





# U.S. Ladies Dazzle at Keri Lotion Challenge

A sweep by the U.S. ladies gave the USA a victory at the Keri Lotion USA vs. the World Figure Skating Challenge, Dec. 18, in Kennewick, Wash.

he women of Team USA responded well to tough pressure, sweeping their match-ups to lead the United States to victory at the Keri Lotion USA vs. The World Figure Skating Challenge on Dec. 18.

The U.S. women were forced to win all three of their events when the World Team captured two of the three match-ups in the men's competition.

The city of Kennewick and the Tri-Cities Coliseum were thrilled to host the event, and all the skaters remarked on the fans' enthusiasm and spirit. First-day ticket sales for the competition at the Coliseum doubled the arena record, and event programs sold out 45 minutes after the doors opened, proving skating's popularity in the city.

December's event was also marked by a special competitive appearance by the legendary Dorothy Hamill, who awed many of the younger skaters, including Sarah Hughes.

"It was such an honor out there with Dorothy Hamill," said the 14-year-old Hughes. "When I was younger I had the Dorothy Hamill haircut."

Hamill also impressed the judges and defeated China's Lu Chen -- 20 years her junior -- in the second of the three ladies' match-ups.

Hamill followed Hughes on the ice for the ladies, and it was the younger skater who kicked off the U.S. ladies' sweep. Hughes defeated 1988 Olympic silver medalist Elizabeth Manley in the opening ladies' competition.

The World Team jumped on Team USA early, winning the first two men's match-ups. Elvis Stojko rocked the crowd and the judges to defeat Timothy Goebel in the opening contest.

Despite the individual "loss," Goebel still understood the spirit of the event.

"It's good for us to have the chance to root for Team USA," said Goebel. "We are usually out there just doing our own thing, focusing on our own performance. It's

nice to see our fellow countrymen skate for once."

Michael Weiss was still recovering from an ankle injury,


but nevertheless was one of the crowd favorites with his hip number to music from K.C. and the Sunshine Band.
"This was

such a great crowd," said Weiss. "You could tell that a lot of people were really excited to be here. It's an event that's basically set up to let you

ice. So, I just went out to enjoy myself and have a good time." Weiss and the crowd had a good time, but the fans weren't very pleased with the marks given to Weiss' boogie. Viktor Petrenko emerged as the winner in the contest, giving the World a slight 5-4 edge.

Todd Eldredge moved Team USA back into contention with a victory over Kurt Browning in the final men's match-up of the evening.

But, it was the U.S. ladies who turned it on for three impressive individual victories. Hughes was a unanimous winner over Manley, earning marks as high as 5.9 for presentation.

Hamill's appearance at the event delighted the eager Kennewick crowd, and she didn't disappoint with her victory.

"This is such a fun event," said Hamill. "In the old days there really weren't professional skating opportunities like this."

"Anchorwoman" Michelle Kwan solidified Team USA's victory with a win over Surya Bonaly. Bonaly wowed the crowd with her trademark backflip, but it was Kwan's artistry that earned the judges' approval.

Kwan was relieved to be finished with final exams at UCLA, but she had a long road ahead of her when school resumed in January.

"This year has been a handful for me," she said. "Now, I am going to go back home and train really hard for nationals. I have to plan my schedule wisely. It's hard but fun."

The next scheduled USFSA open event will be held in Binghamton, N.Y., on April 11.

# Knee Injury Ends Hartsells' Season

1999 U.S. Figure Skating World Team member Danielle Hartsell of Westland, Mich., suffered a season-ending injury on Friday, Dec. 17, while training in W. Bloomfield Hills, Mich. Hartsell, who competes with her brother, Steve, in pairs, fell to the ice while practicing a new lift and fractured her right kneecap.

The Hartsells will be unable to defend their 1999 U.S. pairs' title at the 2000 State Farm U.S. Figure Skating Championships in Cleveland, Ohio, this month. The team intends to challenge in the 2000-2001 season.

Danielle underwent surgery on Wednesday, Dec. 22, and was expected to make a quick recovery with doctors predicting she may be able to begin light skating as early as mid-February.

"It is a major disappointment right now," said Danielle. "I am upset that we will not have the opportunity to compete at the U.S. Championships or Worlds, but my main focus right now is getting better. Hopefully, I'll have a quick recovery and get an early start on next season."

This season the Hartsells competed in Skate America (8th), Nations Cup (7th) and NHK Trophy (5th). In addition to their U.S. title last season, they placed 10th in the 1999 World Championships and claimed a bronze medal in the 1999 Four Continents Championships.

# USOC Presents Yearly Honors

The United States Olympic Committee announced that cyclist Lance Armstrong, swimmer Jenny Thompson and the U.S. Women's National Soccer Team were the 1999 recipients of the USOC SportsMan, SportsWoman and Team of the Year awards.

The awards are presented annually by the USOC to the most outstanding male, female and team from America's Olympic movement.

Michelle Kwan and Michael Weiss were the USFSA nominees for the awards.

# U.S. Skaters Shine at ISU Junior Grand Prix Final


Deanna Stellato and Jennifer Kirk finished 1-2 in the ladies' competition at the ISU Junior Grand Prix Final, Dec. 14-16, in Gdansk, Poland.

Stellato, the 1999 U.S. Novice Champion, won the free skate and the gold medal after a third-place showing in the short program. Kirk finished second in both the short and long programs. The two U.S. skaters beat out favorites Irina Nikolaeva and Irina Tkatchuk of Russia, who finished first and second in the overall Junior Grand Prix points race. Nikolaeva and Tkatchuk finished sixth and seventh, respectively.

Ryan Bradley, the lone U.S. men's competitor, finished fifth. The 1999 U.S. Junior Champion finished seventh in the short program, but rebounded for a fourth-place showing in the free skate to move up in the standings.

Emilie Nussear and Brandon Forsyth pulled off a minor upset in the dance category, finishing second behind Russia's Natalia Romanyta and Daniel Barantsey. Nussear and Forsyth finished fourth overall in the points' race, but skated elegantly to earn the silver medal. The new U.S. dance team of Tanith Belbin and Benjamin Agosto captured fourth place.

The U.S. did not have any pairs qualify for the Final. Full results are on page 43.

# Robert Wagenhoffer -- In Memory

obert Wagenhoffer, one of the most daring and imaginative skaters of all time, died Dec. 13 at
Harbor UCLA Medical
Center in Torrance, Calif.

Wagenhoffer, a two-time World Professional Champion, recently gained popularity as a choreographer for touring shows.

He was 39.

As an eligible skater, he competed nationally against such great skaters as Scott Hamilton, David Santee, Brian Boitano and Charles Tickner. He was one of only a handful of U.S. skaters to win the U.S. junior men's title and the U.S. junior pairs' title (with Vicki Heasley) in the same year (1977).

In the senior ranks,

Wagenhoffer captured the bronze medal at the 1981 U.S. Championships behind Hamilton and Santee, and the silver medal in 1982 behind Hamilton. He competed for the U.S. on two World

teams in singles, finishing 10th in 1981 and sixth in 1982. In pairs, Wagenhoffer and Heasley were U.S. silver medalists in 1979 and finished sixth in the world that season.

Wagenhoffer continued to gain fame and admiration as a professional, winning two World Professional Championships and a U.S. Professional Championship. He enthralled crowds with

> exciting moves such as the backflip and his signature move -- the

side cartwheel.

He starred in "Ice Capades," "Celebration of Ice," the "World Cup Figure Skating Champions" in three countries and was a guest star on "Skating," a national touring company with Boitano and Katarina Witt.

Wagenhoffer directed and choreographed several on-ice productions, such as "Gershwin on Ice" and, most recently, the video production of

"Alice Through the Looking Glass."

A memorial service was held Dec. 16 in Los Angeles, Calif.

The skating world lost one of its most memorable performers when former U.S. silver medalist Robert Wagenhoffer died on Dec. 13.



# Maplewood Event Sets Precedent for World Synchro Championships

The final hurdle has been cleared and organizers of the 2000 World Synchronized Skating Championships look forward to the months ahead when they will host the first World Championships in Synchronized Skating in Minneapolis, Minn., April 5-8, 2000.

Organizers partnered with the annual Maplewood Synchronized Skating Classic on December 18-19 to evaluate their plans and venues for the World Championships. The Maplewood Classic, which featured nine of the top 10 senior synchronized skating teams in the U.S. as well as 1999 Canadian champions "black ice," was utilized as a test event for the 2000 World Synchronized Skating Championships that will be held in Mariucci Arena on the campus of the

University of Minnesota in April.

"The Maplewood Classic helped confirm that all our systems are in place and ready to go," said Marlys Larson, Chairperson for the 2000 Local Organizing Committee. "We were excited that the top U.S. teams participated and had a chance to compete in the facility prior to Worlds. We look forward to hosting a world class event for all the athletes, coaches and officials and are excited to be hosting the first ever World Synchronized Skating Championships."

With over 15 countries participating annually worldwide, synchronized skating is an emerging sport with hopes of becoming an Olympic sport.

## Figure Skaters Among Greatest Female Athletes

Seven figure skaters were listed among the 100 greatest female athletes of the century, according to Sports Illustrated for Women, Winter 1999-2000.

Selections were made by writers and editors of SI For Women, Sports Illustrated and CNN/SI.

The greatest female athlete honor was bestowed on track and field athlete Jackie Joyner-Kersee. The top-ranking figure skater was Norway's Sonja Henie (4th), who won three Olympic gold medals and 10 World Championships.

Peggy Fleming was the top U.S. skater, finishing 19th in the voting. Dorothy Hamill ranked 32nd, and Germany's Katarina Witt was 38th. Tenley Albright was 47th and Tonya Harding and Nancy Kerrigan were both listed as No. 95 on the list.



hen people think of figure skating, the first thoughts that usually pop into their minds are images of the stars -- the dazzling rtistry and daring athletic feats of ampions. To many, figure skating is a sport on television that thoroughly res the U.S. every four years at the ics.

or everyone who has ever laced up a now it's so much more than that. That s exactly what the Chevrolet/USFSA n is all about -- developing, teaching

and reaching out to the thousands of skaters who want to be part of the sport at any level. Established in 1985, the Chevrolet/ USFSA Skate with U.S. program (also known as the Basic Skills program) is the key to the growth of skating, and an essential "first step" on the ladder toward competitive success.

There are 24 USFSA Skate with U.S. area representatives across the country who serve as local voices for the program, while the Basic Skills subcommittee chair, Joyce Herron, also has exciting ideas for the program's future.

"I truly believe in the Chevrolet/USFSA Skate with U.S. program," said Herron. "Over the last several years my committee and the area representatives have been instrumental in producing a teaching program that will enable any and all skaters to be the best that they can or want to be."

The Skate with U.S. program is the first step toward training the athletes of the future as well as providing an excellent base for the recreational skater. Proper teaching of the "basic skills" will provide a larger pool of skaters who have good basic technique on which to build. Many clubs are also developing a "bridge" program to have skaters progress through the basics and into club-type situations faster.

There are six main objectives for the Skate with U.S. program:

- ◆ Provide an enjoyable and safe skating experience
- Develop social relationships through group instruction
- ◆ Teach correct technique of basic elements
- Provide incentive rewards
- Promote health and physical fitness
- Encourage skating as a lifelong sport

All skaters, whether they are recreational or competitive athletes, or whether they plan to pursue figure skating or hockey, need to learn the "basics" first before branching out into different disciplines. That is the bottom line for the Skate with U.S. program -- teach them right the first time, so skaters have a solid foundation on which to build.

The Skate with U.S. program streamlines that process so skaters, under the tutelage of qualified instructors, progress through a system of classes and tests and then master key elements.

"We want to be sure skaters get the best instruction possible," said Thompson. "That means establishing testing standards, training and qualifications for instructors, good customer service and help for the parents as they move their kids along in the system."

In that sense, Thompson is creating a comprehensive packet for new and current Skate with U.S. members. Information on marketing, training, liability insurance and benefits are available to help programs start from ground zero and build up to success. Registered Skate with U.S. members will receive promotional packets that include pens, pencils, stickers, posters, pins and a banner. The USFSA will also be releasing an instructional video this year with teaching tips and explanations of testing standards.

"Technically, the Skate with U.S. program is the best learn to skate program available," said Thompson. "We have approximately 6,000 instructors and our goal is to assist all of our skating directors and instructors to teach to the highest possible standard. There are a lot of issues our instructors have to deal with and we want to assist them on how to attack each one."

#### THE BASICS

The "basics" of the Skate with U.S. program are simple. Every successful rink in the United States has some sort of learn to skate program. When an ice rink is built, these kinds of programs are essentially the only way to draw the public in. Most rinks are either considered a "USFSA" or "ISI" (Ice Skating Institute) rink, depending on which learn to skate program is utilized.

The Skate with U.S. program is only as good as the woman behind it -- Susi Wehrli-Thompson. Hired by the USFSA in the fall of 1999, Thompson has tackled her new position with full force.

Thompson holds all the tools necessary to do the job right. She started three Skate with U.S. programs in Wisconsin -- the Stoughton Skating School, The Skating Company, LLC. (with partner Kristi Massey) and the Sun Prairie Skating School -- simply by taking the initiative, going to rinks that didn't have learn to skate programs and putting the wheels in motion.

"The Skate with U.S. programs are good for the community and good for the skaters," she said. "They bring people to the rink."

Thompson was a skating coach in Madison, Wisc., before moving to Stoughton and starting her first school. She began skating when she was six in Wilmette, Ill., and her entire family started skating together as a Christmas present to each other. Thompson started skating in the ISI's learn to skate program and by age nine, she was a competitive skater with the Skokie Valley SC. She passed the gold freestyle and figures tests at 16. She also began to student-teach that year, and later worked her way through college at the University of Wisconsin by teaching competitive and recreational skaters.

Thompson moved to Colorado Springs and her new job from Oregon, Wisc., with her husband, Tom, and twin boys, Alex and Zack (6). She is a PSA-rated group and private instructor and also a certified Zamboni driver. She hopes to continue the success of the Skate with U.S. program and help USFSA members reach their dreams.

"The number one element of the Skate with U.S. program is fun," she said.
"That's the most important thing."

Historically, rinks have become USFSA rinks because of an affiliation with a local skating club or because of a desire to create champions out of young skaters. The USFSA test system, beginning with the pre-preliminary level, is the only path to regional, sectional and national competition.

The Skate with U.S. program promotes the recreational and fun aspect of learning to skate. Skate with U.S. does have a competition structure called "Compete with U.S.," but even that is organized as a fun, first-time out competition for skaters.

The Compete with U.S. manual assists clubs/groups with organizing an entrylevel Skate with U.S./Basic Skills competition. Skaters can compete in events such as elements, compulsories, music programs, spins, artistic, dance and interpretive. The competition events are open to all eligible skaters in the Snowplow Sam-Freeskate 6 ability levels.

The competitions are to be conducted in the spirit of good sportsmanship, providing all competitors an opportunity to skate for fun. Any group hosting a



Compete with U.S. competition must be registered with the USFSA as an official Skate with U.S./Basic Skills Group.

The Skate with U.S. program is an 11level system that teaches the fundamentals of ice skating to all ages -- from three-years-old to adults. Skaters are divided by ability, not age, and need to master five to seven elements in each level before moving up.

Skate with U.S. is built around group lessons, which can be a positive aspect of learning to skate for young children. Not only are group lessons less expensive, but they help children develop social skills and learn from each other.

Preschool age children can begin in Snowplow Sam 1-3, which teaches similar elements as the first Basic levels, but with games and stories. Most beginning skaters start at the Basic 1 level, which includes such elements as sitting on the ice and standing up, skating forward and gliding on two feet and backward wiggles. After completing Basic 1-8, skaters can then branch off into one of four disciplines within the USFSA Basic Skills structure -- Freestyle 1-6, Dance 1-6, Synchronized Skating 1-6 and Hockey 1-6. All registered Skate with U.S. members receive a membership card, a member patch, a year patch and a record book with stickers to chart their progress.

The development of skating skills for hockey players is an important component of the Skate with U.S. structure, and is a key element in the proposed partnership between the USFSA and USA Hockey.

"It's been observed that young people who want to play hockey don't spend enough time on the technical aspects of skating," said Thompson. "They just want the quick fix on how to skate so they can start playing. The Skate with U.S. program can help hockey players

really learn to move on the ice and be more successful players."

Thompson said figure skating coaches often teach the hockey classes because they have been studying those technical aspects. She has also been working on revamping the hockey curriculum. With the new curriculum, hockey players can branch out from the figure skaters after the Basic 2 level and go straight to hockey classes.

### **Starting A Program**

If you want to start a Skate with U.S. program in your area, there are a few crucial steps in the process and questions that you might want to consider.

- 1. Contact the USFSA for information and registration forms.
- 2. Decide who is going to sponsor the program -- most Skate with U.S. programs are either sponsored by the local USFSA member skating clubs or the local Parks and Recreation Department. A program can also be privately-owned or run by the ice facility.
- 3. Write a business plan, a mission statement, do a market analysis and consult with other Skate with U.S. programs for advice.
- 4. Decide things such as how many sessions you will offer, how many weeks in a session, how much ice time is needed per week, how many skaters in each class, how much will lessons cost?
- 5. Hire a skating director to coordinate and oversee the Skate with U.S. program.
- 6. Hire a Skate with U.S. instructional staff -- be sure each instructor is welltrained and able to teach high quality skating techniques.
- 7. Decide how best to market and promote your program -- call the USFSA for help!



he U.S. figure skating team is always quite excited to come to Trophee Lalique. First, because the competition is a show in itself -- one of the most classy events in the world, surrounded by the glamour of Paris fashion and the artistry of Lalique pure crystal. Second, because it is held in downtown Paris, which allows skaters to tour a wonderful city and build a strong team spirit. This year's competitors were no exception, and the U.S. participants quickly gathered as one of the most tight-knit teams of the field.

#### MEN

"What a great combination you did!" said Peter Tchernyshev to Michael Weiss after the short program. "Good job! I just missed the start of your program."

"I missed it, too!" Weiss answered laughing.

Indeed, Weiss had fallen on his quadruple toe loop attempt in the short program, but he managed to compose himself right away to land a splendid triple Axel-triple toe combination. This year's Trophee nonetheless proved to be a tough time for Weiss, still handicapped by a stress fracture on his left ankle.

Although his energetic and dynamic long program to

"Carmen" was wonderfully received by the audience, Weiss did not manage to land either the quad or a clean triple Axel, and he had to settle for a disappointing fifth place.

Another beautiful program belonged to France's Laurent Tobel. Skating to the theme from "Austin Powers," Tobel also missed both his triple Axels. Still, his footwork, steps and precise edges, as well as his trademark humorous style, provided a program of high technical difficulty and a delight to watch.

"I was lucky to benefit from the advice of Tatiana Tarasova on steps and style," Tobel commented. "I always learn so much from other coaches' advice."

The podium went to those who managed to land the strongest jumps. Russia's Alexei Yagudin won both programs, showing once more his mastery of the most difficult jumps and artistic talent. Second was Vincent Restencourt of France, who with Yagudin was the only one to successfully land a quad. Restencourt's second-place finish helped him grab a spot in the Grand Prix Final in his first year of senior Grand Prix competition. He is the current World Junior silver medalist and will be a threat to the top guns this year. Bulgaria's Ivan Dinev skated to third place thanks to a well-rounded and mastered program.


#### **PAIRS**

The pairs' competition could have been a remake of last year's Trophee, with Kyoko Ina and John Zimmerman of the U.S. and Sarah Abitbol and Stéphane Bernadis of France battling for first place. The latter finally won both programs, and added another crystal trophy to their personal collection.

"One day, last year, I thought of skating to a 'good and evil' theme," Bernadis explained. "In this program, Sarah is the angel, and I am the devil. If she skates well, she has the right to kill me at the end of the program. If she does not, the story

can end differently," he laughed.

The home crowd could not see any different ending this time, however, as they skated a flawless free program.

Ina and Zimmerman were less lucky, however, as they had to endure two major falls and a loss of edge in their final spiral. Their program nonetheless captured the crowd's applause and earned a fourth-place finish.

Unexpected second-place finishers were Tatiana Totmianina and Maksim Marinin of Russia. They added their very classical style to Rachmaninov's piano virtuosity, and were the only pair to successfully land two different parallel jumps in their free program.

Current European and World bronze medalists Dorota Zagorska and Mariusz Siudek of Poland managed to reach the podium with a solid free program.

#### LADIES

"I came to Paris six years ago," said Sarah Hughes, last year's World seventhplace finisher. At that time, she toured with Surya Bonaly and a few others.

"This time it is the real thing, and I am really excited to be back," she said.

Her mother was quite excited, too.

"Usually my husband goes on trips. I wanted to do this one. We could tour and even did some shopping," she said.

Hughes' programs were certainly among the most well-rounded and consistent of the field, with clean edges, strong jumps (she successfully landed five triple jumps in her free routine, and just missed one triple Lutz) and good moves. She captured the bronze medal -- her first time on the podium in a senior Grand Prix event.

"I worked very hard this last year, and I am very happy with my performance," she said with an ear-to-ear smile.

World Champion Maria Butyrskaya was not nearly as happy.

"I thought I would be more prepared for this competition," she said.


Butyrskaya admitted that she had taken a bigger risk for this season.

"I wanted to skate something different than what the other girls are doing," she said. "I chose to skate to Swan Lake, even though it is a most difficult theme to skate to, as it requires a lot more

A fall on the triple flip and a shaky landing on the triple loop did not prevent her from winning, however.

"This is only the start of the season, and it will allow me to get prepared and ready at the proper time."

Second was Russia's Viktoria Volch-



Volchkova's performances proved that the Russian National Championships would be exceptionally tough this year, with seven talented ladies competing for a spot on the World team.

#### **ICE DANCING**

U.S. dancer Naomi Lang was also quite happy to be in Paris.

"It is so beautiful, and there is so much to see here. Actually, I would like to come back for vacation," she said.

She and her partner, Peter Tchernyshev, drew to skate first in the Original Dance, but they managed to hold on to fifth place from the beginning to the end of the competition.

"Our practices were so awful, we are glad we skated the way we did," said Tchernyshev.

Winners were the French crowd's favorites, Marina Anissina and Gwendal Peizerat. Their free dance to "Carmina Burana" showed a different vision of their skating and dancing abilities. The precise changes of edges they created with former Olympic gold medalists Torvill and Dean, the velocity of their steps, their footwork and high pace throughout their program earned a standing ovation and one 6.0 for presentation.

Italians Barbara Fusar-Poli and Maurizio Margaglio explained that the theme of their program (to "Braveheart") was that of "a duel with dance."

"Then she becomes a girl, and I start loving her," said Margaglio. "But anyone can understand the story they wish. It is the imagination of the viewer that counts."

They took the silver, ahead of Lithuania's Margarita Drobiazko and Povilas Vanagas, who managed to create an intense emotion in the rink.

Margaglio summed up the whole ice dancing competition by commenting that "we all have very technical programs now, because that is what the ISU wants. We all skate as fast as possible, from twizzle to circle to diagonal, as difficult as possible."

The best ones not only manage this technical difficulty, but also create emotion and art: certainly the best ingredients for Lalique's glamour.



Regardless of the sport, athletes and coaches alike are always looking for ways to improve their performance -- on the court, on the ice or on the playing field. Synchronized team skating is no different.

As the level of proficiency in team skating improves, and as the ISU issues new rules and guidelines for the sport, coaches and skaters wonder what's allowed and what is not allowed in competition. Coaches are sometimes confused about what to teach their young charges and skaters wonder if it helps or hurts to try new techniques.

To help standardize the information given to skaters, and to "level the proverbial skating rink," In Synch went to the experts for help. Pat French, member of the ISU Synchronized Skating Technical Committee, graciously offered her time and expertise to answer a few questions.

### Q: Are assisted jumps allowed, and if so, in what manner?

**A:** Yes, assisted jumps are allowed in free skating programs but not in the short programs. These maneuvers must not look like assisted lifts, since those are illegal. To be safe, there should be a "vaulting action by the skater(s) performing the jump." An assisted jump is defined as a jump of not more than one revolution, in which a skater(s) provides passive assistance to another...in a nonsupportive role. There is a continuous ascending and descending movement. The hands of the skater(s) providing assistance must not be higher than the shoulders.

Ann Gooding talks to Pat French, member of the ISU Synchronized Skating Technical Committee, about ways to improve your team's overall performance.

### Q: Are enhancements/highlighting allowed in the short program?

**A:** Absolutely NO! Highlighting is illegal in both the short program and free skate, and enhancements are only allowed in the free skate. The term "highlighting" should no longer be used when defining movements used to enhance the free skate because it is illegal.

### Q: What mark reflects the judges' consideration of enhancements?

**A:** Movements of a few skaters, done in isolation from the rest of the team and which do not distract from the team's performance....are permitted in the free skate, provided these movements are not illegal movements as per SSR21.03 (i.e., jumps of more than one revolution, intersections using back spirals, lifts, prolonged lying or kneeling on the ice.) Movements such as short spins, some spirals, etc. and other unique or innovative movements must show a relationship to the overall maneuver and enhance the musical interpretation. Think of a Christmas tree. If the movement is like the star on the top, it is highlighting and illegal. If the movement is the tinsel or ornaments, then it is enhancement and "probably legal."

The team must still predominantly act as one unit and if not, a deduction of 0.2 should be made in the technical merit mark. If it is seen as enhancements and legal, it could raise the base mark for technical merit, and "as it could and should enhance the musical interpretation, it could also raise the mark for presentation."

### Q: Does a fall count as much when it happens between maneuvers as during them?

**A:** A fall is a fall is a fall, whenever it occurs, but a fall is dealt with differently in the short and free skate programs. In the short, a fall during a transition doesn't carry the same mandatory deduction a fall in a required maneuver does. It will still impact the base mark given the team. It is up to the judge to decide where the fall took place.

### Q: Should moves in the field be required and to what level?

**A:** Moves in the field teaches the basics of skating: edge quality, quickness, extensions and power -- all necessary for synchronized skating. Moves provides a firm foundation for skating in any discipline. The team should assess the level of its members and set goals for the year. The long range goal should be equal to or higher than the division the team competes in. This will take much work and planning and will not be accomplished in one year.

### Q: Should moves in the field be used in team tryouts?

**A:** Yes, as this will give the coach an indication of the skaters' abilities. For tryouts, it is more important to possess good skating skills.

### Q: Should a new team's goal be to pass synchronized tests?

**A:** Tests were designed to provide a structure to develop synchronized skating within a club or country. The tests give the framework for developing team skating skills and can be beneficial.

### Q: What is the best way for any team to improve its performance and marks?


**A:** There is no one best way, but there are several important factors:

- ◆ Improve skating skills
- Establish goals for the season and evaluate at the end of the season
- ◆ All must be committed to effort (parents/coaches/skaters/club)
- ◆ The whole team should be physically, emotionally and nutritionally fit
- Elicit comments from local judges at the highest level. Get different opinions.
- Send videotapes to judges and ask for their comments
- ◆ Attend competitions that have critique sessions and listen as well as ask. Follow through on them
- ◆ When attending competitions, have skaters watch as much as possible
- ◆ Coach should attend competitions and watch if team is not competing
- ◆ Coach should be a member of the PSA and rated
- Attend synchronized skating camps

Finally, Lee Ann Miele adds: Work hard, develop better edges, speed and control.

# No Time to Warm Up? I hink Again

Skaters need to take the time to warm up their muscles both on and off the ice. Here are a few simple stretches to help prevent injuries and improve flexibility.

ost of us are very busy. Skaters may be rushing from school to skating practice and vice versa thinking they do not have time to warm up and stretch. Yet some decide to start during competition week. Warming up is not a waste of time -- it is a must and should be consistent throughout the year. It just takes 5-10 minutes and is incredibly important.

Easy jogging, jumping or stroking to a slight sweat before increasing your practice intensity or off-ice workout raises your body temperature. This, in turn, increases blood flow so that muscles can contract more efficiently. Your joints, ligaments and tendons become more flexible (allowing for freer and easier movement), decreasing your chances of muscle strain injuries. This slow increase in intensity and stretching also helps to decrease post exercise muscle soreness. Stretching is also a great tool for relaxation.

Here are a few on-ice and off-ice stretches that should be performed daily before and after exercise. Perform three times, holding the stretch for 15-20 seconds. Breathing should be slow and rhythmical. If you are bending forward to stretch, exhale as you go forward and then breathe naturally as you hold the stretch. Do not hold your breath. It is imperative that

you consult your doctor or physical therapist prior to beginning new exercises.

Competition warm-ups should be used to prepare and relax your body so that it can do automatically what it has been trained to do.

For example, warm up office by jumping or jogging 5-7 minutes, then perform slow stretches with proper breathing techniques. During your on-ice warm-up, begin by stroking 2-4 laps, breathing and stretching during stroking, spirals or spins. Follow with single jumps and progress to a few doubles and triples. While waiting to compete, maintain your body warmth and relaxation by moving, diaphragmatic breathing, stretching, visualization, joint oscillations or rotations and/or any other techniques that work for you.

#### **Quadricep Stretch**

Stand or lie on your side, grasp your foot and pull it toward your buttocks while tilting your hips forward. Keep your thighs in line with each other.

#### Gastroc/Soleus Stretch

Stand toward the wall or counter and bend the knee of your front leg with the other leg straight behind you. Keep hips forward back straight and back leg heel on the



ground. Maintain a neutral ankle position (avoid excessive pronation).

To stretch your soleus, lower

your hips down and bend your back knee to a gentle stretch.

#### **Hamstring Stretch**

Maintain the slight curve in your low back. Lie on your back or use the rail or a bench.



#### Piriformis (hip)

he new millennium. The sports world is no less affected by this new age than any other part of our society. For skating, change comes in the form of the first ISU World Championship of Synchronized Skating -- and the U.S.

teams are ready.

The United States will face more than a dozen countries in this challenging competition of the world's best team skaters. First, they have to beat the local talent back home, at the 2000 U.S. Synchronized Skating Championships, March 1-4, in Plymouth, Mich. This year, the top six U.S. teams -

members of Project 2000 - and the myriad other senior-level synchronized teams, are preparing for the Championships knowing that the stakes are higher than ever. Teams reach the U.S. Championships by qualifying through one of three sectional competitions, while a few

> of the top teams will receive byes.

> This particular U.S. Championships in the year 2000 brings drama, excitement, and a fight for a berth at the first World Championships. Teams have been setting their training clocks earlier, and introducing more speed, athleticism and drama. It is a quest for the covet-

gold receives an automatic berth to the World Championships, April 5-8, in Minneapolis, Minn. Another team (not necessarily the silver medalist) will also receive a berth, so the pressure is on to perform at the highest level.

This is an honor and an opportunity never before enjoyed by synchronized skating teams. That means better training and choreography, more speed, sharper programs and even, a surprise or two.

"It has changed -- the skating itself has dramatically improved in just the last four years alone," said USFSA Synchronized Skating Committee chair Lee Ann Miele, who has been with the sport for two decades. "It's not a sport just for recreational skaters. They have to be in top form and train as top athletes."

In the past, winning the U.S. Synchronized (formerly precision) Team Skating Championships meant prestige and respect among team skaters and the folks back home. And that's about it. The respect and understanding of the talent and effort that goes into a podium finish generally ended in the locker rooms, among competitors, officials, friends and family. Now, a national finish means a whole lot more.

In 1995, the International Skating Union changed the face of team skating. It gave its official nod to the sport and sanctioned the first World Championships. That approval meant worldwide attention, and eventual possible acceptance as an Olympic sport.

In preparation for this event, the USFSA has put all its chips into training top-winning teams. The organization conducted a three-year training mission called "Project 2000," chaired by world judge Gale Tanger and coordinated by Miele. The six elite teams -- Haydenettes, Miami University, Starlets, Crystallettes, Team Elan and Team del Sol -- participated in the Project, mastering choreography, edges, speed, strength and endurance training. What they learned will be borne out on the ice this season, making them better contenders for a World title.

"The first World Championships have definitely inspired change and updating



of Team Elan's training regimen," said Team Elan coach Jeannine Cullen. "Our trainer, Debbie Pitsos, has worked to coordinate all off-ice training with onice. We restructured some areas of our training and have added on-ice aerobic and anaerobic programs."

She also said they've added many "skills and drills" to shape up skaters, working on technical turns, stroking, knee bends and extension.

The "prize" could be representing the U.S. at the first World Championships.

"We have left no stone unturned," she said.

Beth Sisofo, head coach and director of synchronized skating for the Starlets of Wagon Wheel FSC, in Barrington, Ill., agreed.

"We really want to be contenders for this historic event," she said.

The Starlets started training and creating programs much earlier than usual. Sisofo said a third-place finisher in the past is a bit like being an "underdog" (the Starlets finished third in 1999). However, that takes the pressure off skaters and coaches alike.

"What do you have to lose?" she laughed. "You just gotta go for it."

The Starlets will be rocking to Big Bad Voodoo Daddy's swing program in the short, and a montage from the hit movie, "The Mummy," in the long.

Lynn Benson, coach of the nine-time U.S. champion Haydenettes, said their "focus is still the same. We work very hard to create a strong, appealing short and long program and try to skate them well. The rest will fall into place."

The reigning silver medalists will skate to "The Skaters' Waltz," in the short, and to the big band style of "Fosse," for the long.

Benson said her teams have been working harder and their training schedule reflects that.

Shannon Peterson, primary coach of the Crystallettes of Dearborn FSC (Mich.) has been busy gearing up for the event.

"I feel way more pressure," she said. "I

think everybody wants to make synchronized skating history...and the first Worlds does that."

Preparation for the Crystallettes has included working with head choreographer of the Radio City Rockettes, Marianne Selbert, who visited the team

"The skaters really enjoyed her," said Peterson. "She really motivated them, helping them with full presentation, as well as with their arms and the little extras."

Selbert has worked with a number of the elite teams since first meeting them at the New York City conference of Project 2000 last June.

Peterson has also pulled in two Russian international gold dancers and their club dance coach, and increased on- and off-ice dance training, and hours of training. Their short program is a melody in four different ethnic themes, and their long will be a swing program.

"Synchro has come a long way in a short time. It definitely is a crowd pleaser. As long as the sport keeps moving along with exciting programs and very motivated officials, skaters, parents and coaches, it (will be like) the proverbial snowball rolling down the mountain!" said Benson.

Team del Sol has also been working with outside sources to improve their overall look and increase fitness.

"We increased our ice time this season,"





# of Russia

he Cup of Russia in St. Petersburg was the fifth and best-attended competition of the Grand Prix Series, and the skaters treated the excited crowds to some excellent skating.

### MEN

World silver medalist Evgeny Plushenko dominated the men's competition in his new hometown. In the short program, he fell on the quad toeloop, but otherwise skated excellently. In the free, the 17-year-old crowd favorite started with a brilliant combination of quad and triple toeloop, followed by seven more triples. The judges awarded him with a 6.0 for presentation -- the only one at the entire event.

His teammate, Alexander Abt, twofooted the quad in both programs, but completed most of his triples to earn the silver. The 23-year-old from Moscow had improved his style and steps since his opening competition at Skate America. Abt's artistry allowed him to defeat China's Zhengxin Guo for the silver, although the Chinese skater performed a clean quad in both programs.

Trifun Zivanovic, the only U.S. man at the event, skated well in his second Grand Prix event, performing most of his planned triple jumps to finish sixth.

### **LADIES**

In the ladies' competition, there was a Russian sweep on the podium. Irina Slutskaya gave her best performances in a few years and easily won both programs. For the first time since 1997, she mastered the Lutz in the short and impressed the judges with the double Biellmann spin on both feet. In the free skate, she completed five triples and showed a lot of energy.

Julia Soldatova landed two jumps in the short a bit shakily and struggled at the beginning of her free skate. She later hit four clean triple jumps to finish second. Elena Sokolova was fourth in the short after two mistakes, but moved up after a strong and energetic free skate. American Angela Nikodinov skated a clean short program and was third going into the free skate. She landed four triples in the long program, including a brilliant Lutz combination, but was unable to move onto the podium.

### **PAIRS**


Maria Petrova and Alexei Tikhonov, fourth at last year's Worlds, were in second after the short program after Petrova fell on the triple toeloop. In the free skate, they completed all of their difficult elements flawlessly to win the gold medal -- much to the delight of the home crowd.

World silver medalists Xue Shen and Hongbo Zhao were first in the short with a clean performance. They slipped twice in the long, which cost them the victory, despite extremely impressive elements.

U.S. contenders Tiffany and Johnnie Stiegler fell victim to illness and were forced to withdraw after the short program. The same ailments affected Skate America winners Jamie Sale and David Pelletier, who also withdrew due to stomach problems.

### DANCE

The ice dancing event ended with that rarity in the sport -- a surprise. With World Champions Anjelika Krylova and Oleg Ovsyannikov absent due to her



back injury, Canada's Shae-Lynn Bourne and Victor Kraatz were the favorites.

Although they made no mistakes, they finished second in each dance of the competition. Italians Barbara Fusar-Poli and Maurizio Margaglio, who beat Irina Lobacheva and Ilia Averbukh at Skate America, came away as the winners instead. The good technique of the Italians in the Viennese Waltz, their quick, though relatively easy, steps in the Latin combination and their high speed in the free dance helped them to the

The U.S. team of Debbie Koegel and Oleg Fediukov were forced to withdraw before the competition because of his visa problems.

very year the NHK Trophy is the last competition of the Grand Prix Series. Each time it is in a different Japanese city -- this time in Nagoya, about 200 miles southwest of Tokyo. Nagoya is known as the hometown of former World Champion Midori Ito, who coincidentally worked as a television commentator for the NHK channel, the title sponsor.

### MEN

One week after the Cup of Russia, Evgeny Plushenko also won the men's competition in Japan and his third Grand Prix event with two excellent performances. In the short, he mastered a quad toeloop and a solid triple Axeltriple toe combination. In the free program, he opened with a three-jump combination -- quad toeloop-triple toeloopdouble loop -- the first time it had ever been performed in competition. During training, Plushenko even showed the combination with a triple loop at the end. Seven more triples, quick spins and a high speed earned him the gold and two perfect 6.0 marks.

Skating right after Plushenko, Timothy Goebel had a good start to his free skate, landing an effortless quad Salchow-triple toe combination. He fell on his quad toeloop, but later hit a second quad Salchow and six more triples to capture the silver and qualify for the Grand Prix Final.

"I am quite satisfied, but I still have a lot of work to do before nationals and Worlds," said Goebel.

World Junior Champion Ilia Klimkin popped a quad Salchow in the free skate, but landed a quad toeloop-triple toeloop combination for third place. He also showed some unusual movements, such as a triple Salchow out of a camel spin.

### **LADIES**

World Champion Maria Butyrskaya won the ladies' competition, although she was not in top shape. In her new long program to Swan Lake, the 27-yearold Russian landed the first two triples shakily and doubled the toeloop. She completed four triples overall and won mainly because of her mature presenta-


after the short program and she hit five triples in the free skate to finish second. Despite a groin injury, Tatiana Malinina won the bronze medal, while Amer-ican Amber Corwin finished seventh.

### **PAIRS**

Skating to Vivaldi's "Four Seasons," Russia's Maria Petrova and Alexei Tikhonov mastered all their key elements to win the pairs' competition. Their free skate helped them beat France's Sarah Abitbol and Stephane Bernadis, who led after a flawless short program.

In the free skate, Abitbol struggled on both individual jumps and admitted that the Russians had a better day. Poland's Dorota Zagorska and Mariusz Siudek impressed the judges with their lifts, but had some mistakes on individual jumps to finish third. China's Xue Shen and Hongbo Zhao did not medal after missing two elements in the free skate.

Americans Danielle and Steve Hartsell struggled in the short program, but skated well in the free skate to move up to fifth place.



### DANCE

The French team of Marina Anissina and Gwendal Peizerat unanimously won the ice dancing competition with their program to "Carmina Burana." Their free dance was more fluent than at Trophee Lalique, and boasted intricate footwork and difficult lifts.

The silver went to Russia's Irina Lobacheva and Ilia Averbukh, who went back to last year's free program after losing to Barbara Fusar-Poli and Maurizio Margaglio at Skate America. The free skate of Margarita Drobiazko and Povilas Vanagas was well-received by the crowd, and the judges rewarded them with the bronze medal.

**ES:** My favorite was Bruce Lee-The Dragon because it was a breakthrough





However, those hockey classes will incorporate many of the techniques used in the higher Basic levels, so the players will continue to learn skating skills.

Once figure skaters complete the freestyle or dance program, they can then move on to the traditional USFSA testing structure that leads to the regional competitions.

### THE CHALLENGE

Rinks are constantly being built across the United States, and the USFSA is keeping pace by signing them up as Skate with U.S. members. Thompson added 16 new clubs in November and December alone, and the applications keep coming in.

Thompson (see sidebar on page 13), along with Herron, the skating directors and area representatives, is part of that plan to increase recognition for the program and bring new rinks into the fold.

"It's definitely a challenge,"


said Thompson. "I like to build programs and help people. People who want to start a program can call me and talk to someone with experience."


Title sponsor Chevrolet also sees good things coming out of the program.







said Team del Sol head coach Karen Weismeier. "We've also continued to work with national champion coach/choreographer Sundae Bofo-Lebel and Russian champion Yuri Ovchinikov."

The squad also added a plyometric program for off-ice conditioning that has been very beneficial. Weismeier hinted at Team del Sol's upcoming season by saying the long program will be quite entertaining and the short will be more competitive than in the past.

Defending U.S. champion Miami University had a whirlwind year after capturing its first-ever national title and finishing as the top U.S. team at the World Challenge Cup. The team has also benefitted from Project 2000 and will use the new knowledge to chase its second straight gold medal.

"The pressure comes from trying to be the best we can be and not let the Worlds get into our heads," said head coach Vicki Korn. "The skaters are extremely focused...They want to live up to the title and win it again."

Miami will be skating its short program to a specially-composed rock and roll number featuring early rock stars. The team's long program was developed with the help of Lenore Kay (who works with Canadian champs "black ice") and is a piece about the power and beauty of water.

This is a unique opportunity for the sport to set the stage for the first World Championships. The better the U.S. teams become, the better they will do at the world level. With that comes more recognition and growth at the grass roots level.

"I see us growing every year, but we're not the only ones improving," said Miele. "We have to get down on our knees more and get more flow and power. A far as I can see, I see no end in sight for our sport."
