



"I'll Take Four-Time U.S. Champions for \$300, Alex"

Skating fans should keep an eye on their local listings for a future telecast of "Celebrity Jeopardy" starring Olympic gold medalist Scott Hamilton.

Competing for charity, Hamilton was paired against Greg Germann, the pinstriped barracuda named "Fish" on "Ally McBeal" and NBC Today Show Weekend Edition co-anchor Jodi Applegate.

The show was taped in early January and will be broadcast later this spring. We won't reveal the results, but we can tell you that Hamilton was the crowd favorite — skating friends Kristi Yamaguchi, Ekaterina Gordeeva, Ilia Kulik and Tara Lipinski were in the audience and also were there to record future celebrity clues.



During the 1998-99 International season, the USFSA Team Envelopeadded some promising new pairs teams:

Crystal Beckerdite and Matt Healy started their competitive season off with a fifth place finish at the 1999 World Junior Team Selection Competition, making them alternates for the 1999 World Junior Championships. The pair placed in the top 10 at the 1999 Blue Swords Junior Grand Prix international competition in Chemnitz, Germany and also placed ninth at the 1999 Grand Prize SNP in Slovakia.

Emilie Nussear and Brandon Forsyth were the silver medalists in the Junior Division of the 1998 U.S. Championships. Prior to her partnership with Brandon, Emilie was focused on pairs skating. Brandon and his former partner, Kerrie O'Donnell, placed eighth in the 1997 World Junior. This dance pair placed third in the 1998 Junior World Selection Competition and finished 15th in the 1998 World Junior Championships.

Amanda Magarian and Jerod Guzman are another new duo. Guzman won the 1996 U.S. Junior Championships with former partner Natalie Vlandis. During his five-year partnership with Vlandis, the pair also placed fifth at the 1998 U.S. Championships.

Junior Grand Prix Final

The United States will be represented in every disipline of figure skating at the 1999 Junior Grand Prix Final.

The following U.S. athletes advanced to the final: Sarah Hughes, ladies; Ryan Bradley, men; Matt Savoie, men; Laura Handy and Paul Binnebose, pairs; and Jamie Silverstein and Justin Pekarek, dance.

This year's competition will be held in Detroit, Mich., on March 12-14, 1999.



Russians Defend Home Ice at Grand Prix Final

The ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating travelled the globe for six weeks, taking in the United States, Canada, Germany, France, Russia and Japan. A total of 181 skaters from 26 countries participated in this year's events, the fourth year of the series. There was a new look to the skating world in this the first season of the next Olympic quadrennial. Different partnerships have been formed -both on the ice in new pairs teams and off, as skaters work with new coaches and choreographers. And new names were to be found on the podium after outstanding skating that built to a tremendous climax at the last event in Japan as the world's best battled it out to qualify for a place in the prestigious ISU Grand Prix Final in St. Petersburg, Russia on March 4-7, 1999.

LADIES

Four Final places were left wide open until Japan after European champion and world bronze medalist Maria Butyrskaya won in Detroit and Paris and fellow Russian Elena Sokolova triumphed in Gelsenkirchen and Moscow to qualify for the Final with maximum points.

Canada was the venue where Elena Liashenko (UKR) emerged as a world class skater to win ahead of 17-year-old Fumie Suguri (JPN), back from a year sabotaged by injury and displaying her enchanting talent. A resurgent Nicole Bobek (USA) placed second in Paris to stake her claim to a Final place. World silver medalist Irina Slutskaya (RUS) made her customary erratic start to the season and arrived in Sapporo knowing she had to place high to make the Final. But another new name burst through to take top place on the podium: the virtually unknown 25-year-old

Tatyana Malinina (UZB) outskated the world class field to win the event and qualify for the Final. Slutskaya, Suguri and Liashenko finished behind her to take the remaining three places, leaving Bobek as first reserve.

MEN

A new era of men's skating has begun with the introduction of the option for a quadruple jump in the short program and the top skaters took up the challenge. The first clean quad in the short is yet to come but clean quads and quad/triple combinations abounded in the free.

Only three Russians can go to the ISU Championships but four will go to the Grand Prix Final. The incredible depth in Russian skating was illustrated when Final places went to Evgeny Pluschenko, Alexei Yagudin, Alexei Urmanov and Alexander Abt. And they earned them in tremendous style.

Yagudin, the reigning world champion, was simply invincible and landed a clean quad toeloop to win in Germany and Paris. Plushenko went one better, landing a quad/triple toeloop combination to win in Canada and Japan - and earned his first perfect 6.0 in the process. Urmanov returned after a year off the ice following the serious groin injury that forced him to retire from the World Championships after winning the short program. His win in Russia was his first for nearly two years and a hugely emotional moment. Abt, the European bronze medalist, is accustomed to living in the shadow of his more famous



teammates. A second place to Yagudin in Germany and third behind Urmanov and Plushenko got him to the Final.

Michael Weiss (USA) finished second to Yagudin in Detroit and Paris and proved he has moved up a league this season, pushing the world champion to his very best in Paris. Three time world champion Elvis Stojko (CAN) was also on the comeback trail from the groin injury he suffered winning silver at the Olympic Winter Games. Outclassed by the very strong field in Detroit, he finished fourth but one week later was back to his near best as he placed second to Plushenko in Canada.

PAIRS

World champions Elena Berezhnaya & Anton Sikharulidze (RUS) went from strength to strength, winning in Detroit and Moscow to earn their berth in the Final which takes place in their home city.

The Final will feature two new pairs who only joined forces this season. Maria Petrova, who twice won world junior gold with Sikharulidze, started skating with the veteran Alexei Tikhonov during the summer. Tikhonov had spent four years as a show skater but maintained his eligibility. They finished second in Canada and won in Germany to secure their place.

Kyoko Ina (USA) placed fourth in Nagano with Jason Dungjen but the duo parted ways over the summer and Ina paired up with John Zimmerman. Coached by Tamara Moskvina, the legendary trainer of so many world and Olympic champions including Berezhnaya & Sikharulidze, Ina & Zimmerman placed second in Paris and third in Russia to win their Final place. European bronze medalists Sarah Abitbol & Stephané Bernadis (FRA) recovered from a disappointing sixth place in Detroit with an impressive victory in Paris to earn the last Final place.

DANCE

All the top dance couples meet for the first time at the Grand Prix Final. There tribal drums will take on The Man in the Iron Mask and techno-rock.

World champions Angelika Krylova & Oleg Ovsiannikov (RUS) have departed from their usual style this season and their percussion-only free dance helped them to victory in Germany and Russia. Silver medalists Marina Anissina & Gwendal Peizerat (FRA) won in Paris and Sapporo; their dramatic and emotional free dance is set to the score of The Man in the Iron Mask film. World bronze medalists Shae-Lynn Bourne & Victor Kraatz (DAN) have been working with Torvill & Dean to create their Celtic waltz and technorock free dance. They won in Canada and placed second in Germany.

Irina Lobacheva & Ilia Averbukh became the second Russian couple to qualify for the Final after finishing second in Detroit and Moscow. Even the intricate tie-break system of the Grand Prix could not separate Italy's Barbara Fusar-Poli & Maurizio Margaglio and Lithuania's Margarita Drobiazko & Povilas Vanagas. The couples were absolutely tied in fifth place so both will skate in the Final.



He's smart, disciplined and extremely committed to developing himself both as a person and an athlete. In recent years, this 22-year-old athlete has battled his way up through the depths of the competitive eligible realm, and has established himself among the premier talents in men's singles skating over the past two seasons.

Known for his extraordinary technical ability, strong work ethic and fierce competitive spirit, Weiss seems poised to lead the U.S. Figure Skating Team into the next century and, of course, the 2002 Olympic Winter Games in Salt Lake City.

"This is an exciting prospect, but I try not to think about my skating on such vast terms," Weiss said. "I just try to take everything one step at a time. Each day, I set up various goals for myself, and do my best to achieve those goals. Through it all, I have tried to remain grateful for all of the unbelievable things that have happened in my life because of skating. I have been truly fortunate."

Family Affair

Sports, and skating particularly, has always been a family affair to Weiss. And both his family and love of the sport is growing.

"I have received incredible support from my family throughout my entire skating career," Weiss said. "They've been there through the ups and downs, and have always believed in me." Weiss' father, Greg, was on the 1964 U.S. Olympic Gymnastic Team, and his mother, Marjorie, was also a nationally ranked gymnast. Weiss's oldest sister, Genna, was a Junior World diving champion and his other older sister, Geremi, was a figure skating champion, who won a junior silver medal at the 1987 National Championships.

"I am very proud of my family's accomplishments - they are amazing people, and have made an important impact on me," Weiss said. "They helped teach me the importance of having good life values and a healthy perspective on things. Most importantly, they taught me to always count my blessings."

This past September, Weiss and his wife, Lisa, who doubles as one of his choreographers, celebrated the birth of their first child, daughter Annie Mae. Weiss regards his new little girl, who never seems to stop smiling and laughing, as the greatest gift in his life.

Already showing signs that he is a tremendously devoted father, Weiss and his new daughter are inseparable. During his training breaks, he will race home to spend time with Annie Mae. If his schedule becomes too hectic, Lisa might bring her to the rink so they can be together. "Whenever he has a break or some time off, he'll take Annie Mae. He just loves being around

her all the time. The two are attached at the hip," said Lisa.

Lisa's role has obviously expanded as well to include mother, wife and choreographer.

"Lisa has been absolutely great,"
Weiss said. "I consider myself very
lucky to have ever met her. I could not
have asked for any more in a person."

Describing her husband as someone who is strongly committed to achieving excellence, Lisa said that their marriage has been a terrific experience. "Mike is a good person with a good heart. He is witty and funny, and always says the right thing," she said from their home in Fairfax, Va., just minutes away from both of their families.

Rising Star

Recognized for his high-flying jumps and dramatic artistry, Weiss has come to be known as one of the boldest and most captivating personalities in skating today. He captured nationwide attention in 1997 as he was one of the first men to attempt a quadruple jump at the U.S. Championships, a challenge he continues to strive to master.

Weiss has been carving his niche as one of skating's most daring innova-

tors. In the last few competitive seasons, he has portrayed a diverse range of themes and moods through his programs. His presentations have included an interpretation of the contemporary rock music of Santana; a portrayal of the brilliant and tormented Baroque pianist, Ludwig von Beethoven; and a depiction of a valiant warrior from the Disney film, "Mulan."

"Through my skating, I want to show people what I am about," Weiss said. "I think if you have the proper perspective on competing, you will benefit. The whole process involves challenging yourself, believing in what you do and overcoming any sense of doubt. That, to me, is what competition is really about."

The philosophy apparently works. In 1997 and 1998, Weiss finished second at the U.S. Championships, trailing only veteran men's champion, Todd Eldredge, who is not competing among the eligible ranks this season. He followed those performances up with top-10 finishes at the World Championships. He also finished a strong seventh at the 1998 Olympic Winter Games in Nagano, Japan.

With his confidence growing from his strong 1998 Olympic season, Weiss

has established himself as a formidable leader in men's singles skating with second-place finishes at the 1998 Thrifty Car Rental Skate America and Trophy Lalique in Paris, which earned him a spot in the Grand Prix Final March 4-7 in St. Petersburg, Russia. Pairs team Kyoko Ina and John Zimmerman are the only other American entry in the international final.

"It's certainly been a great season," Weiss said. "But in this sport, you are as good as your last competition, and I try to remember that. I never want to rest on my laurels, I want to just work hard at getting better. The real challenge of skating, I believe, is to continue developing and improving. As long as I keep doing that, I will be successful."

Good Timing

Weiss' success this season has come at a good time. With five-time U.S. Champion Eldredge basically taking the year off, Weiss had no problem assuming the forefront as the most recognizable American male skater.

"I try not to think about the results in regard to competition," he said. "Instead, I like to focus on the every-

day process in reaching that point. As long as I continue to maintain a strong work ethic, an optimistic attitude, and a commitment to developing my abilities, I will have succeeded."

Weiss said his primary goal this season is to make a strong impression with his skating from both an athletic and artistic standpoint. His short program, in which he will interpret the rock music of Van Halen, features a soaring triple axel combination as well as various innovative spins and footwork sequences.

Weiss's free program, in which he will skate to the music from the movie, "Mulan," is highlighted by a quadruple toe loop as well as a triple axel combination, and a variety of other three-revolution jumps. Fittingly, the piece portrays the story of a war hero, and Weiss utilizes both ornate costuming and interesting arm movements and edgework to help convey that theme.

"I have really enjoyed working on these programs. They are indicative of the various aspects of my personality. I wanted to try some new and different things this year," said Weiss, who developed his programs under the creative guise of choreographers Brian Wright, and his wife, Lisa.

He has also been working on his consistency, trying to string as many clean performances together as possible. Determined to achieve this goal, he has been pushing himself harder than ever in practice.

"I've always admired Todd (Eldredge) for his consistency. In event after event, he always performs well, and I think that this year, I've proven that I am capable of the same thing," Weiss said.

Still, even at the top level, things don't always come easy. That's where his work ethic takes over. It is reflected in his daily training schedule. Weiss trains four to five hours a day, nearly six days a week at the Fairfax Ice Arena. He works extensively with his coach, Audrey Weisiger, on strengthening his technical abilities, artistic skills, and programs. He also visits a local Gold's Gym nearly three times a week in order to build his muscle strength.

"The biggest thing I've learned from skating at this level is that things don't come easy," he said. "I have been given a talent and want to do everything I can to live up to my potential."


Impressive Skating History

Weiss began his skating career at age nine. Although Weisiger said that he did not really stand out to her as an unusual athletic talent, she noticed his drive, focus and strong work ethic.

"Michael has always been a diligent worker," she said. "He will just keep at something until he gets it, and that I think is a major part of why he has become such an accomplished skater. He also has an amazing level of courage and faith in himself."

Within an astonishing three-year period, Weiss made a meteoric rise into elite competition. By age 12, in 1988, he qualified for the National Championships in the Novice division. He passed more than half a dozen difficult United States Figure Skating Association tests in three years and could execute all of his double jumps, including the axel.

"I was motivated by the challenges of skating, and loved the idea of competition. I guess that I have just always

Junior Men's title. Several months later, he secured his reputation as one of the sport's rising stars when he captured the World Junior title in 1994.

"Skating, for me, has been a handson education about life," Weiss said. "It takes a lot of hard work to achieve contender. He could execute all seven triple jumps—including the axel. Armed with this potent arsenal of technical elements, he climbed to a reputable fifth-place U.S. ranking by 1996.

In 1997, Weiss fulfilled his goal of becoming a medalist in the Championship Men's division when he captured the silver medal at the State Farm U.S. Championships in Nashville, Tenn., with a memorable free skate performance that featured a near quadruple toe loop, which television replays showed was landed on two feet.

Still, skating to the music of Santana, Weiss's efforts generated an overwhelming standing ovation from the crowd and he received high enough scores to make the United States World Team.

"1997 was a breakthrough year for me," Weiss said. "My primary goal that year was just to show what I was capable of doing, and the turnout was a terrific surprise. I think this experience taught me a lot, especially how vital confidence can be in achieving a dream."

He repeated as silver medalist at the U.S. Championships last year in

felt comfortable at the rink. It's a great environment," said Weiss.


Weiss had certainly found his calling. The following year, he competed again in the National Novice division and placed second. At that point, he was landing a triple Salchow and triple toe loop, and well on his way to becoming a leader in men's singles skating.

In 1993, he captured the National

success in this sport, and can often be very tough. I just try to approach it as a job, a goal and a motivational force, and that seems to work. I get the proper perspective that way."

Breakout Season

Determined as ever to reach the top, Weiss spent the mid-1990's paving his way toward becoming a world-class



Philadelphia. Skating to the music from the film, "Immortal Beloved," Weiss dazzled the crowd with an array of triple jumps, edges and spins. Like the previous year, he sent the audience into an uproar when he nearly landed a high-flying quadruple lutz jump. Weiss's valiant efforts earned him a well-deserved spot on the Olympic team.

Weisiger, his coach, cites this moment as a highlight in Weiss's career: "He really had to prove himself that night, and under such pressure, he succeeded. It was a very moving moment for me. I know how much it means to Michael to do his best, and I was so happy for him. He works so hard."

Bright Future

Dedicated, compassionate and committed to the people and things he believes in, Weiss has emerged as an ideal role model for contemporary figure skating. His most admirable trait, however, seems to be his unusual level of courage. Over the past several seasons, he has shown that great risks can, most certainly, engender great rewards.

"One of the reasons I skate is because I enjoy putting everything on the line. That is when you discover what you are truly all about," he said.

Weiss said the most important element of his success has been his basic love for skating. For this young champion, the true glory lies in just being on the ice, where he is able to glide around at top speed, soar through the air and spin like a top.

"Skating will always be a part of my life -- it provides me with so much satisfaction," he said. "I hope I can always somehow give back as much as it has given me."



U.S. skater Paul Binnebose takes readers inside the team and behind the scenes of the 1999 World Junior Figure Skating Championships in Croatia.

Editor's Note: Armed with a tape recorder and alone with his thoughts, U.S. Team pairs skater Paul Binnebose gives readers a first-hand perspective of the 1999 World Junior Figure Skating Championships, held Nov. 22-29, 1998, in Zagreb, Croatia. The task apparently didn't distract from his skating as Binnebose and partner Laura Handy earned a silver medal in the pairs competition.

Thursday, Nov. 19, 3 p.m.

I just got up from a nap and I'm feeling pretty satisfied with the room conditions. I was kind of concerned about the bathroom especially. At the last international (competition) we attended in Slovakia, we didn't have any shower curtains, but thankfully this one does.

We have all the comforts of Europe – Eurosport (television) and a couple of extra blankets.

Our flight from the States was about seven hours. It was a really long flight. The jetlag wasn't too bad. We took a nap for about five hours when we first got here because we left on a Wednesday afternoon and got here real early on a Thursday morning.

Thursday, Nov. 19, 7 p.m.

They just brought the piece of luggage which was lost in Frankfurt. I'm going to brush my teeth for the first time in 30 hours - all right!

Travelling does get a little old. My partner, Laura Handy, and I have been to four international competitions already this season because of the Junior Grand Prix Series. Normally, you do two or three. We've been doing something every two weeks.

Our favorite place we've been was Germany. It's a really beautiful country and the people were nice. The food was good, the hotel was nice. There was nothing bad about that competition. Everything was just amazing. We got to do the most touristy stuff there. We went on a short tour here of Zagreb, but that's pretty rare. The schedule for the team isn't really designed to accommodate people's wishes to see the country. They encourage you to do it if you have the time, but most of the time you don't have the time.

Thursday, Nov. 19, 9 p.m.

Not much to do here other than watch Eurosport and freeze. It's cold and pretty boring. Nothing else to do but talk into a tape recorder, I guess.

Thursday, Nov. 19, 9:30 p.m. My partner cheats extremely bad at cards.

Friday, Nov. 20, 10 a.m.

I just got back from breakfast. I'm trying to make this heater device in our room work. It's pretty cold here. I'm watching the Cartoon Network and looking for extra blankets.

This is my first time in Croatia. It's pretty much like I expected. It's a lot like Slovakia. They use coal for power, so it's a little overcast and pretty gray. (We were here for 11 days and I don't think I saw the sun - a good, bright sun - once. Sometimes it was a brighter gray sky, but it was never sunny.)

Where I live in the States (Newark, Del.), it's not a big city. It's a small town. I prefer that. This is a real big city and it has some of the drawbacks of any big city. It's dirty and there's a lot of hustle and bustle, like New York City. I'm more of a small-town guy, I guess. There's not a lot of people who drive here. Taxi cabs are real popular. I guess that's because gas is so expensive. Over here, you'll pay over four Kunas a liter - that's a lot of money for not a lot of gas.

Friday, Nov. 20, 12:30 p.m.

We're getting ready for our first practice. This is always a good time to sit back and think about the other teams you've competed against during the year. This is our first chance to see all the teams we're going to compete against face-to-face. Laura and I are hoping to finish in the top three.

Friday, Nov. 20, 3 p.m.

It's just after our first practice. There's a strong sense of camaraderie on the team. Tiffany Stiegler just gave me an orange, just to give you an example.

Friday, Nov. 20, 3:50 p.m.

We're on a search for food since the dining facility doesn't seem to be up to our standards. We're going to take a bus over to the Intercontinental to take a gander to see if there's any restaurants.

I think the food is pretty good. There's not much variety, but it's good. It's not like they fed us squid or anything. We had good pastas and a lot of pork. I have a hard time finding chicken in Europe for some reason. Usually we have a chance to try some local cuisine. They like pork over here. In Germany, you eat a lot of beef. Croatia's cuisine, I guess, are these pork rolls that are filled with stuffing and vegetables. I don't know what it's called, but it's not bad. Sometimes you'll get some pretty obscure things inside the meat, but you fish through that stuff.

Sunday, Nov. 22, 9 p.m.

We had a pretty busy day yesterday and we had our draw tonight. We had two practices today. We're skating pretty well and feeling pretty good. We're ready to compete tomorrow. We have our short program at 7:30.

We are paired with two of the Russian teams and one of the Estonians. We're happy that we got paired with a good group of skaters.

Monday, Nov. 23, 9 a.m.

We had a practice this morning and skated real well. We're getting ready to compete tonight. We feel real strong, but you always have to go through the pre-competition jitters, just thinking about the program. I run through the program, oh maybe, 50 times in my head just to try to work out the nerves, I guess.

This is only the second international

my family has ever been to and the first one overseas, so it's a big deal for them. Laura's mom is here as well. There's a lot of parents here at this competition and that will help the skaters a lot. I'm just waiting for time to tick away.

Tuesday, Nov. 24, 10:45 p.m.

Yesterday we competed in our short program. We skated extremely well for us. It was probably the best short program we put together all year. We finished second. Laura and I are really excited about that. I know a lot of people involved with the team are

Wednesday, Nov. 25, 10 p.m.

Laura and I competed in long. We weren't really excited about the way we skated. We had two mistakes that we never have. We didn't skate the greatest we ever had, but we still finished second, which we're extremely pleased with and everyone seems to be happy with. We were worried about making sure we did the best we could and didn't disappoint the U.S.

The Stieglers skated well and pulled up to fourth. I feel there's a lot of camaraderie on the team. A lot of people have a good sense of rooting for their teammates and supporting each other, so that's cool.

Talent is important and it is a piece of the puzzle that you need, but I also feel like you need a really strong work ethic and a very supportive family behind you to help.

happy for us. The other American skaters skated really well. There wasn't another American that didn't skate well. Everybody's really proud of what they did and was very happy with their performance.


We move on to tomorrow for the free skate. We drew last, which is really a great place for us to start. We're happy skating there because as soon as we're done, the event is over and we know exactly where we are. The hardest part of the whole thing is after you're done skating, going up into the stands and watching your competitors skate. You're not wishing for them to skate badly but you're hoping your marks are higher than theirs. Laura and I really want to do well. We want to move up. We would like to win and we're going to go out there and try to skate the best we can. Second after the short is a good sign for us and gives us something to be proud of what we've done. We have to see what the long has in store for us.

Laura and I feel like we're really skating strong right now, fairly consistently - a few bobbles here and there aside. I don't think our opinion of our skating changed from this competition. We know there are things we need to improve on. Some of them are the same things we wanted to work on before this competition. I guess you could say this competition was part of our game plan for the year. We trained for it. It came, it went and we're still trying to improve what we do.

Thursday, Nov. 26, 7 p.m.

I'm sitting here at dinner with my good friends Justin Pekarek and Jamie Silverstein, Laura, her friend Monica, my mother and Wendy Handy, Laura's mom. Our dance team - Justin and Jamie - have just secured a first place after the Original Dance.

We were fortunate enough to be invited to a Thanksgiving dinner at the United Nations compound here in Zagreb. That was really nice. The food was delicious. Turkey was pretty scrum-dilly-umptious over here. Justin



is enjoying his mash potatoes and gravy.

I think we were well received. The U.S. Team handled themselves well. That was pretty much the standard for this trip. Every kid on this team really showed well and didn't do anything to compromise the reputation of the USFSA or themselves. It's always good when you have a team of responsible skaters.

(Also, it was kind of cool that the ambassador to Croatia came to, I think, three different competitions to cheer on the U.S. skaters. That was really cool. I was very pleased to meet him. He was into skating. He brought his friends and his kids.)

Thursday, Nov. 26, 8 p.m.

Hi, this is Jamie Silverstein here. We just embarrassed Paul. It's his birthday. We gave him a huge cake. I'm tempted to put his face in it, but I'm going to resist. Happy Birthday to Paul!

Friday, Nov. 27, 2 p.m.

The locals take notice of the team when we go out on the town in our team warm-ups. We're usually the only ones with thick jackets on, thanks to the USFSA. People like them. The other teams really like them - the Canadians especially. They haven't received good winter gear like the U.S. Team has and I think there's a little bit of jacket-envy going on. It's nice to have everyone look good.

Sometimes people just look at you. Other people might ask for an autograph at the rink. That feels good being able to go to a competition and wave your country's flag. That's what it's all about. Representing the United States overseas - that's the best. That's what every athlete, in any sport, is striving for.

Friday, Nov. 27, 9 p.m.

They want me to talk about the dynamics of a pairs team. It's pretty much like any other relationship. You have your up and down days, your up and down weeks. Most of the time, we're together. That's sometimes good and sometimes bad. Laura and I have a

good time. We have a lot of friends in common so we spend a lot of time off the ice together, even before we started skating together. We're friends and we get along well.

Every single team has problems and every single team fights. But the ones who succeed are the ones who learn how to work through the times they're fighting or when it's one of those days one person doesn't feel like skating. Sometimes you need your partner to be there for you and sometimes you need your partner to just be there, but not really say anything.

Saturday, Nov. 28, 10 p.m.


As I'm sure everyone knows by now, the U.S. Team won two silvers and a gold at this competition. I am impressed with the caliber of skaters we have on this team.

I don't think I'm one of those people who has a special talent or skating is completely natural for them. I feel like I've had my problems in the past technically with skating and I've had a lot of stuff I've had to overcome in my skating. There are a lot of talented people who never succeed due to work ethic. Talent is important and it is a piece of the puzzle that you need, but I also feel like you need a really strong work ethic and you need a very supportive family behind you to help. It's a long journey. No one is going to be

able to do this by themselves. You need to have a good federation and I think a lot of the U.S. skaters don't realize how lucky they are. The USFSA really does a lot for their skaters.

Well, I hope I've given you an idea of what it's like to be on an international team. Thanks to everyone!

Making Precision Practices Productive

Practice may not make perfect, but it definitely helps a precision team's cohesion.

It happens. A coach scolds a skater for repeatedly not paying attention. The skater may brood or snap back, and then, there are hard feelings. Sometimes hard feelings escalate to the point where cliques form, practices are ruined, and coaches and athletes both get fed up.

What to do? Start by stepping back, taking a deep breath and looking at the techniques that build a team, rather than destroy it.

Teams are made up of as many personalities as there are skaters and coaches. Each one has a different response to stress, a different coping strategy, a different threshold to criticism. Begin by recognizing the diversity and embracing it.

As a member of the team, take a moment to ask yourself the following:

- What is the main reason you keep coming to practice?
- If you could change anything about practice, what would that be?
- Is there anything the coach or other skaters could do to make you feel or work better?
- What would make the environment a happier or more productive place to be?
- When the coach is at her best, what does she do?
- When the coach is at her worst, what does she do?
- What are your overall goals in skating?

This exercise might be a good lesson in sensitivity-awareness. Do it as a group effort someday before or after practice. Maybe your responses could be written anonymously,

and handed in to your coaches to review.

The quickest way to perk things up in a practice is to remember: you are a team, which means you help one another. What can you do to bring this about?

Here are some measures your coach can take to help all team skaters work harder and enjoy practice sessions even more:

- Encourage skaters. Say something positive to let them know if they have made progress or improved.
- Be specific. Tell them what you want them to do before you start a new skill. And continue to do so with helpful, constructive criticism.
- Tell them what went wrong don't yell or ignore a skater.
- Talk. Listen. Show respect for one another.
- Say something positive when skaters are working well so they will continue to want to work hard.
- Delight in the fact that skaters are trying their best...even if it isn't quite a perfect program. Yet.
- Encourage good sportsmanship at all times not only within your own team, but also among other teams within and outside of your club.

Here's what skaters can do to help their coaches:

- Smile when you arrive at practice leave your bad day outside the rink doors.
- Be prepared and ready to start practice, when your coach arrives. Have your skates on.
- Listen carefully as your coach gives instructions. No one wants to hear instructions over and over, and nobody wants to give them over and over again.
- Work well on your own. Be willing to help each other a team is only as good as its weakest link. Each skater has strengths, be patient and willing to share your own.
- Remember upcoming events and important dates. The team skates best when all of its members are present at all of its practices, competitions and shows.
- Remind yourself the coach is there to help you reach your potential.
- Tell the coach when you think she/he has done a good job, after the practice. None of us gets too old to appreciate a little recognition.

Ways to make fellow athletes more productive and confident:

- Go out of your way to say "hello," be friendly, and project a good mood when you come to practice.
- Encourage your teammates compliment one another and cheer them up if they're having difficulties.
- Work to correct problems, rather than complaining about them, or getting frustrated if something goes wrong.
- Help each other improve skills.

Precision skaters are much like pioneers, breaking new ground in a sport that is fast gaining recognition worldwide. Remember, like those early settlers, you won't be able to "Go West," unless you go there together.



The following rules have been issued from the ISU Dance Technical Committee to be applied to the 1999-2000 Season. These rules will also be applied to all Junior and Senior Dance Competitions in the U.S. The source for this information is ISU Communication 1005 and the just released Special Regulations -Ice Dancing 1998. Since the process is ever-growing and changing, modifications may be made as we progress toward next year.

Junior and Senior Dance 1999-2000

Compulsory Dance

Blues

Judges will be required to take deductions for specific technical and timing mistakes for each dance. The errors and deductions will be published in a future communication.

Original Dance

The Original Dance must have the character of ballroom dancing translated to the ice by flow and use of

For both Junior and Senior, the rhythms of the original dance will be Latin Combination

Type: Any 3 of the Cha Cha, Mambo, Merengue, Rhumba or Samba Range of Tempo: Any tempo - with hesitation, retard or pause permitted

REQUIREMENTS / RESTRICTIONS

- Orchestral music is preferred. Vocal music is permitted.
- · Only music with a rhythmic beat may be used. Only one music selection my be used for each rhythm chosen. Each rhythm may be used only once, played in any order.
- The musical introduction to the original dance may be without beat or melody for a maximum of 10 seconds.
- The dance shall be 3 minutes (plus or minus 10 seconds) in duration. The timing shall commence when one of the couple begins to move or to skate.

• The pattern of the dance must proceed in a generally constant direction (either clockwise or counterclockwise). The dance pattern must not cross the long axis of the ice surface except at the end of the rink (no more than 20 meters from the barriers) and except during the required step sequences. Loops are permitted provided they do not cross the center line.

Steps

· All steps, turns, rotations and changes of position are permitted provided they are appropriate to the Latin rhythms and the music chosen. At least one skate of each partner must remain on the ice at all times except during the lifts. Skating on 2 feet (defined as showing inability to skate or maintain balance) is not allowed. However, up to 2 highlights for which one or both partners are on two feet may be included (maximum duration - 5 seconds). Kneeling on 2 knees on the ice is not permitted. Repetition of any step or step sequence is permitted. A few toe steps for both partners may be included.

Separations

• Partners must not separate except to change dance hold, or to perform movements in character with the Latin rhythms chosen provided that they are not performed at more than 2 arms-length apart.

Positions

- There are no restrictions on dance holds, arm movements, handclaps and the like that are interpretive of the music. Brief hand-in-hand positions to express the character of the Latin rhythms are permitted except during the required step sequences. Otherwise, hand-in-hand positions with extended arms are not permitted.
- Pulling or pushing the partner by the boot and/or leg is not permitted except during the required dance lifts or dance spin.
- Skating (or posing) with a hand (or hands) on the ice is not permitted at any time including the introduction and conclusion.

Stops

 No more than 3 stops in total are allowed. These stops must not exceed 5 seconds and any appropriate Latin choreography including a separation appropriate to that music selection is permitted during the stops. A stop may not be performed during the required step sequences.

The following elements must be included:

A. Two dance lifts (more than 2 are not permitted). A dance lift is defined as an action in which the partner is elevated to any height and set down. During the action, the lifting partner must not raise the hands higher than the head. Sitting or lying on the partner's shoulders or back is not permitted. Lifts must not be acrobatic, i.e. not contain moves in which the partner is held by the blade, foot, leg or arm and swung around. The maximum duration of a lift is 5 seconds. B. One circular step sequence executed in the middle of the rink and utilizing the full width of the ice surface in closed, tango and/or open (but not Kilian) position and incorporating difficult footwork for both partners. No jumps or hops may be included. C. One straight-line step sequence along the mid-line (center axis) of the ice surface extending the full length of the ice. It must incorporate difficult mirror and/or matching footwork and

at least one set of synchronized twiz-

zles. During this step sequence the

partners must remain at not more than 2 arms-length apart, but may not touch each other. Small hops or jumps (of not more than 1/2 rotation) may be included. No lifts, spins, stops or pattern regressions are permitted during either step sequence. D. One Dance Spin with a minimum of 3 and maximum of 5 revolutions. This Dance Spin must be skated in any Kilian position (Kilian, Reversed Kilian, Open Kilian and Crossed Kilian) with or without a change of foot by one or both skaters.

Free Dance

Free Dancing is the skating by the couple of a creative program with dance steps and movements expressing the character of the music chosen by the couple and may express a concept, story, theme or idea.

REQUIREMENTS / RESTRICTIONS

Music

- All types of music are allowed and may be vocal partly or throughout. Such music must have an audible rhythmic beat and melody, or audible rhythmic beat alone, but not melody alone. The couple must generally skate to the rhythmic beat.
- The Free Dance shall have a length of 3 minutes for Junior and 4 minutes for Senior.

Step

- All steps and turns are permitted. A program that relies heavily on the use of chasses and progressives is considered to be less difficult than one containing changes of edges, rockers, choctaws and other such steps. The program must be developed through skating quality rather than non-skating actions and activities.
- Pair skating elements are not allowed (excluding spirals, spins and step sequences).

Separations

• The number of separations permitted is not restricted. The duration of a separation is 10 seconds maximum.

Positions

- All changes of position are permitted. The following are not permitted:
 -standing, sitting, leaning on, or
 holding the partner's boots without
 having at least one skate on the ice
 -pushing or pulling the partner by
 the boot
- -skating with a hand (or hands) on the ice -lying on the ice

Stops

• The number of stops is not restricted. The duration of a stop is 5 seconds maximum.

The following elements must be included:

A. Lifts

Senior - 5 but not more than 7 (2 of which will be specified in a later communication)

Junior - 3 but not more than 5 (1 of which will be specified in a later communication)

B. Dance Spins

Senior - 2 but not more than 3 (1 of which will be specified in a later communication)

Junior - 1 but not more than 2 (1 of which will be specified in a later communication)

C. Synchronized Twizzles for each partner - a series of simultaneous twizzles i.e. performed by both partners at the same time.

Senior - at least twice

Junior - at least once

D. Two step sequences for both Senior and Junior - one circular utilizing the full width of the ice surface, and one diagonal going fully from corner to corner. One of the step sequences must be in closed and/or open position; the other may be in optional varied dance holds. Both step sequences must incorporate mohawks, choctaws, rockers, counters and other dance steps. Lifts, jumps, dance spins and pirouettes are not allowed during the step sequences.

Special Notes for Novice and Lower Dance

The Dance Committee is proposing the following changes to the Novice and lower level free dance rules. If adopted in May, they will go into effect for the 1999-2000 competition season.

- 1. The definition of a dance Lift will be uniform throughout the structure to match the definition used in the Junior and Senior levels. A dance lift is defined as an action in which the partner is elevated to any height and set down. During the action, the lifting partner must not raise the hands higher than the head. Sitting or lying on the partner's shoulders or back is not permitted. Lifts must not be acrobatic, i.e. not contain moves in which the partner is held by the blade, foot, leg or arm and swung around. The maximum duration of a lift is 5 seconds. Assisted jumps will be included under this definition as lifts. The number of lifts required are: Novice Free Dance - 2 required, but not more than 4 Intermediate Free Dance - 1 required, but not more than 3 Juvenile Free Dance (test only) - none required, but not more than 2
- 2. One step sequence (either circular or straight line) will be required in the Novice and Intermediate Free Dance and will be optional for the Juvenile Free Dance. The required step sequence must utilize the full width of the rink for the circle, and the full length for the straight line.

Laurent Tobel is more than a 6-foot-4 clown. The serious French showman uses his unusual ice antics to open himself up to an audience.

French skater Laurent Tobel may not yet be considered the greatest skater of his time, but few will argue that the crowd favorite stands tall on the ice. A solid 6foot-4, any triple jump Tobel lands makes the ice and the stands shake alike.

While his size may now be considered a strong point, it hasn't always been so.

"When I was 12, I was consid-

ered a child prodigy skater,"
Tobel recalls. "I was landing all
the triples successfully, and the
French skating community made
me their favorite hope for the
future."

All of a sudden, in 1990, that momentum stopped when he started to grow. In that year alone, he shot up about 8 inches. Not only did he struggle with his jumps, his body could not sustain

the stress of growing: "I injured myself each time I would skate," he said. "The ankle a couple of times, a wrist, my knee, my hip. It was terrible."

The French have always had a passionate relationship with their sport heroes. They are quick to boost them to the top, but just as fast to denounce them when they do not succeed. Such was the case with Tobel: "After just one



year of under-performance, I was taken off the French National Team," he said. "I had to start everything again from scratch."

Fortunately, he was not discouraged from skating.

"My parents encouraged me very much: 'Just keep going,' they said. 'You'll quit when you have had too much.' Well, I never had too much," Tobel said. After a time of reflection he adds: "I was hoping that doing triple jumps was just like bicycling. That is, once you have mastered them, your body will never forget them."

Indeed, at the French National Championships of 1993, all his triples were back for the first time in three years. Laurent Tobel was back on his promising track from so long ago.

And just recently, Tobel achieved what only the very best

skaters can: he found his style. Contrary to what many people think, this was not just a matter of finding the most suitable choreography to match his size and personality.

"It was not so simple," Tobel said. "I was a very boring skater. I tried to skate classical, because that was what we were asked to do. But I could not give any emotion through my programs. And I was boring myself as well. I had no fun skating."

Fortunately for Tobel and many others at that time, American coach and former skater Allen Schramm was commissioned by the French Skating Federation to teach footwork and technical basics to the elite skaters.

"He fascinated me," Tobel said.
"His theories were so brilliant. ...
Skaters like Allen Schramm or
Canadian Gary Beacom empha-

size steps and attitudes to create emotions. Jumps can be boring: you have to jump because that gives you the marks, but it does not bring much to your program in itself."

From his childhood, Tobel had practiced and retained school figures. "They were very important for my progress," he said, "because all steps and movements could be derived from them."

"At the 1997 World Championships," Tobel recalls, "I counted the number of backward crossovers contestants would do in their free program. Some did around 50 in their 4-and-a-half-minute routine. These programs can be so uninteresting! Of course, doing crossovers is much more economical to gain speed: you just go backward and that is it. Yet it does not create emo-

tions. It is the same with jump preparations. Threes on the ice can be so boring, compared to using rockers and counter-rockings to change edges. These are of course much more difficult to perform, because they add to the think we bring something very special to skating. Look at the Duchesnays, at Marina Anissina carrying Gwendal Peizerat in their Romeo and Juliet routine, at Surya Bonaly's athleticism or Philippe's special themes. They

difficulty of jumps themselves. But they are so much more rewarding!"

Altogether, Schramm and Tobel built his routine to "The Pink Panther" with only 18 backward crossovers in the whole program. A difficulty that paid off, according to Tobel. "You see, that is what makes these programs so special to the audience," he said. "There is more than jumps in them. Ideas and feelings come with the program."

Something strange about Tobel strikes his listener. Known as a funny person and an exhilarating skater on ice, his words and thoughts are so serious. He spent so many hours, both on ice and in his own life, perfecting his style and the message he wants to transmit.

Compared to his popular teammate Philippe Candeloro, the 1998 Olympic bronze medalist, Tobel says: "We are very different. Yet we have one thing in common: our originality. French skaters may not be the best technical skaters in the world, but I

will be remembered for something."

And Tobel hopes to be remembered, too. His 1997 program to "The Pink Panther" as well as his

Worlds (in 1997), everything started."

That World Championships in Switzerland will remain a very special moment to him. "My



Laurent Tobel is comfortable both on the ice and in his familiar Paris surroundings.

The French skater hopes to one day make a name for himself on a professional tour, which seems best suited to Tobel's high-energy, highly unorthodox programs.



grandfather was Swiss," Tobel said. "A skating enthusiast, he brought my sister and myself to the rink when we were children."

The road has been a long one since those times. Is there anything in Tobel's life, apart from skating?

"No," he is quick to answer. "I once loved models, especially cars. But it is not even worth mentioning anymore." The reality is that Tobel doesn't have the time for much other than skating. His days start rather late, around 9 a.m. with a shower and breakfast. Then he prepares for the rink, where he trains until 1 p.m. After a one hour rest, he goes back to the rink by 4 p.m. and doesn't come home before 8 at night. A little television, and that is it for the day.

"I do not train more than 3 to 4 hours a day, but with conditioning and preparation, I can assure you that my days are completely

packed," he said. "I sometimes feel like a commerical representative: hours of selling may not be long, but travel time makes the day!"

Very few of his friends are skaters. "I can not be friends with people I will be competing against," he explains. "Whereas real friends are people I can rely on in every circumstance."

His mother and his sister Sandrine, with whom he shares his Vincennes apartment in France, are his warmest supporters, always giving him a hand when he needs it. Tobel likes his Vincennes surroundings. The forests and parks there are considered the "Eastern Lung" of Paris. They gather joggers every Sunday morning.

The 1990-1996 blank period, when he did not compete frequently, at least had one advantage in Tobel's life. It allowed him to keep a full load of study.

He finished high school and then embarked into physical therapy studies. "I have stopped for the last two years, but I will be able to start again whenever I am finished with competitive skating," he said.

Tobel won't consider ending his eligible career before the 2002 Olympic Winter Games in Salt Lake City. By then he will be 27 years old.

"It is extraordinary for me to have such a career," he says enthusiastically, "with the fun of competition and traveling."


Tobel says skating in the United States is especially rewarding. "Not so much for training," he said, "but for the show."

To him, shows and exhibitions are the real reward of skating. He has skated with the Tom Collins Tour. "There is nothing more encouraging than 25,000 people applauding and cheering," Tobel said. "Really, shows provide the motivation for all the rest — training and exercising and competing."

Skating in a show, to Tobel, means establishing contact with the audience. "If there is no contact," he explains, "there is no art anymore. Only some skating. I want to serve the audience. I try to open myself to them, so that it is not 25,000 people watching one skater, but 25,001 people making a show together. I am also their spectator. We watch each other, though in a different way. A show is nothing but an exchange."

May the show last long. Everyone loves it, spectators and Tobel alike.

Speed and Power Jumping

Jumping rope can give skaters the winning edge.
By Buddy Lee

Since my introduction to figure skating at the 1997 Team USA Training Camp in Colorado Springs, I have witnessed all levels of skaters use the jump rope as a warmup to stretching exercises before ice practice and competition. What a great start. Now is the time to take your jump rope program to the next level and maximize the benefits for the winning edge. Rope jumping does much more than serve as a warm-up to stretching. It can develop refinement of key movement in figure skating and create a synergy of quickness, speed, strength and endurance.

Before the 1996 Olympic Games, a number of gold medalist teams and athletes came to me in search of that "edge." I simply showed them how to train with the rope for their sport. Many championship performances are determined by times that can be measured in blinks of an eye or snaps of the fingers. In team competitions, a scoring opportunity may have been created with the championship edge in quickness, speed, strength or endurance.

The race for getting the edge and achieving it is a continuing one. It may take a combination of factors to produce the edge that makes the difference. The edge will be created by the athletes or teams who are able to bring winning components together during competition. Bringing them together in such a way that each component is maximized to synergistically create the performance edge in time and space.

In the end the win will go to whoever used the physical and physiological edge to nail the jumps and receive the marks when it counts.

Buddy Lee's Five Minute Speed and Power Program:

My Five Minute Speed and Power Program is designed to produce that synergistic effect among an athlete's quickness, speed, strength, endurance and timing. This synergy will create the edge in performance that makes the difference between winning and losing. My program will improve overall conditioning and explosiveness while strengthening the legs, ankles and feet for better takeoffs and landings of jumps in figure skating.

Integrate rope jumping as a 5-minute warmup at a moderate intensity (120tpm) before starting the following jump rope program. Only try this program after you have jumped regularly for a few months. If you have not been jumping, start a jump program during your offseason.

The goal is to jump as fast and efficiently as you possibly can. Jump at each station for the suggested time, with a 30 or 60 second rest in between. Count the jumps (for alternate foot step count right foot and multiply by 2) and try to achieve the same number or higher in the following sessions:

- 1. Alternate Foot Step 60 sec.
- 2. Double Unders 30 sec.
- 3. Double Unders 30 sec.
- 4. Alternate Foot Step 60 sec.
- 5. Double Unders 30 sec.
- 6. Double Unders 30 sec.
- 7. Alternate Foot Step 60 sec.

Incorporate this program 2-3 times per week. It is important to stretch before during and after each session – calves especially.

Remember: "The key to effective jumping is to be light on the balls of your feet." Buddy's Jump Rope Programs are designed for use with a plastic speed rope and allows the figure skater to train the way he/she wants to perform.

Basic Bounce Step

Jump only high enough to clear the rope and land lightly on the balls of your feet.



Alternate Foot Step

Jump with alternate foot, like jogging in place.

High Step

Same as Alternate Foot Step. Bring knees up to waist level.



Skier's Jump


Jump a few inches to the right, then jump a few inches to the left. Alternate. Keep feet together and torso straight ahead. Result should look like a skier's slalom.



Double Unders

Jump a little higher than Basic Bounce Step. Turn wrists quickly to allow rope to turn twice in one jump. Keep head straight and torso relaxed for good jumping form.

Who are these judges anyway?

Believe it or not, there are real people with real lives behind those marks you see at competitions.

Have you ever wondered about those three people who determine the outcome of a skater's test or that group of people ranking a field of competitors? Just who are those souls with the uninvited ability to frighten young children and intimidate parents new to the skating game? Have you wondered what they're like as people and what exactly they have done to be qualified as skating judges? And have you wondered why these people will volunteer to spend their weekends judging skaters rather than golfing?

Well, let's see if we can shed a little illumination on the subject.

First of all, most judges are former skaters. Many have competed and a few are still actively competing and testing. Some have had noteworthy careers as competitors and are giving something back to the sport as judges. A very few came to love the sport through their children and have become actively involved as judges.

All have been initiated into judging as "trial" or prospective judges. This is a program where the trial judge interacts with the "official" panel of judges (both on test and competition panels) in a process of recognizing skills and applying a score to rate the skater either against a standard (tests) or against the other skaters (competition). All trial judges must achieve a high percentage of agreement over time, with the official panels before they can be considered for promotion. The time frame necessary to achieve the skills will vary.

In a recent survey of all types of skating officials in which information was requested on time spent on skating activities such as judging, committee work for the USFSA and volunteering at their local club, some not too surprising data turns up:

- The younger the judge, the less time they have to spend as a volunteer as they are juggling a job and/or school and family. Taking time away from a job is a problem and the use of vacation time can take away from family time. For many, there are childcare considerations.
- Judges with grown families and those who have retired are giving the most, certainly in terms of time.

The point is that they are all giving something and they do it for no compensation. Officials are reimbursed for out of pocket expenses only. Many of these same judges are volunteers with other organizations such as their church, Habitat for Humanity (or similar organizations), Big Sister/Big Brother and a variety of support groups.

We might mention that judging and officiating often is a family activity and can span more than one generation. Of particular interest are the sister/brother and parent/child situations

where both generations are national (and in some cases international) level officials. It is a pool of talent that tends to draw upon itself to produce a successive generation of judges.

Our judges are college graduates with an extensive array of degrees and a fascinating variety of careers. There are a goodly number of M.D.'s and Ph.D.'s and a fair number of lawyers and engineers. We have nurses, fire and police personnel. Many are retired from their chosen field. A couple of notables found in the biographies that were collected are an airline pilot (female) and a restaurateur who has founded his own chain of eateries. We know of one judge who was working in the World Trade Center at the time of the bombing.

The majority of judges are married and average slightly less than two children per family. They have a huge range of hobbies in addition to skating — the top being reading, travel, skiing, needlework, gardening and music. Tennis and golf surprisingly fall somewhere in the middle of listed hobbies. Astonishingly, two different people listed cattle drives among their hobbies!

Now, don't these judges seem a bit more human with this small profile of their background? Isn't it nice to know that they are just regular people with a special hobby? It should be noted here that there is a group of behind the scenes skating people encompassing accountants, music coordinators and ice technicians (to name a few) who are also a part of USFSA officialdom and are a part of the general profile.

1999 ISU Grand Prix Series wraps up at NHK Trophy in Japan. Malinina scores surprise win to earn position in Grand Prix Final

The sixth and final event in the 1999 ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating -the NHK Trophy held in the Makomanai Ice Arena in Sapporo, Japan, Dec. 2-6, 1998 -- established the field for the ISU Grand Prix Final in St. Petersburg, Russia, March 4-7.

Stealing all the headlines was Tatyanna Malinina from Uzbekistan, who registered a come-from-behind win over a world class field to win her first title of the year and secure her position in the Grand Prix Final field.

Malinina, who had previously managed only a seventh place finish in Grand Prix events, altered the landscape for the ladies Grand Prix Final, dropping Nicole Bobek of Chicago, Ill., to seventh place, one position out of the final qualifying group. Malinina outskated an NHK field that included 1998 World silver medallist Irina Slutskava of Russia, 1998 Skate Canada winner Elena Liashenko of the Ukraine and Fumie Suguri of Japan.

Trailing both Liashenko and Slutskaya after the short program, Malinina turned in the the performance of her life. Skating to the music from "Aladdin" she landed five triples with her only mistake coming a triple flip to end her program. She earned a total of three 5.8s and seven 5.7's to secure her first international title.

Angela Nikodinov of San Pedro, Calif., who had a chance to make the Grand Prix Final following her bronze medal performance at Skate America, was fighting the "flu" throughout the competition, and was forced to withdraw after the short program due to illness.

Skate Canada champion Evgeny Plushenko of Russia once again dominated the men's field to earn his second Grand Prix title of the season and finish tied with teammate Alexei

Yagudin with 24 points.

Plushenko led throughout the competition and was never challenged. In the free skate he was rewarded with eight marks of 5.9 for technique and one perfect 6.0 and six more 5.9s for presentation.

"It was the first 6.0 I have ever received," said Plushenko, "and I know how precious a 6.0 is. It was the best I have ever skated. I believe I am getting better and better."

Derrick Delmore of Fort Washington, Md., placed 10th in the field and finished in 18th among the Grand Prix standings. Delmore, the 1998 World Junior Champion, finished fifth in Skate America performing well in his first Grand Prix Series.

In the pairs free skate, Elena Berezhnaya and Anton Sikharulidze again showcased their top form, earning one 5.9 for presentation and six 5.8's for the title. Xue Shen and Hongbo Zhao of China earned the silver medal while Jamie Sale and David Pelletier of Canada jumped ahead of the Danielle and Steve Hartsell (second after the short) for the bronze medal.

Marina Anissina and Gwendal Peizerat of France put an exclamation point on their Grand Prix season by winning their third straight dance event of the season.

Eve Chalom and Mathew Gates who train in Dallas, Texas, placed seventh.
