFSA is so recognized by the International Skating Union (I.S.U.).

The USFSA recognizes that the PSA is an organization of teaching and performing skating professionals and their respective activities and is the organization responsible for the education and certification of skating coaches.


The USFSA and PSA jointly agree that they desire to promote and encourage the fulfillment of the objectives of each organization consistent with their respective goals.

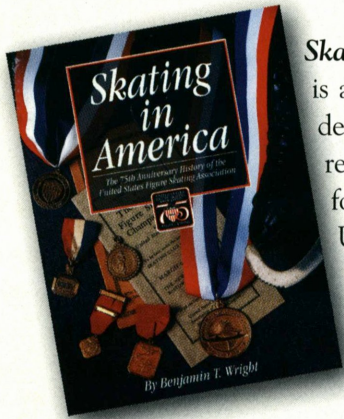

National Novice Ladies champion (1951), National Junior Ladies champion (1952), Senior Ladies silver medalist (1953-56), U.S. Ladies champion (1957-60), North American silver medalist (1953, 1955), North American champion (1957, 1959), World silver medalist (1955), World champion (1956-60), Olympic silver medalist (1956), Olympic champion (1960).

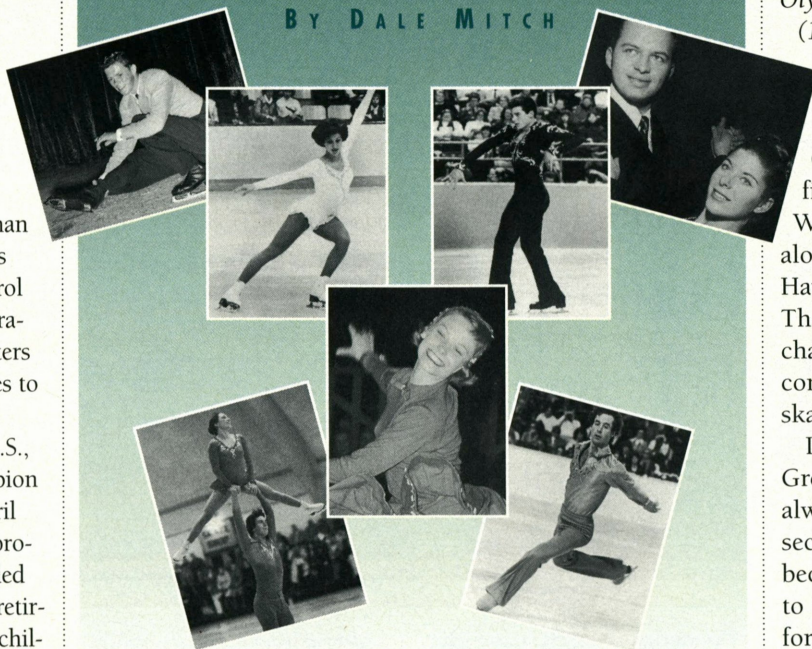
The only American woman to ever win five world titles plus the Olympic gold, Carol Heiss Jenkins was an inspiration to a generation of skaters that followed and continues to influence the sport today.

Heiss Jenkins married U.S., World and Olympic champion Hayes Alan Jenkins on April 30, 1960, and had a brief professional career that included Hollywood movies before retiring. The couple had three children, Mark, Karen and Laurie, and have four grandchildren. After 18 years away from the ice, she returned to teach and

Where are they now?

Where are they now and what have they been doing on or off the ice? SKATING catches up with some of the nation's foremost champions who are part of the heritage of American skating on both the national and international levels.

has become one of the country's foremost instructors, with students including Tonia Kwiatkowski, Aren Nielsen, Ryan Hunka, among others; and three 1996 National champions: Timothy Goebel, Junior Men; Joey Knazek, Novice Men; and Parker Pennington, Intermediate Men.

Heiss Jenkins is an honored member of the Ohio Women's Hall of Fame, the Women's Sports Foundation Hall of Fame and the World Figure Skating Hall of Fame.

James Grogan

U.S. Men's bronze medalist (1947), National silver medalist (1948-49, 1951-52), North American Championships silver medalist (1947, 1949, 1951), World silver medalist (1951-54), Olympic bronze medalist (1952).

As a member of two Olympic Teams and six World Teams, James Grogan was part of the first U.S. sweep of men's World medals in 1952, along with Dick Button and Hayes Alan Jenkins.

Though never winning a championship, he is still considered one of the finest skaters of the era.

Inducted into the army, Grogan recalls, "I am and always will be proud of my second-place medal(s), because Uncle Sam sent me to Ft. Leonard Wood, Mo., for 16 weeks of basic training for the Korean War. And through some stroke of magic or appreciation of my former accomplishments, I

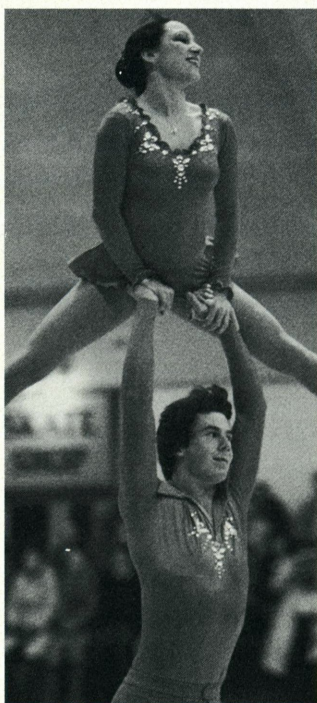


was spared the trip to Korea and was ordered to represent the U.S. and the army at the Worlds in Davos (1954)."

Grogan later established the James D. and Barbara Wagner Grogan Skating School at Squaw Valley, which became the foremost training center on the West Coast. In 1985, he was the principal choreographer for opening and closing ceremonies for the Worlds in Japan.

Grogan is now retired and lives with his wife Jasako at Blue Jay, Calif., where he occasionally teaches. His son J.D. is in business in Atlanta and his stepdaughter Hiroko, following a competitive career in singles and ice dancing in Japan, is with Turner Broadcasting in Tokyo and also is active in judging.

Grogan was elected into the U.S. Hall of Fame in 1991.



Kitty Carruthers Conrad & Peter Carruthers

U.S. National Pair silver medalists (1980), U.S. champions (1981-84), World bronze medalists (1982), Olympic silver medalists (1984).

Linda Fratianne Maricich

National silver medalist (1976), U.S. Ladies champion (1977-80), World champion (1977, 1979), World silver medalist (1978), World bronze medalist (1980), Olympic silver medalist (1980).

One of Linda Fratianne's milestones was being the first woman to land two triple jumps in international competition, besides being only the fifth U.S. woman to win the World title.

Fratianne literally toured the world as a popular professional with *Ice Capades*, *Ice Follies – Holiday on Ice*, *Walt Disney's Magic Kingdom on Ice*, and the *World Cup Champions on Ice* and produced two exercise albums before retiring from touring. She competed in most of the professional competitions and has taught

freestyle seminars nationwide.

Fratianne now makes an occasional guest appearance in the Sun Valley Skating Center's summer shows, where she lives and teaches and has been active with the Special Olympics and the National Cerebral Palsy Foundation. She is married to Nick Maricich and has a four-year-old daughter, Alexandra Marie.

Fratianne was inducted into the U.S. Hall of Fame in 1993.



The Carruthers became national and international stars after being the first American pair (since their coach Ron Ludington) to medal at the Olympics in 24 years.

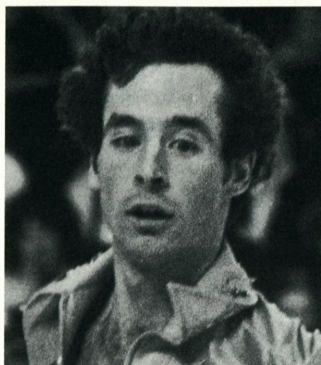
The adopted brother and sister were raised in Massachusetts and started skating on a backyard pond. Along with Ludington, they developed the lateral twist lift, which became a trademark move as members of four World and two Olympic Teams.

After a long and successful professional career with *Ice Capades* and *Stars on Ice*, during which the Carruthers also appeared throughout the

world and in special TV performances, they have moved on to other pursuits. "We have retired more than once," Kitty admits, "But we still love to skate in special engagements now and then."

Peter has continued his involvement in the sport as a television analyst for ESPN, Fox and Turner Sports. He and his wife of eight years, Diana, have one son, Kurt, born March 1996, and live in Thousand Oaks, Calif.

When time allows, Kitty teaches in Houston but admits "most of the time is busy running around after my one-year-old son, Brett." She and her husband live in Katy, Texas.



Charles Tickner

National bronze medalist (1974-75), U.S. champion (1977-80), World champion (1978), World bronze medalist (1980), Olympic bronze medalist (1980).

Charlie Tickner didn't decide to fully devote himself to skating until his freshman year of college, and then with no real idea of making a career of it. He left college, and once he started training, there was no stopping him. Four national titles (winning his first when he was 23), a World title and an Olympic bronze medal later, he left the amateur ranks. Continued success followed as Tickner became a popular performer from 1980 to 1994, appearing in all major touring shows and on television specials.

Tickner met and married his wife Kathy in 1984, and they have three sons, Jonathan, 9, Jake, 4, and Jordon, 2. Although the two older boys skate, it is only for fun as they have interests in other sports; while Tickner describes Jordon's two sports as "walking and destruction." The family lives in Byron, Calif., where Kathy is an art teacher and Tickner now teaches in the Northern California area.

Tickner was inducted into the U.S. Figure Skating Hall of Fame in 1991.

Christopher Bowman

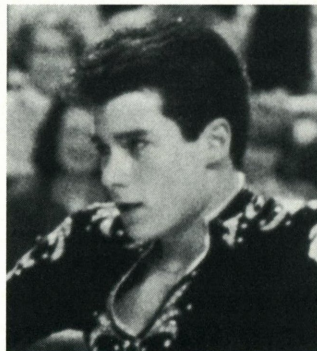
U.S. Junior champion (1983), World Junior champion (1983), U.S. Senior silver medalist (1987, 1991), bronze medalist (1988), U.S. champion (1989, 1992), World silver medalist (1989), World bronze medalist (1990).

A member of six World and two Olympic Teams, Bowman was considered by many to be one of the greatest natural talents to ever take to the ice.

Bowman started skating at age four as an outlet for his hyper activity and developed into a superb athlete and interpreter of all types of music, from classical to show tunes,

from jazz to hard rock. Coached for the majority of his career by Frank Carroll, he became one of the country's most popular performers ... tagged "Bowman the Showman" ... and was a regular on the annual Tom Collins Tour of World Figure Skating Champions for many years.

As a child actor, Bowman appeared in numerous films and on the television series



Little House on the Prairie. He even dabbled in movie stunt work and combined martial arts as part of his training regimen.

Bowman was forced to withdraw from the 1990 Nationals, unable to defend his title due to an injury, but was appointed to the World Team and succeeded in medaling. He is still remembered for his gutsy performance at the 1992 Worlds in Oakland, Calif., during which he tore a ligament in his ankle and continued to finish the long program despite the injury.

After turning professional, Bowman starred with Ice Capades, then began teaching in Rhode Island, Massachusetts and now in Michigan where he lives. Bowman married Annette Jasinkiewicz in August 1996 and the couple now teach together.

Judy Schwomeyer Sladky & James Sladky

National Dance bronze medalists (1967), National Dance champions (1968-72), North American bronze medalists (1967), silver medalists (1969), North American champions (1971), World bronze medalists (1969, 1971-72), World silver medalists (1970).

One of America's most popular dance teams, the Sladkys created what is now the Yankee Polka international dance. They are one of only five U.S. duos to ever win a World silver medal, but never had an opportunity to enter the Olympics since dance did not become an official event until 1976.

The Sladkys' successful professional career included performing in Ice Follies, Holiday on Ice, Disney's World on Ice and in countless personal appearances and competitions. For several years, they were the skating Campbell's Kids, and because of her petite size, Judy also skated as Snoopy in ice

shows and TV specials, as well as doing commentary on ESPN.

Judy has concentrated her efforts on acting and created the character of Alice Snuffleupagus on *Sesame Street* on PBS, where she is now in her 11th year and operates Plush Productions from her home in Bloomingdale, N.J. "I am thrilled to be able to make a living by hugging and bringing a laugh to the world," Judy said.

"I have grown up to be a Stuffed Animal."

Jim has performed with many children's theaters and written articles for numerous skating publications. He has taught in New Jersey, California, Minnesota and currently in Troy, N.Y., where he lives. "I learned to find much joy in providing a service that makes a difference in people's lives," he said, adding, "I'm still trying to decide what I will do when I grow up."

Schwomeyer and Sladky were inducted into the U.S. Hall of Fame in 1991.

Skating last, Kazakova and Dmitriev returned to the late season form that earned them the European title and a fifth-place finish at Worlds. Their free skate to Hendel's "Passaquala" was artistic, dramatic and included a soaring throw triple Salchow and innovative lifts. The presentation marks of 5.2-5.7 were the difference in earning them five of the nine first-place ordinals and vaulted them into first place overall.

"We are more familiar with our free, but we need to concentrate more on the short program," said Dmitriev, who with former partner Natalia Mishkutenok was a two-time world champion and 1992 Olympic champion. "We feel pretty good about our performance, but we know it will still get much better."

Lyons and Wells were equally impressed with the company they were keeping in this the first competition of the season.

"We came into the free skate in first, ahead of a former Olympic medalist, so that was exciting," Wells said. "The outcome of the competition was definitely a confidence builder."

Dance

The competition began with the discipline that featured arguably the most well-rounded and experienced field of the competition — ice dancing.

Of the 12 couples competing, nine had competed

in the 1996 Worlds, while the French team of Sophie Moniotte and Pascal Lavanchy came in looking for a successful return to competition after staying out last season due to Moniotte's broken ankle.

While the French couple wasted little time establishing themselves among the top teams at Skate America, they also quickly recognized that even the seemingly glacial pace of international ice dancing can pass you by in a year's time.

In third place after the one-and-only compulsory dance, Moniotte and Lavanchy found themselves looking up at Russians Anjelika Krylova and Oleg Ovsiannikov and Irina Lobatcheva and Ilia Averbukh for the remainder of the competition. The French bested both teams at the 1995 Worlds.

"It was very hard to come back. We left the skating scene for over 18 months and now I can see that it was not very good," Lavanchy said. "While we were gone, many others really improved. We lost the habit of controlling our stress and controlling the pressure. With more competitions we hope to get back into the rhythm."

Anjelika Krylova and Oleg Ovsiannikov were the class of the ice dancing field.

In addition to a very innovative free dance — a modern waltz to "Masquerade Waltz by Katcheturian — Krylova attributed her and Ovsiannikov's success at Skate America to a rigorous new training regimen. Well, hers anyway...

"I have been training

hard. Cross country like Forrest Gump while Oleg sleeps and eats red meat," Krylova said.

Three-time U.S. dance champions Elizabeth Punsalan and Jerod Swallow were able to move from fifth-place after the original dance into fourth place overall with an energetic Cha-Cha/Rhumba free dance to "Perhaps, Perhaps, Perhaps," "La Macarena," and "Suavito."

Americans Kate Robinson and Peter Breen, who have been skating together only two and one-half years, jumped from 12th to ninth place with their Tango original dance to music from "The Addams Family." They finished in ninth overall.

Americans Amy Webster and Ron Kravette finished a disappointing 11th place after a fall in the free dance.

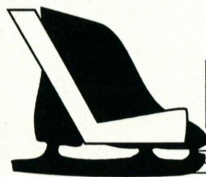

USFSA.com

Internet site offers wider access to official news, results

The USFSA's ever-expanding presence in cyberspace recently took a quantum leap forward with the Oct. 28 launching of the association's official internet site.

The site (<http://members.gnn.com/USFSA/index.html>) offers universal, 'round-the-clock access to current USFSA news, results, information on upcoming events and member clubs, links to other event/club internet sites and much, much more.

Developed by USFSA Online volunteer board leader Marge Reynolds with design assistance from U.S. ice dancer Neale Smull, the USFSA internet site made its debut in the heat of the 1997 regional competition season. In its first few weeks of operation, the site has drawn rave reviews from thousands of cyber-visitors looking for results from regional and international competitions.

While the internet site offers wider access to USFSA news and results, the association will continue to maintain its USFSA Online (keyword: USFSA) area on America Online (AOL) as its primary online information outlet.

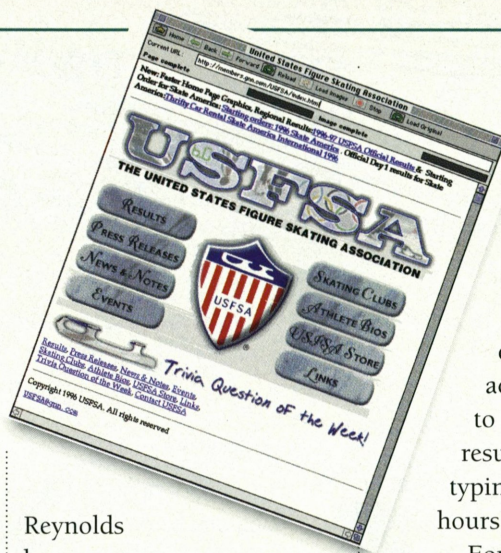
"We just joined the modern world," says USFSA

President Morry Stillwell of Malibu, Calif., who made the development of a USFSA online information area one of the key planks in his platform for presidency in 1995. To initiate the process, Stillwell turned to the USFSA's Development Division staffers and enlisted the help of Marge Reynolds, a longtime cyber-acquaintance.

"I got to know Morry online first and then in person at the 1994 Nationals. When he asked me to contact America Online about the USFSA going online, I told him I was happy to help," Reynolds recalled.

As the USFSA's online information area began to take shape and grow, so did Reynolds' responsibilities with the project. Now, the skating mother from the Chicago area, is serving in a volunteer capacity as the board leader for the USFSA Online and internet sites — logging many hours of online time each month to update and maintain the areas. She knows from her own past experiences the information skating fans are looking for.

"Prior to the 1994 skating boom, it was harder to find results — even in the newspaper," Reynolds recalls. "But, on the internet I found a lot of information."



Reynolds became more involved in skating by attending the 1994 U.S. Championships as a photographer and the 1995 U.S. Championships as a reporter for her hometown *Chicago Daily Herald*. Most recently at the 1996 U.S. Championships in San Jose, Calif., Reynolds pulled double duty — uploading competition results for USFSA Online and writing articles for the *Daily Herald*.

One of the greatest challenges facing Reynolds as the volunteer board leader has been obtaining and then disseminating competition results. 'Round-the-clock access has translated into 'round-the-clock demand.

"I try to get them (results) up there as quickly as possible," Reynolds said. "The skaters, their families and fans have really come to appreciate this service."

While steps have been taken to streamline the results process for Regionals and Sectionals by providing the accountants with software and AOL accounts through which to transmit results via modem, the process is not always fail-proof.

"Sometimes there will be

problems, such as a modem will be dead, so the accountants have to fax me the results. Then, I'll be typing them in for hours," Reynolds said.

For international competitions, Reynolds relies on the U.S. Team leaders to fax her results, which she then retypes and uploads into the system. Late nights and fuzzy faxes are situations that Reynolds has become accustomed to working around.

"I keep a magnifying glass by my computer. Faxes can be fuzzy and we really want to be accurate," she says. "We do the best we can."

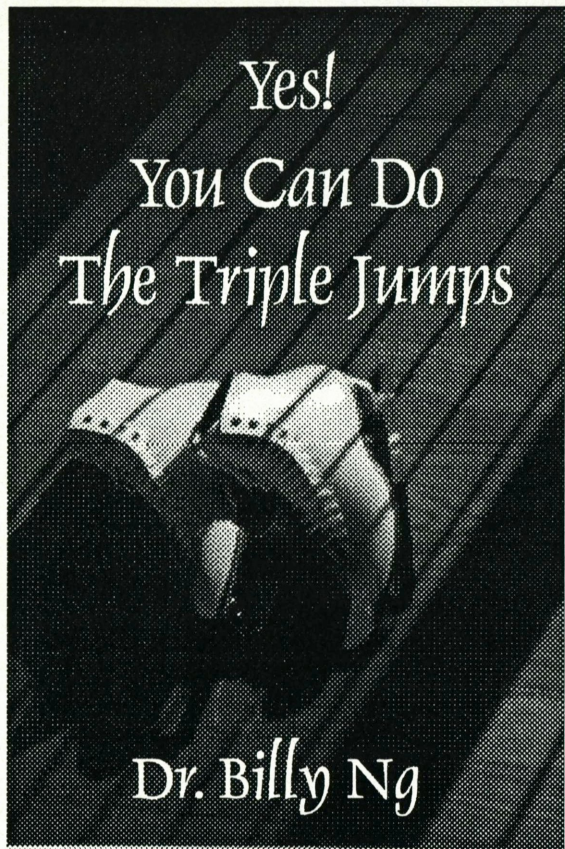
As the results and information keep coming, the hard work of Reynolds and Co. is paying dividends in the form of a better informed skating community.

"I look at it everyday," Stillwell says. "It's the quickest way for me to find messages and the messages are so concise and readable."

While the offerings in each of the online areas are certain to expand over time, the foundation of Stillwell's dream has become a reality.

"It's a major information point," Stillwell says. "Across the country and the world, our members can stay in touch and have instant access to skating information."

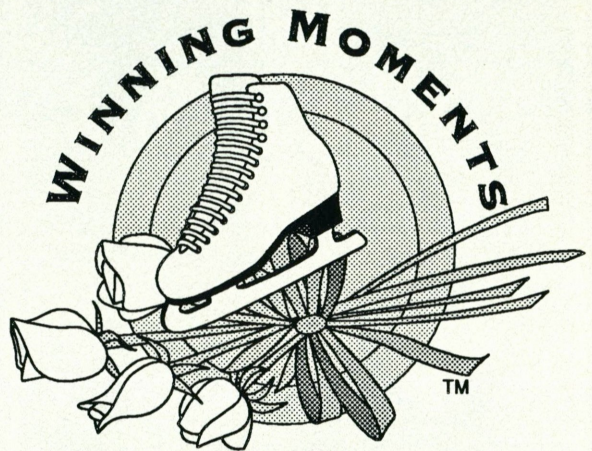

body for the Council to disseminate important information appropriately. It is no secret that our sport has undergone rapid change, and we as athletes must adapt to the intense scrutiny by the media, the potential exploitation by promoters, the explosion of television coverage, and most important our roles as ambassadors of our sport. We cannot forget that without athletes, there is no sport, and how we act and present ourselves to the public will be our future destiny and legacy.

There are numerous important and urgent issues which need to be addressed

by the new I.S.U. Athletes Commission, such as: the institution of random drug testing; the ever-expanding list of banned substances (some of which on the surface appear quite innocent); the distribution of prize money to athletes, the timing of competitions on a calendar basis, as well as the individual schedule at competitions; the entire issue of nationality and its confusing requirements on the National, I.S.U., and Olympic levels; the complex issue of Olympic Games qualification standards, and, of course, the ever-engaging issue of fair and unbiased judging.

It will be important for our Commission members to interact directly with their respective I.S.U. Technical Commissions to ensure a

friendly exchange of opinions and information, as it will be for me to consolidate these issues for presentation to the I.S.U. Council on a timely basis.

In the upcoming months, the remaining Commission members will be identified and I encourage each of you to communicate directly with your respective representative should it involve international skating matters. Please keep in mind that this is an international commission and should not be confused with the USFSA Athletes Commission which addresses domestic issues.

Our Commission in the near future will begin to narrow the focus of our activities so that we directly identify and propose solutions for specific concerns to us all. I hope that each of you

will not forget that we are a resource for change and improvement with a stated goal of cooperation in accomplishing all of our common goals in the sport.

In the January issue of this column, I will address the topic of judges' and athletes' compensation. I am always available for comment and can best be reached via e-mail at KKC@sherburne.com.

"Wilmington had a few skaters, but not very many," he recalls. "When I came from Detroit, I more or less did everything myself."

But while continuing to make Olympians — including Susan Kelley and Andrew Stroukoff in '76 and Stacey Smith and John Summers in '80 — Ludington assembled a staff in a manner as novel to its time as the lasso lifts performed at the end of his athletic career had been to theirs.

"I was one of the first people to become involved in team teaching," he says. "As a program gets bigger and becomes more selective, you need more specialists in different areas."

Ludington currently employs about 40 coaches, 80 percent of them his former students. Longtime staffer Bob Young spent nearly three decades with Ludington, first as a pupil and then as a coach before leaving to open the International Skating Center of Connecticut in 1994. When establishing ISCC, he formed his own duty-sharing squad in the fashion Ludington pioneered.

"Ron has always believed in the team concept," Young says. "Nowadays, the only way you can really survive is with a team concept."

Ludington's team continued building throughout the early 1980s and peaked in 1984. In addition to filling eight of the year's 18 U.S. Olympic slots from his corps, Ludington became — as Carroll and Fassi had before him with Linda Fratianne and Peggy Fleming, Dorothy Hamill, John Curry and Robin Cousins respectively — the coach of Olympic medalists. Though his soldiers had already conquered eight world podiums, it wasn't until Kitty and Peter Carruthers battled to a silver in Sarajevo that Ludington earned this distinction.

The first Olympic pairs medal won by the United States since Ludington's own got the road on which the Wilmington club sits renamed Carruthers Lane and caused an enrollment surge that necessitated a new camp.

"At that point, I came down here to the university and had this facility built," Ludington says, motioning toward the walls decorated with citations from two

Delaware governors.

His 1986 move to Newark from his former one-rink base gave his troops the use of both a hockey-sized sheet inside the 1971-built Gold Arena and an Olympic-sized sheet inside the just-constructed Blue Arena.

To the new facility Ludington brought the outdated, industrial-sized music and video player that he sits by when rink-side. The other UD coaches prefer to teach from the venue's hockey boxes and use its rafter-filling stereo unit, but he always sits across from them on a wooden stool with a space heater at his feet and his ever-present briefcase open atop what he calls "my music box."

"This gives me my own sound system so that if I want to work separately, I can," he says, explaining why he's kept the technological dinosaur. "They'll probably put me in it and bury me — it's big enough."

While at UD, Ludington has coached skaters Suzy Semanick and Scott Gregory, Gillian Wachsman and Todd Waggoner, Natalie and Wayne Seybold, April Sargent and Russ Witherby, Calla Urbanski and Rocky Marval and Karen Courtland and Todd Reynolds into eight more world championships and three more Olympics. He's also earned the 1990 Professional Skaters Association Coach of the Year Award, been inducted into the United States Figure Skating Hall of Fame and received the 1995 PSA Honorary Member Lifetime Achievement

Award. In addition, he's improved the 1,000-skater center's dance program with the addition of Linichuk, husband-partner Gennadi Karponosov and their students — including 1994 Olympic champions Oksana Grishuk and Evgeny Platov.

After noting that the brightly painted platter amid his office decor was a gift from a different group of former Soviets, Ludington confirms a rumor regarding him and yet another set of Russians. Relocating the Moscow Ice Theater group headed by Igor Bobrin, his wife, Natalia Bestemianova, and her dance partner, Andrei Bukin, to Lancaster, Pa., is a project for which he's acting as a consultant.

"Their concept is wonderful," Ludington says. "It's a theater with an ice rink attached all together."

"I think it's amazing, probably the first of its kind to be developed."

Whether or not the company procures the funding necessary to move, he'll remain busy. He expects to attend another Olympics when Linichuk's Russian and Ukrainian dancers make their respective teams for Nagano — especially if new Delaware trainee Shepherd Clark earns membership on the U.S. men's team and/or if new UD duo of Tristen Vega and J. Paul Binnebose captures a U.S. pairs slot.

He'll also concentrate on teaching his staff more as he begins to wind down the coaching career he started nearly four decades ago.

"I'll basically be trying to help guide these coaches so they start to develop and become experienced," Ludington says.

But he'll also pause to reflect on the experiences he's shared with Roles Williams, Carroll, Callaghan and Fassi and to engage in his favorite work-related activity.

"I think the best part of my job is actually now sitting back and watching this whole thing operating," he says. "Other than still working with the youngsters, the best part is just seeing how this program has developed."

"This has been a dream that's come true."

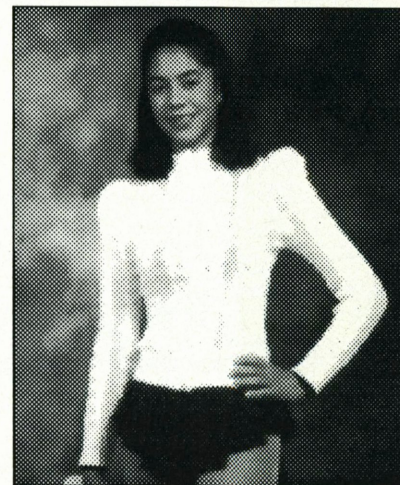

Fantasy Skating Update



The Silver Blades, managed by Sally J. Chigas of Glendora, Calif., have outskated 494 other teams through the first two events in the Champions Series of Figure Skating to take an early lead in Skating Magazine's *Fantasy Skating Series*.

With 146 total points, The Silver Blades hold an eight-point lead over four teams tied for second with 138 points with point totals from two of the six Champions Series of Figure Skating events completed — Thrifty Car Rental Skate America International '96 and Skate Canada. As of press time, there were four Champions Series events remaining on the schedule: Trophy Laliq, Nov. 15-17; Nations Cup, Nov. 21-23; NHK Trophy, Dec. 5-8; and Cup of Russia, Dec. 12-15.

As outlined in the October issue of *Skating*, fantasy team managers were asked to select eight competitors (two in each of the

four disciplines) from a weighted list of international skaters to make up their team. Points are awarded to the fantasy team competitors based on their finishes in the real-life Champions Series events. The managers for the top three teams at the end of the contest will receive gift certificates for USFSA merchandise.

Reader response to the first-year contest was high, as more than 500 entries poured into Skating magazine's offices from all over the country. In all, there were 495 valid entries from 41 of the 50 states. For the record, there are more fantasy teams based in California (57) than anywhere else; New York and Ohio were next with 33 each.

Fantasy team managers seemed to particularly enjoy the opportunity to name their teams — a critical function of team ownership in any rotisserie or fantasy league. *Skating maga-*

zine editor and Fantasy Skating Series commissioner Jay Miller has selected his Top 10 favorite team names and listed them below. Miller adds that real-life precision team coaches looking for an original team moniker may find some ideas here!
