Members of the team received denim and leather letter jackets from Chevrolet along with a plaque and certificate commemorating their achievement in the ceremony.

This year's team boasts six members with a 4.0 GPA and seven members have represented the U.S. in international competition. Martinez was a member of the 1997 Chevrolet Lumina Scholastic

To be eligible for the team, applicants were required to be a full-time junior or senior in high school, have competed at the junior or senior level in USFSA events and have at least a 3.2 grade point average (on a 4.0 scale). Athletes from figures, singles, pairs, dance and precision team skating were eligible for the award.

## Perfection earns Kwan more than just U.S. title

Never again will Michelle Kwan have to ask to borrow the family car.

Kwan was the winner of the second annual Chevrolet Perfect 6 Award. A 1998 Chevrolet Cavalier convertible was up for grabs as the skater with the most 6.0s during the week-long State Farm U.S. Figure Skating Championships would drive away with the prize.

Enroute to her second U.S. title, Kwan recorded seven 6.0s for artistic impression in her short program and followed that up with eight perfect marks for artistic impression in her free skate. Her 15 perfect marks set the U.S. Championships record for perfect scores.

Ice dancers Elizabeth Punsalan and Jerod Swallow won the award last year.

# Five inducted into U.S. Hall of Fame

The five most recent additions to the now 66-member U.S. Figure Skating Hall of Fame were officially inducted in a special ceremony at the 1998 State Farm U.S. Figure Skating Championships. The inductees — Kristi Yamaguchi, Oscar Iobst, Gordon McKellen Jr., and Evy and Mary Scotvold were presented a sterling silver Revere bowl and were guests of honor at areception that followed.

Yamaguchi of Fremont, Calif., won her first U.S. singles title in 1992, a year in which she won her second world title and the Olympic gold medal. She was also 1989 and '90 U.S. Pair champion with then partner Rudy Galindo.

Iobst, currently residing in Peyton, Colo., has been active with the USFSA for more than 27 years. He served on the USFSA Board of Directors from 1971-83. He was President of the USFSA from 1980-83 and served as interim Executive Director from 1992-93. He is a national-level referee and judge for all four figure skating disciplines.



Kristi Yamaguchi, Oscar lobst, Gordon McKellen Jr., and Evy and Mary Scotvold were recognized as the newest inductees into the U.S. Figure Skating Hall of Fame at the 1998 State Farm U.S. Figure Skating Championships.

McKellen of Irving, Texas, was a three-time U.S. champion from 1973-75 and was a member of five World Figure Skating Teams, finishing as high as fifth in 1975. He was also a member of the 1972 Olympic team, placing 10th.

The Scotvolds of South

Dennis, Mass., are former national competitors and were principal performers in Ice Follies for many years. The duo are now prominent coaches, having directed Paul Wylie to the 1992 Olympic silver medal and Nancy Kerrigan to the 1994 Olympic bronze medal.

# Novices focus on 2002 in second-year program

More than 70 novice-level competitors, parents and coaches got the opportunity in Philadelphia to witness the Olympics from past, present and future perspectives.

While the 1998 U.S. Olympic Figure Skating team was in the process of being selected, the Chevy Malibu Team 2002 program gave the National Novice team a chance for each member to prepare for his or her own run at a shot on the 2002 team. The first preparation came from keynote speaker and 1988 Olympian Debi Thomas.

While Thomas stressed hard work and persistence as a key to success, several seminars and classes offered the Team 2002 skaters the opportunity to enhance all facets of skating.

The skaters worked with experts and doctors on

warm-up and cool-down activities, strength and conditioning, plyometrics, injury prevention, choosing the right footwear, padding and psychology.

The athletes also observed the national practices, trial judged the Junior Ladies competition and had the opportunity to meet with top USFSA officials, judges and referees to increase their overall awareness of the sport.

"This program has a two-pronged approach," said U.S. National Programs Director Christy Krall. "First we want the athlete to understand the total operation of a U.S. Champion-ships and how each volunteer and judge dictates their energies and expertise to provide the very best for the skaters.

"Secondly, the goal is to

give the parents, coaches and athletes all the information necessary to prepare themselves both physically and emotionally to return again many times to the U.S. Figure Skating Championships."

Now in its second year, the Team 2002 program is designed to target the future generations of skaters and give them the information they need to succeed on the international level.


### Champions to battle at Hershey's Kisses Challenge

WORLD FIGURE SKATING CHAMPIONSHIPS

While Minnesota sits geographically atop the United States, skaters from across the globe hope Minneapolis and the Target Center offers the chance to come out on top of the figure skating world.

#### Minneapolis, Minn.

While many of the inhabitants of Minneapolis, Minn., originate from Scandinavia, it will not just be the locals of Norwegian, Swedish and Finnish descent that will use the Twin Cities as a playground when this winter turns to spring. Skaters from more than 50 countries will embark upon "The Land of 10,000 Lakes" for the World Figure Skating Championships March 29-April 5.

Just five weeks after the Olympic champions are crowned at the Olympic Winter Games in Nagano, Japan, more than 250 skaters will get the opportunity to exact revenge and attempt to unseat the four Olympic gold medalists in the event that will officially decide the world's best for 1998.


The building where all the action will take place is the Target Center, an all-event center that opened October 13, 1990, primarily for the arrival of NBA's Minnesota Timberwolves.

Located in the northwest portion of the Minneapolis downtown district, it is a modern state-of the art facility that will welcome thousands of spectators for the week-long championships.

Practices will be held at both the Target Center and the Parade Ice Garden, which is approximately one-and-a-half miles from the Target Center.

The city of Minneapolis is used to hosting championships. In a 14-month period beginning in February 1991 the city hosted five major national championships. Beginning with the 1991 U.S. Figure Skating Championships at the Target Center, Minneapolis, a city of 355,000 residents, hosted the U.S. Open Golf Championships, the World Series, Super Bowl XXVI and the NCAA Men's Final Four basketball championship — the latter three held at the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome.

While the Target Center has staged



two major U.S. Championships — hosting the 1995 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four in addition to the 1991 U.S. Figure Skating Championships — this is its and the city's first chance to host a major world championship. So confident is the ISU in Minneapolis' ability to stage a great championship event, Minneapolis has already been awarded the rights to host the first-ever World Precision Team Skating Championships in 2000.

The Target Center — a 20,000-plus

seat arena with 68 luxury suites — is conveniently located just minutes from Minneapolis' central downtown district. Hotel accommodations, shopping, fine dining and entertainment are just minutes away by foot. Navigating the city's downtown is remarkably easy as a pedestrian, thanks to miles of elevated, climate-controlled passenger walkways, called the Skyway. Waiting for traffic to clear or a light to turn green is not a concern in Minneapolis because of these walkways, nor is the impending



Minnesota cold that can greet visitors even in April.

Nearly 60 city blocks in downtown Minneapolis are connected by this passageway. More than five miles in total length, many of the downtown attractions are connected via the Skyway, including the majority of the downtown hotels, dozens of restaurants and bars, a downtown shopping mall and shopping district, the convention center and the Target Center. The Skyway itself is like a mini-metropolis, lined with shops, convenience stores, fast-

food restaurants and various other service-oriented stores.

While the Skyway offers the downtown visitor an escape from the cold and bitter elements, its possible that Minneapolis will be very pleasant during the duration of the

Championships. The average high for the month of April is 56 degrees. Even though the earlier part of the month may be slightly cooler, it's entirely possible that the weather will make a stay in the Twin Cities quite pleasant during that time. Downtown Minneapolis offers many opportunities for entertainment, fine dining and culture. Fed by the Mississippi River, 22 lakes in the city limits give visitors an opportunity to experience the outdoor life in the Twin Cities.

If the action at the Target Center isn't enough to fill your day, or if your stay begins before or extends beyond the length of the World Championships, there is plenty to do in and around the Minneapolis/St. Paul area, ranging from cultural to shopping to outdoor events.

Shopping has quickly become a reason why many visitors chose the greater Minneapolis/St. Paul area for vacation. According to a 1995 *Twin Cities Metro Report* study, the top activity of all visitors to Minnesota is shopping. The 4.2-million square-foot Mall of America is located just south of Minneapolis proper and immediately south of the Minneapolis/St. Paul International Airport and attracts some 40 million visitors per year, making it the most visited site in Minnesota. It is the largest retail facility of its kind in the nation.

The attraction of the Mall of America is not just its gargantuan size or the number of shops, but the other attractions the mall houses that makes up its grandeur. In addition to 400 stores and 27 sit-down and 25 fast-food restaurants, the Mall also has nine night clubs, 14 theater screens, the largest indoor theme park in the U.S — Knotts Camp Snoopy — and Underwater World.

With Knotts Camp Snoopy and Underwater World, it's easy to forget their surroundings are a shopping center. Knotts Camp Snoopy is a sevenacre theme park with 28 rides and attractions. Surrounding the theme park are 30,000 plants and 400 trees, some ranging as tall as 35 feet. Underwater World, the newest of attractions at the Mall, is a 1.2 million-



gallon walk-through aquarium.

If a day at the world-famous Mall of America isn't enough shopping, a visit to the City Center, a shopping mall of more than 75 stores located downtown, and the Nicollet Mall 12-block shopping district may be in order. Nicollet Mall is located just three blocks from the Target Center and contains more shopping in a fourblock radius than any other U.S. city.

Shopping may not be for everyone and Minneapolis has several other options, especially in its outdoor life. The most noticeable attraction of the Minnesota landscape is the multitude of lakes that exist. Over 15,000 lakes of five acres or more are in the state; 22 of the 949 lakes in the Twin Cities area are within the city limits of Minneapolis.

Much of the outdoor life of Minnesotans and visitors alike revolves around the many lakes.

Canoeing, windsurfing and fishing — both regular and ice fishing for walleye, pike, largemouth bass and crappie — are amongst the most popular of lake-based activities. Even though the

water temperature of the lakes won't be tolerable in early April, the beauty of many miles of shorelines in the state will still be in full effect.

Sharing roots with figure skating, inline skating — invented in the Twin Cities and popularized by Minneapolis-based Rollerblade, Inc. is a popular past-time of Minnesotans. Around the several miles of lake-side shoreline are many trails on which inline skating is encouraged.

If it's a night at the theater you are searching for or an afternoon matinee of a show that's popular on Broadway or maybe hasn't even hit Broadway yet, Minneapolis is the place to be. Second only to New York in theater seats per capita, Minneapolis is home to several spectacular shows. The most popular theater is the Guthrie Theater, located

west of downtown. This Tony-award winning theater-in-the-round is a must see for show buffs.

Located adjacent to the Guthrie
Theater is another of Minneapolis'
famed attractions, The Minneapolis
Sculpture Garden. It's most famous
sculpture — Spoonbridge and Cherry
— resides among 40 other sculptures
and flower beds on this 11-acre park.

Also adjacent to the Guthrie and Sculpture Garden is the Minneapolis Institute of Art — a must see for any art lover. Including works by Georgia O'Keefe, Rembrandt, Monet and Picasso, just to name a few, this museum has a full collection sure to satisfy any art lover.

If museums suit your taste, a visit to any one of four science museums in the Minneapolis area are sure to be a big hit. Visits to the Science Museum of Minnesota or the Museum of Questionable Medical Devices are sure to please and all offer a variety of interactive exhibits.

With so much to do in the greater Minneapolis area, it's easy to see why millions make Minneapolis a place to spend a vacation and why the city will be such a good host for the 1998 World Figure Skating Championships.

# One for the Record Books

The 1998 State Farm U.S. Figure
Skating Championships opened in
Philadelphia's CoreStates Center with
a nostalgic look back at the last U.S.
Championships hosted by the City of
Brotherly Love in 1968, but by week's
end the 1998 edition had clearly
earned its own special place in the
annals of U.S. figure skating history.

As in 1968, anticipation was high entering Championships Week in Philadelphia, Jan. 4-11, as 95 of the nation's best Championship-level skaters vied for nine berths (three ladies, two men, two pairs and two dance) on the U.S. Olympic and World Teams that would compete in the international arenas of Nagano, Japan, and Minneapolis, Minn., in the coming months. For the best of the best, the State Farm U.S. Figure Skating Championships represented the first of


the "Big Three" competitions for 1998. Like Peggy Fleming, Tim Wood and the other champions crowned in 1968, the skating standouts of today hoped that stellar performances in Philadelphia could help catapult them to international glory.

Being the final U.S. Championships of the quadrennium, the fields in all four disciplines were deep with accomplished veterans of the past four to eight years — all hoping to keep their Olympic dreams alive.

For many of those veterans, such as four-time U.S. champion Todd Eldredge and four-time U.S. dance champions Elizabeth Punsalan and

Jerod Swallow, these Championships not only represented a chance to etch their name in the record books as five-time U.S. champions, but also marked their first stop on their farewell tour of the competitive ranks. Other less decorated veterans came into these Championships knowing that they would be their last and hoping that they too could grab a piece of history for themselves.

For younger standouts Michelle Kwan and Tara Lipinski, these Championships represented yet another er major intersection in their personal roads to Olympic gold. It had been one year since those roads had been



transformed into a two-woman collision course heading toward Nagano and every head-to-head meeting commanded more and more media and public attention. Both were hoping to ride the acclaim of a second U.S. title into the Olympic Winter Games where they would challenge one another again for the ultimate prize.

For still others, the 1998 U.S. Championships represented an opportunity to establish themselves as the early frontrunners in the next quadrennium. While their Olympic dreams remained works in progress, their steady ascent up the U.S. Championship ranks was as critical to them as a top finish was to this year's Olympic hopefuls.

With all of these competing interests and compelling storylines, it came as no real surprise that Philadelphia's state-of-the-art CoreStates Center was packed with enthusiastic and supportive crowds throughout the week and that an unprecedented 13-plus hours of television coverage by ABC Sports and ESPN received stellar ratings. In the end, local organizers and the host club, the Wissahickon FSC, fulfilled its promise of providing all competitors and officials with "a memorable Championships experience" and in return the athletes provided the figure skating community with an event that will go down in history.

Championship Ladies

Michelle Kwan has often stated her desire to make her mark among the legends of U.S. figure skating. In Philadelphia, Kwan made that mark — or 15 marks to be exact — as the 17-year-old from Torrance, Calif., garnered an unprecedented 15 perfect 6.0s in her two performances combined en route to her second U.S. title. Of all of the outstanding showings at the U.S. Championships throughout the years, Kwan's was without question among the best.

While one might think that such an historic performance would have been

clearly foreshadowed, it was not the case with Kwan. In fact, Kwan's ability to even compete was the subject of a great deal of speculation leading up to the short program.

Still suffering from the effects of a stress fracture in her second toe on her left foot that kept her in a cast for 10 days in November and forced her withdrawal from the ISU Champions Series Final in mid-December, Kwan fought through pain at each practice throughout the week.

While Kwan was worrying about her toe, others were nipping at her heels. Chief among her competition was

defending U.S. and reigning World Champion Tara Lipinski, who rebounded from a disappointing early season to capture gold at the ISU Champions Series Final.

While Kwan and Lipinski were the odds-on favorites to land two of the three Olympic berths, the third spot figured to be a battle between perennial medal contenders Nicole Bobek, Tonia Kwiatkowski and 1996 pewter medalist Angela Nikodinov.

With so many skaters having legitimate chances to land on the podium, a clean short program was all but mandatory for a chance at the U.S. title. Kwiatkowski, skating first, set a standard that was only to be topped by Bobek five skaters later and by the best short program in the history of the U.S. Championships from Kwan.

Quickly quelling any doubts of her condition, Kwan reeled off a flawless triple Lutz-double toe combination and followed it up with a solid double Axel and triple flip. With an everbuilding sense of confidence through the short, Kwan expressed her program better than she ever had before. Seven of the nine judges agreed by awarding her a perfect 6.0 for presentation — the most 6.0s in a short program since Brian Boitano's eight 6.0s in his 1988 short program.

"I thought it was one of her best short programs ever," Kwan's coach Frank Carroll said. "She skated with ease and she looked like she was performing rather than competing. It was a pleasure to watch."

Perhaps feeling similar pressure that befell Kwan as defending World and U.S. Champion in the 1997 U.S. Championships, Lipinski all but eliminated herself from repeating as U.S.

Champion, falling on a triple loop.

"I felt confident and it was going so well," a stunned Lipinski said. "I just didn't get the lift I needed. I'm disappointed, but at least I wasn't doubting, and it wasn't a technical problem. Just a fluke mistake at the time."

With Kwan, Bobek, Kwiatkowski and Lipinski holding the top four spots respectively entering the free skate, a sold-out crowd of 19,082 jammed the CoreStates Center for what promised to be a memorable ladies' final.

Bobek was the first of the top six to take the ice and appeared to seal her spot on the podium and upped the ante for making the Olympic team with marks of 5.6-5.8 for technical merit and 5.7-5.9 for presentation.

Vowing to rebound from her disappointing short, Lipinski made good on her promise in her free skate to music from the movie "The Rainbow." She

reeled off her eight planned triples, including her trademark triple loop-triple loop combination and the triple toe-half loop-triple Salchow combination and her marks placed her ahead of Bobek.

With her historic short program performance serving as an analgesic for her tender foot, Kwan took to the ice for her first competitive free skate in more than two months. If she could harness a fraction of the confidence that she exhibited in the free skate, she would become the first U.S ladies' single skater since Debi Thomas to regain a U.S. title.

From the opening strains of her music "Lyra Angelica," Kwan exhibited an air of serenity about her. From her flawless opening triple Lutz-double toe combination to her triple-loophalf loop-double toe combination, Kwan seemed to have found her zone somewhere in the stratosphere above the CoreStates Center.

With the crowd on its feet, Kwan's serenity remained unbroken even through the thunderous applause. That applause remained constant through the end of her program to the display of the technical marks — one 5.8 amongst eight 5.9s — and reached a crescendo at the display of the artistic marks. With eight 6.0s, it was apparent that the booming crowd was in agreement that they had just witnessed the greatest single ladies' performance of all time.



The unenviable task of following one of the greatest skating performances of all time fell on the shoulders of Kwiatkowski, who would need her personal best performance to keep her Olympic dream alive. A fall on a triple Salchow sealed her fate early in the program. A fourth-place finish would leave her as the first alternate as announced by USFSA International Committee Chair Carolyn Kruse. Kwan, Lipinski and Bobek were named to the Olympic and World teams. Nikodinov was named second alternate. Immediately, talk of a possible U.S. medal sweep in Nagano began.

"I think we have a great chance with these girls to sweep," Bobek's coach Christa Fassi said from the post-event dais. "We definitely have the Dream Team."

While it would remain to be seen whether the Dream Team might become reality in Nagano, it was clear to all that the dream skate of Michelle Kwan was one that would be remembered for a long time to come.

"When I'm skating, I want to have fun," Kwan said. "When I'm listening to the music I think of angels, clouds and flying. Nothing can stop me. I'm free and gone. . . . 'Cloud nine' here I come."

#### Championship Men

Coming into these U.S. Champion-ships, Michael Weiss equated his position with that of a challenger in one of boxing's heavyweight title bouts. To dethrone four-time U.S. champion Todd Eldredge, he would have to deliver skating's equivalent of a knockout punch.

Weiss had attempted to deliver a haymaker in the form of a quadruple toe loop in last year's free skate and while that failed attempt stole some thunder from Eldredge's fourth U.S. title campaign, it did not fulfill its intended purpose. So it was with much bravado that Weiss sauntered into Philly and telegraphed the blow with which he intended to knockout the champ in this year's showdown — the quadruple Lutz.

While Eldredge remained noncommittal about whether he would

counter with a quad of his own, the champ expressed confidence that he could again dodge the blow with clean, consistent skating and superior presentation. Among those on the undercard hoping that the slightest slip by either Eldredge or Weiss could give them a shot at one of the two Olympic berths to be decided were two-time U.S. champion Scott Davis and two-time U.S. bronze medalist Dan Hollander. In all, 18 skaters would answer the opening bell for the short program.

Skating first in the short program, veteran Shepard Clark of Atlanta, Ga., set the early standard for the field with a solid performance to Bach's "Fugue in D Minor." His marks of 5.2-5.3 for technical merit and 5.4-5.5 for presentation figured to put him in contention.

Skating fourth, Weiss upped the


ante for Eldredge and Co. with a solid, albeit not flawless, performance to a flamenco guitar piece. While he barely held the landing of his triple toe on the back end of his combination, all other elements were sure and he weighed in with technical marks in the 5.6-5.7 range and presentation marks of 5.7-5.8.

Next up, Eldredge delivered a complete package of spins, jumps and footwork in his "Walk on the Wild Side" short offering. His opening triple Axel-triple toe combination was first-rate as were his spins and footwork and the judges rewarded him with all nine of the first-place ordinals.

The ordering of the top three would remain unchanged until Scott Davis of Great Falls, Mont., skating 14th, edged Clark out of third with fast spins and a solid triple Axel-double toe combination despite a popped triple Lutz. Trifun Zivanovic of Los Angeles, Calif., rounded out the top five heading into the free skate.

With the field of viable Olympic contenders now reduced to the five who would skate last in the final, there were many questions entering the men's free skate. Would Weiss gamble with his immediate Olympic future by carrying through with his promise to attempt the quad Lutz, a jump that had never been landed in competition? Would Eldredge enter the quad fray in his attempt to win a fifth U.S. title?

As the final group took to the ice for their warmup prior to their free skate, all indicators pointed to "yes" on both questions. Weiss and his coach Audrey Weisiger maintained that he would still attempt to make history with the quad Lutz. Eldredge meanwhile tried a quad toe loop in the warmup that sent him

crashing to the ice.

Skating first in the final group, Clark started strong with a solid triple Axel-double toe combination, but subsequently popped two of his next three jumps and put both hands down the landing of the other. While his presentation marks of 5.4-5.5 appeared to secure his best-ever finish, a spot on the medal podium remained uncertain.

Next up, Zivanovic suffered a similar fate to Clark — strong opening triple flip followed by a popped triple Axel and a smattering of doubled triples. Unfortunately for Zivanovic, the lackluster presentation could not offset the technical miscues and he plunged well out of contention.

Skating first among the top three, Eldredge sensed that the time was right to finally put the quad question to rest. Seconds into his free skate to "Gettysburg," Eldredge launched into a quad toe. While he made four complete revolutions, he was unable to hold the landing and crashed again to the ice. There would be no quad for Todd.

Eldredge quickly put the failed attempt behind him with a pair of superb combinations and a pair of solid triple Axels. With technical merit marks of 5.6-5.9 and presentation marks of 5.8-5.9, there was some room for the champ to be dethroned, but not much.

The quadfest took a momentary breather as Davis took the ice hoping to rekindle the magic that had sent him to the Olympic Winter Games in 1994. Davis suffered problems early on — falling on his opening triple Axel — but he rebounded admirably and managed three solid triples in the final 45 seconds of his program. With both sets of marks ranging from 5.5-5.7, all he could do was wait and watch.

With the eyes of all 7,000-plus fans and a nationwide live television audience on him, Weiss wasted little time before attempting his leap into the record books. Seconds into his performance to "Egmont Overture," Weiss reached back, picked and whirled his way into the quad Lutz. While he remained upright on the landing and the crowd roared its approval, it was clearly a two-footed landing. It would be the second flawed quad for Weiss in as many years.

With more than four minutes remaining in his program, Weiss had to harness the adrenaline rush to ensure that his subsequent elements were executed cleanly. He managed mixed results in that regard — as his subsequently solid triple Axel-triple toe combination was followed by a popped triple flip and a scratchy landing on a triple Axel. By program's end, it was clear that he had skated his way on to the Olympic team, but whether he would go as U.S. champion rested solely with the judges.

With Weisiger and his wife/choreographer Lisa by his side, Weiss saw the effects of the quasi-quad reflected in his technical marks of 5.8-5.9, but with only four presentation marks over 5.7, Weiss would be forced to settle for the silver again. Davis would settle for the bittersweet bronze and a spot as first alternate on the Olympic and World Teams.

Afterwards, both Eldredge and Weiss talked about their quad attempts — both expressing no regrets about having tried them — and the United States' chances at the Olympics.

"I hope we can skate as well as we did here or even better and give the rest of the world a run for the medals," said Eldredge.


By winning his fifth U.S. title, Eldredge joined an illustrious foursome atop the list of most U.S. men's titles amassed (7 — Dick Button and Roger Turner; 5 — Eldredge, Sherwin Badger and Robin Lee).

Championship Pairs

Three-time U.S. pair champions Jenni Meno and Todd Sand have seen injuries decimate their dreams in big competitions in the past. So, when the husband-and-wife team set their sights on reclaiming the U.S. title they lost to Kyoko Ina and Jason Dungjen last season, they also prescribed themselves a little preventative medicine.

During this Olympic year when international test runs are seemingly critical, Meno and Sand stayed home training in Costa Mesa, Calif., for most of the international season to protect themselves from injury. For them, a healthy run at the U.S. title was more important than any benefits the early-season internationals might bring.

"We're both injury-free and happily so," Sand said early during Championships Week. "Last year was difficult, especially toward the end,



because I had back surgery and arm surgery, but now I'm ready to go."

While that positive, pain-free outlook would prove short-lived for Meno and Sand, the pair took to the ice along with 13 other pairs in the short program.

Skating in the unenviable first spot in the short were the Colorado Springs, Colo.-based pair of Shelby Lyons and Brian Wells, a team considered to be darkhorse challengers for one of the two Olympic berths to be decided. The pair opened their "El Condor Pasa" performance with problems as neither nailed the opening side-side-side triple Salchows, but the pair rebounded nicely in their subsequent combination spins and lifts. Their technical marks of 5.0-5.1 and unanimous 5.5s for presentation set the standard for the pairs to come.

Next up, Meno and Sand opened with clean side-by-side triple toe loops and demonstrated speed, sychronicity and confidence with each passing element in their performance to "Pomp and Circumstance." With marks of 5.6-5.8 for required elements and 5.7-5.8 for presentation, their marks topped the field until Ina and Dungjen took the ice midway through the

in the standings by a narrow 6-3 margin in the ordinals.

Even the best of the rest had varying degrees of technical difficulties. Laura Handy and J. Paul Binnebose from the University of Delaware grabbed the fourth-place standing with a performance to "Candide," while 1997 World Junior Champions Danielle and Steve Hartsell from Westland, Mich., rounded out the top five.

As previously mentioned, for all of the care Meno and Sand took to remain healthy for this competition, it turned out to be for naught. In the warmup just prior to the start of the free skate, Meno jammed her right ankle on the landing of a throw double Salchow and the couple left the ice to seek medical treatment. By the time the free skate got underway, the couple had returned to the official hotel for additional treatment and therapy.

The first of the top five to skate were the Hartsells. The skating siblings had problems early on as Steve fell out of the landing on the pair's side-by-side double Axels, but they rebounded well to post scores of 5.2-5.5 for technical merit and 5.1-5.5 for presentation. Next up, 1997 U.S. Junior Champions Tiffany and Johnnie Stiegler of Manhattan Beach, Calif., continued to impress spectators and judges alike with their burgeoning talents. While their performance lacked the difficult side-by-side triples of the top pairs, the elements they executed were clean with a presentation still well beyond their years.

By the time the final warmup group took to the ice, Meno and Sand had returned to the arena in hopes of gutting it through their performance. After consulting with the physicians and taking a cursory look at the couple during the warmup, the pair's coach John Nicks made the call for Meno and Sand to be withdrawn from the competition. Upon being informed of the decision, Meno was distraught.

"She warmed up not too badly on the first couple of jumps, but when we got to the throws she couldn't land without pain," Nicks explained. "I didn't want to go on and hurt herself any more. . . . She's very, very disappointed in her non-participation in tonight's competition."

The withdrawal of Meno and Sand opened the way for Lyons and Wells to the silver medal position. Again the pair suffered problems early on with their opening side-by-side triples as Lyons popped the loop and Wells fell, but their ensuing split triple twist and throw triple loop were solid as were their side-by-side triple Salchows to double toe combinations. With Ina and Dungjen yet to skate, Wells and Lyons stood atop the field.

While the withdrawal of Meno and Sand could have lessened the intensity with which Ina and Dungjen approached their "Polovetsian Dances" free skate, it did not. The defending champions opened with a lofty throw



triple Salchow and first-rate side-byside triple toe loops. They aggressively attacked each element and were rewarded by the judges with 5.8s and 5.9s in both marks.

"Everything went well tonight,"
Dungjen said. "We came in wanting to
put out the best performance we could
and it was even better than I thought
it would be. It was an incredible performance."

With Lyons and Wells finishing in second, the question still remained who would fill the second Olympic spot. After tallying the vote of the USFSA International Committee, committee chair Carolyn Kruse announced that Meno and Sand had been named to the Olympic Team pending the outcome of a monitoring session that would be conducted in two weeks.

Championship Dance

At the 1997 U.S. Championships, Detroit-based dancers occupied all three spots on the medal podium. While a Motown sweep seemed certain for the second consecutive year, the central questions seemed to be: How deep could the domination run? And, which two of the three Olympic-eligible couples from the Motor City would represent the U.S. in Nagano?

Certainly the premier U.S. dance team of Elizabeth Punsalan and Jerod Swallow, who would be vying for a record-tying fifth U.S. title in this their final year in the eligible ranks, appeared to be a virtual lock for the top spot, but things could prove interesting beyond that with Detroit stablemates Kate Robinson and Peter Breen and recently crowned World Junior Champions Jessica Joseph and Charles

After two U.S. Junior titles and a World Junior Championship, Jessica Joseph and Charles Butler skated their way to a silver medal and a spot on the Olympic team.

Butler figuring in the mix. Neither Detroit SCers Naomi Lang and Peter Tchernyshev nor 1997 U.S. silver medalists Eve Chalom and Mathew Gates were eligible to compete at the Olympics due to the foreign national status of Tchernyshev and Gates, although both couples were expected to contend for medals.

The question of how deep the Detroit domination might run was clearly evident after the compulsory dances (Quickstep and Silver Samba) as the Motown dance machine occupied places 1-5 with Punsalan and Swallow in first, Lang and Tchernyshev in second, Joseph and Butler in third, Chalom and Gates in fourth and Robinson and Breen teetering out of the Olympic sweepstakes in fifth.

When asked to pinpoint the reason for the collective success of the Detroit dance program, Punsalan was quick to credit Igor Shpilband and Liz Coates, coaches of all five of the Detroit FSC couples.

"Good coaching attracts good skaters and with Igor and Liz, we have been fortunate enough to attract good skaters to our club," Punsalan said. "It's been a slow progression over the past six years to get to where we are now."

The inclusion of vocal music for this year's selected Jive Original Dance rhythm continued to prove popular with the fans as the dancers boogied their way through the second portion of the competition to the likes of Jerry Lee Lewis, the Blues Brothers and Screamin' Jay Hawkins.

Punsalan and Swallow's "Little Demon" was again the class of the field in terms of speed and innovation. Youngsters Joseph and Butler knocked the dust off of the golden oldy "Great Balls of Fire" and their marks of 5.3-5.7 for composition and 5.4-5.8 for presentation were enough to overtake Lang and Tchernyshev for second overall heading into the free dance.

"We didn't come in with any expectations except to skate about as well as could to prove to the judges that we were ready for the senior level," Joseph said of the couple's rapid rise up the ranks. "It's not like we're chasing (Punsalan and Swallow) but following in their footsteps. It's an honor to be in this position."

In the free dance, Punsalan and Swallow delivered their final performance at the U.S. Championships to an Elvis Presley medley — a dance that the couple announced they would abandon for the Olympics in favor of an Argentine Tango. Their fast and precise maneuverings to their Elvis swan song netted the couple eight 5.9s for presentation and earned them their fifth U.S. title and second trip to the Olympic Winter Games.

"It's been an important year," Punsalan said. "We've been planning for it for so many months. It's coming together in the Olympic year. We were happy with how we skated."

Joseph and Butler capped their remarkable rookie year in the Championship ranks with a second-place finish in the free dance, a silver medal and an unexpected trip to Nagano. "We are very happy with the way this has turned out," Butler said.

Dr. Lew Morrison

On Jan. 18, Dr. Lew Morrison, a 55-year member of the Winter Club of Indianapolis, celebrated his 80th birthday and two days later he was the guest of honor at a special party staged by his many friends during a club test session.

It was the second momentous occasion in the past two months for the man affectionately known as "Dr. Lew" by fellow Winter Clubbers. In December, Dr. Lew passed the Preliminary Moves in the Field test at the tender age of 79.

During more than a half century of involvement with the Winter Club, Dr. Lew has served as President, Secretary along with numerous terms on the club's Board of Directors. He keeps busy with club affairs by serving as the club's historian, teaching Basic Skills classes and assisting with a Special Olympics figure skating program. In addition to his busy schedule,

Dr. Lew continues to take weekly skating lessons — as he has for the past 32 years — from club coach Sandy Lamb.

Skating magazine joins the Winter Club of Indianapolis in saying, "Happy Birthday, Dr. Lew!" and thank you for your longtime and continued devotion to the sport of figure skating.

#### **DEATHS**

#### Dr. Richard J. Porter

Dr. Richard J. Porter, a pioneer in the development of precision team skating, died Dec. 18 in his hometown of Ann Arbor, Mich. He was 84.

Born Oct. 22, 1913, in Swapscott, Mass., Porter received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Virginia and received his Ph.D. from the University of Chicago. He was a member of the faculty of the Public School of Health at the University of Michigan from 1941-1978 and served as the assistant dean for curricular affairs.

In 1957, Porter helped establish the Ann Arbor FSC Hockettes with a group of local teenage girls for the purpose of skating a precision chorus number at the club's annual show. A few months later, with Porter's help, the team members performed during intermission at a University of Michigan hockey game and were an instant hit.

Porter's contributions to the development of preci-

sion — the newest of the five skating disciplines recognized by the International Skating Union — were honored by the Ann Arbor FSC in 1996 with the establishment of the Dr. Richard Porter Precision Classic team skating competition.

In addition, Porter was a board member of the Ann Arbor FSC and a USFSA judge.

He is survived by his wife Rachel (Pat) Kelley Porter, seven children and 12 grandchildren.

#### **Noyes Orr**

Noyes Orr, a member of the Spokane FSC, died Nov. 26 in Spokane, Wash., following a lengthy illness.

Orr was raised in Tacoma, Wash., and began skating at the Lakewood Winter Club. After moving to Spokane in the 1950s, Orr joined the Spokane FSC and was an active member for more than 45 years — serving in a variety of capacities from president to board member up until the time of his death. In 1995, Orr received his 25-year pin as a USFSA figure and dance judge. He was appointed Judge Emeritus in September

Orr's also was a roller skating judge and was active in the Scottish Country Dancers. Additionally, Orr was an avid bag pipe player with the Angus Scott Pipe Band and instructed many students on the classic Scottish instrument.

Orr's knowledge of music and sound equipment was instrumental to the success of many dance sessions, ice shows and competitions that the Spokane FSC has hosted through the years.

During the last 12 years of his life, Orr worked to develop a successful dance club session at Riverfront Park Ice Palace in Spokane. He skated at these sessions until the age of 86.

Orr was respected by all who knew him for his many kindnesses and the encouragement he gave to all skaters during his many years as a judge.

#### Harry W. Meiss

Harry W. Meiss of Cincinnati, Ohio, a member of the Queen City FSC for more than 40 years, died Jan. 3. He was 78.

Meiss, along with his wife of 54 years, Nancy (a USFSA national judge), attended numerous World Championships and several Olympic Winter Games. Meiss, a prominent Cincinnati businessman, also was instrumental in the conduct of the 1987 World Figure Skating Championships in Cincinnati. Meiss will be remembered by the skating community for his quiet, caring nature and for his dedication to the sport he loved.

Meiss is survived by his wife, Nancy; a daughter, Toni M. Scherzer of Cleveland and one granddaughter.



## Eyeing the Future

With the majority of the focus on the championship-level skaters and their battles for spots on the Olympic team, the junior skaters were not to be overlooked. With the 13 members of the 1998 U.S. Olympic Team owning nine U.S. junior titles, a precedent certainly exists for junior champions to represent the U.S. in an Olympic Winter Games. Several junior skaters were hoping that their performance at the U.S. Championships could send them on a similar path.

#### Junior Ladies

It was a competition of firsts for Sarah Hughes. The 12-year-old representing the SC of New York was competing in her first national championship at any level. Never before had she competed in a juvenile, intermediate or novice championship.

In her first try, Hughes captured the Junior Ladies championship.

Hughes had two previous attempts at qualifying, advancing to Eastern Novice sectionals in 1996 and '97, but fell short in her bid to make it to the Championships, placing 10th and sixth respectively.

Performed to music from the motion

picture soundtrack "JFK" and the "Olympic Fanfare," Hughes turned in a solid short program that earned her high enough marks to claim first place on seven of the nine judges' score cards.

Two nights later, Hughes performed a jump-filled free skate that was element-packed from start to finish.

Hughes' free skate was highlighted by two combinations, both of which were special in their own right.

Hughes' initial combination continued on her theme of firsts. She landed a triple Lutz/triple toe combination flawlessly and effortlessly. It was so clean that it was impossible to notice that it was her first time to try that combination in competition.

Her second combination was equally as impressive as the first. She nailed all three elements of a double Axel/double toe/double loop near the end of the program to help her win in the free skate and junior championship.

"The double Axel/double toe/double loop is impressive because it's at the end of the program, when she's tired," said coach Patti Johnson.

Also in Hughes' free are three other triples and a double Axel.

"I think the jumps are the best," Hughes said. "It's like you are flying through the air."

Hughes admitted that she wasn't expecting to perform this well at such a young age in her first U.S. Championship.

"I wasn't really expecting to win," she said. "I was just hoping to skate a calm, clean program and just do the

best I can because it was my first nationals."

Andrea Aggeler, representing the St. Clair Shores FSC, improved from a fourth-place short to move up to the silver. Aggeler, 17, used her height and her long lines to produce a graceful free skate that was placed first by two judges and second by the other seven.

A silver medalist in this event a year ago, Erin Pearl fought through a season riddled with injuries to become a two-time medalist. Pearl, from the Detroit SC, has been fighting back injuries in the off-season and throughout portions of this season.

"There's not been much pain in my back lately," she said. "I feel like it's all healed."

Both Hughes and Pearl said they will move up to the senior level for next season.

The 1997 Novice champion, Naomi Nari Nam of the All Year FSC won the pewter.

#### Junior Men


After three years of disappointing performances at the novice level, Scott Smith and his coach Pam Gregory decided it was time for a change. They collectively chose to pass on future attempts in the novice championships.

Smith, representing the University of Delaware FSC, made his debut in the junior championships in 1998 and, according to his coach, the fresh start helped him focus. The move proved to be the right one as Smith won the 1998 U.S. Junior Men's Championship.

In his first try at the U.S. Championships, Smith placed fourth at the 1995 Novice championships. A strong short was followed by a disappointing free skate. The next two seasons, Smith was plagued by problems beyond his control. He was forced to miss the 1996 Championships with a fracture in his back. In 1997, Smith fell ill during the competition with the flu and it affected his performance and he finished sixth.

But this year was a fresh start for Smith at the junior level.

"He's had a lot of unfortunate circumstances, so we just moved up and said, 'Let's forget this novice,' and I had a feeling that with the new event

and with no pressure of holding back, he'd do well," Gregory said.

In fact, Gregory was so confident in Smith's abilities, that she knew he had a legitimate chance to win the title.

"I thought he was going to win," she said. "Scott's really good at the triple jumps, and in the junior, there are a lot of inconsistent skaters. They can do the triple jumps, but can't put

together a program. Scott is very good at that. I thought that if we got here healthy, that he'd do very well."

Smith skated the best short and the best free of the competition, according to the judges. Six of the nine judges in the short and eight of the nine in the free placed Smith at the top.


Familiar with placing first in the short program — he won the short program at the 1995 Novice Championships only to fall to fourth after a fifth-place free skate — Smith concentrated on removing the short from his memory and skate the free as if it was a new competition.

"I was very excited (after winning the short), but I just tried not to think about the short program and concentrate on the long and pretend I had no idea what place I was in," he said.

Skating to "Capelia," Smith needed a strong outing to hold up to the rest of the field that followed.

A performance that would be good enough to win required him to successfully complete the elements in the beginning of his program, something which he was not completely confident in.

"I've been having some trouble with opening. Once I got past the first three jumps, I just stayed confident that I'd



probably be alright," Smith said. "The opening I've been missing a couple of jumps in it. So I just wanted to be real strong for it."

It all nearly fell apart on Smith's first jump, but he held on to the landing and was able to skate clean for the remainder of the program.

"I'm happy that I really fought through my opening jump, it did not get up at all," he said. "It was really forward. Then I just fought hard through it the whole way so I came out of it on my feet."

Skating second to last, Braden Overett of the Denver FSC had the opportunity to improve on his fifthplace short thanks to mistakes by the competitors that skated before him.

Overett's only blemish was a stumble on a planned triple Salchow that was turned into a double.

"Coming in second place was really an unexpected outcome," he said. "After the short, placing fifth, I was hoping to move up into the top four. That was my ultimate goal."

Kurt Fromknecht of the Winterhurst FSC placed third in both the short and free to win the bronze medal. Novice champ of a year ago, Daniel Lee, representing the Broadmoor SC, won the pewter.


#### **Junior Pairs**

The chase for a junior pairs title was as topsy-turvy as a featured roller coaster in an amusement park. Scores were all over the place, ordinals varied and the results from the free skate differed greatly from that of the short program.

At the end of all that commotion stood Heather
Allebach and Matthew Evers, as the junior pairs champions. Ninth a year ago,
Allebach, from the University of Delaware FSC, and Evers, of the Red River Valley FSC, suffered from an inconsistent short program.

So inconsistent was their short that it was reflected in the judging. With marks ranging from 3.8-4.7 for required elements and 4.0-5.1 for presentation, their ordinals were equally scattered. Three third-places contrasted with the seventh- and 12th-place ordinals they received. The scattered ordinals had them in fourth place following the short.

Larisa Speilberg and Craig Joeright, both representing the Detroit SC, looked strong following the short and

appeared to be the team to beat. Fourteen of the 18 short-program marks Speilberg and Joeright received were 5.0s. They were placed first by seven of the judges and won the short.

But the free skate was a different story for Speilberg and Joeright, who skated second to last, immediately after Allebach and Evers. While their marks topped at 5.1, most hovered between 4.7-4.9.

At that moment, Allebach and Evers, stood in first place. A strong free skate was evident in the improvement from their short to the free as they received 4.9-5.2 for technical merit and 4.7-5.1 for presentation.


"We skated our best and that's what we wanted and the final was up to the judges," Evers said.

One pair remained capable of knocking Allebach and Evers out of first. Third place after the short, a win in the free would have made Jaisa MacAdam, of the SC of Boston, and Garrett Lucash, of Charter Oak FSC, the champions.

MacAdam survived an early stumble and the pair skated strong for the rest of the free, but it was only good enough for second.

"You don't let something like that (stumble) distract or affect you," she said. "I think about one element at a time and once one is over, I concentrate on the next."

As their program concluded, the relief of skating a solid program was



evident in MacAdam's expression.

"I said, 'We did it!' and gave him a big hug," she said. "We came here to do our best. It was one of our best long programs ever. We had been training so hard that we wanted to come out and enjoy this now that the training is over."

MacAdam and Lucash benefitted from mid-season changes in both programs.

"We changed our short program right after we returned from our first international competition (the Ukrainian Souvenir)," Lucash said. "We also re-choreographed parts of our long and added two new elements and Charles Butler from the junior level seemed to give Silverstein and Pekarek the inside track. A 10th-place finish at the 1998 World Junior Championships and a strong international season that led to a berth in the Junior Series Final seemed to make this team a safe bet at winning the junior title. If all that wasn't enough, the reputations of coaches Liz Coates and Igor Shpilband — coaches of the top five championship dance finishers — had to go a long way to establishing this team's chances at a junior dance title.

But instead of an easy route to a championship, Silverstein and Pekarek

Melissa Gregory and James Shuford came away with the U.S. Junior Dance championship after a tough battle with Detroit SC pair Jamie Silverstein and Justin Pekarek.

in our long that we had been doing but were new to competition for us."

The performances of Allebach & Evers and MacAdam & Lucash pushed Spielberg and Joeright to third. Tiffany Sfikas and Josiah Modes, both representing the Tampa Bay FSC, were second after the short and fell to fourth after finishing sixth in the free.

#### Junior Dance

Before the junior dance competition started, Detroit SC skaters Jamie Silverstein and Justin Pekarek had to be considered the favorites — not only for ther own merits, but also for the merits of other Detroit SC dancers.

A second-place finish a year ago combined with the exodus of two-time junior dance champions Jessica Joseph found themselves in one of the better competitions of the week-long U.S. Championships with Melissa Gregory and James Shuford — fourth-place finishers from a year ago.

Silverstein and Pekarek dashed out to a quick lead claiming firsts in both compulsory dances. Gregory and Shuford's win in the original dance set up a winner-take-all free dance.

Gregory, representing the Broadmoor SC, and Shuford, from the Skokie Valley SC, edged out Silverstein and Pekarek in the free dance to take the title. With marks so close, the winners weren't sure of their fate until they saw it on the stadium's scoreboards.

"I think I was more nervous after we got off the ice (waiting the scores) than as we skated," she said.

But as the odds-on favorites, Silverstein and Pekarek weren't disappointed in their performance. After a strong season, Silverstein said their goal at the U.S. Championships was to carry the momentum from the World Junior Championships into this event.

"We just came back from junior worlds, which was a really big high for us. So we were just trying to maintain that, which is the hardest," she said.

Shuford and Gregory earned marks from 5.1-5.3 for technical merit in their free dance and their presentation marks ranged from 5.3-5.6 to secure the junior dance championship. The couple said choosing the right free dance was not as difficult as it might appear.

The inspiration for their free came from choreographer Sandra Hess. After watching a Danielle Steele TV movie about a man trying to steal a married woman from her husband and children. Portraying that story is not easy, according to Shuford. They use the story as motivation.

"We've been working with a national coach to try to improve the emotion because we realize that no one is going to see that story on the ice. It really helps to give us some focus for drawing the emotion out of it," he said.

Both teams have their sights on accomplishing many goals in future years at the senior level — Gregory and Shuford plan to move up to the senior level next season. As Shuford said, the progress of young American dancers is encouraging to their future.

"It's real exciting to see someone so young and new such as Jessica and Charlie really fly up and it's real encouraging for us as young skaters," he said.

In an equally exciting competition, Crystal Beckerdite of the Palomores SC, and Raphael Kelling of the Broadmoor SC, won the bronze medal over Cerise Henzes, from the SC of Boston, and Walter Lang, from the Babson SC. Henzes and Lang placed third in the two compulsory dances and original dance. Beckerdite and Kelling's fourth-place finishes in the same dances kept them in striking distance. Taking third in the free, Beckerdite and Kelling were able to catapult themselves into third place.

# Eleven-year-old phenom Elizabeth Kwon continues to rise, winning the 1998 U.S. Novice Ladies crown just months after winning the intermediate national title.

## A New Kwon on the Horizon

The atmosphere inside Philadelphia's CoreStates Spectrum for the start of the Novice events was as warm and inviting as the unseasonably comfortable weather outdoors as more than 4,600 enthusiatic figure skating fans took advantage of a well-devised "Family Day" promotion on Sunday, Jan. 4, to see the future of U.S. figure skating compete in the Novice short programs.

With the opportunity to compete before a large and receptive audience in such a fabled facility as the Spectrum (site of the 1968 U.S. Championships), the rising young stars of U.S. figure skating did not disappoint.

#### **Novice Ladies**

The ladies collectively rose to the occasion by presenting one of the most delightful short program rounds ever seen in their category.

There were falls and errors but each of the 12 contestants had their individual merits — demonstrating a variety of styles and a clear dedication and devotion to interesting choreography.

The youngest competitor, 11-year-old Elizabeth Kwon of McLean, Va.,

won the free skate in a unanimous decision — moving up from a third-place standing after the short program to take the title.


Included in her free skate, performed to ballet music, were a double Axel to double loop, two triple toes (one combined with a double toe), a double Axel from an Ina Bauer, a triple Salchow to double toe, a triple loop and some excellent spins.

Though her career has been short, Kwon has had her share of hurdles to clear enroute to the Novice title.

She began skating at the age of 3, following her older brother — who is now a promising young hockey player training in Canada — to the rink. Her first experiences in group lessons were not as stellar as her performances since.

Kwon recalls that the rink manager threw her out of her group class because she hadn't learned to pick herself up properly after falling and was holding the others back.

She was forced to enroll in private lessons before she could return to the group class. After graduating from the group class, coaches Debbie Prachar and Nick Purna took the promising young skater and have taught her since.

After conquering that hurdle, Kwon's coaches had to convince her to stop wearing beautiful, lengthy Korean outfits while skating because they hid her legs.

Explaining this to Kwon was difficult, her coaches said, because she did not speak English at the time.

"Everything had to be done by visualization," Prachar said.

This season, Kwon faced another minor setback when she placed third at the Eastern sectionals.


"She's always enjoyed watching the other competitors," Prachar explained. "This time when she saw some were trying more difficult moves, it seemed to get to her."

That proved to be a valuable learning experience in preparation for the U.S. Novice Championships. Kwon had to learn to ignore the rest of the field.

"I just got nervous, but I learned a lot," Kwon said.

While she may still be learning to deal with her nerves, Kwon has no lack of ambition. She readily states that she wants to be a two-time Olympic champion. She's off to a good start having won two national titles in as many years. Last April, she won the Intermediate Ladies championship at the Junior Olympics.

She said she is also helped by training in the same rink as 1998 Olympian Michael Weiss and looks forward to learning new moves, including the triple Axel which she






Parker Pennington won his third national title, claiming the 1998 Novice Men's Championship by winning both the short program and free skate.

has attempted while in a harness.

Twelve-year-old Jennifer Markham of La Jolla, Calif., improved on a fifthplace finish at last year's Nationals by earning the silver medal. Markham, who is coached by Frank Carroll, Irina Rodnina and Evelyn Kraemer in Lake Arrowhead, Calif., was second after the short program, but only fourth in the free skate.




Jennifer Kirk, 13, of Newton, Mass., rose from seventh to win the bronze medal with a second-place free skate.

Sixteen-year-old Kristen Adamczyk of Burr Ridge, Ill., training in Colorado Springs, Colo., who had won the initial round with a solid showing, dropped to fifth behind Sara Wheat of Swedesboro, N.J., training in Newark, Del.

#### Novice Men

The 1995 National Juvenile and 1996 National Intermediate champion, Parker Pennington, took the men's title. The 13-year-old from Windsor, Conn., who trains under Carol Heiss Jenkins and Glyn Watts in Lakewood, Ohio, drew to skate the short program first and set a standard that wasn't equalled.

Before his free skate, he followed his set routine of throwing a penny in a fountain — fortunately there was one handy in his hotel lobby. That — and performing a triple Lutz, a triple toe to double toe, a triple

loop and two triple Salchows (one combined with a double toe) — won him the first-place votes of five of the nine judges.

Pennington started skating when he

was 3 years old. He began training with Jenkins and Watts four years ago, at which time Jenkins encouraged Pennington's younger brother Colin to try the sport. The younger Pennington is a national Juvenile Champion and Jenkins sees them following in the tracings of the Santee brothers (David and James)— who played a significant role in U.S. skating in the 1970s and early '80s.

Watts, who choreographs Pennington's programs, said his student's drive to succeed was a main part of the reason that he won the U.S. Novice title.

"I don't think I've ever seen a more focused skater of his age," Watts said. "He's already picked out the music he'd like to skate to next season."

With a lively Yankee Doodle Dandy medley for his free skate, Ryan Bradley, a 14-year-old from Colorado Springs, Colo., who was third after the short, won the silver medal pushing Johnny Weir of Newark, Del., down to third overall.


#### **Novice Pairs**

The Detroit SC-based duo of Christie Jaszewski and Joshua Murphy won both sections of the Novice pairs to capture the gold.

Murphy is one of the contingent of skaters that accompanied coach Craig Maurizi from Omaha, Neb., to Detroit.

Maurizi teamed Murphy, 16, with Jaszewski, 11, in October of 1995 although neither had any previous pair experience. According to Maurizi, having experience competing in pairs is not important in the formation of a strong pairs team.

"To win pairs today, you must have two excellent singles skaters. They must have side-by-side double Axels," he said. "The pair that wins doesn't necessarily have the most tricks, but they will have the most speed and unison. Last year, Christie and Joshua got to Midwests, but didn't have the speed

and unison to make it further. They've worked hard since then, mainly on speed."

"I was a little scared to try pairs, but I really wanted to try it because it looked like a lot of fun," Jaszewski said.

Their free skate, which was awarded seven first-place ordinals, was performed to "101 Dalmations." It was selected by Maurizi to fit their style.

"I wanted something that was light and uplifting," he said.

In second place entering the free skate, Katie Gadkowski of Colorado Springs, Colo., fell from a lift in the warm-up to the long program.

Landing with such force on the ice, Gadkowski fractured a bone in her hand and bruised her ribs and hip.

Courageously, Gadkowski opted to skate, but with partner Derek Trent, dropped from second to fourth.

The Jamestown, N.Y.-based pair of Emily Morgan and Justin Cogley and Costa Mesa, Calif.-based Jessica Waldstein and Devin Patrick advanced from third and fourth respectively to take the silver and bronze medals.

#### Novice Dance

Penny Schnering and Timothy Jones, training at the University of Delaware in Newark, dominated the compulsory dances — Foxtrot, Blues and American Waltz — managing 26 of the 27 first-place ordinals in the three dances combined.

Schnering and Jones held onto that lead although they were challenged closely in the free dance by Wendi Mangiagli of Montclair, Calif., and Andre LeBlanc of Houston, Texas, training together in Southern California.

Schnering, 15, teamed with Jones, 18, last May after her previous partnership with Marty Weinberger dis-

solved following a fifth-place finish in Easterns a year ago.

Jones had previously teamed with his sister, Kim, and advanced as far as the U.S.

Championships in 1996 where they placed fourth. But Jones was left searching for a partner when his sister decided to retire.

Jerry Santoferra has coached Jones for the past eight years.

Schnering also trained at the same rink and Santoferra brought them together as they both searched for partners.

"Their skating styles really looked similar when they tried out," Santoferra said. "They're very technically correct. They have good unison. Right now, we're working to try to get them a little more maturity."


"I was nervous in the free," Schnering said. With good reason apparently.

Forced to scramble for a dress before their free dance, skated to music from "Crime Scene" and "Dick Tracy," Schnering borrowed a black shoulderless dress from her previous coach, Christine Fowler, just before the performance and skated to gold.

Mangiagli, 16, and LeBlanc, 18, gave the leaders a serious challenge in the free dance by earning two of the nine first-place ordinals. They would settle for the silver.

## A Ladies Battle in Figures

The figures competitions were without men for the first time since their separation, as no men qualified for the event under this year's unified figures format. Next year marks the final time figures will be contested at the U.S. Championships.

#### Championship Figures

Cassy Papajohn of Littleton, Colo., won her second U.S. Figures Championship, sweeping first place in all three figures. Papajohn, the 1996 U.S. Champion, was the only competitor to receive scores in the 5.0 range, earning four 5.0s on the third figure — the RBO, LBI Paragraph Loop.

Lynne Petta of Scottsdale, Ariz., held on to second place with two second-place finishes in the first two figures. Sarah Devereaux of Chugiak, Alaska, competing in both Championship Ladies and Figures, captured the bronze medal.

#### Junior Figures

In one of the more competitive events at this year's U.S. Championships, Kharen Kloeffler and Brooke Pitman tied for the gold in junior figures.

Kloeffler of San Diego, Calif., the 1997 Novice Figures Champion, struggled with the first figure — the LFI, RBI rocker — and placed seventh. A third-place second figure and a first-place third figure helped Kloeffler climb into a tie with Pitman of Columbus, Ind., who recorded third, first and seventh places in her three figures respectively.





## Russian Invasion









Russians capture nine of the 12 medals awarded at the 1998 European Figure Skating Championships in Milan, Italy — including a sweep of the gold and silver medals.

Russian skaters continued their dominance at the European Figure Skating Championships by capturing nine of the 12 medals up for grabs at the 1998 pre-Olympic edition of this competition, Jan. 11-18, in Milan, Italy.

For the second consecutive year, the Russians swept the gold medals in all four events, but this year's medal haul also included a sweep of all four silvers.

Contributing to the Russian dominance was the withdrawal of several top European contenders from the event. Whether for pain or politics the noshows in ladies' and men's singles were numerous enough to eliminate the qualifying rounds, while the pairs competition, already diminished by the absence of Germany's Mandy Wöetzel and Ingo Steuer, suffered a further loss when Marina Eltsova and Andrei Bushkov from Russia withdrew due to equipment failure less than a minute into their short program. The only event that survived in tact was the dance.

#### Dance

There were no surprises when the compulsory results flashed across the board, but there was a bit of intrigue before each compulsory.

In an early practice session, reigning Olympic champion and prohibitive favorite Pasha Grishuk was cut on the elbow when she collided with compatriot Anjelika Krylova.

"It was a bit painful, but not serious," Grishuk said.

Later, during the Quickstep warmup, Krylova's blade sliced through Platov's pant leg, cutting his calf.

"It was crowded out there, and everyone was skating so closely together, that's why it happened," said Krylova's partner Oleg Ovsiannikov.

Both Russian couples took the top two spots. Grishuk and Platov won both compulsories, with Krylova and Ovsiannikov placing second.

The French team of Marina Anissina and Gwendal Peizerat entered the original dance in third.

The Jive original — an excellent selection for the season — is fast, tricky and very entertaining. Anissina and Peizerat covered two of those bases with good edges, but lost some speed on the curves and remained third.

Grishuk and Platov tried to distance themselves from the field with a wellbalanced and extremely difficult interpretation of Elvis Presley's "Jail House

Rock." Their unison was impeccable throughout, but halfway through the dance, Platov fell backward to the ice. That brief interruption cost them first place in the original.

Krylova and Ovsiannikov benefitted. Good edges and a displayed sense of rhythm to Presley's "Rock Around the Clock" earned them the top spot heading into the final.

In the free dance, Barbara Fusar-Poli and Maurizio Margaglio of Italy, fifth overall, woke the crowd with a delightfully playful and romantic interpretation of Nino Rota and Federico Fellini's "Amarcord." They were narrowly edged out of fourth place by Russians Irina Lobacheva and Ilia Averbukh.

The bronze went to Anissina and Peizerat with a solid string of third-place ordinals. Two points of choreographic interest occur when Anissina lifts Peizerat.

"It's not a gimmick," Peizerat said, "Both moves developed with the program."

Though their "Romeo and Juliet" prevented a Russian sweep, it did not break up the top two.

The gold and silver went respectively to Grishuk and Platov, and Krylova and Ovsiannikov, but not by a unanimous vote. Grishuk and Platov earned seven first-place marks with their technically difficult dance to Michael Nyman's "Memorial Requiem."

#### Men

Russia's Evgeni Plushenko, second to skate in the short program, truly set the base mark for the remaining competitors. His performance — precise, smooth, and complete — typified the Russian practice of leaving nothing undone.

Alexander Abt continued Russia's tradition of quality men's skating. His late selection to replace Ilia Kulik did not keep him from overtaking Plushenko and pushing up the ante for Alexei Yagudin.

Skating last, Yagudin rose to the challenge. Self-assured, and without trepidation about attacking the requirements, Yagudin turned the European short into a Russian sweep.




Despite a second-place original dance, Pasha Grishuk and Evgeny Platov won the European Championships, their 21st major win in a row.

The free skate warmup was a quad and triple/triple exhibition of the top contenders. The subsequent contest was no letdown, but before that show, a stunning performance was turned in by France's Philippe Candeloro.

Candeloro's short program was a ninth-place disaster, but his free skate to Maxim Rodrigues' "Three Musketeers" was brilliant. He called his performance "one of my best in my career." Belgian judge Rita Zonnekeyn agreed — giving Candeloro the first 6.0 for presentation since Alexei Urmanov's in 1995. Third in the free, he moved up to fourth overall.

Abt's performance looked choreographically disjointed. His planned quad toe loop was a faulted triple. Had Candeloro's short been better, Abt's fourth-place free would not have been

enough to win the bronze.

Plushenko came out with a vengeance, although he put a toe down on the quad toe loop/triple combination. More triples followed, including a triple Axel/triple toe combination, and earned him the silver medal.

Alexei Yagudin turned the championship into a Russian sweep for the men. His triples were solid, but the quadruple toe loop was not top quality. The quad, however, was judged clean by Sally Ann Stapleford of the ISU's Technical Committee, and so it stood on the books and the gold medal was his.

#### **Pairs**

The pairs competition, after the fallout, was dominated by Russians Elena Berezhnaya and Anton Sikharulidze. Their elegance, line, and positions on the ice were undeniably superior to all of the others. Assured, but with no air of arrogance, their presentation in the short program was almost flawless. Polish judge Anna Sierocka saw it as such and awarded the pair a 6.0.

The excitement generated by Sarah Abitbol and Stephane Bernadis of France was infectious. With precise movements and almost everything in perfect unison, they drove a second place wedge between the Russians.

Oksana Kazakova and Artur Dmitriev seem almost obsessed with keeping "2001" until they get it just right, but it's a program that seems jinxed. Unison problems throughout marred their performance and left them third.

In the free skate, the magic surrounding Abitbol and Bernadis faded. Errors crept into the program as it went on, and by the end, the cumulative effect left the couple in third place overall.

Kazakova and Dmitriev's free-skate moves seemed predictable and lacked originality, although their performance was good enough to move up to second and win the silver medal, but it lacked the attraction of their top-notch compatriots.

While Berezhnaya and Sikharulidze were not quite as sharp in the free skate as they were in their short, the aura that surrounds them hid their minor flaws. The romance, charm, and sense of security that they appear to find in each other exudes an honesty that fake

smiles cannot imitate. Their traditional "Dark Eyes" was a golden performance by a golden couple.

#### Ladies

A wide array of ordinals made for an interesting ladies' short program.

Germany's Tonja Szewczenko survived skating first for most of the short, retaining the top spot through the first 28 skaters.

Russia's Irina Slutskaya looked uncomfortable in the short. Surva Bonaly of France skated cleanly and seemed to surpass Slutskaya on the ice, but with the varied ordinals she was behind the Russian.

Maria Butyrskaya of Russia had two

hands down on the triple Lutz to her combination, then turned out on the following double toe relegating her to fifth, but her medal hopes remained very much in tact.

Following the skate of Hungary's Krisztina Czako, the ordinals seemed to be corrected and the order entering the free skate was Szewczenko, Bonaly, Slutskava and Czako.

In the free skate, placements for the last group produced results even more astonishing than in the short, although the blame easily rested with the inconsistency of the skaters.

Bonaly's famous triple toe-half looptriple Salchow wasn't quite there. Czako's skating produced as wide a

range of ordinals — third to 12th earning a sixth in the free, dropping her to fifth overall.

Szewczenko aborted a number of planned triples, and dropped to third. Slutskaya's fortune moved her up to second place in the long, and won her the silver, but her performance was hardly any better than Szewczenko's. Three attempted triple loops eluded her.

The real star of the day was Butyrskaya. After a successful opening triple Lutz, her expected nervousness vanished.

The physics of staying on her feet worked very well, and dramatized perfectly her exotic style, it catapulted her from fifth place to first.

at intermission at a local speed skating meet and even skated at a Los Angeles Kings hockey game between periods.

Currently, there are a number of new rinks opening up in Southern California and we are looking into the possibility of skating in Grand Opening festivities which may hopefully spark more interest in precision skating at these new facilities.

We always find that our team learns so much from every public performance and that enthusiasm at the next practice is very high. The more we perform, the more comfortable and relaxed we feel and learn from any mistakes that we may have made.

Our team tried to compete as much as possible, but unfortunately at this time, there are not enough teams in the area to support local competitions. Many of the teams also skate in ISI competitions, but there are usually only one or two teams in these events.

In 1997, the Arrowhead FSC resurrected a competition that began in the mid '70s as a dress rehearsal for all of the local teams competing at sectionals a few weeks later.

The event was run exactly like a competition — even though each team entered was in a different category — and the panel of judges critiqued them and even conducted on-ice sessions with them afterwards. All the teams seemed to benefit from this experience as reflected by their performances at sectionals.

Last April — in response to the lack of local competitions — the first United SKATES Precision Challenge was held. This event attracted 19 teams from up and down the West Coast of the U.S. and Canada and looks to have a bright future with anticipated participation from teams further east for next season.


But enough about what we've done out here in the west. What can you do as a skater and a team member? Look for any opportunity to get your team — and precision skating in general — into the public spotlight.

There are many ways to do this. Start with your club. Encourage them to include precision skating in exhibitions, carnivals and competitions. Hockey teams or speed skating groups in your own rink may be looking for alternate entertainment for intermission periods. Professional and semi-pro hockey teams also like to include a variety of intermission exhibitions.

There are always opportunities to create your own events. Organized critiques where a number of teams bring in judges to share the expense of ice time can be very beneficial. New precision competitions are always welcomed.

Look for the alternatives and get your team out there.
